



With the turn of the calendar, 2020 will bring a very exciting opportunity for our congregation. At the end of January, about 120 Pastors, Ruling Elders, and Visitors from around the Midwest will be joining us in Edgington for the 28th Stated Meeting of the Rivers & Lakes Presbytery of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. We will have the opportunity to be gracious hosts to our brothers and sisters in Christ as we welcome them to our hometown. Many of you might remember when we last hosted Presbytery in 2016. Well, the time has come again to open our doors and give our hands in service. To help us prepare for that, there is some important information that we all need to know.

First, what is a presbytery? A presbytery is the regional level of church government in Presbyterianism. It is a larger group, made up of Pastors (Teaching Elders) and Ruling Elders within a specific geographical boundary. Our presbytery, Rivers & Lakes, is one of 14 different presbyteries in our denomination, made up from churches in Illinois, Iowa, Wisconsin, and Minnesota. Altogether, there are more than 30 churches in our presbytery, with each Church sending their Pastors and several Elders to represent their churches at the meeting. The presbytery meets three times a year (Jan, April, Sept), and different churches in the presbytery take turns hosting the meetings, so we get to visit our various churches, get a sense of their community, and enjoy their hospitality.

The next thing to know is that, even if you're not a voting Elder delegate to this meeting, as a congregation member, you are welcome to be involved! First, please join me in praying for safe travels for all of our visitors and for the blessing of God to be upon the presbytery as they meet to conduct the more formal business of the church. Second, because the most important aspect of the church is worship, there will be plenty of that! You are invited to the Friday evening worship and communion service with the whole presbytery to be held Friday, January 24th at 7pm. We hope to fill our church with our own community members, as we join with all of our visitors to worship the Lord together. You won't want to miss the sound of a hundred church leaders raising their voices in praise together – it is wonderful!

Another very important way for you to be involved is through volunteering your time and efforts ahead of, and during, the meeting itself. If you would be interested in serving in some capacity (and we have plenty), please speak with one of the R&LP Hosting Committee representatives about their area of coordination: Tara Johnson (Hospitality); Cindy Oak (Food Service); Mel Block (Building & Grounds). We appreciate any and all volunteers that will help to make this weekend run smoothly.

More than anything, amidst the anticipation of hosting, we want to exhibit warm hospitality to all of our guests, who truly are united with us in Christ. That being said, I encourage you to think of this as one big family gathering: to work together, to serve together, and most importantly, to worship together. You'll be seeing and hearing lots of information about this in the coming weeks. Thank you in advance for being such a wonderful community to welcome our presbytery in to. I know all of our guests will be blessed to be among us, as we will be blessed to serve them.

The November Session meeting was held November 26th at 7:00pm. The meeting was held in the conference room of the church with Zach Hopkins, Tara Johnson, Jim Mueller, Kevin Oak, Patrick Shovar, and Keith Wilson in attendance.

Old Business:

- Mel noted he has received many comments from the congregation thanking the trustees for the work that they do.
- Septic Tank
 - New tank and field have been installed.
 - All plumbing in the church is now connected to the new system. This includes all bathrooms and the kitchen. Three old septic systems have been removed from service.
 - o Ken is working on the electrical service to the two new lift pumps.
 - Restoration work for the yard will wait until next spring. Likely will need some additional dirt fill at that time.
- Several lamps are not working in the light fixtures on the second floor of the Sunday School wing. These are old style fluorescent fixtures. They will be updated with new LED lamps.
- Two hydrangea trees on the south side of the sanctuary were damaged in the high winds this fall. Will look at replacement plantings next spring.
- Cleanup work was completed at Dunlap Cemetery and at the Manse on October 26th.

New Business:

- It has been discovered there is moisture below the carpet in the basement. The glue on the back of the carpet tile has dissolved and is causing staining on the top of the carpet. It is likely this carpet will need to be replaced. Would like to hold off on this project until next spring. Will try to clean some of the glue spots on the carpet.
- Session has requested a meeting with the Trustees after church on November 24th to discuss long range planning of maintenance projects. Trustees have identified many maintenance and repair projects that need to be addressed however funding is currently not available.

Mel closed the meeting with a prayer at 8:15pm.

- **Buddy Bags:** Discussed the Buddy Bags; Lisa is getting information from schools on their need; Barb will introduce to the congregation at the annual meeting just to take a pulse on interest and support

 - We received more information after the close of the meeting. Tara expressed gratitude and it would be helpful if the Mission Committee could pay half, which would be approximately \$1,100 (it's \$9 / box.) We will need to vote on this after church.
- **TEAM Missionaries:** It was moved and seconded to provide Tom and Phyllis Bassett (TEAM missionaries who will be at church on Sunday) \$500. Barb will get the check processed so we can present it to him there.
- Christmas Eve Donation: It was moved and seconded to match at least 1:1 the Christmas donation to our EPC World Outreach partners the Hubers, Burdsalls, and Woodworths; with others to be considered after the actual amount is determined. We decided to not include the McCallum's at this time; however, the approval is flexible enough to add others when reviewing the amounts in January. As an example, if the donation that evening is \$500, then at a minimum we would provide \$500 each to the Hubers, Burdsalls, and Woodworths.
- Christmas Gift: It was moved and seconded to provide a Christmas "gift" personally to the Hubers, Burdsalls, and Woodworths of \$750. We will send those checks to their homes (with the exception of Burdsalls).

At the end of November, I spent a week in Albania training ministry leaders in the subject of Transformational Leadership. Two days after I returned home, a 6.4 magnitude earthquake shook the country just 20 miles from the school. Over the course of the next week, over 100 aftershocks continued to stress the country's infrastructure and the emotional state of the entire area. While all of our national partners were physical safe, over 30 Albanians lost their lives, and numerous others where injured. A natural disaster of this size would cause



significant distress for any country, but it is particularly difficult for a country like Albania, who is still emerging from decades of foreign occupation, dictatorial rule, and ruthless communism. During this time of rebuilding, please pray for the less than 1% of Evangelical Christians who will have an opportunity to share the life and hope of Jesus Christ with their Muslim neighbors.

"Call unto me and I will show you great and mighty things that you know not" Jeremiah 33:3.

When we first arrived in Malaysia and sat down with our World Outreach team of workers there, one of the first things the team leader mentioned was Extraordinary Prayer. And as our team laid out how the week might look for us, it all fell in the confines of prayer. There



weren't specific projects or outreaches or sightseeing escapades laid out for us, there was an itinerary of prayer. It wasn't an afterthought, prayer was THE thought. This commitment to extraordinary prayer has stood silhouetted in my mind ever since, not because I haven't seen it before, but because it stands in stark contrast to what I see too often here at home in our own churches and even in my own prayer life.

There are many ways God can move us into extraordinary prayer, but I wanted to share a couple of ways we experienced it in Malaysia that can translate into our own lives:

Pray scriptures. In Malaysia, roughly 17 million people don't have...

Be creative. During that same prayer time, our team...

Move about. We spent another day entirely focused on...

Gather together. We regularly met and prayed with...

FOOD PANTRY STAFF THANKS YOU!

Once again, thanks to community support, we had another successful food distribution in December 2019. We served 42 families consisting of 83 adults, 16 teens, and 32 children, for a total of 131 people. Each family received 3 generous boxes of food in addition to produce and meat.

On Friday, December 13th, we had 17 folks who helped to shop for and pack the food. On Saturday, December 14th, we had another group of 13 willing workers who helped with the distribution. A special thanks those who braved the cold outside to load the cars.

Even though we've been doing this for quite a few years, I'm still amazed by all the people who pitch in to help in so many ways. It is wonderful to have such a giving community and such support by the community churches.

Though my head was hung low, my heart was full. As I opened the door to my car, I heard one of the workers say, "I never seen nothing like that before and I've been putting in septic tanks for twenty years."
