

ELDERS FOR GOD'S PEOPLE

Entering a new year brings many organizational changes to the life of our church family. We've just recently completed our Annual Meeting where we celebrated the Lord's work among us in 2017, and trusted God to move in and through our ministries in 2018. One of the most significant aspects of the changing of the year is when we see a new group of church officers accept the call to serve the Lord and His people through the Church. I want to tell you why we have these officers, and how thankful I am for each of them.

If you go back into your Old Testament history, particularly the book of Numbers, you will find the people of God in a tough spot. Around chapter 11, the wonderful strength of God, displayed in the parting of the Red Sea, was only a distant memory. Even though they received a daily portion of manna from God, they felt it wasn't as good as it used to be back in Egypt, where they had access to all kinds of foods. They come to a place in their minds and hearts where they are convinced that they would have been better off to stay in Egypt as slaves, rather than be delivered, just to starve and die in the wilderness. So they do what we all do – they complained.

In that specific context, God does something wonderful for His people. In Numbers 11, God appoints elders to come alongside Moses in the work of caring for and leading the people of God. The Lord said to Moses, "Gather for me seventy men of the elders of Israel...and let them take their stand with you" (Num. 11:16). In other words, God is saying to Moses that his task is more than he can bear on his own. That is why men of wisdom and faithfulness were gathered together, and most notably, in v.25 God pours out His Spirit upon them. Now, Moses could lead the people with a team of other leaders who were every bit as called and equipped by God as he was. This was great news for Moses.

It was also a blessing to the people. Through the care of the elders, the people of God are nurtured in their faith so that their complaining and shaky faith can find solid ground in and through trusting in the God who had given them these leaders. The elders are God's gift to the people. They are called out from among their own peers, to stand in front and lead in the pursuit of faithful worship and obedient living. God cares for His people's weakness and tendency to wander, through the loving oversight of elders. This is the ordinary means through which God works His extraordinary care for us.

Speaking for myself, I want you all to know just how thankful I am for those who hold these positions of leadership in our church. I trust them and their wisdom. It is a joy for me to submit to their leadership, as we seek to serve the Lord together. Let me encourage you to be thankful for them as well. They are God's gift to you as overseers and caretakers of your souls.

To that end, I'm thankful that we'll be ordaining and installing new church officers at the end of January. When we do that, we are following ancient council from the Lord, to gather together those who would seek to lead us: with boldness, mixed with meekness; as leaders, but willing servants; with their gifts, yet still humble; with wisdom, but always seeking the mind of the Savior.

Please join me in offering prayer and love for those who serve us so faithfully. Thank you.



We provide comprehensive services to survivors in Scott, Jackson, Clinton, Muscatine and Louisa counties in Iowa, and Rock Island County in Illinois. Braking Traffik works toward building a statewide collaborative a response to human trafficking through education, legislative advocacy, and community partnerships.

Community Outreach: Braking Traffik provides training and coordinates efforts among social service providers, law enforcement, medical personnel, faith-based groups and others to ensure survivors receive the holistic care they need.



RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?


SCRIPTURE LINKS



FOOD PANTRY DISTRIBUTION December 9th, 2017 (This is an update, as last month's article was actually 2016's update, printed in error!)

THANK YOU to all who prayed for us and donated time, money, and/or food to make this distribution a big success. We served 44 families with this distribution – 106 Adults, 22 Teens, and 31 Children. We had several new families this time and one came at the last minute, but we had enough food on the shelves to pack another basket. Some of those who came to pick up had tears in their eyes because they were so grateful for our help! The gratefulness of all the families made all the hard work and hours of preparation worthwhile.

We will be doing another distribution in the spring and pray for good support for that effort also. We spent approximately \$4,300.00 for additional, food, meat, and produce in addition to all the nonperishable foods gathered by the churches and high school. We spent less money for this distribution because of the generosity of the community.

Items that we can especially use are fruit juice and tomato juice, pancake mix, syrup, sugar, flour, canned meats, pasta, fruit, saltine crackers, and graham crackers.
