Attendees Present: Teaching Elder Zach Hopkins and Ruling Elders Jim Mueller, Kevin Oak, Mic Penry, Patrick Shovar, and Keith Wilson. A quorum is present.

Pastor Zach acted as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer and read from Ephesians 4: 1-6. The Elders prayed for individual members of the congregation, then studied and discussed the Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 25: "The Church".

**Approval/Amendment of Docket:** Motion was made and seconded to approve the docket. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes: April 25th, 2021 minutes were reviewed. Motion made, seconded, and approved.

**Zach's Report:** Zach reported on members with health concerns and prayer needs. During the past month he conducted 2 office visits, 12 home visits, 2 hospital visits, a Zoom meeting with the Session and Nelsons, the Jim Doonan funeral, and participated in Buffalo Prairie EPC, VBS, and Mission Committee meetings and attended the RHS FCA Baccalaureate.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- The Nominating Committee has set up a meeting for May 27th.
- Zach is making plans for Leadership Training to be conducted in the fall.
- Rev. Wayne and Sandra Nelson will be welcomed into affiliate membership on Sunday, May 27th.
- Mathew and Jennifer Youck's children; Lexi, Liam and Emmi will be baptized on Sunday, June 13th. Ruling Elder Patrick Shovar will assist Zach with the baptism.
- COVID Guidelines: We discussed the impact of the changes that were made following the Session's April 27th decisions.
- The Shepherding Meeting was originally scheduled for December 5th 2020 and postponed due to COVID. The Session agreed to meet on June 12th, 2021, from 9:00am to noon.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- COVID Guidelines Discussion. The Elders reviewed the outcome or their discussions with members of the congregation. The Elders concluded that members are overwhelmingly in favor of relaxing COVID protocols. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to remove masking and distancing requirements for worship. Communion will continue to be served to the congregation coming forward and offering plates will continue to be placed in the entryway.
- Zach reported on recent Deacon and Mission Committee conversations concerning Outreach and Evangelism. Members of these committees are interested in seeing our church doing more outreach within our local community. More discussion needs to occur on ways to do this effectively.
- Zach reported that his next sermon series subject will be the Apostle's Creed. This will also be the topic of his Sunday School teaching during this sermon series.
- A request was reviewed concerning including a prayer in our worship service on June 13th for individuals in law enforcement. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to include such a prayer on June 13th.
- Zach shared the following dates for Summer and Fall Ministry events: VBS July 19th 23rd; Ice Cream Social August 22nd; Harvest Party TBD.

- Zach requested vacation from August 16th 23rd and will need pulpit coverage on August 22nd. The Session approved Zach's vacation request and Mic volunteered to fill the pulpit.
- Zach reported that there is the potential for a large Youth Communicant Class this fall and a fall Adult Membership Class.
- Communion will be held on June 6th. The next Stated Session meeting will be: June 29th, 2021 at 7:00pm.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting at 9:46pm. Motion Carried.


## **TRUSTEES**



### **MY FIRST THOUGHT...**

One Patient's Story in Her Words



Hi, I'm Bianca. (not patient's real name) I first heard about Pregnancy Resources in 2013 when I found out I was pregnant for the very first time at only 19 years old. I ended up having a miscarriage of the twins but during that time the staff was very caring and the environment was very welcoming. When I walked in the doors, I felt relief and weight was taken off because I was in a safe place.

Fast forward to 2020, I am now 27 and currently pregnant with my second child due in 2021. This pregnancy was also unplanned and Pregnancy Resources was my first thought. I could call them and I knew they could lead me in the right direction on where I needed to go and what was right. They could help me figure out what I needed to do. I made the call shortly after taking a home pregnancy test. The gal on the phone took my information and spoke to me for a little bit. It was incredible! She was so, so, so sweet and helped change my whole mindset on the situation and the journey I am walking now.

After the first appointment, I came back for my ultrasound to help determine how far along I was in my pregnancy. I was about 9 weeks pregnant and an emotional wreck! The father of the baby was absent—he decided to leave me shortly after finding out I was pregnant. I didn't have much of a support team or many to look to for help. I decided to take the parenting classes offered at Pregnancy Resources to help me retrace the steps of what I am going through again with a newborn as well as prep my mind mentally. With Pregnancy Resources, I am not doing this completely alone.

I will keep going no matter what; I have a two-year-old girl who turns three soon and soon have two beautiful girls. Thanks for showing you care so much gals at Pregnancy Resources!

### THE B.....'S

Serge Grace at the Fray

Last year we were in lockdown over Eid al fitr, so this was our first normalish experience of it while in L..... It was a very big reminder of the diversity of this area, and also why we are located here! A week before Eid, we were brought hot food and an Islamic tract from the local mosque. Then both A...... and J.....'s schools were closed for Eid, with the schools sending out messages of Happy Eid. A......'s school had a big Eid party the next day with children wearing their best clothes, samosas and other treats, and a big school zoom assembly. In the market, most shops were closed for Eid, while there were lines outside the mosque and into the park behind our house, as people waited socially distant to

go in and pray. We were very aware that we are a minority in this area- which makes it the perfect place to be.

We were able to hold another Asha service (Asha means "hope" and is the name of the church plant) last week. Again, many came and listened well, and stayed afterward for discussion and fellowship. We are planning monthly services over the summer, and also working on paperwork to make the church an official recognized charity. This is an exciting step in moving forward- please pray for wisdom for those doing all the legal stuff, and for God's leading as we plan services and events in the next couple months.

At our most recent service I noticed a couple girls, probably around 10, who were very excited about the puppet part of our service, specially aimed for children. They had also come to the Easter service, and we learned later that after Easter they had made their own show at home, retelling the Easter story using the Bible story book they had received. It is so encouraging to see things like this- the excitement they have and the knowledge they are gaining. Pray for us as we continue with services this summer - for ways to connect with adults, but also with the children that come.

English classes started again and have been going for two weeks. Class numbers have been small, so pray that more will come back, feel safe in the classroom space, and that they will learn both from the lessons and from the Bible story at the end. Pray for S.... and A..... as they teach.

Our local B..... church home and also the church hosting girl's club, has been able to get funding for all their afterschool club kids to get bikes and also learn how to ride them. The last two weeks the girls have been learning to ride bikes in the park. There have been tears and frustrations as they dealt with some embarrassment over being teens and not knowing how to ride, and struggles with how to be modest with a dress and a bike, but also big smiles of accomplishment when they mastered the skill. It is exciting to see them have this chance for a bit more independence and confidence.

During half term the girls will go on a day trip to learn about street art. Pray for opportunities during this time of bus rides and walks, to share deeper with them and just continue to let them know of a God that loves them.

Our team is planning to start book table outreach again now that markets are open and more people are out. Pray for Scott and other teammates as they are out- for good conversations with those that stop by, and also for people to take and read the Bible.

S....has been continuing to do boxing workouts/outreach with one of our plant teammates. Last week a couple more joined and they are praying for more. Exercise is a big interest in this area, so pray that this outreach can bring others in.

### **PRAYERS AND PRAISES:**

J..... is doing well adjusting to school here, but still feels the pressure of learning the system. Pray for him in learning how best to study and figure it all out. He also has had some deeper questions from some Muslim classmates about what he believes and why he won't just convert! Pray for wisdom for him as he responds and is a good witness for what he believes.

invisible when the government would do harm but visibility to those who are seeking to hear about Jesus. May pastors encourage, trust, and team with each other. **Pray** that the junta leaders have dreams and visions of Jesus that interrupt their sleep and thinking. May they hear that God will judge injustice and violence and learn the blessings of faith over political power and greed. **Pray** for peace & justice.

These men finished the second set of classes in March and are tasked with passing on the material to 30 other leaders each in their region of SE Asia. So far, we know that four have completed training classes and two are in progress reaching a total of 112 people.

The area is experiencing a resurgence of Covid cases in 25+ provinces making life challenging for people there. The WHO reports "clusters of cases" with the increase starting in May. Based on the team meeting last week this is a great concern for the people affected and the impact this will have on the October class. Only 1.8% of the country are evangelical believers; 53% Buddhist, and many are atheist. **Pray** that the Covid spread will stop, victims will be healed, and the gospel will increase & spread.

Ed continues working on the OT overview class for October and praying that travel to the class site will still be an option for students and us. The goal is to help them "connect the dots" of major biblical themes. **Pray** for Ed's uninterrupted, focused study time.

In late April Ed flew to North Carolina for an <u>ITEN Leadership Retreat</u>. It was a rich time of goal evaluation, planning, and celebrating accomplishments. Our site in the Middle East is experiencing great stress due to ungodly members on the Seminary Board. Would you please join us in **praying** for the Board to return to godly values that promote the Kingdom of God, for the four/five evangelical staff who are currently unpaid and sidelined, and for wisdom for next steps ITEN should take in this situation?

We both attended <u>Presbytery of the West</u> in Denver area and enjoyed time with supporters, friends, & peers with many encouraging conversations and presentations. Afterwards we enjoyed a meandering trip home visiting four national parks. We were inspired by the "kissing dinosaurs" at Arches National Park as you see in the picture at the top.

We both will be at the EPC's annual meeting, <u>General Assembly</u>, in Memphis June 21-25. If you will be there, let's connect! We'd love to arrange a time to set aside for you over a meal, in a hallway, whatever. Ed will be co-leading a Networking Lunch for Leaders of Small Churches. **Pray** for divine appointments and good connections with our supporters & Ed's Networking Lunch. If you are not attending, a number of the Assembly events will be live streamed, including worship services.

Nan's role with World Outreach as Senior Child Safety Officer summer tasks: 1. Record the updated Child Safety Refresher training which includes more info about online dangers & strategies for minors to use in body boundary safety. 2. Contact those needing refresher training. 3. Vet & Train a group of young adults in body boundaries before they head to the Middle East for a vision trip. **Pray** for effective completion.

This holiday weekend we are thankful and appreciative for the freedoms we have in our governmental system. Yes, we have plenty of challenges, but looking at what our brothers and sisters in SE Asia have lost under the military coup has been sobering.

We appreciate you. We pray blessings and peace upon you.




