



HARD WORK AND GREAT MEMORIES: YOUTH MISSION TRIP ESSENTIALS

A summer highlight for many of our students here at Edgington has become the annual youth mission trip. We are in our third year of serving with Group Workcamps, a national organization that provides all the logistical support so that youth and their leaders can enjoy a great experience together. For the past two years that is exactly what we have enjoyed! In 2016 we served in Brownsville, TN, and then in Dahlonega, GA last summer. This year we are heading to a new location with some students who have served before, and a few first timers.

On Friday, July 14th, we'll pack up and head north on our 600+ mile journey to Red Lake, MN. Our first stop will actually be a couple hours south of that in Sartell, MN where we'll spend the night at one of the churches in our presbytery – Riverside Community Church. Then, on Saturday morning, we'll check into the local school where we'll stay for the week, which also serves as the main base of operation.

The community of Red Lake is actually an Indian Reservation of the Chippewa Tribe. It is the largest and only closed Indian reservation in the state of Minnesota. They primarily speak the *Ojibew* language. Thankfully, Group Workcamps has a longstanding relationship with the tribe, and they certainty welcome all of the support they receive from these workcamps. 40% of this community's residents fall below the poverty level with over 60% unemployment. There will be plenty of opportunities for our service.

There will be over 30 different work sites where residents who are in need will receive our help as an expression of Jesus' love and compassion. Work projects typically include things like: building wheelchair ramps and handrails, weatherizing homes and trailers, reconstructing sagging porches, painting projects, interior and exterior carpentry, and other home repair projects that the homeowner cannot otherwise complete. The youth will work each day on the same worksite, giving them time to not only complete their projects, but also develop meaningful relationships with their resident and fellow workers.

The work crews are a special part of the trip. Participants are split up on six-person work crews for the work portion each day. In most cases, this is one adult and five youth, each person from a different church. When students are mixed up in their work crews it encourages them to develop social and leadership skills, make new friends, and grow closer with their resident and their own youth group.

For all 2018 camps, Group has selected "GRIT" as the theme. Each day students will have time in large group morning worship, work crew afternoon devotions, and evening programs that will unpack the relationship that Jesus had with Peter; calling him toward a stronger, more enduring faith and focus – as Group is calling it – Spiritual Grit. Each day has a theme and a passage to study: Risk (<u>Lk 5:1-11</u>); Courage (<u>Mt 14:22-33</u>); Forgiveness (<u>Mt 18:21-35</u>); Trust (<u>In 6:60-69</u>); Surrender (<u>In 18:1-11</u>); Love (<u>In 21:1-17</u>). The week promises both hard work and spiritual growth.

This year we are welcoming back a few veterans of the workcamp experience as well as some new students. Youth include: Nathan Flickinger, Jim Johnson, Colby Mueller, Maddie Mueller, Kira Nelson, Laina Nelson, Cade Reimers, and Logan Wistedt. Every one of them have expressed excitement about meeting new people, serving together, and having a great experience making lots of memories.

So, from July 14 – 21 please remember us in prayer for safety, hearts of service, and a wonderful time together. We can't wait to share our experience once we come back.

Kevin opened the meeting with a prayer at 7:01pm.

Reviewed minutes from the last meeting of 3/13/2018. Motion made and seconded to approve the minutes as presented, motion carried.

It was noted that the Treasurer's report for February was approved by the trustees after the March meeting. Cindy presented the March Treasurer's report. Motion made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's report and additional bills presented. Motion carried.

Old Business:

- Update on Pastor's office renovation. Drywall and painting are complete. Air conditioning unit has been installed. Lighting and electrical work complete. Carpet, furniture and book cases will be installed in the next two to three weeks.
- Date for tree removal has been changed to April 14th.
- Discussed the parking of tree service trucks on the church parking lot. Permission was given this year for the parking. Likely will not allow parking again in the future due to concerns for damage to the parking lot and conflicts with church functions.

New Business:

- Trustees inspected the stair tread on the stairs in the new addition. Determined the vinyl base has been kicked, but appears the tread is ok and not a hazard.
- Discussed April cleanup of landscape area. Jeff indicated he will work on removing leaves from the landscape area. Further work possible when weather warms.
- Discussed possible removal of tree stumps after pin oak trees are cut. Will determine what is needed after trees are cut.
- Need to do some repair work on the old front door. Larry will contact the door company for suggestions.
- Discussed possibility of moving bank funds to receive better interest return. Motion made and seconded to close the General Fund Money Market, and move the funds into the General Checking Account. Interest rate is better in the checking account.
- Noted the flag pole rope has broken. Will purchase new rope and install.

Barb opened the meeting with prayer.

Old Business:

- The minutes of the last meeting were read. The donation to CEF was corrected to read \$45.57 and minutes were approved.
- The Committee discussed the visit to Youth Hope MAD. It was determined this visit would occur on May 2, 2018
- A discussion was held concerning the presentation from Human Trafficking. Jim Cooksey spoke with Rebecca as to how we could assist. Though they could use funding, we felt we were working in other areas to assist their cause. The group discussed how our work with Youth Hope, VBS, and Sunday school offers our children dedicated individuals they may reach out to; decreasing the possibilities these children could become victims. We talked about putting together some documentation on "signs" to watch for that might be of help to our teachers and counselors. Paige will be attending a class this month and will report back to the committee. After great discussion, the committee decided to table this topic as we seek understanding in how this issue fits into our mission.

New Business:

- Mic and Zach attended a banquet sponsored by Pregnancy Resources with locations in Moline, IL and Davenport, IA. This organization offers education and training for both mother and father on child care, they assist with financial aid, physicians, maternity housing, provide clothing, and testing for young mothers. This is a Christian organization and beyond the immediate care, they share the Word of God. Mic will ask Liz Ryan, of Pregnancy Resources, to attend our May or June meeting, so the committee may understand how we can partner to support their needs.
- We discussed the commitments we have made for Q2:

- These commitments were approved by the committee.
- A donation of \$1200.00 was approved for Marion Medical Mission who partner with African churches to provide safe drinking water while educating the poor in how they can continue to support themselves
- Christian Care of Rock Island offers shelter, support, and resources to those who are homeless. We discussed this mission and agreed we could sponsor a Men's Clothing Drive. Todd will contact Christian Care for more information.
- The committee discussed the needs of Tom/Phyllis Bassett (France), Pregnancy Resources, Mission Aviation (provides aviation, communication and technology to Christian and Humanitarian agencies), and Scott Burdsall. It was suggested we could realign our commitment to Ed/Nancy McCallum to make additional funds available. This discussion was tabled and will be addressed at our next meeting.
- Minutes for Mission the committee determined we are not yet ready to address MAD until after our visit on May 2. Therefore, we will present information on the Marion Medical Mission this Sunday (April 22). Paige volunteered to present this topic to our congregation.
- A special prayer request from Youth Hope was passed to all members.

"I feel our case management program is very unique because it is centered on the client's needs. We do not create a one size fits all action plan." - Pauline Gordon, Shelter Supervisor.

All clients at Winnie's Place must meet three goals to stay in the program. "Clients are expected to follow all the rules and policies we have in place, secure some source of income, and, once secured, save as much as possible, and search for housing," Pauline explains. "The rest of the case management is up to them." The client is given a packet of information with forms to fill out and return within 24 hours of intake. "We ask them to identify immediate needs, reflect on their situation, and write in their own words what's going on," Pauline says. "Often, it is not one single event that leads someone to homelessness."

If the client has no family, Winnie's staff works to link her up with potential support systems. "This could be church, parenting groups, co-workers, or volunteer opportunities," Pauline says.

To encourage your personal study of God's word, and prepare for each Lord's Day message, please consider reading in advance to familiarize yourself with the sermon texts.





In order to understand and apply God's word, ask yourself the following questions as you read. Notice the acronym **"MIRROR"**:

MAGNIFY - What does this text reveal about God that leads me to praise Him?
INSPIRE - How does this text lead me to pray?
REVEAL - What sin or disobedience does this text show me that I need to turn from?
RECOGNIZE - How does this text point to or anticipate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior?
OBEDIENCE - How does this text command my obedience to God's revealed will?
RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?

Click on that tab and you are taken to the Strong's Concordance link for each word in the verse. 
