

JESUS, THE CHRIST

I'm sure at some point in your life you were awakened to the truth that "Christ" is not Jesus' last name. To be clear – it's not. So why do we call Jesus, "Christ?" Well, it has everything to do with His title, or we could say, His role.

The word for Christ in the New Testament is *christos*, which is a word translated into Greek from the Hebrew word for Messiah, which is *mashiach*, which means "anointed one." So when we hear of Jesus being spoken of as "Christ" or "Messiah" it's the same concept, but the word "Christ" has Greek roots from the New Testament, and "Messiah" has Hebrew roots from the Old Testament. In the Bible, this title was given to the promised Anointed One who would be revealed to rule over and deliver God's people from all their enemies.

The witness of the New Testament is that Jesus of Nazareth claimed to be the Messiah. This is seen, among so many places, very clearly in the episode with the woman at the well in John's gospel when she speaks to Jesus, saying, "I know that Messiah is coming (He who is called Christ); when that One comes, He will declare all things to us." Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am He" (John 4:25-26; cf: Mt 16:17; Mk 14:61-62; Jn 17:3).

In addition to this testimony, Jesus also perfectly fulfilled the promises about the Messiah from the Old Testament. Here are five:

- 1. Jesus was born in Bethlehem. [Promised: Micah 5:2; Fulfilled: Matthew 2:5-6]
- 2. Jesus was born of a virgin. [Promised: Isaiah 7:14; Fulfilled: Matthew 1:23]
- 3. Jesus performed many miracles and signs. [Promised: <u>Isaiah 35:5-6</u>; Fulfilled: <u>Luke 7:21</u>; <u>John 11:47</u>]
- 4. Jesus was rejected by His own people. [Promised: Psalm 118:22-23; Fulfilled: Matthew 21:42-43]
- 5. Jesus suffered for sinners. [Promised: Isaiah 53:12; Fulfilled: Matthew 27:38; Mark 10:45]

All the lines of evidence from the Bible point to the clear affirmation that Jesus is the Messiah, the Christ, and the Promised Anointed One come to deliver the people of God from their bondage.

The idea of a king who reigns through suffering was precisely the struggle of the people in the Bible to accept that Jesus was the Christ. It seemed strange to consider that the one who would come to deliver God's people would die. But, that was the plan. Jesus makes it very plain that the reign of His Kingdom is established through His suffering and death. (Mark 10:31, 45). Even after the resurrection, when the disciples struggled to understand this, He affirmed that it was indeed necessary for the Christ to suffer and then enter into His glory. (Luke 24:26) In one of my favorite verses from Luke's gospel, the men who walked with Jesus on the road to Emmaus said of their interaction with the Risen Christ, "did not our hearts burn within us while He opened to us the Scriptures" (Luke 24:32). Their hearts burned because they had apprehended by faith that Jesus was indeed the Christ. It was all true!

As I reflect on that, it represents everything that I want for us as the people of God here in Edgington. I want our hearts to join those disciples and burn with a passion and love for Jesus Christ as He is revealed to us though the Word of God. With Easter swiftly approaching, I hope that you will take advantage of every opportunity given for you to grow in your knowledge of and love for the Savior. Come early on the Lord's Day and join in on a Sunday School class. Lift the voice of your reconciled soul to your Covenant King assembled together with His people. Worship the crucified Messiah on Good Friday. Exalt the Resurrected Messiah on Easter Sunday. As we do, may our hearts likewise burn with faith in Jesus, the Christ, our Savior.

- Jeff discussed the possibility of replacing current fluorescent lights with LED lamps. Estimated cost is \$5,000 with a \$1,000 MidAmerican rebate. Estimated payback in 4 years. Will work on getting fixed bids for review by the trustees.

New Business:

- Two of the hot water heating pumps at the boiler needed repairs. Work was completed on Tuesday.
- Discussed orientation information for new trustees who will begin their term at the next meeting.
- Pam and Larry have volunteered to reupholster the two chairs at the front of the sanctuary.
- Trustees did some minor maintenance work following the meeting.

Mel closed the meeting with a prayer at 7:30pm.

The Mission Committee met on January 16, 2018 in the basement of the church. Those attending were Jim Cooksey, Nancy Engstrom, Paige Schmidt, Mary Ann Vroman, and Sue Penry. Barb Freyermuth led the meeting by video.

Paige opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved.

Old Business:

- We shared several pieces of mail and thank-you notes. Scott Burdsall had sent a newsletter also.
- During the last meeting we learned of families in the Rockridge district that were in need during the holidays. Sarah Leonard, who is principal of Illinois City and Taylor Ridge Grade Schools, was given \$455.00 to spend on families as she sees the need. Braking Traffik is a program of Family Resources dedicated to eradicating human **braking** trafficking in Iowa and Illinois. We provide comprehensive services to survivors in Scott, Jackson, Clinton, Muscatine and Louisa counties in Iowa, and Rock Island County in Illinois. Braking Traffik works toward building a statewide collaborative response to human trafficking through education, legislative advocacy, and community partnerships.

Community Outreach: Braking Traffik provides training and coordinates efforts among social service providers, law enforcement, medical personnel, faith-based groups and others to ensure survivors receive the holistic care they need.

RECOGNIZE - How does this text point to or anticipate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior?


OBEDIENCE - How does this text command my obedience to God's revealed will?

RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?


