

IMPROVING OUR BAPTISM

For many Christians, baptism has little day-to-day relevance in the Christian life. This is why the Westminster Larger Catechism referred to "improving" (or *applying*) our baptism as a "needed, but much neglected duty" ($\underline{WLC 167}$). It's not that there is something wrong with our baptism and it needs to be amended, but rather that the spiritual benefits of baptism remain largely unused in our lives. How can we better apply the grace of baptism to our lives? Consider the following applications:

1. We should *cultivate communion* with the church into which we have been planted by baptism. Just as baptism solemnly admits people into membership in the visible church, so also baptism promotes the communion of the saints in the church. This is why private baptisms should ordinarily be unthinkable. Taking baptism out of the worshiping congregation robs the church as a whole of its continued benefits. Think of the blessing that you have enjoyed as you consider that families that bring their children are a part of our larger church family. That should stir affection for the Body of Christ in your hearts.

2. We should **pursue spiritual communion with Christ**. After all, it is Christ whom we have put on in baptism (Gal 3:27). Growing in our relationship with Jesus will deepen our understanding about what it means to be "in Christ." Our relationship with the Lord grows as we regularly make diligent use of the means of grace in our lives (Word, Sacraments, Prayer).

3. Baptism teaches us to **hold fast to the promises of the covenant**, which are held forth in baptism. By these promises, we renounce Satan, the sin of the world, and our own sins, committing ourselves wholly to God, who will faithfully keep His covenant promises.

4. We ought to be *assured of the remission of our sins*, since this benefit is held forth and sealed to us in baptism. In this way, baptism not only promotes repentance and obedience, but faith in the promises of God and in the God of the promises.

5. We should use baptism to help us **long for the Holy Supper** so that we might be nourished and confirmed in the grace of the covenant. This is an excellent way of showing how the two sacraments should work together in the Christian life. Sacraments are covenant signs that seal covenant promises.

6. Baptism directs us to *keep faithfully whatsoever Christ commands us*. As Christian believers, we want to walk in the ways of the Lord. Reminding ourselves that we have been claimed by Christ aids our commitment to walk in His ways.

These are just a few ways for us to consider cultivating our relationship with the Triune God through the sacrament of baptism. If you have been baptized, then you have been claimed by the grace of God. May that grace reign in your life!

Resuming Corporate Worship




General Items

- Individuals in at-risk health groups (including the elderly, presently ill/symptomatic, and those on medications that suppress the immune system) are encouraged to continue worshipping at home by livestream.
- All in-person Sunday School classes will remain suspended at this time.
- For those choosing to worship on site, the use of masks will be encouraged for entry and exit. Once you are seated in a pew, and appropriately distanced, the continued use of a mask will be up to the conscience of the individual worshipper. They will not be required during the service. If you would like a mask, one will be available to you while supplies last.
- We encourage you to maintain appropriate physical distance while on the church grounds. While we recognize a deep longing for fellowship, we encourage you to avoid shaking hands or other forms of physical contact for the present time.
- If you would like to convene in small groups please do so in the parking lot only.


On-Site Practices

- Out of consideration for others, and to accommodate capacity limits, please arrive 15 minutes before service in order to allow for seating arrangements and lessen disruption to the beginning of the service.
- Please refer to the attached map to see the appropriate entry/exit points to accommodate one-way direction of movement inside the facility.
- Livestream equipment will remain setup in the sanctuary to accommodate those who choose to worship at home. We hope this will only be minimally distracting to those worshiping on site and we appreciate everyone's understanding.
- Seating will be available in various limited capacities (see map below):
 - Sanctuary seating will be available and appropriately spaced to allow for social distancing between family units. Those pews containing stacked Bibles and hymnals will be off-limits. Limit: 50 worshippers.
 - Additional limited seating will be available in the balcony.
 - Once the attendance limit has been met in the sanctuary (50), worshippers will be directed to the basement where the service will be live-streamed (audio & video).
- Offering plates will be placed just outside the sanctuary doors to collect tithes and offerings. Online giving is also available and encouraged. You may also mail your contributions directly to the church [Edgington EPC 13228 140th Street West Taylor Ridge, IL 61284].
- Pews will be dismissed to allow for easy exit.



In compliance with CDC guidelines, "one-way" routes will be established for entry and exit from the facility. To promote the safe flow of entry and exit, please plan to visit in the parking lot before or after the service, rather than in the facility.

Mel opened the meeting with a prayer at 7:03pm.

Minutes from the July 8th, 2020 meeting were reviewed and approved.

Reviewed the Treasurer's report for July. Motion made and seconded to approve the report as presented – motion carried.

Old Business:

- Siding work on east wall of sanctuary is complete and has been painted.
- Front yard has been tilled and graded in preparation for seeding this fall.
- Repair work has been completed at the manse in preparation for sale.

New Business:

- Trustees are investigating installation of acrylic or polycarbonate covering on the outside of the stained glass windows. This will help protect against physical damage and should also solve the water infiltration problem. Currently the plastic material has a long delivery time due to COVID 19.
- A budget proposal has been received for the new sanctuary roof. The estimated cost is approximately \$57,000. Trustees strongly believe this work should be done in 2021. Additional bids will be solicited so a contractor selection can be made yet this fall.
- Trustees will obtain pricing for seeding or sodding of the church yard. This work will be completed in the next month or two.
- Trustees reviewed the list of projects that need to be completed in the short term. These include:
 - New sanctuary roof
 - Stained glass window covering
 - Resurface parking lot
 - Replace sanctuary A/C units
 - Reseed front yard
 - Replace basement carpet
 - Patch plaster damage in sanctuary
 - Replace incoming water line

The total estimated cost of this work is approximately \$110,500. Trustees have suggested borrowing money from other church funds so the work can be completed. The borrowed funds will need to be repaid in a timely manner – perhaps through a fund drive.

Mel closed the meeting with a prayer at 7:50pm.

The Mission Committee met on August 18, 2020 at 6:30pm in the church basement. Those attending were: Barb Freyermuth, Deb Wagamon, Todd Stegmiller, Nancy Engstrom, and Session Representative Kevin Oak.

Barb opened the meeting in prayer.

Old Business:

- Minutes from Previous July Meeting: approved
- **<u>Review of Church Mailings</u>**: The committee reviewed all ministry newsletters, thank you notes, and flyers to ensure we are current on all requests, upcoming fund raisers, and ministry needs.
- **Local Ministry Supplies**: The newsletter has included a list of supplies needed by our local ministries. A bin remains in the church entrance for these donations.

New Business: (Mission Monies available \$5,719.90)

- <u>Youth Hope</u>: We discussed the ministry of Youth Hope in our area. The discussion uncovered several questions we felt needed to be answered before we would be able to prayerfully discern if additional support was needed. Deb Wagamon will be meeting with YH to discuss their program and will report back to the Mission Team at our September meeting.
- **Pregnancy Resources "Walk for Life":** Pregnancy Resources is sponsoring their "Walk for Life" fundraiser on September 12th. Their goal is \$65,000 in donations. Zach will remind the congregation of this fundraiser on Sunday and we encourage all to participate.
- Champion assignments for Missions: The mission team feels it would be advantageous to assign a mission team committee member to champion each of our ministries. They would stay in touch with the ministry group or Missionary and report back to the team each month. The report would include current needs and activities of the ministry. This would allow the Mission team to always have a good understanding of the active work of each mission and what their immediate needs may be so we can prayerfully consider how EEPC can partner and assist. We tentatively assigned members to each of our core partner ministries, and will reach out to those members not in attendance to confirm if they are willing to take on the role assignment. THERE WILL BE ONLY ONE DISTRIBUTION THIS FALL -SATURDAY, OCTOBER 31st FROM 8:30-11:00AM. If there are other needs before the spring distribution, patrons can call and set up a time to pick up food. If you know of anyone in need of food, please have them call the church office.



We are not asking for any outside help. We are doing the shopping day-by-day, as some things are limited in the stores. Jim and Dewey have been watching for bargains and doing the shopping. The food pantry staff will pack the items. We will not label the boxes but pack all of them the same.

Sue will still call the families and inform them of the date of the distribution. She will set up inside the Sunday School Door and take names, give them gift cards, and cross them off the list. The people will wait in their cars. Masks will be required, as will social distancing.

We will keep 6 carts loaded and have them ready to go. We will not buy produce, but give the patrons increased gift cards, and they can shop for that themselves.

We will need a few people from EEPC to help on the day of distribution – loading carts and loading cars.

We appreciate all the monetary donations and food that we have received. The food donations have been down, but the money has been provided so we have been able to do the shopping. We can still use any nonperishable items that you want to donate.

The Deacons' charge is to care for the church body. You may already know that we provide delicious treats to celebrate new members, collect coats for those in need, and organize blood drives. But did you now that we are ready to serve in other ways, too?

Here are some of the ways a Deacon can help out:

- Visit shut-ins (including those who are temporarily unable to make it to worship) to provide cheer and recordings of the sermon (during this time, they will make calls to visit over the phone)




