## AN APOSTOLIC ADMONITION FOR 2018

Whether you're looking for help with your New Year's resolutions, or don't even bother to make them in the first place, the Apostle Peter has one in mind for you. With all of his apostolic authority, Peter gives this concluding word to his second letter, *"You therefore, beloved...take care that you are not carried away with the error of lawless people and lose your own stability"* ([2 Peter 3:17](#)). In other words, keep steady in your Christian life - and how can we do that in 2018? Peter continues, *"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ"* ([2 Peter 3:18](#)).

Just like regular health physicals are good for the body, regular spiritual check-ups are needed for the soul. Am I content in my Christian walk? Am I growing in holy living? Do I know the Word of God as much as I desire to? Am I learning more of Christ, so that I might trust Him more? Am I quick to forgive others? Do I hold too closely to material possessions? If you're like me these questions reveal that there are still many areas of my life that God is still at work in my heart. That is true for all of us. This side of heaven, every Christian believer is still a work in progress.

That work of God by the Holy Spirit is called sanctification. It's the life-long process where God is growing, changing, and making us into more mature disciples of Christ. But, that work of sanctification is also something that we are to give ourselves to with sincere efforts, which is why Peter can say "grow!" Against this backdrop is the glorious promise that God began a good work in us, and He will complete it ([Philippians 1:6](#)). Even for all of our sincere pursuits, the process of sanctification is laced together with God's grace that will never leave us or forsake us.

So, before you go about determining that you would like to read the Bible more in 2018, and formulating a plan (which by the way, two different plans are included in this newsletter), or any other discipline to help you grow this year, remember that sanctification has three meanings in the Bible.

- **Past tense:** You have been sanctified. God has made you His own in Christ. You have been saved. You are a saint in indissoluble union with Christ.
- **Present tense:** You are being sanctified. That salvation is being worked out over days, months, years, decades - to make you into the likeness of Jesus.
- **Future tense:** You will be sanctified. One glorious day the work will be complete, and you will be made perfectly holy to stand before His majesty and live forever. You will be saved.

With that in mind, we can have confidence that we put our hands to the plow of our spiritual growth, knowing first of all that God has empowered us by the Spirit to create the desire, supply the power, and produce the results of His work of sanctification.

I look forward to seeing how we will grow together in Christ in 2018, and I leave you with the words of the always beautiful Puritan prayer book, the Valley of Vision: *"I launch my bark on the unknown waters of this year, with Thee, O Father, as my harbor, Thee, O Son, at my helm, Thee, O Holy Spirit, filling my sails."*

To Him be glory both now and to the day of eternity ([2 Peter 3:18](#))!

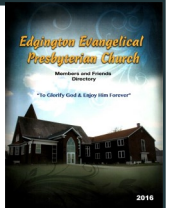

In order to understand and apply God's word, ask yourself the following questions as you read. Notice the acronym "MIRROR":

**MAGNIFY** - What does this text reveal about God that leads me to praise Him?

**INSPIRE** - How does this text lead me to pray?

**REVEAL** - What sin or disobedience does this text show me that I need to turn from?

**RECOGNIZE** - How does this text point to or anticipate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior?

**OBEDIENCE** - How does this text command my obedience to God's revealed will?

**RESPOND** - How must I respond in faith to this passage?

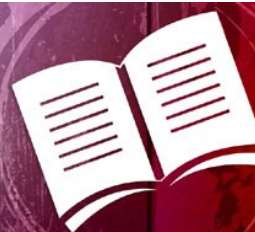

## FOOD PANTRY STAFF THANKS YOU!

Once again, thanks to community support, we had another successful food distribution in December 2017. We served 51 families consisting of 119 adults, 25 teens, and 35 children, for a total of 179 people. Each family received 3 generous boxes of food in addition to produce and meat.

On Friday, December 9th, we had 18 folks who helped to shop for and pack the food. A lady donated 11 dozen eggs for the patrons. On Saturday, December 10th, we had another group of 14 willing workers who helped with the distribution. A special thanks to the 8 who braved the cold outside to load the cars.

Even though we've been doing this for quite a few years, I'm still amazed by all the people who pitch in to help in so many ways. It is wonderful to have such a giving community and such support by the community churches.

We are still well stocked with green beans and corn, but have lots of room on the shelves for a variety of foods. Thank you in advance for your continued support.



## Rockridge Food Drive



Edgington, IL -- The Rockridge District wide food drive sponsored by the High School Student Council was conducted from October 30th - November 20th. All donations collected were delivered to the Edgington Presbyterian Church's Pantry and the Reynolds Methodist Church's Pantry on Tuesday, November 21st. Twenty-four Student Council members were chosen to help deliver the donations to the pantries. The members helped to collect the items from classrooms and buildings, sort them, and weigh the do-

nations before taking them to the pantries. The council members also helped to sort and stock the pantries at the churches and are shown in the attached photo after one of their deliveries. This year the total collections weighed in around 8,150 pounds.

Donations were collected at each elementary school, the junior high, and the high school along with a door to door collection within the community. During the drive, there were different activities within each building to promote bringing in dona-

tions. Within in each elementary building, the classroom who donated the most items received a monetary reward. The winners in each building were as follows: Illinois City - Mrs. Buckrop's Kindergarten class; Taylor Ridge - Mrs. Enes' 2nd grade class; and Andalusia - Mrs. Aten's 4th grade class.

Mrs. Aten's class voted to donate their winnings to #TeamEvelyn, which is supporting the daughter of RHS English Teacher Mrs. Valerie Kline. Evelyn is currently battling Neurob-

lastoma and is recovering from a Stem Cell Transplant. Mrs. Aten said, "We talked about how we have so much to be thankful for and how our community helps others in need.

I am sure they [the Kline family] could use it for gas, food, or maybe a toy for Evelyn to have during their long stay in Chicago."

In the junior high and high school different activities were conducted throughout the three weeks of the drive in

order to encourage helping out the local pantries. There was a Hat Day which brought in a total of \$100 and was split between the two pantries. The money collected from this is used to help purchase extra items needed. We held a Peanut Butter Jelly Time Contest and a 1st hour Competition. PBJ Time consists of students bringing in PB&J containers to their favorite teacher. The 1st hour competition was held on a Wednesday. The class in each building who brings in the most weight per student wins

a breakfast party. This year in the high school Mrs. Gorham's class won with 7.58lbs per student and in the junior high Mr. Henry's class won with 14.83lbs per student.

Student Council would like to thank each and every student, staff member, family who provided donations throughout the drive. The efforts of everyone involved a greatly appreciated by the churches.
