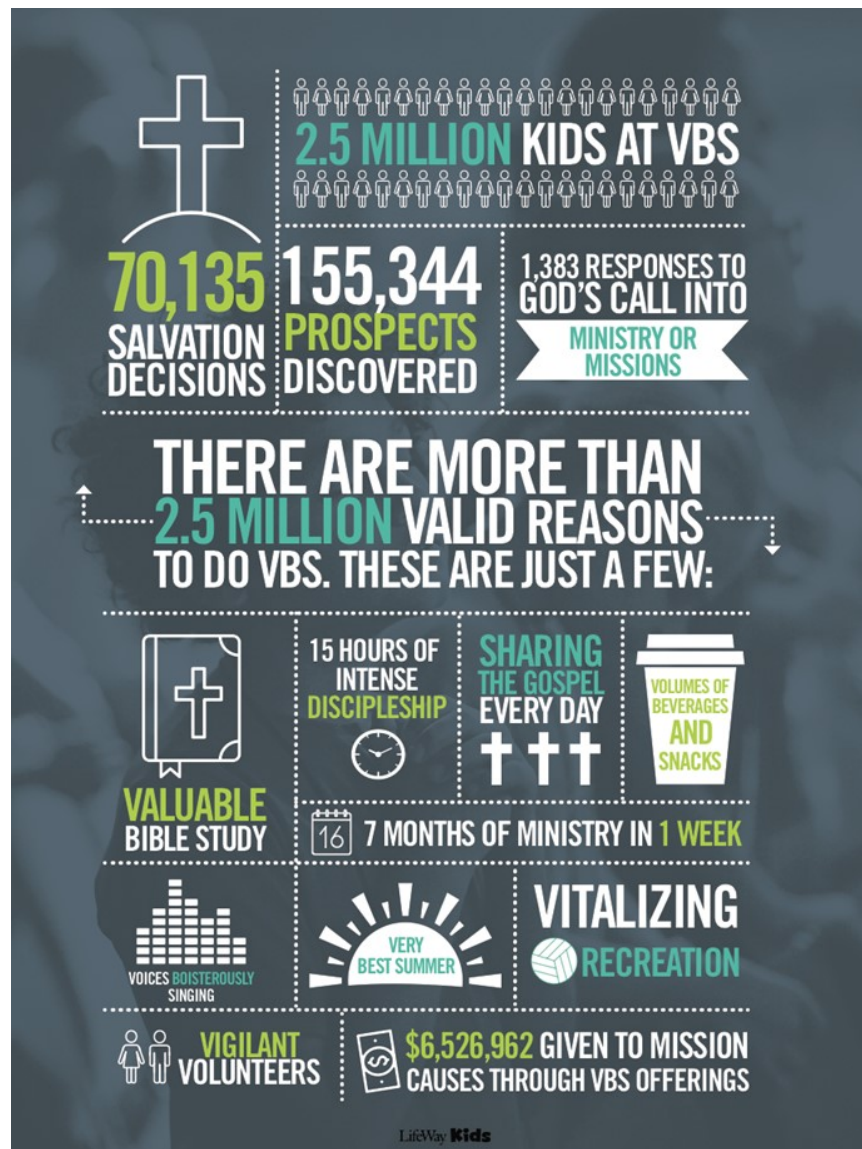

Jeff opened the meeting with a prayer at 7:00pm

Reviewed the minutes from the last meeting of April 10th, 2018. Motion made and seconded to approve the minutes as presented, motion carried.

Cindy presented the Treasurer's report. Motion made and seconded to approve the report as presented, motion carried.

Old Business:

- Update on Pastor's office renovation. Almost everything is complete now. The trim still needs installed, the door replaced on the closet, and a lateral file and couple remaining pieces of furniture still need purchased.
- The removal of the two pin oak trees has been delayed due to the low bid contractor having continual equipment problems and new bids need to be solicited and a different contractor selected. The timing on removal is still unknown until a new contractor is chosen and the removal cost is expected to increase.
- The handles on the old front entrance double door were reviewed again. Investigation of installing a new push bar that can stay locked the majority of the time but can be opened in the event of an emergency, will be investigated.

New Business:

- A list of projects needing completed was reviewed including filling the ruts and holes, and repairing the sod in the front and side yards at several locations, repairing and/cleaning gutters above the north sanctuary window, and protecting the new heat pump in the parking lot below the pastor's office. A weeknight work date on May 16th was set to meet and try to get as many of these projects completed as possible.
- A suggestion to asphalt the boulevard strip along the highway/parking lot entrance whenever the next parking lot maintenance project is planned was discussed. No action was taken on this suggestion at the present time as no asphalt maintenance is currently planned for 2018.
- Reviewed a couple of notes from the office from Lisa regarding the fire alarm panel that has been nuisance tripping and that the vendor has been out to check on it and indicates it seems ok at the moment, but may need a cleaning if it continues to nuisance alarm. Also, the main projector in the sanctuary is out of service and is going to need maintenance or replacement. Jeff indicated he would look into the options and costs, and have them ready to discuss with the group at the next work night on May 16th.
- Cindy mentioned that the church is scheduled to host the next Rivers & Lakes Presbytery meeting in 2020, and that we need to start identifying and scheduling projects that need completed prior to that date.
- Chris mentioned that there is an oak tree down on the edge of the Dunlap cemetery and is offered to anyone who wants to come out and cut it up for firewood.

Chris closed the meeting with a prayer at 7:43pm.

MISSION COMMITTEE

May 15, 2018

The Mission Committee met on May 15, 2018 at 6:30pm in the basement of the church. Those attending were Deb Wagamon, Nancy Engstrom, Paige Schmidt, and Todd Stegmiller, and Session Representative Mic Penry.

Mic was elected as moderator, and opened the meeting with prayer.

Liz Ryan from Pregnancy Resources was onsite to provide the team with an overview of the program. Pregnancy Resources provides a safe place for men/women to come and seek biblical answers to difficult questions. The program focuses on the needs of these women offering assistance for up to two years. This includes free pregnancy testing and ultrasounds, education, clothing & equipment, diapers, referrals for financial assistance, physicians, housing, etc., and loss support. Free programs include health classes, fatherhood coaching, bible study, and counseling. The program has three locations - a mobile medical van, an office in Moline, and one in Davenport.

There are many opportunities to support the initiatives of this program. There are multiple fund raising events throughout the year, opportunities to be a prayer partner, a monthly mission partner, support for educational programs, donations of needed supplies, and opportunities to be a program volunteer. The program also offers in school education for middle and high school classes called "No Regrets" which teaches the importance of abstinence.

As there are many support opportunities available, the team will take the time to prayerfully consider this program and discuss it at our meeting in June.

Old Business:

- Youth Hope - discussed our visit on 5/2/18. The team would like to schedule a second visit
- Christian Care - Todd contacted Christian Care and is still collecting information. He will setup a visit to determine the true needs of this organization.

New Business:

- Approved donations and/or support for this month:

 - Mission Aviation \$1000.00
- Ed McCallum - tabled until June meeting
- Discussed the needs of Tom & Phyllis Bassett; will check with Keith Wilson and address in June
- Minute for Mission - the committee determined this Sunday's presentation will cover our 5/2 visit to Youth Hope's MAD program. Deb will present.
- A special prayer request from Youth Hope was passed to all members.

The Committee closed the meeting in prayer for the success of all missions discussed. A special prayer was offered for Andrew Brunson.

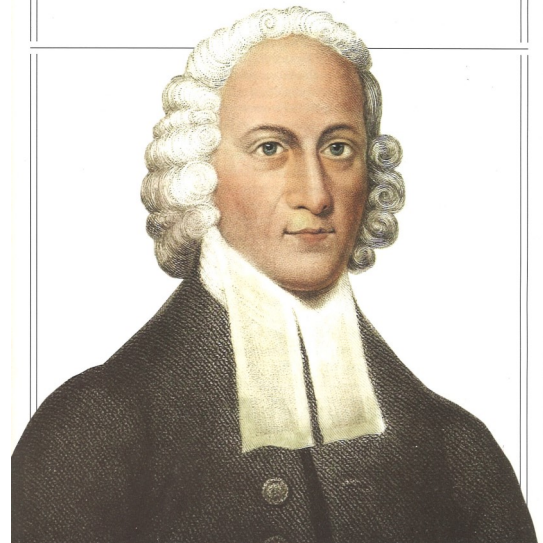

In order to understand and apply God's word, ask yourself the following questions as you read. Notice the acronym "MIRROR":

MAGNIFY - What does this text reveal about God that leads me to praise Him?

INSPIRE - How does this text lead me to pray?

REVEAL - What sin or disobedience does this text show me that I need to turn from?

RECOGNIZE - How does this text point to or anticipate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior?

OBEDIENCE - How does this text command my obedience to God's revealed will?

RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?

Click on that tab and you are taken to the Strong's Concordance link for each word in the verse.
