



WHERE TO LOOK DURING THE LORD'S SUPPER

Every month at our Session meeting we review our plans for our celebration of the Lord's Supper among our church family. In the recent months the discussion has often centered around logistical and practical matters. For example: should we return to passing the bread and cup on trays among the pews? Why or why not? What do we like about the mode of having the congregation coming forward? We love to see families come forward for a blessing. Does this mode give people the proper time to prepare their hearts before receiving? Is this mode confusing even though we've been doing it for some time? All that to say – we care deeply about all of these things. For now, we still plan to administer the Supper in the same manner except with one change that was instituted in July – and that is, we plan to sing! We'll sing together as we wait, as we await our turn at the table, and after we've chewed and swallowed the bread and cup, as we're returning to our seats, and until the whole congregation has communed.

For even more practical reflection, consider this encouragement about where to look during as you celebrate communion.

LOOK UP - to your gracious Heavenly Father who invites you by grace to the sacrament. You don't deserve His grace and there is nothing you have done to earn His love. It's all about the wonderful salvation that He has provided in His Son. Lift your eyes by faith and fix your gaze upon your God.

LOOK IN – according to the Apostle Paul's direction and examine yourself (<u>1 Cor 11:27-28</u>). Confess your sins. Unburden your guilty conscience through the grace of repentance. Consider your need to grow in faith and maturity. Release the death-grip you have held onto your own self-righteousness with. Confirm by this examination that, sinner though you are, Jesus is the Savior of sinners. You qualify.

LOOK BACK – to the once for all sacrifice of Jesus upon the cross for God's people (<u>Heb 10:10</u>). We're told that these ordinary elements of bread and cup are a sign and seal of the new covenant. It directs us to the person and work of Christ who is the mediator of this life-giving covenant.

LOOK AROUND – at your fellow Christians. Paul's instructions in <u>1 Corinthians 11</u> are not just for individuals, but the church corporately. The Supper is a community meal that we take *together*. Are you in good standing with one another? Is there unity among us? Do you have love for one another and willingness to extend grace and forgiveness? We must look around and acknowledge that as we are united to Christ by faith, we are necessarily united to one another as well. Christianity is not an independent reality.

LOOK FORWARD – to what the fullness of the sacrament signifies. God has promised a future wedding feast that all our earthly communing anticipates (<u>Rev 19:6-9</u>). We're not there yet. And the grace and strength we need to press on and forward lies before us on the table as we look forward to the heavenly feast yet to come.

What a joy to join together as we turn our eyes upon Jesus and look full in His wonderful face!

- The Nominating Committee met in May and will begin to reach out to candidates.
- The Session reviewed the Youck family baptisms that were held June 13th.
- The Shepherding Meeting was originally scheduled for December 5th, 2020 and postponed due to COVID. The Session was unable to meet on June 12th, 2021 due to the Rursch funeral. A date for this will be established in the future.
- Zach reported on the 2021 41st EPC General Assembly that was held June 22nd 25th in Memphis.
- The Session discussed the need to further explore the conversation with the Deacons and Mission Committee concerning furthering the church's "Outreach and Evangelism".
- Keith gave an overview of the process of applying for loan forgiveness for the Payroll Protection Program loan that the church had received.
- Committee Reports:
- The Trustees met on June 6th and the Deacons met on June 13th.

• The Session discussed ministry and care for a church member.

Communion will be held on July 4th. The next Stated Session meeting will be: July 27th, 2021 at 7:00pm.

MISSION COMMITTEE

May 18, 2021

The Mission Committee met on May 18th, 2021 at 6:30pm in the basement at EEPC. Those attending were: Barb Freyermuth, Deb Wagamon, Todd Stegmiller, Kevin Oak, and Pastor Zach Hopkins.

Barb opened the meeting in prayer.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Previous Minutes: Approved
- **Skype Meeting with Burdsalls:** S.... updated us on the status of their ministry. July will mark 2 years they will have been in L...... They are just now moving out of lockdown and beginning to have indoor meetings. They are working with a search team (team leader is a member of PCA) and a church planting team, who began 18 months before they arrived. They have video outreach in place to reach out to seekers. S.... has received his certification to teach English and C..... is working with a local craft club at school. They are having meetings once a month through July, then a six-week summer break. In September they are hoping to begin meeting once a week. They currently have 30 35 non-Christians participating in their services.

Ministry Prayer Requests: to be able to move forward out of the pandemic lockdown; that Bible studies will continue; and that God will open the hearts of the B..... people to their ministry efforts. (The B..... are on the conservative side of the Church of E.....). Their current meeting place is a building owned by a Christian organization, so the rates are good. The Church planting efforts are going well; prayers this continues. Also, requesting prayers that the weekly meeting will continue to plant seeds.

Funding Support: S.... feels they are in a good place at this time. They have 88% of what they require for monthly support. At this time, they have a \$1,500 a month shortfall; however, they did have a large reserve in place before they arrived in E..... which they are using.

Personal Prayer Requests: Hoping to have everyone's first shots by July. Their oldest son is attending University of IA and will be going to South Korea to study this fall. Prayers this study trip will be approved so he can move forward in his preparations. Their daughter is beginning her first job. Prayers she does well with the transition. She also has asthma and has yet to receive her vaccine – prayers she remains healthy. Their youngest son had a birthday on Saturday – 15 years old – prayers for a happy celebration. There are few Christians in his school and tensions in Gaza. He struggles with pressure from peers and different religions. Prayers he continues to be strong as he faces these obstacles.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Mission/Deacon Meeting Review: Beth Flickinger joined the meeting to review the discussion she had with Barb concerning the Mission team's desire to be more effective in our outreach locally. The objective: to show the love of Jesus by caring for the physical and spiritual needs of our local community through the combined efforts of the Mission team and Deacons. Beth handed out a brief review of the meeting outlining ideas about how we can be more effective and where we need to be watchful in our outreach. Next Steps: Zach will outline our request to the Session. He may also reach out to other churches in the area to see how they are reaching out and assisting with local needs, both monetary and spiritual.
- **Minute for Mission:** Jim Reimers and Zach will do a video interview with the Burdsalls and present this for the Minute for Mission on May 30th.

Zach closed the meeting in prayer

Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 15th, 2021 at 6:30pm.

Serge Grace at the Fray

Happy 4th of July! Seems a bit of a shock that somehow it is July already - with the kids still in school and the temps being fairly cool, it hasn't felt like summer. This will probably be a shorter letter, but wanted to get something out, before the month moves on too far!

As we start to pick up pace here in ministry and things to do, I was reminded this week of where we need to keep our focus, and also that we can completely rest and trust in God's power.

"Unless the LORD builds the house, its builders labor in vain. Unless the LORD

watches over the city, the watchmen stand guard in vain. In vain you rise early and stay up late, toiling for food to eat-for he grants sleep to those he loves." Psalm 127:1-2

Pray that as we see all the things we can be doing, that we remember all of it is done through God's power, not our own. And pray that we can rest in that promise of God's power. Praying that for you too- as you all work for the Lord in your own areas and communities.

Some highlights of activities the past month and things to pray for this month:

The Asha service in June went well, even with slightly lower attendance. There was good discussion again, and we are happy to see repeat visitors. We will have another service on July 18th. The discussion will be over Abraham's sacrifice and how it points to Jesus. The celebration of Eid al adha (when Muslims celebrate their own version of Abraham's sacrifice) will be July 19th or 20th, so please be praying for good discussion at this Asha service, and for chances in general to share with our Muslim neighbors at this time.

English classes have had low numbers, although it has picked up some. We have a few more classes before break for school holidays. Pray that these classes go well and pray for increased numbers in the fall. Pray also for those that are quite engaged in the Bible stories at the end of lesson time, that these truths will make sense in their hearts.

The girl's club street art trip was very rainy! But the girls had a great time being creative and getting to try out their own stencils and art. We continue to pray for the girls to feel that club is a safe place, and for ways to share both that we care for them and that God cares for them. Pray for the time with them this summer with longer trips and a couple more bike riding times - for good chances to talk and share.

S.... was able to do one book table, which included both a loudly-singing, Scottish football fan and a Christian-believer that brought them cold water as a thank you for sharing Bibles. Since then, our team has had multiple times of kids being sent home to isolate, which has made book table hard to schedule. Pray for more chances during the rest of the summer.

This week we will have time with Serge missionaries in W. L..... - both to spend time praying and talking and to do some outreach in our respective areas. Pray for good outreach time and good connections with our extended mission family. All of these things have been put on hold for a year because of Covid, so we are looking forward to this time together.

FAMILY PRAYERS AND PRAISES:

- This has been a busy couple months pray for stamina as we have lots going on the next few weeks, and A...... and J..... have two weeks left in school. Pray that they can stay in person for these two weeks and not have to isolate. (A...... had a week of isolation last month, which was hard on everyone)
- We are going on vacation the last week of July! Pray that it is restful and a good time to spend as a family. Also pray that L..... can get off work and be able to join us.
- C.... is preparing to study abroad this fall, leaving mid-August. Pray for his preparations, and for his visa to process quickly and easily.
- J..... has been on the debate team at his school, and this past week they competed as one of the top 16 schools in a national competition. They didn't win, but it has been so great to see him enjoying and doing well in school here. A big praise.

McCallum's July Musings 2021

The World Outreach Child Safety Office Team

N..'s Notes:

Why does World Outreach have a Child Safety Office?

We are committed to the safeguarding of minors, people under 18, because they are vulnerable and need protection. Never do we want them to be abused emotionally, physically, or sexually or neglected. This is part of our

organizational DNA. Our proactive, robust application and intake process with vetting followed up by safeguarding training and periodic refreshing of all workers raises the standard of maintaining a safe, positive, nurturing environment for children guided by Biblical principles of morality and ethics.

How did you get into this and what do you do?

In 2012 E. came home from the EPC office and asked me a seriously off the wall question. Would I be willing to be trained to respond to reports of abuse within World Outreach? Three times abuse had impacted people I knew, raising my realization of minors' vulnerability. I could see some personal skills that would fit. Praying, I asked if my involvement would help to lessen the risk of abuse and keep workers on the field with their families safer from abuse? Was this a way I could keep God's name from being slandered by the horrible stories of child abuse? Was this something I could do at my stage of life and our with goals as a couple? My "YES" led from one thing to another in this field.

I give leadership to our team as the Senior Child Safety Officer. (Not reflective of my age. - I didn't pick the title.) During the application process, I do applicants' vetting, talking with references listening to see if there are red flags and if I would entrust my grandchildren with these candidates. Do they have a track record of wise decision-making regarding minors? I am getting to know the candidates through other people's eyes. My teaching background is well used in researching content and tailoring trainings for various audiences. G... and I together do scripted initial trainings and refreshers. We created a parenting video for preschool/elementary ages. To address local needs we provide personalized refreshers and consulting. G...'s years overseas and her education experiences have given her good application insights. My teaching background preschool - high school, my ability to ask questions, having tenacity, organizational skills, and enjoying a flexible schedule help me in this role. Personally, I have appreciated getting to know and pray for our workers the past nine years.

What's happened this month?

Two newly appointed World Outreach couples were trained along with our new Director and his wife. Many have and will complete refresher materials.

A group of 30 of high schoolers and adults from Tennessee and North Carolina received training before traveling up to D..... to learn about Islam and loving Muslims and ways to express it. Mornings were spent learning. Afternoons was serving Bangladeshi families with recently flooded basements. Can you imagine the teens hauling out soggy, smelly furniture and belongings likely wearing long gloves and maybe masks? They also spent time talking with these families, hearing their stories, and playing with their children. Evenings were spent in prayer and worship for the seeds sown hearts to grow into knowing God personally.

A second trip to C......, July 26-Aug 6, will involve a college age cohort who have been interacting for about a year online. Hosted by Centerville EPC in Fremont and Fremont EPC in Sacramento they will connect with Muslim communities. This is a dynamic group with strong encouragement from their references. Pray for them please.

What are some topics you cover in training? I'm so glad you asked!

Our bodies have private areas that in our culture we cover with underwear and bathing suits. Minors and adults need to respect this. Minors need to be empowered to say to others, "Don't touch me or I'll tell." Or "I'm not into hugs, how about a High 5 instead?" Parents are empowered to say to adults, "Let my child initiate touch."

As we interact with friends, family, or strangers we need to train ourselves in safeguarding and boundary standards to protect us from false accusations and to model wise actions for others. Increase visibly when with minors and decrease isolation. One on one is a bum!

Our tech devices open up wonderful ways to explore the world, meet people, and have fun, but being aware of potential risk factors is needed to prevent heartaches. I encourage all to be proactive. A resource is: Axis and their e-publication The Culture Translator for families with tweens and teens. https://axis.org/culture-translator/ Be present for your kids; listen to what they tell you. This will keep the door open if they have something serious to tell you in the future.

Happy Summer to you!

Our family just returned from a week in Memphis, TN for the EPC General Assembly. This was the first time since 2019 that we'd been able to gather in person with representatives from EPC churches across the country and with our World Outreach family. It was SO GOOD to be with everyone!

One of the highlights of the week was getting to meet the new director of EPC World Outreach, Gabriel de Guia, and his wife Rachel. We are very excited to welcome them to the family and see how they build on the incredible foundation laid by our former director Phil Linton and his wife Janet. Here is an article of introduction if you'd like to read more about the de Guias. A very small-world connection: Rachel lived in the tiny country of Lesotho, Africa (where Jesse was born) at the same time that the Dimmocks were there!

Another highlight was being able to gather in person with members of our Missions Cohorts! We kept our kids up waaaay past their bedtime to hang out with a group of seven young adults interested in long-term missions (and to introduce them to 8 workers with field experience). We pray that God would bless the connections made during that gathering for his glory and the furthering of his kingdom. It was also fun throughout the week to find the fathers and pastors and elders who saw the missions calling in the lives of all our cohort members and connected them with us. We tried to take pictures with each of them to share in our group chat.

We were able to share in front of the whole assembly about our work with the Missions Cohorts and came away with a couple of connections for the next groups. Finally, we witnessed the commissioning of TWELVE long-term global workers! It was a huge blessing to be able to lay hands on them and pray for them as they were sent out by the denomination especially exciting for Josh and Katya, a couple that we began coaching through the application process in 2019.

Our week in Memphis was just the beginning of a busy season for us. We are grateful for God's answered prayers, but would love for you to join us in praying for the next couple of months. Here are some specifics:

- Jesse's pregnancy: Pregnancy in the heat of the summer is not the most comfortable thing and Jesse's feeling it...
 especially with four other littles to care for. Praise the Lord that she's been able to start some physical therapy so
 that's been helping, but we'd appreciate continued prayers. Please pray for comfort and strength for Jesse and for this
 new baby boy on his way. He is due mid-August (though Jesse wouldn't mind it if he came a week early).
- Protection from the enemy: Saul has two more trips coming up before the baby arrives and it's not uncommon for us to deal with more physical ailments, house maintenance needs, communication issues, or mental stress leading up to his travel. Please pray protection over our house and family and work as we prepare for these mission trips.
- Summer Jam: Saul will be in Hamtramck, MI the week of July 12th facilitating a high school trip where students will learn about Muslim Outreach and how to "Find Somewhere Different to Love Your Neighbor." Please pray for everything to come together for the trip: lodging, travel, materials, worship, etc. and that seeds of love for different people groups would be planted in these high school youth.
- MC1 Trip: Originally, the plan was for Saul to help lead 6 of our college cohort students to Jordan (in the Middle East) for two weeks in July. Things have changed and that trip has now been postponed to Winter break (hopefully). Instead, the group will travel to Sacramento, CA from July 26 August 6 to work with a large Pashtun (Afghan) community there and to even do a soccer camp! Please pray for the college students as they deal with the disappointment of not going to the Middle East. Pray for the details to fall into place for this trip as it gets planned in a matter of weeks!

Thank you so much for your prayers and encouragement in this season! We couldn't do this work (and keep our sanity) without you. 


