SINNERS AT THE SUPPER

It is the apostolic command, tradition of the Reformed faith, and practice of this church to do what is called "fencing the table" during the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. The Apostle Paul writes, "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a person examine himself…" (1 Cor 11:27-28). These words should weigh heavily upon the hearts and minds of all those who bring themselves before the sacrament. They direct us to do the hard work of examination as we consider our struggles with sin, the tiresome warfare with our fallen flesh, and the many assaults of the enemy of our soul. Still, we must examine ourselves.

But when we faithfully do that, inevitably we will come to this point of question – what if I am unworthy? The table is fenced, and, in that moment, it may rest heavily upon our conscience that this is not a table for me. But if we are in Christ and continuing in Christ by faith and repentance, we need to be assured that, though I am a sinner, sinners are welcomed at the supper. For it is sinners that Jesus has come to save, as He said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick" (Mt 9:12). Let it be clear that when the table is fenced, it is fenced from those who are unbelieving and unrepentant – it is not fenced from the Christian who is clinging to Christ as He is offered in the Gospel.

Still we have lingering doubts and fears. What if I continue to sin against God's mercy? What if my obedience is neglectful and poor? What if my faith is weak? What if I have doubts? Am I still called to come to the Supper? In Christ, the answer is always – yes; and the invitation is always – come.

Here are some reflections from church history to encourage us in this reality.

- Martin Luther said, "See your sins upon Christ, and then they are no more yours, but His." When we believe that, our sins will humble us, but they will not discourage us from coming to Christ. He has born our griefs and carried our sorrows, the prophet Isaiah says, so we must no longer carry them as our own burden (Is 53:4). In Jesus Christ, you are set free from the guilt of your sin.
- John Calvin writes, in reflection with those who though believing, feel unworthy in themselves to come to the supper. "This is the worthiness the best and only kind we can bring to God to offer our vileness and our unworthiness to Him so that in His mercy we may be taken as worthy; to despair in ourselves so that we may be lifted up by Him; to accuse ourselves so that we may be justified by Him" (Calvin, *Institutes of the Christian Religion*, 4.17.42).

To the struggling Christian ridden with guilt and fear that they have sinned themselves out of God's grace – remember – that there is more grace in Jesus Christ than there is sin in us. Our abiding and indwelling sin is what qualifies us, not to flee from the supper, but to sit down with Jesus at that covenant meal and hear Him say to you, "behold My body and blood, broken and shed for you and for your sins." It is with that word of assurance that our guilt-ridden souls might be refreshed by His grace and encouraged to rise from the table with the confidence that we are the children of God who are forgiven and loved. How I love to sit at that table alongside of all of you, dear church, and most of all, with our Savior.







OBEDIENCE - How does this text command my

obedience to God's revealed will?

RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?
