# **GRACE FOR TRIALS**

In all things

aive

"Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds..." James 1:2

You've heard it plenty and likely said it a few times yourself; I know I have: "*I am so over <u>this</u>*." And the *this*, of course, is the pandemic and all the frustrations that have come with it. We have an incredible capacity to whine about all of these things. But, do we have an equally opposite capacity to trace the hand of God's providence in the midst of these events that produce so many emotions within us? What is God doing?

On the one hand, I am not so presumptuous as to suggest a specific answer to that question. As the hymn says, *"leave to thy God to order and provide."* So we can be content to agree with Moses when he says, *"the secret things belong to the LORD our God"* (Dt 29:29). But that's not all Moses said about that either. He also says, *"but the things that are revealed belong to us and to our children forever."* That means, we recognize there are the secret mysteries of God's providence that *we can never* understand fully in this life, and honestly, shouldn't even seek to know. But that doesn't mean we can't know anything. In fact, that's exactly what the word *"revelation"* means in Deuteronomy 29:29. God has revealed, or explained, certain truths that are clear, and not only may be known by us, but ought to be learned by us in order to pass them to future generations. In that sense, what has been revealed by God about the purpose of trials in the life of the Christian believer?

Let's look back at those words of James, Jesus' half-brother. In the very opening words of the epistle that bears his name he writes, "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing" (Jas 1:2-4). I'm struck by the emphasis on the words for you know. It's as if James is reminding us of what we know but refuse to accept. And that difficult to receive truth is this: that trials are often the Lord's choice tool to refine His people. Do you believe that?

In the 17th century Samuel Rutherford memorably said it this way: "grace grows best in winter". That sentiment agrees with what James is teaching. And it helps us understand why in the world we should count it all joy to meet trials. We are not taught to count it joy *that* we are suffering some kind of trail. Rather, we are to meet our trials with joy because we know that God knows what He is doing, and by the use of these light and momentary afflictions (to use the Apostle Paul's language) God is at work to refine, to strengthen, to bless, to sanctify, to encourage, and to increase our faith.

Here's the truth: I am over COVID along with the rest of you. But I am not over the ways in which I have seen the Lord at work in our lives as a congregation in the midst of this trial. As your pastor I delight to hear about your spiritual growth and the ways you've been challenged and how those challenges have been met with a daily supply of mercy. There have been physical, emotional, and spiritual challenges among us – each of varied circumstances. But in every circumstance, the Lord has confirmed His grace to us, and as James says, steadfastness is being worked in us. In that I rejoice. And with James I'll count it all joy. I hope you do the same. Hang in there.

A quorum is present.

Pastor Zach will act as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer. The meeting began with a reading and discussion of Acts 6: 1-7. #### **New Business:**

No refreshments will be served due to Covid-19 restrictions.

- Zach gave a briefing concerning several youths with skateboards that have been hanging around the church property.
- Zach informed the Session that there is interest in a New Membership Class this Fall. He will schedule the classes in November.
- The Session discussed a request for the use of church facilities. Due to current Covid-19 restrictions the request was denied.
- Zach informed the Session that the 30th RLP meeting is scheduled for Friday, October 9th from 12:45pm to 4:00pm. Zach and Mic will be attending in person, Keith will attend virtually via Zoom.
- Communion will be served during worship on October 4th, 2020.

The next Stated Session meeting will be October 27th, 2020 at 7pm. The Session will discuss implementation of the concepts learned from *The Shepherd Leader* by Timothy Witmer.

# **Resuming Corporate Worship**




#### **General Items**

- Individuals in at-risk health groups (including the elderly, presently ill/symptomatic, and those on medications that suppress the immune system) are encouraged to continue worshipping at home by livestream.
- All in-person Sunday School classes will remain suspended at this time.
- For those choosing to worship on site, the use of masks will be encouraged for entry and exit. Once you are seated in a pew, and appropriately distanced, the continued use of a mask will be up to the conscience of the individual worshipper. They will not be required during the service. If you would like a mask, one will be available to you while supplies last.
- We encourage you to maintain appropriate physical distance while on the church grounds. While we recognize a deep longing for fellowship, we encourage you to avoid shaking hands or other forms of physical contact for the present time.
- If you would like to convene in small groups please do so in the parking lot only.


#### **On-Site Practices**

- Out of consideration for others, and to accommodate capacity limits, please arrive 15 minutes before service in order to allow for seating arrangements and lessen disruption to the beginning of the service.
- Please refer to the attached map to see the appropriate entry/exit points to accommodate one-way direction of movement inside the facility.
- Livestream equipment will remain setup in the sanctuary to accommodate those who choose to worship at home. We hope this will only be minimally distracting to those worshiping on site and we appreciate everyone's understanding.
- Seating will be available in various limited capacities (see map below):
  - Sanctuary seating will be available and appropriately spaced to allow for social distancing between family units. Those pews containing stacked Bibles and hymnals will be off-limits. Limit: 50 worshippers.
  - Additional limited seating will be available in the balcony.
  - Once the attendance limit has been met in the sanctuary (50), worshippers will be directed to the basement where the service will be live-streamed (audio & video).
- Offering plates will be placed just outside the sanctuary doors to collect tithes and offerings. Online giving is also available and encouraged. You may also mail your contributions directly to the church [Edgington EPC 13228 140<sup>th</sup> Street West Taylor Ridge, IL 61284].
- Pews will be dismissed to allow for easy exit.



In compliance with CDC guidelines, "one-way" routes will be established for entry and exit from the facility. To promote the safe flow of entry and exit, please plan to visit in the parking lot before or after the service, rather than in the facility.

#### Old Business:

- Minutes from Previous Meeting: approved
- **Review of Church Mailings:** The committee reviewed all ministry newsletters, thank you notes, and flyers to ensure we are current on all requests, upcoming fund raisers, and ministry needs.
- Local Ministry Supplies: We continue to support the needs of Christian Care and Winnie's Place by notifying the congregation of the need for supplies; specifically toilet paper and paper towels. A bin has been placed in the church entrance to collect these donations. Committee members will deliver them to the local ministries.
- Youth Hope: Deb Wagamon gave an update on the current activities and needs of Youth Hope. This included an update on their fund raiser, summer camp, the M.A.D. program changes, food deliveries, school supply program, their efforts to stay in touch with the children and teens daily care and immediate needs. YH has two immediate needs: funding for the new YH Creative program leader and three new transit vans needed to transport children to and from their programs and school. We continue to pray for this ministry and the children whose lives are being changed through the love of Christ.
- **Champion assignments for Missions:** the committee discussed the expectations of these assignments and confirmed who will be representing our ministries. #### New Business: (Mission Monies available \$5,719.90)

- **Pregnancy Resources "Walk for Life"**: The "Walk for Life" fund raiser was held September 12th. The committee approved a \$500 donation, \$250 for Team Lisa and \$250 for Team Kelly.
- Winnie's Place: Nancy updated the committee on the status of this ministry. They have three new women coming to shelter. Winnie's Place generally operates at full capacity. Supplies are desperately needed to assist the shelter. We will share this need with our congregation. They are currently looking for a group to assist with repairing a deck at their facility. Nancy will obtain more information on this project and report back to the committee in October.
- Saul & Jess Huber: Kevin Oak offered an update: Saul and Jess travel America looking for young people interested in being missionaries. Their last newsletter outlined two new candidates they were exploring. Kevin will reach out and obtain more information for our October meeting.
- **Current US Disaster Support**: With all the need from local disasters (fires, storms, etc.) in the US today, we have been asked if we should be offering more assistance. Barb will be checking to see if the EPC has identified a source where churches may donate to support those in greatest need. We will address this at our October meeting.

#### **NEW Education Support Network**

On September 21st, ten children began attending our pilot Education Support Program, whose goal is to support students in Rock Island County public schools that are falling behind during this online learning era. Students receive assistance with their online learning at Learning Sites two days a week. Online learning is not easy, but families whose parents have their own learning challenges are at a greater disadvantage. We are also creating a system for churches to open Learning Sites in their buildings, with YouthHope providing the tools and training for the effort. Together, we can help hundreds of families and keep our community educationally strong!

mothers, the reactions ranged from tears of shock to shouting, clapping, and praying! My favorite reaction came from a single mom of five. I sat down on her only furniture on the main level, a futon that one boy was asleep on at the time. I said, "I think I have some good news for you..." She looked at me with wide eyes full of tears and said, "I don't know what to say. I'm going to cry. You really can't believe how hard this is. I can't do it. It's just too hard. I can't believe you would do this for us. I'm going to cry when you leave."



# Teaching Begins in Vietnam

After months of planning, curriculum development, "Missionary zeal does not grow out of intellectual beliefs, nor out of theological arguments, but out of love." — Roland Allen

technology purchases, translating, and countless meetings on Zoom- the launch of our training program in Vietnam has finally begun. This multi-year program of "training trainers" has been in development for the last year and

has experienced serval COVID-induced stops and starts. Nonetheless, God has been faithful in giving us wisdom and perseverance to move ahead in creative ways.

The program is designed to train students who will become certified to take theological, biblical, and ministerial training materials into the rural villages of Northern Vietnam. Following their weeks of equipping with ITEN, they will share these courses with hundreds of village pastors who lack the mobility or financial means to access further theological education.

Through a hybrid of live Zoom lectures, and group projects my colleague Ed McCallum is currently teaching a course on *Understanding, Applying, and Teaching the Bible* and I will begin teaching on *Spiritual Formation* from October 19-22. Due to the time difference, it will mean teaching during some late nights/early mornings - a small sacrifice for the opportunity to participate with God in his unfolding plans to expand the Kingdom into every corner of the Earth. As many of you know, each year I make 1-2 trips to the beautiful country of Albania. Our partnership with <u>ISTL</u> and its founder Hervin Fushekati has been a constant source of inspiration for our work as we have watched the school continue to grow and flourish in a Muslim majority country. This year, I will be teaching *Introduction to Leadership* from a distance through live Zoom lectures. The course will run from November 9-13 and will serve over 20 ministry leaders hungry to see Christ glorified in this often forgotten country.

#### HUBER-VENTURES - Covid update and prayer request! "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps." Proverbs 16:9

A couple of weeks ago Saul came down with what we thought was a sinus infection until he completely lost his senses of taste and smell. Zuri started running a fever around the same time and tests for Covid-19 came back positive for both of them. What followed was a couple of very stressful days as we tried to figure out how to isolate the sick ones and limit exposure for the rest of us. Saul has run his course with the virus and been released from quarantine now. Zuri has recovered from her symptoms, but still has a couple more days before she is no longer contagious. It wasn't



possible (or mentally or emotionally healthy) for us to totally isolate our four year old so those of us who are negative will have to quarantine for another 14 days once she's done to see if we show any symptoms. We're looking at being confined to our house until October 31st at the earliest!

#### "The heart of man plans his way..."

We didn't plan this way. We had plans to meet both of the couples we are coaching for World Outreach in person for the first time. We had plans to visit pumpkin patches and the farmers market. We had plans to carve jack-o-lanterns and eat apple cider donuts...and hopefully we'll still be able to do some of these things in November.

#### "...but the Lord establishes his steps."

As God walks with us during this time, we have seen him establishing our steps in ways we could not have thought up or understood on our own.

- We are continually thankful the place God has put us in. Our house has a basement guest room and bathroom where Saul and Zuri have been sleeping and showering to maintain semi-isolation.
- We began working on our patio last year, replacing the railing, adding steps down to our backyard, and resurfacing the concrete. Since we got positive results, this has been where we have eaten all of our meals and let Zuri play outside with her siblings....

#### Work Updates and Prayer Requests

- Those of you who've been with us for a while might remember that last October we were in the middle of a whirlwind trip to India, Southeast Asia, and the UK to visit some of our coworkers. It is crazy to think that this picture from a park on the other side of the world was taken exactly one year ago today. When we got back from that trip, the verse that helped us explain our experience in our newsletter was... Proverbs 16:9! "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps." God is teaching us the same lesson in a very different way this year!
- Praise God that we were able to add two more students to our EPC Missions Cohort this month! Please pray with us as we are cautiously planning a gathering in-person around the New Year in Hamtramck, MI--that everything would fall into place for that. We are also looking for young adults to fill our second cohort. If you know anyone in the EPC between 18-30 who is interested in missions, would you send them our way or direct them to this website: epcwo.org/cohort?
- We are also excited that the couple we've been coaching for over a year has made it to the final assessment event for World Outreach, called Engage. Saul says it's the Super Bowl for mobilizers. This is where they get their...




