

"Help! My Beliefs Are Viewed As Intolerant"

I can still remember watching an interview years ago where Oprah Winfrey asked Tom Cruise about his controversial religion of Scientology. Cruise's faith had come under fire due to recent events, and Oprah was pressing him pretty hard about what he really believed.

After a few testy exchanges, Oprah finally got to the nub of the matter: "So Scientologists don't believe their way is the only way?" With this one solitary question—which was obviously *the* question—the tone of the interview shifted dramatically. Whatever other things Cruise might believe, surely he couldn't believe his religion was the only right one. Who could ever have the audacity to believe *that*?

Not surprisingly, Cruise alleviated Oprah's fears: "No. We're here to help. It's not like you've got to believe this . . . [that] you must believe what I believe." After a deep exhale, the interview then continued on with a more gentle, friendly tone.

As I watched this exchange play out, I pondered what might have happened if Oprah had asked that same question to a committed Christian. What if she had asked *me* that question? Would I have had the courage to say, "Yes, I believe Christ is the only way"?

Let's be honest. As our world continues to speak about inclusivity, diversity, and tolerance, it can seem like Christianity is embarrassingly behind the times. Indeed, we can feel a bit like the knuckledragging Neanderthals of the religious world—ignorant, unenlightened, and archaic in our beliefs.

To be sure, feeling like cultural pariahs has had an impact on the church. Some Christians have decided the easier route is just to focus on religious *deeds*. Why alienate non-Christians in debates over truth claims when we can cooperate with them to help make the world a better place? Instead of awkward religious conversations, we can work to stop homelessness, serve the poor, and fight for justice.

Now, to be sure, Christians ought to care about these important issues. Good deeds are the outworking of God's grace in our lives. But the point here is that the cultural stigma over Christianity's exclusivity has led some Christians to withdraw from important cultural conversations.

So, where do we go from here? Well, what is needed is perhaps some fresh thinking about how to engage the non-Christian world about the exclusive truth claims of Christianity. That cannot be solved in a single article, but here are a few thoughts for future conversations.

Sometimes I get the impression that people think the exclusivity of Christianity is something Christians came up with—as if Christians, at some point in church history, were so enamored with their own religion that they declared it must be the only right one.

It's as if Christianity is a sports team and the fans (Christians) are predictably cheering: "We're number one! We're number one!" Needless to say, on those terms, Christians come off as exceedingly arrogant.

There's just one little problem: the exclusivity of Christianity is not something Christians came up with. It doesn't come from Christians, it comes from Jesus: "No one comes to the father except through me" (John 14:6). Is it arrogant simply to believe what Jesus has said about himself? Not at all. It is his claim, not our claim. We are merely passing it along.

In most conversations about exclusivity, the non-Christian often remains entirely unaware of *why* Christianity must be exclusive. Is there any internal logic for why Christianity makes this claim?

At this point, we need to reassure our non-Christian friend that Jesus's claim about himself is not arbitrary nor is it merely self-aggrandizing. Rather, Jesus is making that claim because he, and he alone, is the only solution to the problem of sin.

And here's the point: Jesus is the only one who remotely qualifies as someone who can take away sins. Indeed, he is the only one who even *claims* to take away sins.

So, we can ask our non-Christian friends a simple question: "Do you have another savior from sins I don't know about?" If not, then Jesus is, by definition, the only option available to them.

One of the most common reasons that people reject the exclusive truth claims of Christianity is because they believe truth is *relative*. In other words, they argue that there is no objective truth. There is just truth *for you*, and truth *for me*.

While relativism may sound reasonable on the surface, it ends up collapsing under its own weight. Relativism only works if the statement "There is no objective truth" is objectively true. Thus, relativism only works if it exempts itself from its own rules.

It is the equivalent of saying something like "All sentences are false." But if *all* sentences are false, then that very sentence is also false. Thus, relativism is essentially like sawing off the branch you're sitting on.

Unfortunately, our current cultural context does not allow for the free exchange of ideas like prior generations. Now, if you say another religion is wrong, it is taken as an act of hostility or aggression. Disagreement is the same as disrespect in most people's eyes.

Thus, we need to work hard to make sure our non-Christian friends understand that we love and respect them, even if we disagree. We need to reassure them that Christians are not out to denigrate, demean, or despise adherents of other religions.

This will not be easy. It will require that we give more attention to our tone and attitude than we might normally do. But it's worth it if we are to reach our non-Christian world.

In the end, my hope is that these four considerations will help us in our conversations with non-Christians over the exclusive claims of Christ. Of course, even if we follow them, that doesn't guarantee smooth conversations. We should expect that we will endure some hostility and resistance as we speak about such things.

To do so will require courage. So, take heart from the words of <u>1 Peter 3:14–15</u>: "Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you."

Ruling Elder Kevin Oak made a motion for the Edgington Evangelical Presbyterian Church to apply for the PPP loan, authorizing Ruling Elder Keith Wilson to carry out the application and have signature authority on the application, as well as any subsequent associated loan documents. The motion was seconded by Ruling Elder Patrick Shovar. After a brief discussion, the motion was voted by voice and carried by unanimous vote.

Teaching Elder Zach Hopkins closed the meeting with prayer.

We are very glad to announce that we will worship in person again beginning January 17, 2021. We have missed being together, especially throughout the Advent and Christmas seasons, but we are thankful to have the chance to enjoy the fellowship of the church family again. As everyone likely anticipates, things will be different for now, as they were last summer and fall. The Session has reviewed the governor's guidelines, consulted with officials in the Rock Island County Health Department, and kept an eye on the metrics and data for both our state region and local community. With all this in mind, we want to make sure we are clearly communicating the plan for resuming our gatherings in our building. We've organized this information around some frequently asked questions, but if you have any other questions or concerns, please feel free to contact us at the church office at 309-795-1713 or edgingtonepc@gmail.com.

Should I stay home?

That is a decision that we will not bind your conscience with. We want to assure anyone who, out of genuine health and safety concerns for themselves or their family, might feel safer staying home and worshipping via livestream that you should feel no guilt or shame in doing so.

Additionally, if you have any of the following symptoms, please do not attend: fever, chills, body aches, cough/congestion, recent loss of taste or smell, or if you are generally unwell. Based on current medical advice, we encourage those who are in categories of increased risk of hospitalization from COVID-19 due to underlying health issues, low immunity, or age, also to consider refraining from attending worship services right now.

What guidelines are in place?

- For those choosing to worship on site, the use of masks will be encouraged for entry and exit. Once you are seated in a pew, and appropriately distanced, the continued use of a mask will be up to the conscience of the individual worshipper. They will not be required during the service. If you would like a mask, one will be available to you while supplies last.
- We encourage you to maintain appropriate physical distance while on the church grounds. While we recognize a deep longing for fellowship, we encourage you to avoid shaking hands or other forms of physical contact for the present time.
- Seating will be available in various limited capacities (see map below):

- Sanctuary seating will be available and appropriately spaced to allow for social distancing between family units. Those pews containing stacked Bibles and hymnals will be off-limits. Limit: 65 worshippers.
- Additional limited seating will be available in the balcony.
- Once the attendance limit has been met in the sanctuary (65), worshippers will be directed to the basement where the service will be live-streamed (audio & video).
- Pews will be dismissed from the back to the front after the postlude has concluded.
- Offering plates will be placed just outside the sanctuary doors to collect tithes and offerings. Online giving is also available and encouraged using <u>Tithely</u>. You may also mail your contributions directly to the church [Edgington EPC - 13228 140th Street West – Taylor Ridge, IL 61284].

What about Sunday School?

Sunday school classes will meet at 9am. Please enter through the main entrance and go directly to your classroom. Children's classes will meet in their normal rooms which allow for appropriate distance. The Adult Class will continue to meet in the sanctuary, in addition to providing a livestream of our Hebrews teaching series.

What if I have grown comfortable worshipping from home?

Notwithstanding the answer to the first question above, if you are healthy and well, we encourage you to heed the call to come and worship with your brothers and sisters in Christ. We have been worshipping from home out of necessity, not personal convenience. Come and enjoy the blessings of the Lord's Day as we worship together in our beautiful sanctuary and delight in the glories of Zion on this side of heaven. Furthermore, we have missed you – and we long to see you and your family again.

What if I have other questions or conscience objections to any of these plans?





- Discussed the narrow grass area along the west side of the Sunday School building. This area is difficult to mow. Agreed to rework this area and cover with stone.

THE DIRECTOR'S DESK MARCH 2021

When Pregnancy Was Not Planned – Every Choice Has Loss

In this first quarter of 2021, God is sending profoundly more women and men to Pregnancy Resources in the midst of an unplanned pregnancy. These parents are



actively planning or seriously considering terminating pregnancy. Many of these moms & dads are married (or in a longterm, monogamous relationship) and already are parenting other small children. Financial stressors, employment uncertainty, relationship struggles, a missing or lacking emotional support network, and the current demands of parenthood are common reasons why these parents often find themselves seriously considering abortion. It's not uncommon to hear moms and dads in these complicated circumstances say, "abortion is my ONLY choice". Pregnancy Resources provides **medically accurate abortion education and options information to every client that comes through our doors for a pregnancy test or ultrasound.** We believe that knowledge is power, and every woman and man should make informed decisions regarding the pregnancy. We know that when parents understand what abortion is and when they see life on the ultrasound screen, they are much more likely to choose life for their pre-born child. We also acknowledge that every pregnancy decision involves loss:

- For the mom who continues the pregnancy and chooses to parent this child there is a loss of every possibility that existed before the pregnancy and the creation of this new human life occurred. Life has been protected, and hope remains.
- For the mom who continues the pregnancy and chooses to place this child in the arms of a loving forever family there is the loss of the daily experience of parenting this child. Life has been protected, and hope remains.
- For the mom who terminates the pregnancy with abortion the life of this pre-born child is lost. For the post abortive mother and father there can be emotional loss, spiritual struggle, and long-term trauma. But with Jesus, there is always hope, freedom, and forgiveness available for all.

Be **COURAGOUS AND MERCIFUL**. Don't let your sister or brother, your daughter or son, your neighbor, or your friend believe the lie that they have "no choice." Speak up for her/his sake and for the sake of the pre-born child. It is **compassionate** to recognize when moms and dads facing an unplanned pregnancy are in complicated and difficult situations. It is **merciful** to acknowledge that each pregnancy choice carries unique loss. It is **life changing** to be able to ask questions like "what is the loss you can live with when you look yourself in the mirror every day" or "what is the loss that protects this little human growing inside you, and best meets your needs right now"?

It is true: every choice involves loss, but life can still be protected and there can still be hope.

PRAYER REQUESTS:

- Pray for the abortion-minded client who was seen this week at one of our Centers. She is facing many difficult circumstances. Pray that she will see the value of the life she is carrying and that she keeps her ultrasound appointment. Pray that she will see that an abortion will only add to the trauma of her already difficult situation.
- Pray for the woman who has called Pregnancy Resources twice for guidance. She has experienced a miscarriage and is struggling to process it.
- Pray for an abortion-minded client who left her ultrasound appointment undecided. Pray that she will accept a second ultrasound and that she will allow the father of the baby to attend that ultrasound. Pray for her discernment and for the father of the baby as he is excited for the pregnancy and wanting to carry and parent their child.
- Pray for a woman who ahs revealed an abortion from over 40 years ago and is still suffering from the after-effects.
 Pray that she will be open to seeking help through the post-abortion recovery group and that she will find hope and healing through Jesus.
- Pray for the post-abortion recovery group that is currently meeting. Pray that their time together would be fruitful and filled with hope.

- Praise God for the many answered prayers that the Pregnancy Resources team has seen recently, both personally and professionally!
- Praise God for the ways that we are able to continue meeting the needs of the men and women who walk through our doors!
- Praise God for the blessing that was banquet. Praise Him for his continued provision for this ministry!



ITEN & 2021 - WOODWORTH UPDATE

The picture to the right was taken in our backyard here in Northeast Georgia, where God has graciously provided a 3.5 acre plot of land for our family to steward. Over the past three years we have cultivated the land and planted organic gardens. In addition to the incredible food it provides for our family, gardening is my wife's passion. Behind those gates is her refuge. Soiled covered hands, and the joy of raising plants from seed to harvest brings her an immense amount of joy. It also demands a seemingly infinite amount of work.



Again and again I return to our garden as an apt metaphor for ministry- a healthy harvest demands a great deal of preparation and labor. In fact, the majority of time spent on a garden is dedicated to preparation. Months and months of saving seeds, preparing the soil, mending fences, and sprouting seedlings have to occur in order to achieve just a few months of eating fresh fruits and vegetables.

The past year has often felt a lot like that for ITEN. Months and months of behind the scenes labor in anticipation of the eventual fruit of returning to the field once again. With vaccines on the rise and COVID cases on the decline, it does appear that the worst of this pandemic is finally behind us. In light of this we look forward to getting back into the garden in 2021 to harvest more fruit. Read on to hear about our plans.



Albania: May 17-21

Dozens of students will attend virtually and in-person to spend a week diving into a course on The Gospels. Serge Grace at the Fray

You hear so often from me (C.....) but we thought it would be good to hear from S.... too! This is how he spent his time Good Friday afternoon:

"We're gonna do something different, but we should still have fun." This was how a brief conversation with a Muslim contact ended as I was moments away from meeting, I thought, one on one for bubble tea and conversation. I got to our meeting place to find four men waiting for me. "A." waved and smiled and introduced me to the other men: a brother, a friend, and a "ringer". We ended up travelling a bit through the neighborhood to eat at a picnic table near street vendors. As all slowly got their food the conversation began.

For safety reasons it has been decided not to include photos full names, location, or link to their full update. If you would like to receive their regular updates via email, please contact the church office and Lisa will connect you with the them to be added to their email list.

For the next 90 minutes, I was asked about the validity of the Bible, (as always) the issue of the Trinity, why and how Jesus died, and much more. Throughout our walk to the street food and the ensuing discussion, I was silently praying for wisdom and clarification of the truth of the Lord. I was able to answer most all of their challenges directly, with one question that I wanted to look at further. For my part, I was able to share in bits and pieces the gospel message of God becoming flesh and taking our sin to become the perfect sacrifice. I also learned more from where "A." was coming from and ideas for future interactions. The conversation ended amicably and gave opening for more in the future.

Please pray for "A." as it feels very much like he is open to listening to the truth of God, even as he seeks to set me straight in faith. I feel the extra back up was to feel more confidence in his own faith tradition after meeting one on one. Join me in praying that God's truth takes hold as we continue to get together.

PRAYERS AND PRAISES:

- We are having an Asha service on Easter at 4pm! Pray that people will come, they will have open hearts to hear the Easter story, that we can run things smoothly with restrictions in place, and for good discussion time outside afterwards (in socially distant groups of 6).
- Continue to pray for "A" and for S.... as he interacts with "A" and others that have interest in discussion that S.... can speak the truth wisely and for it to reach hearts.
- As the UK opens up, and we start to remember what normal was, pray for us as we adjust to the shock of things like seeing the parks busy, or riding the tube again. Also pray that we can take opportunities to reach out to those around us, now that it is legal to do so. And, for the best ways to set up programming and outreach as we go forward.
- Pray for the Muslim world during Ramadan. And if you would like a more guided prayer time, check out this link <u>https://www.30daysprayer.com/</u> or this <u>https://www.pray4sylhetis.org/</u> (we know the people putting out the pray4sylhetis content, which will also be specific to the people group we are working with).
- Continue to pray for outreach to local teens through Girl's Club after school on Fridays, and lunch craft clubs in the schools. There is a lot of brokenness in this area pray these girls can be reached with the love of Jesus.
- L..... has a month to figure out university plans and her future. Some schools still haven't released financial aid info, which makes this decision more stressful. Pray things become clear and she has some good answers on what to do next.
- Please pray for our support situation, for God to bring people forward to be part of our support team. And many praises for those of you already on our team- we are so grateful for you!

The support we raise mainly goes to help us live and work here, but some is also going to ministry expenses- things like Bibles to hand out at book tables, or copies of the Easter story for children that each child coming to the Asha service on Easter will receive. **BIG SNOW YIELDS BIG EASTER** (There is MUCH more to this article than I have room to publish. Click <u>HERE</u> for the entire update)

Here's the cool thing that happened: ... The weather had been warming up just a bit at the end of March, and the extended forecast looked good for Easter day...our across-the-street neighbors told us that if we ever wanted to host an event outdoors, we could use their back patio and/or their garage rooftop deck. So, ... we've got a bright weather forecast and a nice decent sized outdoor meeting space and we've got EASTER.....Cathy and I decided to throw an Easter service and invite most of the people we've met. Keep in



mind, most of our new friends are in no way meaningfully connected to the Christian faith or the Christian church. This felt daring given the fact that the only GROUP EVENT we'd ever hosted up till this point was a Super Bowl party in February of 2020. I've hung out one-on-one with folks, Cathy's met people at her art gallery, we've constantly had people (a few at a time) over for porch dinners and hangouts (even through the winter), we've had summer holiday cookouts for smaller groups in our tiny front yard, and we've met people for outdoor dining (and indoor when allowed). Yet, this type of gathering would be a first! I was breaking from the typical game plan for church planting... but... hey... it's pandemic church planting, right?!?!?! ...It was a go-big-or-go-home moment. With only a week-and-a-half to go before Easter, we planned a full-blown Easter service, found a group of 4 great jazz musical artists in the city, and prepared a big luncheon feast after the worship gathering. I invited all our new friends and neighbors.

I was thinking it would be great if 5-10 responded. God surprised us in a BIG way. Including Cathy, Jeffrey Jr. (he was in town visiting), and I, we had 30 people show up for our Easter service!!! Over half the crowd were from other religious or non-religious backgrounds. It was a very eclectic group in many ways. The Spirit blessed the worship service. The music was powerful and super soulful. And, most of all, it was abundantly clear that Christ showed up as our honored guest. As my neighbor who hosted the event put it, "You could feel the spirit moving all over that roof deck!!" Afterward, several people got word to me regarding how people felt moved to consider more seriously the story of Jesus Christ and his resurrection from the dead. One attendee pointed out something I had not seen. He said that while I was leading the worship service, he and his wife observed a young woman who made her way to the outdoor stairway of her apartment building next door and started taking bong hits while attentively watching our entire service. That was a new one for me! Another friend said that one of her apartment flat mates was so moved by the sound of the music that she walked out into the back alley and listened to the service in its entirety.

The passage God brought to mind in the aftermath of our Easter service was:

Psalm 126:[1] When the LORD restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream. [2] Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with shouts of joy; then they said among the nations, "The LORD has done great things for them." [3] The LORD has done great things for us; we are glad. (ESV)

God is and always has been a God who shows up in his timing and surprises us. This was like a dream we couldn't have imagined. God has done a great thing and we are glad!

Pray that the Lord will help us figure out where to go with this. We planned a one-off event and didn't expect this kind of response. We desperately need the Lord to show us what's next – to give us the grace to discern what he's up to and to dive in and be a part of it.

PRAYERS AND PRAISES:

- For the Lord to bless the follow-up to our Easter service. In the power of Christ's love, I want to meet people where they are in terms of responding to their honest questions and struggles.
- For wisdom regarding where we go with the Easter service momentum. Do we find somewhere else to meet outdoors for a series of gatherings? Are there enough people interested in starting a small group? What kind of social events should we host?
- Pray for a jazz event we're hoping to host at Cathy's gallery in May.
- For the Spirit of our Risen Christ to continue empowering us to joyfully persevere in Pandemic Church Planting. For Christ to fill us full of Faith, Hope, and Love as we do so. For God to strengthen our private lives of communion with Christ.
- For God to help us find times to experience His rest during the stress of planting a church and establishing an art gallery business.


