

Dear Church Family,

There is a very special book that never sits on a bookshelf in my office because it gets far too much regular use; it's always on my desk. That book is the Book of Common Order of the Church of Scotland. It is a treasured resource for me, not just because of its historic significance in the tradition of Presbyterianism, but also because I was able to bring the book home from its country of origin.

If you caught me in my study an hour before Sunday School begins you would be able to join me in one of the vestry prayers – that is, prayers by and for the minister in preparation for leading the worship service. They go something like this: O LORD my God, without whom I can do nothing as I ought; go with me, I beseech Thee, into Thy House, and so guide me by Thy Holy Spirit that I may devoutly lead the worship of Thy people, worthily proclaim Thy Gospel, and shew forth Thy truth and grace to all who wait upon Thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

If you were to find our choir assembled about three minutes before the morning service, you would hear us praying from the Choir Prayers – which is exactly what is sounds. In them we pray: O God, who hast given us minds to know Thee, hearts to love Thee, and voices to show forth Thy praise; give us grace, we beseech Thee, to dedicate ourselves freely to Thy service, that we may reverently fulfill the worship of Thy sanctuary, and beautify the praise of Thy House; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The reason why I bring this resource to your attention is, first of all, to let you know that I need help praying – and it certainly helps me. Another reason is to share some of the prayers that I regularly use on the Lord's Day. Further, I want to offer encouragement to your family during this season of Thanksgiving, to offer heartfelt prayer to our Lord who graciously gives us all good things. Maybe this prayer of thanksgiving from the Book of Common Order will help you express your heart of gratitude to our Triune God:

Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, the fountain of all goodness, who openest Thine hand and satisfies the desire of every living thing; we give Thee thanks and praise that in Thy mercy Thou hast brought us through the circuit of another season, and that, according to Thy promise, seed time and harvest have not ceased. We bless Thee that Thou hast crowned the year with Thy goodness, and hast bestowed upon us the kindly fruits of the earth. We pray Thee to grant us grace that we may receive them thankfully and use them carefully, for our own comfort, for the relief of those that are needy, and for the glory of Thy name. Teach us to remember that it is not by bread alone that man doth live, and grant us evermore to feed on Him who is the true bread from heaven, even Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

May God bless you and your family as we join in the chorus of Thanksgiving to our Great God and Redeemer.

The Mission Committee met on September 17, 2019 at 6:30pm in the 1st Floor Conference Room of the church. Those attending were Barb Freyermuth, Deb Wagamon, Mary Ann Vroman, and Nancy Engstrom.

Barb opened the meeting with prayer.

Old Business:

- Approve August Minutes: A change was made to the 3rd bullet under New Business. Item now reads:
 "CFS just started up and requires no supplies at this time". Change made, minutes approved, and sent to Lisa Bowman for inclusion in the newsletter.
- Review of any Newsletters and Mission Information: Mailings / information received during the month were reviewed by the committee. Special attention to Mission Aviation Fund we would like to discuss a donation before end of year. Andalusia Ambulance sent a thank you letter. We reviewed a letter from the Huber's, and noted Phyllis and Tom, from Team Care, are retiring.
- Pregnancy Resources Walk for Life: There was a good representation from Edgington EPC and Buffalo Prairie EPC churches at the Bettendorf location. The event was a success and everyone had a good time.

New Business:

- Dorian Hurricane Relief: There was a long discussion concerning the devastation, loss of life, and need
 for assistance. We voted to send \$3,000.00 at this time to meet the needs in this area. The committee
 also voted to match any donations from the congregation. To this monetary support, we will be
 adding our prayers for all those whose lives have been affected by the destructive effects of this
 hurricane.
- Chicago Church Planting Project: The committee discussed the needs of this local ministry and voted to give a one-time donation of \$1,500.00 to support their needs at this time. We will discuss our 2020 support in future meetings.
- Buddy Bags: This is a new ministry we are prayerfully considering for EEPC in 2020. We have more data to gather and issues to discuss as a committee before we will be able to present this to the Session for consideration. We have determined next steps and will be gathering more information prior to our meeting in October.
- Winnie's Place: Nancy updated us on the status of their projects. All the hot water heaters have been installed. They will now be looking to move forward on the furnace/air conditioner project. We decided we would table the discussion of donations, until we have a chance to review our current commitments. We will prayerfully consider this at a future meeting.
- Minute for Mission: Sunday, September 22nd, the Minute for Mission focus will be the Dorian Hurricane Relief project. Barb will share the status of the relief work in this area, the continued need, and EEPC's support efforts.

Barb closed in prayer for the continued success of all the ministries we support and monitor. To God be the Glory!



FALL SERMON SERIES




Often called "the greatest sermon ever preached," the Sermon on the Mount is found across three chapters in Matthew's gospel account. All women of the church are welcome! We usually meet on the first Thursday of every month for Bible study (often led by Pastor Zach) and association business.


