



FROM FASTING TO FEASTING

It's been five months since we have gathered around the banquet table of God's grace in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Over these months we have fasted with sorrow, even while that sorrow was mingled together with the faithful anticipation of the Marriage Supper of the Lamb in the New Heavens and the New Earth ([Rev 19:6-9](#)). But we have not yet entered into the glories of that day, which is why we have continual need to make use of the sacraments, those signs and seals of God's promises to us.

An understatement would be to say I am happy to announce that the Session anticipates a return to the sacrament on the first Sunday of August. It's an understatement because I am more than happy – I am *thrilled*. That thrill is not just at the prospect of enjoying the sacrament together as the people of God, but also excitement for the chance for us to be earnestly reflective in our preparation for the Supper, which is not only practical, but commanded by the Apostle Paul for the proper reception of the Supper ([1 Cor 11:28](#)).

So, what does it look like to examine ourselves in preparation for the Lord's Supper? Well, I find it most helpful to let the Westminster Larger Catechism speak for itself.

Q. 171. *How do we prepare to receive the Lord's supper?*

A. *Preparation for the Lord's supper involves careful examination: of the condition of our life in Christ; of our sins and failings; of whether we truly and to what degree know God, believe in Him, and have repented, and of whether we love God and our fellow believers. We should have a charitable attitude toward everyone, including forgiveness of those who have wronged us. We must also assess how much we desire Christ and whether we are living in newness of obedience. Finally, we must renew the practice of these graces in us by serious meditation and fervent prayer.*

Q. 174. How must we receive the Lord's supper when it is offered?

A. *In receiving the Lord's supper when it is offered, we should reverently and attentively wait on God, as we carefully observe the sacramental elements and their administration. We should take specific notice of the Lord's body and meditate feelingly on His death and suffering and so stir up in us a lively effect of God's spiritual gifts. We should critically examine ourselves and be sorry for our sins. We should earnestly hunger and thirst after Christ, feeding on Him by faith, drawing from His fullness, trusting in His merit, rejoicing in His love, and giving thanks for His grace. We thereby renew our covenant with God and our love for fellow believers.*

The reason why the preparation of our whole selves (mind, body, and soul) for the Lord's Supper is so important is because it is at the lavish table of the Father's grace that He strengthens the spiritual union we have with Christ in the Spirit. Another way of saying that would be: there we see Jesus, there we are given more of Jesus, there we are comforted, encouraged, and strengthened because of Jesus. So, we need to ready ourselves.

But inevitably our preparation should focus itself not just on the delight in remembering the mercy of the Gospel, but also on the sin that required the shedding of Christ's innocent and righteous blood on our behalf – on behalf of our sins. We experience both emotions at the Lord's Supper, don't we? We are sorrowful because our sins have put Christ to death. Yet we are also joyful, because that death was for the full payment and removal of the penalty of those very sins. That is why the sight of a bleeding Savior is intended to melt us into weeping sinners. We mourn our sins. We marvel at the sovereign mercy of Jesus. And this leaves us humbled with awe, singing along with Isaac Watts, "But drops of tears can ne'er repay the debt of love I owe. Here, Lord, I give myself away; 'tis all that I can do."

And so, as we rejoice in the feast again, may it be a time when we surrender the love of our hearts and the obedience of our lives to the Lord Jesus. Is He worthy? He is!

I look forward to breaking bread and sharing the cup together with you in worship. Until then, remember that I am very gratefully,

SESSION

The Session meeting was held June 30th at 7:00pm in the church basement with Zach Hopkins, Steve Morrison, Jim Mueller, Mic Penry, Kevin Oak, Patrick Shovar, and Keith Wilson in attendance.

Pastor Zach acted as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer. The meeting began with a reading and discussion of Matthew 18: 12-14. The Elders studied and discussed the 8th chapter of *The Shepherd Leader* by Timothy Witmer. The Elders prayed for individual members of the congregation.

There was a motion to approve the docket and the minutes of the last meeting. Motion was seconded and approved.

Zach reported on his activities for the month which included:

- **Visits/Calls:** Phone Calls and Cards sent to members and friends
- **Committee/Ministry Meetings:** Buffalo Prairie Session, Quincy Session
- **Technology:** Continuing to develop and refine the process of live streaming worship service

OLD BUSINESS:

- Zach reported that equipment for a permanent livestream setup has been ordered.
- The Session discussed details and logistics concerning the resumption of worship services beginning July 5th.
- Basement reservations have been cancelled.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Mel Block met with the Session to review the pending sale of the manse. There has been an offer and acceptance on the sale of the manse pending the completion and outcomes of certain inspections. Mel reviewed the process that the trustees have went through leading up to the agreement and outlined the factors that were considered. The Session fully supported the Trustees' decision. The Session was very appreciative of Janet Schmidt's assistance in this matter.
- The Session discussed whether or not the Ice Cream Social should be held. A motion to cancel the Ice Cream Social for this year was made, seconded and passed.
- The Session discussed whether or not the Fishing Derby should be held. The Session will leave this decision up to the Sunday School leadership.
- The Session discussed the details for communion during the July 12th worship service. Zach had acquired disposable single service communion sets containing juice and wafers. The Session examined these and felt that the handling of them was too awkward and would be a distraction during the observation of the sacrament. The Session determined that it would be best to postpone communion and revisit this at the next meeting.
- The Session discussed whether or not the church should conduct fall Sunday School. It was decided to revisit this in future meetings.



Resuming Corporate Worship




General Items

- Individuals in at-risk health groups (including the elderly, presently ill/symptomatic, and those on medications that suppress the immune system) are encouraged to continue worshipping at home by livestream.
- All in-person Sunday School classes will remain suspended at this time.
- For those choosing to worship on site, the use of masks will be encouraged for entry and exit. Once you are seated in a pew, and appropriately distanced, the continued use of a mask will be up to the conscience of the individual worshipper. They will not be required during the service. If you would like a mask, one will be available to you while supplies last.
- We encourage you to maintain appropriate physical distance while on the church grounds. While we recognize a deep longing for fellowship, we encourage you to avoid shaking hands or other forms of physical contact for the present time.
- If you would like to convene in small groups please do so in the parking lot only.

On-Site Practices


- Out of consideration for others, and to accommodate capacity limits, please arrive 15 minutes before service in order to allow for seating arrangements and lessen disruption to the beginning of the service.
- Please refer to the attached map to see the appropriate entry/exit points to accommodate one-way direction of movement inside the facility.
- Livestream equipment will remain setup in the sanctuary to accommodate those who choose to worship at home. We hope this will only be minimally distracting to those worshipping on site and we appreciate everyone's understanding.
- Seating will be available in various limited capacities (see map below):
 - Sanctuary seating will be available and appropriately spaced to allow for social distancing between family units. Those pews containing stacked Bibles and hymnals will be off-limits. Limit: 50 worshippers.
 - Additional limited seating will be available in the balcony.
 - Once the attendance limit has been met in the sanctuary (50), worshippers will be directed to the basement where the service will be live-streamed (audio & video).
- Offering plates will be placed just outside the sanctuary doors to collect tithes and offerings. Online giving is also available and encouraged. You may also mail your contributions directly to the church [Edgington EPC - 13228 140th Street West – Taylor Ridge, IL 61284].
- Pews will be dismissed to allow for easy exit.



In compliance with CDC guidelines, “one-way” routes will be established for entry and exit from the facility.

To promote the safe flow of entry and exit, please plan to visit in the parking lot before or after the service, rather than in the facility.

Minutes from the May 13, 2020 meeting were reviewed and approved.

Reviewed the Treasurer's report for May. Motion made and seconded to approve the report as presented – motion carried.

Old Business:

- Siding work on east wall of sanctuary is starting. Will also ask the contractor to investigate a water leak at one of the south stained glass windows.
- Dirt work in front yard is on going as weather permits. Additional loads of dirt will be purchased at a cost of \$50 per load.
- Gutters on manse have been cleaned and some landscape cleanup also is complete.

New Business:

- Trustees reviewed the appraisal for the manse. Appraised value is \$169,000 in current condition.
- Trustees are aware of someone who is possibly interested in purchasing the house. Motion made, seconded and approved to offer the house at a price of \$169,000. No additional repairs will be completed at the manse at this time.
- Trustees reviewed a request to purchase a camera to be used for digital livestreaming of church services. Cost is \$1,889. Motion made, seconded and approved to purchase the camera and mount.
- Session has determined that services in the sanctuary (and basement) will begin on July 5th.
- Discussed sanctuary roof. There continues to be water leakage problems that need to be addressed. Trustees will contact roofing contractors to obtain ideas on possible options and cost estimates.
- Access to the Dunlap Cemetery needs some gravel to fill in low spots. Chris will arrange for work to be done.

Mel closed the meeting with a prayer at 8:00pm.


Prayer Requests:




