



"TO GLORIFY GOD, & ENJOY HIM FOREVER"

Each year in our annual report we publish a summary of our membership. In this list we identify that our membership is divided into four different categories that our church constitution outlines. Those categories are: Baptized, Active, Affiliate, and Inactive. In the next four editions of the newsletter, I'll be outlining each of the four with points of application for your consideration.

The Baptized Roll: This list includes the names of those infants and children baptized in the local church, and the names of those baptized children of confirmed members received from other churches.

Because we believe that the children of believers are members of the covenant community by right of birth and adoption – they are included as non-communing members of the church. That means, they are members in one sense, but not in the sense of coming to eat and drink at the Lord's Supper. In order to disciple them in covenant nurture, they are entitled to pastoral oversight and instruction with a view to their embracing Christ and thus possessing personally all the benefits of the covenant or, "owning Christ for themselves." Upon such occasion, they would be admitted to the Lord's Supper by the Session.

As children of the Covenant, members of the baptized roll should be regularly reminded of their privileges as recipients of the sign of the covenant (baptism). We do this especially when we administer the sacrament of baptism when we call the children forward to the front row to remind them that "this happened to you." Of course, they don't remember it – which is exactly the point – God's grace precedes our reception. We must embrace what has first been promised and held out.

A person moves off the baptized roll, either by 1) becoming a communicant member by way of profession of faith (i.e. Communicants Class process), or 2) upon credible information that the person has become a member of another church. We have 35 precious covenant children on the baptized roll of our church. We owe them and their parents our love, prayer, and encouragement as fellow members of the household of faith.

What can I do to **encourage parents** of covenant children at Edgington?

Lend a hand to help when kiddos are extra busy in church. Give a supporting smile to a weary parent. Refrain from passing judgment on their circumstances. Remember that parents are wondering if their effort is "worth it." Do everything you can to assure them that the answer is YES! And then help them! Pray for them.

What can I do to assist in the spiritual nurture of the faith of our covenant children?

Volunteer! We need Sunday School teachers and assistants. We need help in various ministries that serve and engage children in service. Learn the names of our children and greet them individually. Tell them how glad you are to see them. Pray for them.

Praise God for the covenant children of EEPC! We love them dearly, as a testimony of God's all-surpassing love for us in Jesus Christ. We want them to know of that love, embrace it, and treasure it all the days of their lives. My sincere prayer for each of them is that they would never know a day in their life when the name of Jesus was not precious to them. Will you join me in that prayer? And join our church in the loving stewardship of every one of covenant children? What a joy!


#### **TRUSTEES**






Pastor Zach is on Facebook Live every Sunday morning at 10am for our Lord's Day Worship Service .


