

WHERE'D EVERYBODY GO?

The Barna Group has always had an interest in the religious trends of American citizens. Unfortunately, plenty of data is looking, not at the strengthening influence of the church, but rather the waning influence of the church in the face of rising secularization. The effects of secularization in America are demonstrated by citizens reporting trends like increasing reluctance to engage in spiritual conversations, aversion to evangelism, and the erosion of religious belief and practice. After collecting the data, Barna was able to target the most post-Christian populations across the country. In 2017, the Quad Cities ranked #50 on that list. In the short span of only two years, the same polling indicated a meteoric decrease that listed the Quad Cities at #15. The simple conclusion is that secularism is on the rise and Christianity is on a rapid decline, even (maybe we should say *especially*) in our immediate geographic context.

While this information is certainly troubling, the division between Christian and non-Christian practices is not as surprising as the trend of behaviors among those who still identify as Christian believers. Consider the matter of basic church attendance. What would you think the rate of attendance of the average church member is in America? Fifteen years ago, 40% of church members attended 4x/month. Today the percentage of people who attend at that same rate is *only* 10%. The overall picture is a 37% decline in worship attendance across 15 years. That means, in under two decades, even if a church's membership numbers stay the same, if you were to look out into the pews on any given Sunday, it would look like the church has lost over a third of its members.

To be honest, I'm not sure if that statistic perfectly represents us here at Edgington, but does it represent us in some ways – of course it does. I admit that I have thought, 'if everyone who worships here during the year were to come on the same Sunday, the sanctuary wouldn't be big enough to fit everyone.' The point of that pondering is not the size of the congregation as the goal, but rather the rumination that wishes we could undo the national trends that show Christians are gathering for public worship on the Lord's Day less often rather that more frequently. Are we busier? Sure. But, we make time for the things that matter to us. Even though some may think regular participation is no longer realistic or reasonable, it's more likely that we've simply decided that we'll attend only to the degree that we feel we need to for our own sake.

The reason why I am reflecting on all of this is because I want to encourage you and your family to continue making the Lord's Day a part of your weekly routine. If we make church attendance optional, we are communicating that genuinely held and sincerely practiced Christian faith is also optional. But, if we claim the name of Jesus – it is not. God's Word calls us to not forsake the gathering of the saints (Heb 10:25). That's because the Church does not fundamentally exist to meet your needs as if it is founded on an essentially consumeristic mission focused on you. Quite the opposite, the Church helps to locate you within a reality that you are a part of, but that is not focused on you and your needs. This true vision of the church goes beyond a therapeutic model of personal fulfillment to an outward focused vision that fixes our eyes upon Jesus and His worth, that calls forth our willing obedience. That means faithful church participation is not about you and what you get out of it, so much as it is about honoring the Lord, strengthening His Church, and encouraging your fellow Christians. Isn't that more compelling then attending because you have to? I certainly think so.

I'm excited about several of the events and classes that are scheduled for this fall to help you and your family grow in Christian discipleship. Please make note of them throughout this edition of the newsletter and make every effort to faithfully participate in our shared ministry as we seek to *Glorify God & Enjoy Him Forever* together as a Church Family.





The week of July 8-13, we spent in Hamtramck, Michigan partnering with one of our local EPC missionaries there to help lead a youth mission trip. PER MEMBER ASKING


What is it? Per Member Asking (PMA) is the support each congregation is requested to contribute to our local Presbytery and General Assembly. The PMA funds the operations of the Rivers and Lakes Presbytery and General Assembly, including the Office of the Stated Clerk, National Outreach, Student and College Ministries, Women's Ministries, World Outreach, as well as day to day office expenses.

Denominational leaders continue to assure us that all financial support will be used to glorify God and advance His Kingdom.

The total PMA for each confirmed member is \$40 (\$17 for the Presbytery, \$23 to the General Assembly). Each year, Edgington EPC pays our total allocation in September based on the number of active members (201). We ask that members please contribute their portion in order to eliminate the expense from our budget. PMA can be contributed at any time throughout the year.




Where do we come from? | What is our purpose? What is right? | Where are we headed?

Starting in October, we'll climb up the mountain with Jesus to sit at His feet and be taught what it means to live as citizens of His glorious Kingdom.






How do you view the world?
















PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN




CALLING ALL PARENTS AND GRANDPARENTS!
