

The season of Advent gives us focused opportunity to dwell on the person of Jesus Christ. After all – Jesus Christ *is a person*. He is a man. That is the central truth of what we celebrate at Christmas – that the Son of God willingly condescended from heaven's throne to assume human flesh and become a human being. The infinite was contained within the finite, and the one who called the stars into existence by the word of His power, lay beneath them as a babe under the dark Bethlehem sky. Wonder of wonders – this is our Savior!

But a growing trend among evangelicals is, according to a recent poll done by Ligonier Ministries in conjunction with Lifeway Publishers, an unfamiliarity with our Savior. We simply don't believe, perhaps because we have never been properly taught, the most basic and ancient truths about Jesus. For example, even though 97% of evangelicals responded that they believe there is one true God in three persons: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, still an astounding 78% of evangelicals report believing that Jesus is the first and greatest being created by God. How is it that a person can profess faith in a Triune God, and at the same time assert that Jesus is a created being; and therefore not, in the words of the Nicene Creed (325 AD) be "true God of true God." It doesn't make sense.

Friends, we need to know our Savior. We need to know the truth about Him. We need to ask that famous question that hymn writer B.R. Hanby wrote about in 1866, "Who is He in yonder stall, at whose feet the shepherds fall?" Who is this Jesus? Hanbry's hymn includes the refrain, "'Tis the Lord! O wondrous story! 'Tis the Lord! the King of glory! At His feet we humbly fall, Crown Him! Crown Him, Lord of all!" Advent is a special time to do just that: crown Him once again, King and Lord of our hearts.

On the one hand, Christmas is simple. Jesus is God's Son come to earth to be our Savior. But, on the other hand Christmas is a glorious mystery that calls us to fall upon our knees in wonder and awe. We're going to do that as we study the human nature of Jesus in our sermon series "The Christ: His Human Nature, Body, Mind, Will, and Affections." There will be plenty of material here to help us all grow in our understanding of the person and work of the Lord Jesus.

As we look forward to growing in this truth, and celebrating the joys of Christmas, I want to encourage you to join us as we worship the Lord together. Whether on the Lord's Day, or during our special Lessons & Carols service (Dec. 9th – 5pm), or the beloved candlelit Christmas Eve service (10pm). What a joy it will be to worship our glorious Savior together.

Zach reported on his activities for October which included: Hospital visits, Home Visits, Office visits, Counseling, Youth Group, Rivers and Lakes Presbytery Ministry Council, Rivers and Lakes Presbytery Coordinating Council, Trustees meeting, Deacons meeting, Food Pantry, Budget meeting, Harvest party, and Missions meeting

Old Business:

• Discussed online giving and online sermon availability. Discussed the Harvest party and the Reformation worship service.

New Business:

- Reviewed the 2019 Draft Budget proposal. More work needs to be done.
- Discussed the Nominating Committee Report
- Lessons and Carols Service will be December 9th
- The 2018 Advent Sermon series will be on "The Christ" His human nature, body, mind, will and affections
- The next Membership class will be in the Spring of 2019

Pastor Zach opened the meeting with a prayer at 7:02pm.

Reviewed the minutes from the last meeting of September 11th, 2018. Motion made and seconded to approve the minutes as presented, motion carried.

Cindy presented the Treasurer's report. Motion made and seconded to approve the report as presented, motion carried.

Old Business:

- Two of the parking lot lights are flickering. Ken will try to arrange to bring a service truck home to reach them, as putting ladders up on the lights is not safe, and this work does not justify asking Bob to bring his JLG out to replace the bulbs in them again.
- Problems continue with the fire alarm dialer. A tech is scheduled for Friday (10/13) at 9am to come out to work on it again.
- Discussion continued on the "Director/Officer (D&O) liability insurance issue. The Session voted to add this insurance coverage to the church's policy to cover legal expenses brought about due to any legal action taken against any of the church's directors or officers while acting in an official capacity for the church. This coverage also includes committee members and volunteers. A motion was made, seconded and approved to add this additional insurance coverage.
- Bids to remove the two pin oaks were reviewed. Five bids were received by 3 trustees with the low bid of \$1,450 received from tree contractor Mike Coers. A motion was made and accepted to award the work to Mike Coers with a tentative completion date of Saturday, November 10th. The stump grinding will not occur on this date, but will occur at a later date, likely in the spring. A work day will be scheduled on November 10th for anyone who can assist in the project cleanup.

New Business:

- The group needs to check on the boiler and check and replace the HVAC filters again at the end of the meeting.
- The group briefly reviewed the proposed drywall project in the basement. Lisa has the month of January blocked off the calendar, so no events will be scheduled during that time frame to allow the paneling to be removed and new drywall installed.
- Zach mentioned that Mel & Scott's three year terms on the Trustee Board are up at the end of the year and will need replaced or their terms renewed if they elect to stay on the board.
- The Session has a budget meeting scheduled for Tuesday, October 16th, and will develop and approve the budget, with the Trustee Board reviewing it prior to presenting it to the congregation for review at the annual meeting.
- A suggestion was made to consider changing out the two thermostats in the front of the church to programmable units to allow for better summer cooling control.
- Zach reviewed the new online giving option that is available on the church's website now through the "Tithe.ly app whiteboard". The fees are less for the direct withdrawal bank option at 1.31% versus the credit card option which charges 3%.

Mel closed the meeting with a prayer at 7:52pm.

The Mission Committee met on October 23, 2018 at 6:30pm in the conference room. Those attending were Barb Freyermuth, Mary Ann Vroman, Nancy Engstrom, Paige Schmidt, Jim Cooksey, Todd Stegmiller and Pastor Zach Hopkins.

Barb opened the meeting with prayer.

Chat with Zach:

- Discussed our involvement with Christian Care; what our purposes could / should be and then to ensure alignment with our church's mission
- Discussed the Burdsall and Huber visit; learned more about purpose of the Huber's ministry and their alignment with World Outreach
- Discussed our mission committee supporting an adult mission trip for interested church members

Old Business:

- Minutes from September Meeting were approved with the following correction: change CEM to CEF and the amount donated from \$52.23 to \$100
- Christian Care continued further discussion regarding this mission and what our involvement could/should be. It was decided to have the Vogelsang's (Board members) and Steve Gottcent (Outreach director) to attend our next meeting to discuss our open questions, and ways that they would like to see us assist. From this conversation we could then determine a defined scope of what we would plan for the coming year.

New Business:

- The following payments were approved by the committee:
 - Hurricane Florence \$905 (congregation) + \$905 Mission Committee match
 - Burdsall's and Huber's \$907 (already paid)
- Winnie's Place: Nancy is in contact with new contact at organization. They want our involvement as before; however, she is still learning the ropes with Nancy's help. Nancy will provide an additional update at the next meeting regarding what we will do.
- Jim made us aware of a prolife ministry announced on American Family Radio which provided ultrasounds to at-risk women. Approximately \$30 contributed to providing one ultrasound. No decision was made at this time; however, it was tabled to discuss for next meeting noting that it would provide more contributions in the US as compared to local and international.
- Minutes for Mission:
 - It was decided not to do any in October.

Barb closed in prayer and the meeting was adjourned.

Our next meeting will be held on November 20, 2018 @ 6:30pm.



In order to understand and apply God's word, ask yourself the following questions as you read. Notice the acronym **"MIRROR"**:

MAGNIFY - What does this text reveal about God that leads me to praise Him? INSPIRE - How does this text lead me to pray? REVEAL - What sin or disobedience does this text show me that I need to turn from? RECOGNIZE - How does this text point to or anticipate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior? OBEDIENCE - How does this text command my obedience to God's revealed will? RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?

SCRIPTURE LINKS

Click on that tab and you are taken to the Strong's Concordance link for each word in the verse. I pray you are finding these links to be a helpful aid and resource in your study of God's Word.




A Jesus Christmas: Explore God's Amazing Plan for Christmas


