AMERICA'S STRIFE WITH GOD

Few issues have divided America as deeply or as emotionally as the matter of abortion; that much is clear thanks to the 2018 *State of Theology* survey sponsored by Ligonier Ministries, and conducted by Lifeway Research Group. According to that report, 52% of Americans agreed that abortion is a sin, compared to the 38% who disagreed. Compare those numbers over the past two years and it seems that this view of abortion as sinful is rising, as only 49% thought so in 2016. More than a meager 3% tip of the scales, these figures tell us, if they are accurate based of the sample-size of 3,000 diverse Americans, that more of our citizens understand the fundamental moral issue at stake in this matter: life has value.

This should come at no surprise to bible-believing Christians. Regular churchgoers who also profess faith in Christ and adherence to the bible as the Word of God say with 79% agreement that abortion is sin. While that is certainly a more significant majority that the representation in the wider culture; we have to wonder, why aren't 21% convinced?

The further we progress into the secular age, the more apparent it is becoming that there really is no moral neutral zone or grey space on this matter. Where the position used to be framed in the context of "Pro-Choice," there remains no doubt that the position on the basis of women's reproductive health and the matter of choice, was really just a poor disguise for the position of Pro-Abortion. Take for instance, the 38-24 vote of the New York State Senate on Tuesday, January 22nd that allows unborn babies to be aborted for basically any reason up to birth. This vote was received with raucous applause and the chants of "Free abortion / on demand / we can do it / yes we can." We have reached a time when those who are intellectually honest about their pro-abortion position are now willing to acknowledge, on the undeniable basis of science: *yes, this is a life in the womb, we just don't care.* The madness of the darkened and depraved mind is seemingly limitless.

Two thoughts immediately come to mind that I'd like to briefly reflect on. The first is one which I take no personal delight in, but find necessary to remind us about: there is an impending judgment and destruction that awaits evil of this magnitude. As the Lord said in Genesis as He evaluated the race of humanity fallen in sin, "my Spirit will not strive with man forever" (Gen 6:3). Though our God is patient and merciful, giving opportunity for those who turn from Him to come to repentance, there is coming a day of vengeance. Deuteronomy 32:35 reminds us, "vengeance is mine, and recompense." This is true because our God is *Yahweh-Ghmolah*, "The LORD of Recompense." Every instance of unrighteousness against the Creator by His rebellious creation stores up wrath for itself on the day of judgment. Oh, and that we would remember that we would receive it as well, apart from our Savior. Let us be humbled to tears.

Secondly, let us take up our God-given responsibility to aggressively promote the biblical teaching of the value and dignity of all people, especially the unborn, who are all created in God's image (Gen 1:27). Let our support be given to those ministries who are on the frontlines every day, not only for the protection of the unborn, but also for the support and equipping of mothers and fathers who bring their unborn children into the world even though they are scared, and for the help and healing of those who chose abortion at any time in their lives through the Bible study, *Forgiven and Free*. Let us pray for these ministries, especially our own mission partner: <u>Pregnancy Resources</u> in the Quad Cities who are doing incredible and life-saving work.

As the Church of Jesus Christ, we have an important witness to bear to the world that infinitely transcends matters of politics. Let us be strong in the Spirit's boldness to shine the light into the darkest corners of our culture. This matter may be among the darkest; but as the Bible says, "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (<u>In 1:5</u>). This darkness shall too be overcome one day.

A Global Alliance of Churches and Missionaries

Charles de Gaulle asked how one can govern a country that is founded on revolution. The constitution gives the right to the French people to demonstrate. maybe you have seen on the news the upheaval with the "Gilets Jaunes" (yellow vests). It is a grassroots movement, revolting, at first, against increasing gas taxes. For the last ten Saturdays in Paris and elsewhere around the country, hundreds of thousands of people took to the streets to express their discontent with President Emmanuel Macron and his government. For many weeks, the

their discontent with President Emmanuel Macron and his government. For many weeks, the Champs-Elysées looked like a war zone......The important Christmas sales, for many stores, was nonexistent because of the destruction and because of people's fear to venture out.

There has been local manifestations in Montargis, but they are usually less violent. One problem with this grassroots movement is that it is unorganized, and so it cannot present its demands to the government in a coherent way. So finally, President Macron started holding town hall meetings with the city and town mayors to hear the petitions of the people. Only time will tell what these meetings will accomplish. France needs the gospel!

From January 7-13, the Montargis church held a second week of prayer focus. The first was in September. Each night and in the homes of our people, we confessed our sins and our weaknesses. Then, we praised the Lord for His blessings and for past answers to prayer. After that, we sought the Lord for current needs and problems. We asked in particular for God's vision and for patience as we wait for Him to move in our stagnated building project.

For the past few months Tom has been leading two of our youth, Naisha and Clément, in biblical training to prepare them for baptism. They are also preparing for senior year final exams. In France, this is called the "Bac" and passing it is necessary to be able to enter college. Please pray for Naisha and Clément.

We are grateful for your partnership as we watch the Word of God transform lives for His glory,



To encourage your personal study of God's word, and prepare for each Lord's Day message, please consider reading in advance to familiarize yourself with the sermon texts.



For the month of February be reading and studying Genesis 12 - 17.

In order to understand and apply God's word, ask yourself the following questions as you read. Notice the acronym "MIRROR":

MAGNIFY - What does this text reveal about God that leads me to praise Him?

INSPIRE - How does this text lead me to pray?

REVEAL - What sin or disobedience does this text show me that I need to turn from?

RECOGNIZE - How does this text point to or anticipate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior?

OBEDIENCE - How does this text command my obedience to God's revealed will?

RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?


SCRIPTURE LINKS
