

"TO GLORIFY GOD, & ENJOY HIM FOREVER"

As we move closer toward the end of the year I want to encourage you to remember that October is not a month without a significant Christian holiday: October 31st! Unfortunately, for most people this is known only as Halloween, but of infinitely more importance is the annual celebration of the Protestant Reformation. October 31st is Reformation Day! This year we celebrate the 502nd anniversary of one of the most iconic moments in all of Church History: on October 31st, 1517, Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the church in Wittengerg, Germany to call into question some of the practices of the Roman Church. Although it wasn't his original intention, Luther's actions sparked a regional and eventually a worldwide Reformation of the Church that gave birth to the Protestant Church, and of particular note our own Reformed tradition.

It was Cicero, the philosopher from classical antiquity, who said; "to be ignorant of what occurred before you were born is to remain always a child." In the same way, as we find ourselves in the stream of history launched by this momentous period of time, it is continually important to remind ourselves of why these events of Church History matter to us in the 21st century, and the answer is the Gospel itself.

The Gospel was, and continues to be the chief issue in the Protestant Reformation, along with the critically associated issue of authority and where we derive our understanding of that precious Gospel. The points of the Reformation can be summarized with the traditional *Five Solas*. That Scripture Alone (Sola Scriptura) is the ultimate authority in the Church, and that sinners are saved by grace alone (Sola Gratia), which is received through faith alone (Sola Fide), which is placed in Jesus Christ alone (Solus Christus) all to the praise and glory of God alone (Soli Deo Gloria).

It's important to remember that the Reformation isn't over! It is a daily reality for us as Christian believes to turn from our self-righteousness and trust in the free

grace of Christ offered to us in the Gospel. In that sense, the Reformation continues everyday in our lives. But it also needs to continue among our churches. Let me encourage you about two opportunities in addition to our regular ministries and worship services:

- Starting on October 9th and running for seven weeks, we'll be using the curriculum "Christianity Explored" in order to establish and maintain a more solid grasp of our understanding of the Gospel. This will be a great study for everyone, no matter your level of knowledge or confidence with the Bible.
- Our annual Reformation Worship Service will be hosted at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Aledo on Sunday, October 27th at 5pm. Join us as we worship with other Reformed Churches from around the Quad Cities!

I'm thankful for the history of the Church of Jesus Christ, and the history of our church here in Edgington. Each and every one of you is an important part of that. What a wonderful thing it is to be a Christian and to be gathered together into the Church. God bless you all.

 this project until the septic tank issue is resolved. Siding work likely will not begin until next spring.
- Have approved a bid to repair some roof tile on the sanctuary and caulk around the exterior of the stained glass windows.
- A water meter has been installed to measure the water usage at the church. This info will assist in the sizing of the septic system.

New Business:

- Motion made and seconded to approve payment of the per member asking. Motion carried.
- Trustees will develop a list of upcoming projects with budget costs. Will consider asking congregation to assist with funding some of the projects.

Zach closed the meeting with a prayer at 8:05pm.

The Mission Committee met on August 20, 2019 at 6:30pm in the 1st Floor Conference Room of the church. Those attending were Deb Wagamon, Jim Cooksey, Lisa Nelson, Mary Ann Vroman, Nancy Engstrom, Paige Schmidt and Todd Stegmiller.

Deb opened the meeting with prayer.

Old Business:

- Minutes from the July 2019 meeting: reviewed and approved by the committee
- Review of any Newsletters and Mission Information: Mailings / information received during the month were reviewed by the committee. We noted Youth Hope will be sponsoring a Fundraiser at Texas Roadhouse on Tuesday, September 17 from 4 8pm. This will be announced to the congregation
- Youth Hope: a donation of \$1000 to Youth Hope for 5 campers, was approved after the close of the last meeting
- Christian Care: There were no updates at this time. We are tabling discussion until next meeting
- Chicago Church Planting project: a few members of the committee were able to meet with Rev. Lancaster after church services on July 21 to discuss how the mission was progressing and where support was needed. These members shared the details of that meeting and a discussion ensued concerning the original plan, where they are today and how EEPC could support this local mission. There were a few questions generated from this discussion so the committee determined we would review the Church Planting plan again and pray for this mission seeking guidance. In this manner, we will be better prepared to discuss our level of support at the August meeting.

New Business:

- **Approved Donations:** The committee approved a \$1000 donation to the Andalusia Ambulance service. Mary Ann Vroman will deliver the donation
- **Mission Brainstorming:** A long discussion was held concerning our list of generated ideas for local ministry. We were able to isolate one program and assign data collection to team members so we could report back at the September meeting. Additional suggestions were added to our list of possible areas where we might share the love of Christ. These will be developed and reviewed for viability. We are praying we can isolate our focus on one particular program by the September meeting.
- **Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF):** The program is just starting up for this year. They report no supplies are needed at this time.
- **Minute for Mission:** Sunday, August 25th, the Minute for Mission focus will be Youth Hope. Deb will offer an update on the Youth Hope ministry efforts in our area.

Paige closed in prayer for the continued focus and spiritual guidance of our Mission committee.

Our next meeting will be held on September 17, 2019 @ 6:30pm.

REV. DR. STEVE WOODWORTH UPDATE

Sierra Leone

I have just returned from a full week of teaching and ministry in the beautiful country of Sierra Leone. Although we have been ministering in the country for several years, this August marked the beginning of a new endeavor for ITEN. For the past six months we have been discussing the possibility of a full redevelopment of our program with our national partners. This August we launched the first part of a multi-year strategy to train the 20 most promising students to take the lessons they are learning back to their home villages. The new program is still very early in the development stage, but our first trial last month went very well and gives us great hope about the future of RBI (Reformed Bible Institute).



While I was teaching Spiritual Formation alongside our national leaders, Bill Massaquoi (a national leader from Liberia) lead our students through a survey of the Old Testament. Despite the heavy rains of the monsoon season, sporadic power outages, and very limited technology, the ministry leaders continue to impress us with their zeal for learning and their passion to see the Gospel transform their country. I will be heading back for another round of courses in early January.

The adventure (aka, Nightmare) started early morning July 9th. I decided to wake early and make haste to turn in the moving trucks we'd rented. To be somewhat compassionate with me regarding the following report, please remember these key nuggets of information: One, I was VERY excited at the time. Two, I had driven





very little in Chicago. Three, Chicago has LOTS of bridges. Four, I haven't driven big moving rental trucks in a while and wasn't on my game regarding the level of clearance needed for these trucks. 



FALL SERMON SERIES
















FALL COAT DRIVE




All women of the church are welcome! We usually meet on the first Thursday of every month for Bible study (often led by Pastor Zach) and association business.
