

DARK SKIES. DEEP MERCY.

As I write this we're currently in the midst of a week-long period of overcast skies. We haven't seen the sun in quite some time. Maybe it doesn't for you, but for many, this begins to have a certain effect that has spiritual parallels. What do you do when you feel yourself being pulled into a season of being emotionally or spiritually overcast? What is that experience like? And how can we be equipped to navigate our way through it?

When we're thinking about the nature of the Christian life, I have an instant reaction to draw connections to John Bunyan's classic work, *The Pilgrim's Progress*. Through the journey of Christian, the main character, we see a metaphor for the way God's grace works in and carries us through our lives. In this wonderful story, there is a particular point early on when Christian encounters a period of, shall we say, emotional and spiritual overcast skies. This is Bunyan's picture:

Now I saw in my dream that... they drew near to a very miry slough that was in the midst of the plain; and they being heedless, did both fall suddenly into the bog. The name of the slough was "Despond." Here, therefore, they wallowed for a time, being grievously bedaubed with the dirt; and Christian, because of the burden that was on his back, began to sink in the mire.

This place, called the Slough of Despond is so named because, as Bunyan continues,

"This miry Slough is such a place as cannot be mended; it is the descent whither the scum and filth that attends conviction for sin doth continually run, and therefore is it called the Slough of Despond: for still as the sinner is awakened about his lost condition, there ariseth in his soul many fears, and doubts, and discouraging apprehensions, which all of them get together, and settle in this place; and this is the reason of the badness of this ground."

In *Pilgrim's Progress*, Christian has to take the hand of another in order to be lifted up out of the Slough of Despond. Consider that essential point, he cannot by his own strength remove himself, his help comes from outside of himself. Such is the way of the Gospel.

I don't know what causes you to feel that you are sinking in the mire of the Slough of Despond – but I know that we all experience it. It happens when we feel, for whatever reason, that it has been far too long since we have enjoyed the sunshine of God's peace and presence. What is the answer? We cannot remove ourselves from this place of distress. We need the help of another.

Whether that other person is physically the hand of a friend, family member, of fellow-church member, ultimately the grace of the extended hand to the poor and needy believer is the hand of our Lord Jesus. He promises to live and abide with us, and to lift us from the Slough of Despond. As the Psalmist says, "In my distress I called to the LORD, and He answered me" (Psalm 120:1).

Dear treasured people of God, as we so often sing, "turn your eyes upon Jesus." His grace will lift you from the place of your despair, and His peace will be as a light to you, that you may continue to walk in faith and obedience. Repent, and once more, lay your trust upon Him.

The Session meeting was held January 7th at 7:00pm. The meeting was held in the conference room of the church with Zach Hopkins, Tara Johnson, Jim Mueller, Kevin Oak, Patrick Shovar, and Keith Wilson in attendance.

Pastor Zach will act as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer. The Elders read and discussed Ephesians 4: 1-17. The Elders prayed for the committees and volunteers of the church.

There was a motion to approve the docket and the minutes of the last meeting. Motion was seconded and approved.

Zach reported on his activities for the month which included:

- The Session reviewed and discussed the 2020 budget.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Zach mentioned the church needing to submit its 2019 records to the Presbytery. Zach and Keith will schedule a time to complete.
- The Session discussed the upcoming Annual Meeting scheduled for January 19, 2020. Zach presented a draft agenda for review. Zach asked the Ruling Elders to submit a short writeup to include in the annual report. These writeup's are due January 14, 2020.
- The Session discussed the upcoming 28th Stated Meeting of Rivers and Lakes Presbytery to be held in our church January 24, 2020 January 25, 2020.
 - o Zach shared a draft of the schedule for the meetings and worship.
 - The meeting will begin early afternoon on Friday and conclude at noon on Saturday.
 - A motion was made, seconded, and approved to appoint Kevin and Patrick to serve as delegates at the meeting.
 - o A number of volunteers will be needed to help during the meeting and dinner.

- Keith reviewed a concept for a plaque describing the early years of our church as a memorial to Janet Jack. He has contacted the Memorial Committee and will be contacting the Trustees concerning this.

Edgington Evangelical Presbyterian Church Annual Meeting

January 2019 – December 2019 January 19th, 2020, 12:30pm

Location: Church Sanctuary

Attendees: 40 members were in attendance, which exceeds the requirements of 20 for a quorum.

Zach Hopkins served as moderator.

Zach opened the meeting with prayer and reading from Psalms 48: 12-14. Zach read the poem "My Church" by William Henry Boddy D.D.

- **Purpose:** The annual congregational meeting is held to review the reports for the year 2019 and to elect officers for 2020.
- Approval of Docket: Motion made and seconded to approve the docket. Motion carried.
- **Approval of minutes:** The January 27th, 2019 minutes were reviewed. Motion made, seconded and approved. Motion carried.
- OLD BUSINESS: None
- Committee Reports: Appreciation was expressed to all committee members, teachers, and volunteers.
 Reviewed collectively with comments as noted, motion made to approve all reports, seconded and approved.

Session: Zach reviewed the Session activities for the year. In keeping with a short-term goal that the Session has had the church's audio ministry has seen use as there were 1016 downloads of sermons during 2019. The Session continues to focus on the spiritual needs of the congregation and delegating the various business needs of the church to the appropriate committees.

Tara Johnson thanked the congregation for the opportunity to serve on the Session as she concludes her term after serving for six years. She offered her assistance to anyone that needs a helping hand and is eager to continue to serve the church.

Deacons: Beth Flickinger reviewed the activities of the Deacons during 2019 and thanked the members of the committee. She noted that the committee viewed the Session as steering the boat and their committee as looking after the needs of all of us in the boat. She asked the congregation to notify the committee of any needs that they should be aware of.

Trustees: Mel Block reviewed the activities of the Trustees in 2019, as noted on page nine of the Annual Report, and thanked the trustees and other volunteers for their efforts. Mel also called attention to the list of proposed future projects for 2020, as outlined on page 10 of the Annual Report. He noted that many of these projects are significant and the nature of certain projects will require hiring contractors.

A member asked what material would be used to re-side the east side of the church. Mel answered that it would be cement siding to match the siding that is on the new main entrance.

Another member inquired about the cause of the failure of the basement carpet. Mel answered that moisture coming up through the floor was a contributing factor, and that the Trustees are continuing to look for an appropriate remedy.

Manse Task Force: No report at this time.

Mission Committee: Barb Freyermuth thanked the committee members and summarized their work. The committee continues to put Christ in the center of their discussions, as they decide on how to best to further His word. The committee is dedicated to supporting EPC's World Outreach. The committee has also developed a priority for bringing people to Christ through outreach in our local community. They are beginning to work with the local school system to identify the needs of children and how they can be addressed.

Treasurer's Report: A question was asked concerning the position of Music Director. Zach stated that Lori Dixon has resigned the position effective the end of May. We are very fortunate to have two organists that serve our church. We will be searching to fill the position of Music Director.

Investment Committee: A comment was made that it is good to see that the loan from the Organ Fund to the General Fund has been repaid.

Youth Group: No comments

Vacation Bible School: Kathy Stegmiller was thankful for the community involvement that makes this program possible. She expressed a concern regarding the need to enlist younger adults to join in. Zach commented that while VBS is a community program, he stressed that our church's policies apply to this ministry. Zach also noted that the church maintains lists of attendees of VBS that are either unchurched or not at present actively involved and invite them to events such as the ice cream social and the fall harvest party.

Food Pantry: Zach expressed appreciation for the tireless work of the volunteers.

Presbyterian Women: Dorothy Rursch thanked the church and members of the organization for their support. She said the group would love to have more members to join in. She mentioned the groups involvement in organizing funeral dinners, the rummage sale, and projects such as recovering the choir chairs.

Memorial Fund: No comments **Auditor Report:** No comments

New Business

New Ministry Opportunities: Zach stated that a Men's Ministry is still a gaping need within our church, and he wants to do at least one thing really well in this area in 2020. Zach also reminded us that Sunday morning worship is the most important aspect of our spiritual life, and asked the congregation to encourage others to attend.

Review of the 2020 Budget: The Session previously approved the budget. The congregation votes to affirm and support it. It was noted that mission giving remains at 25% of amounts contributed to the church and is budgeted to increase by \$5,000 in 2020. A motion was made and seconded to affirm and support the 2020 budget. The motion was approved.

Presentation of Slate of Nominees – Motion was made to accept the slate of nominations as presented. Motion seconded and approved. Motion carried.

Motion made to adjourn the meeting, seconded and approved.

Zach closed the meeting with prayer followed by the congregation singing the doxology at 1:35pm.

Mel opened the meeting with a prayer at 7:01pm.

Reviewed the minutes from the November 13th, 2019 meeting along with the Treasurer's report presented by Cindy. Since a quorum was not present at this meeting, no votes to approve the minutes and Treasurer's Report were taken.

Old Business:

- Larry rewired 7 light fixtures on the second floor of the Sunday School wing, converting them over to new LED lamps, with the materials and labor both donated. Also, two new coat racks were constructed and installed by Larry in the basement, with materials and labor also donated.
- Ken donated a considerable amount of time over the past month to wire up the new septic system pump and control system.
- A silt fence was installed by Mel & Jeff Thomas around the new septic system spoil piles on the
 northwest corner of the church to help control some of the silt & mud that is running out into the
 parking lot and getting tracked into the church, causing additional carpet cleaning work. Mel has spent a
 considerable amount of time shoveling up mud that was previously washed out into the parking lot to
 try to keep it from getting tracked back into the church.
- The issue concerning the basement carpet glue dissolving and migrating up into the carpet was discussed again. While it is likely the carpet may need to be replaced in the spring, an interim measure to steam cleaning the glue spots might help the appearance for the short term.

New Business:

- Two Christmas trees were offered from two different families as a replacement to the aging Christmas tree in the church sanctuary. After a short discussion, a determination was made that the Trustee Committee was not the appropriate group to make a decision on this issue, and it should be referred to the PW group who typically takes care of holiday decorating.
- A short discussion was held on whether additional rugs at the entrances are needed to help control some of the mud problems. If the mud tracking issue continues, then this may be necessary.
- Mel mentioned he is compiling a list of completed 2019 projects for presentation to the congregation at the annual meeting in January 2020.

Mel closed the meeting with a prayer at 7:41pm.

December 17, 2019

The Mission Committee met on December 17, 2019 at 6:30pm in the Conference Room of the church. Those attending were Barb Freyermuth, Deb Wagamon, Jim Cooksey, Lisa Nelson, Mary Ann Vroman, Nancy Engstrom, and Todd Stegmiller.

Barb opened in prayer.

Old Business:

- **Approve Minutes:** November minutes were approved by the committee.
- **Buddy Bags:** Mike Ruff, Principal of the Andalusia school, was in attendance. To bring Mike up-to-speed on the program, Barb reviewed the thoughts behind this mission. The idea came from the church in Abington's program, "Feed My Lambs" concept of feeding children over the weekend when they do not have access to good nutrition. The school would identify the children who could benefit from this program and notify EEPC how many bags they would need. EEPC would provide the bags to the school, and they would dispense them. Mike estimated 20 children in the district; but will certainly follow-up with area schools to get a final count. He has worked with a similar program in a previous position, and feels our area could certainly benefit from such a mission. We spoke about providing nutrition for all members of the student's family rather than just the student. Also, discussed designing a form to be filled out by the family indicating any allergies that might modify the foods being distributed.
 - Next steps: Mike will provide a number of students/family members by January 2020. We can then determine if this is a viable mission for EEPC, and present this at the annual meeting.
- **Review of Newsletters:** This was completed by committee.
- Christmas Eve Donation: This will go to World Outreach (Woodworth's, Huber's, and Burdsall's) Committee will match at least 1:1, and the final decision will be made in January 2020.
- Winnie's Place: All Angel packages are due back this Sunday. Nancy will need assistance delivering the parcels. The Furnace Project is on-going. The HVAC system needs to be replaced. There was a water leak which caused damage, and a new deck needs to be installed. All total, they need 90K in additional funds over and above operational expenses. The Rockridge Honor Society has collected funds, and will be donating to Winnie's Place.
- Tom and Phyllis Bassett: Visit to church on Nov. 24, 2019. They are moving toward retirement in the Q.C. area and could use additional funds toward that transition.

New Business:

- **Christmas Box Postage:** The committee agreed/approved a donation to the Youth group of \$1,200.00 toward the postage for the OCC Shoebox box program.
- Andalusia Family: Mike Ruff brought a local family to the attention of the Committee. This family is in need of physical and spiritual assistance and support at this time. The Committee discussed the issue and approved a \$1,000.00 donation to the Andalusia school program to be used for this family's needs.
- Minute for Mission: Barb will speak to the topic "Spreading Goodwill Locally".

Quarterly Ministry Recap – Oct, Nov, and Dec 2019 Statistics

It's your **prayer commitment**, your **sacrifice of time**, and your **financial investment** that makes this type of consistent ministry possible!



- 927 unique visits for individualized care
- 189 Pregnancy Tests were performed
- 121 Ultrasounds were performed
- 1,610 Students in 17 schools were influenced by the No Regrets Sexual Integrity Program
- In 2019, five groups of women went through our post-abortion recovery bible study.

On January 2nd, 2020, the first day we were open after the holiday, Pregnancy Resources staff and volunteers <u>provided 15</u> pregnancy tests, four ultrasounds, and had 17 parents attend parenting classes. At that rate, we did almost a pregnancy test with options counseling every hour we were open! Life was seen at every ultrasound appointment and parents learned, shared their story and grew together. What a difference a day can make.

In the first full seven days of services in 2020, we saw 22 abortion-vulnerable patients; of that, ten patients were abortion-determined*. (*abortions scheduled in the following week)
