Edgington EPC "To Glorify God & Enjoy Him Forever"

I have heard more than several people say recently, "Easter is about as late as it can be on the calendar this year." Of course, that's true, but, more than a point of chronological significance, I have been reflecting on the fact that we have *needed Easter to come*. It was a long winter. And we suffered through dark and cold days. We have needed the dayspring of a new season, and a refreshment for our hope in the midst of a fallen world. Hence the promise, Christ is risen – and we are called to rejoice and celebrate. Dear friends, Easter is indeed coming!

But a proper celebration of the Easter season is not complete without first stepping back into the darkness and hopelessness of winter. Metaphorically speaking, Good Friday has something to say to us about this. We who have suffered long under the winter of our sins, would do well to reflect upon the suffering of our Lord, who went to the cross on our behalf. There we must ponder the wonders of His redeeming love.

As I have been doing that, I remember the words of the Reformer John Calvin who reflects so deeply upon this great truth, which I'd like to share with you all. Calvin writes: "For since only weakness appears in the cross, death, and burial of Christ, faith must leap over all these things to attain its full strength. We have in His death the complete fulfillment of salvation, for through it we are reconciled to God, His righteous judgment is satisfied, the curse is removed, and the penalty paid in full." In other words, the weakness and suffering of the cross is the pathway to joy! What makes the light glorious, is that we have known the darkness. Easter is sweeter because Good Friday is a reality. Let us not turn away from that. So please, join us for our Good Friday worship service on April 19th at 7pm. Your celebration of the resurrection will be more full of joy because you have lingered at the foot of the cross where Jesus died to set you free.

Then, come again on Easter morning, April 21st at 9am to worship the Risen King! Jesus did not remain in the tomb, and our hopes are not frozen in winter. The Spring warmth brings with it the promise of resurrection. As Calvin continues, "For as He in rising again, came forth victor over death, so the victory of our faith over death lies in His resurrection alone. Paul better expresses its nature: 'He was put to death for our sins, and raised for our justification' [Rom. 4:25]. This is as if he had said: 'Sin was taken away by His death; righteousness was revived and restored by His resurrection.' For how could He by dying have freed us from death if He had himself succumbed to death? How could He have acquired victory for us if He had failed in the struggle? Therefore, we divide the substance of our salvation between Christ's death and resurrection as follows: through His death, sin was wiped out and death extinguished; through His resurrection, righteousness was restored and life raised up, so that-thanks to His resurrection – His death manifested its power and efficacy in us." (John Calvin, Institutes of the Christian Religion, II.xvi.13)

Good Friday matters deeply. Easter Sunday matters deeply as well. Will you come and join us as we worship? Even more, will you bring your family, friends, and neighbors with you to hear the name of Jesus lifted high? I hope you will. And I look forward to that time that we will share as a family of God. May He bless you, in the waiting, and in the fulfillment.



OBEDIENCE - How does this text command my obedience to God's revealed will?

RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?
