# MISSION COMMITTEE

June18, 2019

The Mission Committee met on June 18, 2019 at 6:30pm in the 1st Floor Conference Room of the church. Those attending were Deb Wagamon, Nancy Engstrom, and Paige Schmidt.

Deb opened the meeting with prayer.

#### **Old Business:**

- **Minutes from the April 2019 meeting:** Approved by the committee
- **Review of any Newsletters and Mission Information:** The committee reviewed newsletters from Youth Hope, Caminul Felix, Churches United, Shiloh Christian Children's Ranch, along with a Thank you note, from the Huber family for our continued support
- Winnie's Place: A bid was accepted for \$40,000 to replace 6 air conditioners, 6 furnaces and 6 water heaters. Todd reviewed the bid and agreed this was a reasonable quote for the special sized units. Winnie's Place is now looking for funding assistance. The committee decided to table this discussion until the July meeting. We agreed to hold a short meeting with the rest of the committee after church on Sunday, June 23rd to discuss when we can make an announcement to the congregation concerning donations to this ministry. We are currently collecting donations for Pregnancy Resources and want to ensure this is completed before we address Winnie's Place concerns.
- Mission Brainstorming: Due to small attendance at this meeting we decided to table the
  discussion concerning how we can provide more outreach to our own community focusing on
  those who are unchurched. We will address this at the July meeting, and hope to generate ideas
  for additional outreach, build consensus around key directions, and determine next steps for the
  committee.

# **New Business:**

- Additional Gifts of Time or Monetary Funding for Missions: Discussions concerning additional funding for supported ministries were tabled until the July meeting
- **Minute for Mission:** Trisha Wilson, from Pregnancy Resources will be speaking to the EEPC congregation on June 23<sup>rd</sup> for the Minute to Mission. This will cover the Baby Bottle Campaign currently underway, as well as the success of their many ministries in the Quad City area.
- Claire Yerkey: Paige brought this young girl to the committee's attention. Navigators are a ministry that shares the gospel of Jesus, through discipleship. Consisting of a broad family of missionaries, supporters, and volunteers; they reach out through college campuses, Int'l Mission trips, Military, Community Churches, or anywhere they can share the Word of God. Claire will be participating in a mission trip to Puerto Rico, and may be looking for funding assistance. Paige will investigate further and report back to the committee in July.
- Mission Brainstorming: We would like to add an item to our current "Ideas to Date"; bringing back Evening Adult Bible Study

Deb closed in prayer for the success of all the missions we support.

# **CHILD STORY**

My name is Maria Marincas and I am 17 years old. I was born into a large family, along with all my siblings. In time, my parents became hard drinkers, which affected our whole family. The little money that they made by working for people in our village they would spend on alcohol and cigarettes. We lacked a lot of things that a child needs, such as: food, clothes, school supplies, toys. The most painful thing however, was the lock of our mother's love, as well as the lack of our father's care and protection, since their minds were often darkened by alcohol.



Because the abuses and neglect did not stop, when I was seven, three of my siblings and I were taken away from our family by the Child Protective Services and taken to a government placement center. We stayed there for three months and after that we were taken by a set of parents and brought to Caminul Felix.

Caminul Felix, through my new parents, has given my parental love, education and many other things that every child needs. Now I have someone to call Mom and Dad, I have parents who love me and do their best to understand me and give me advice to help me in life.

In August 2015 I went to a Christian camp. There I received an answer to many of the questions I had, so, I decide to make a change in my life: I accepted the Lord Jesus into my life. Even though I did not have the opportunity to grow up in my natural family, I understood that God loved me very much and has great and beautiful plans for my life. And even if there might be times when I don't understand His plans, I will always remember His words, "'For I know the plans I have for you' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'"

Currently I attend a vocational school, majoring in Culinary Arts. I dream to work in this field and with God's help to become very good in what I do. I am thankful and grateful to God for my life.

I also want to thank all of you who are involved in this ministry, especially those who have supported me and have been there for me when I needed it. May God bless and reward you!



**RESPOND** - How must I respond in faith to this passage?





# 2019 VBS WRAP-UP



By the time you read this article VBS will be over for another year, but as I write this we are still in the midst of the week. While we have made it through hump day, I am not breathing a sigh of relief just yet. It seems like each day has brought its own unique challenges, such as:

- 1. A problem with the pool pump, and not being sure we would be able to use the pool
- 2. Raccoons getting into the Dining Hall and wreaking havoc
- 3. Work on Andalusia School's parking lot that required us to change the pick-up/drop-off location three days before camp started
- 4. A road closure on one bus route that we found out about Monday morning
- 5. Health concerns that kept key leaders from being there as much as they wanted

It was very appropriate that one of our Bible points was, "When life is unfair, God is good." We were reminded of that throughout the week as problems kept popping up.

Another Bible point this year was, "When life is good, God is good." That point was also driven home numerous times throughout the week. A few of the blessing we witnessed were:

- 1. A week of sunshine and mid 80 degree temps after a week of sweltering heat and humidity
- 2. Children and parents/grandparents enjoying the great outdoors, having fun together, and bonding
- 3. People from all different ages and walks of life, different towns, and different churches working together to make this camp a reality for the youth of our area, and, working together when things didn't go as planned to quickly switch to "Plan B"
- 4. Approximately 80 high school/college age youth volunteering their time to shepherd the younger children, while at the same time, learning responsibility, discipline, and getting a peek at how tough it is to be a parent
- 5. Kids learning that its not just about them and the joy that can be felt in serving others; whether cleaning up brush or assisting under-privileged kids
- 6. Kids making new friends and developing lasting relationships
- 7. Kids learning to look for God's presence in the everyday happenings around them, and trusting God to be there beside them each moment of each day

The week of VBS is always exhausting for everyone, from the young preschooler to the 85 year old volunteer, but at the same time very rewarding for the lessons that God has taught each one who opens his heart to receive the **GOOD NEWS** of His love and care. There were a lot of preparations and the week flew by quickly, but our prayer is always that life altering changes took place in the hearts of all involved.
