

Reviewed the minutes from the April 2019 meeting. Motion made and seconded to approve the minutes as presented, motion carried.

Cindy presented the Treasurer's reports for April. Motion made and seconded to approve the report as presented, motion carried.

Old Business:

- Tree stumps will be removed this week.
- Discussed the installation of a curtain at the north side of the basement lounge. It seems the major reason for this is to provide an airconditioned space for dressing during weddings. Trustees decided the money would be better spent on two portable air conditioners that could be used in the Sunday School rooms. Two more units will be purchased similar to the one bought last year
- It was reported that all 33 of the cushioned chairs in the sanctuary have been reupholstered.

New Business:

- Discussed the possibility of obtaining drone photos of the roof areas to determine if there are
 possible leak locations. Mel indicated he knows someone who can do this for us. We also will
 check to see if our insurance carrier offers this service.
- There continues to be a leak issue at the east end of the sanctuary. It appears the leak is at the intersection of the east wall and the lower roof. The wood shingle siding in this area is failing. Trustees will investigate installing new siding for the entire east face of the church.
- Gutters need to be checked and cleaned.
- A/C unit filters were checked
- One of the dimmer switches for the sanctuary lighting is broken. A new switch has been ordered and will be installed.
- Several light bulbs need to be replaced in the sanctuary.
- Chris reported on some concerns he received from the owner of the property leading to the Dunlop Cemetery. It appears these issues are being caused by campers coming from Hidden Lake. Trustees agreed this is not a concern for the church.

Mel closed the meeting with a prayer at 7:48pm.

MISSION COMMITTEE

The Mission Committee met on April 16, 2019 at 6:30pm in the basement of the church. Those attending were Barb Freyermuth, Deb Wagamon, Mary Ann Vroman, Nancy Engstrom, Paige Schmidt, Todd Stegmiller, and Pastor Zach Hopkins.

Barb opened the meeting with prayer.

Old Business:

- Minutes from the March 2019 meeting: approved by the committee
- Caminul Felix Bob Winter met with the committee to bring us more information about the Caminul Felix mission in Romania. This mission began as a dairy farm to support the Felix town orphanage. Bob shared a video outlining the startup of the mission and how it has spread to additional missions in the area in the last 20 years. There are now multiple orphanage programs, work training for the children and teens, jobs, Nobel House where visitors can stay while visiting or working for the mission, and a teen complex where young people can stay while transitioning from school to the working class. This mission has also built many homes for local families in partnership with Habitat for Humanity. There is also a choir that travels to the U.S. performing and raising funds for Felix Action, and a child sponsorship program that allows individuals to help support the children through letters, prayers, and funding.
- Burdsall Mission: they have received 89.5% of their funding
- Andrew Brunson Update EPC no longer has an active link for this funding mission; the need has been fulfilled
- Church Planting in Chicago Zach gave us an update on this mission: Jeff Lancaster, the creator of this mission, is still in Memphis trying to get everything completed for the move to Chicago. He states funding is moving along as expected. Jeff will be speaking at Edgington EPC July 21, 2019. The Mission Committee is making plans to meet with Jeff so we may better understand the needs of this mission
- **Pregnancy Resources and Youth Hope Banquets:** Several representatives from Edgington EPC attended these banquets. They were very successful in raising funds to support their endeavors in 2019 and brought insight and awareness to all concerning the success of their local mission efforts
- **Camp Summit Furnace:** a check was sent in the amount of \$500 as approved by the mission committee
- Winnie's Place: Todd scheduled a meeting to discuss the furnace project; however the meeting had to be postponed and will be rescheduled. Nancy requested Betsy create a list of smaller projects that needed to be accomplished so we could provide a team to assist with these tasks
- **Christian Care:** No Updates
- **Saul and Jesse Huber:** reached 100% of pledged support. They still need \$92 in monthly support to be fully funded as one pledge remains unfulfilled





OBEDIENCE - How does this text command my obedience to God's revealed will?

RESPOND - How must I respond in faith to this passage?

WATCHMEN TEAM FORMING


