


The changing of the calendar to a new year brings both new mercies and opportunities for growth in Christian discipleship. To that end I am excited to share some information about our upcoming sermon series for the first half of 2022. Together we'll be digging into Paul's epistle to the church in Colossae.

Why Colossians? Well, truth be told, I don't have an explicitly specific reason other than it's a New Testament book. It's been my pattern to preach an Old Testament book and then a New Testament book with a topic series in-between. So, after Ecclesiastes and the Apostles' Creed, it's time to return to the New Testament – and Colossians is the choice.

I remember that it was this book that the Lord first used in my life when I started to read the Bible for myself as a new Christian believer. It was clear to me that I ought to be reading the Bible, but I didn't have a lot of direction as to how to read the Bible. So, when I was in college I received some advice to pick a shorter book out of the 66 books of the Bible and read it in its entirety, every single day, for one month. That's what I did with Colossians. It was amazing how much fresh insight came day after day in this wonderfully rich book.

Paul writes to this congregation about the glories of Christ and how we as Christians grow into maturity in Christ. The Apostle is also concerned to warn the believers in the first century, and by extension, you and I in this century, about the dangers and distractions of false teaching. As I've outlined the sermons, I plan to not only preach expositionally through the book, but also to take one or two scenic bypasses on the topics of Gender/Identity/Human Sexuality and also Christian Baptism. While there could certainly be more of these wonderful



sideroads, it seems to me that these two topics might be some of the most relevant and beneficial for us today. As we take up the message of Colossians, I am hopeful that these ancient truths will be freshly relevant and beneficial for us.

Would you accept my encouragement to take up the book of Colossians on your own in preparation for our sermon series? Whether you take the approach that I so wonderfully enjoyed many years ago or commit yourself to reading through Colossians one or two times before we begin our studies together, I am confident that your investment of spiritual discipline will produce wonderful returns.

I look forward to seeing you in the New Year!

Attendees Present: Teaching Elder Zach Hopkins and Ruling Elders Jim Mueller, Kevin Oak, Mic Penry, Patrick Shovar, and Keith Wilson. A quorum is present.

Pastor Zach acted as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer and read from Acts 15:1-35 and 16:4-5. The Elders prayed for individual members of the congregation, then studied and discussed the Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 31: "Synods and Councils".

Approval/Amendment of Docket: Motion was made and seconded to approve the docket. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes: November 2nd, 2021 minutes were reviewed. Motion made, seconded and approved.

Zach's Report: Zach reported on members with health concerns and prayer needs. During the past month he conducted 1 office visit, 2 home visits, Bible studies at Brookstone, moderated Trinity Presbyterian Church in Sparta, IL Session's meeting via remote ZOOM, held 3 communicant class meetings, conducted memorial service for Clarissa Jahn.

Old Business:

- The Session reviewed the list of nominations for nominating committee.
- Zach reminded the Session of the upcoming Shepherding meetings. The first session will be held on Saturday, December 4th from 8:00 to 10:00am. The second session will be held on Tuesday, December 7th from 5:00 to 7:00pm. Session members are encouraged to refresh their learnings from "The Shepherd Leader".
- Church directory update. Lisa and Zach are still considering options for Church Management Software and will be deciding soon.
- Zach reviewed his plans for Adult Sunday School and Worship for the 2021 Advent Season. Lessons will be based upon "The Songs and Stories of Christmas in the Gospel of Luke".
- The Session discussed the outcomes of the "Day of Thanksgiving" devotions that the Session had called the congregation to observe on Thanksgiving. The devotions that Zach had prepared for this were very helpful.
- Zach shared a draft of the budget that the Finance Committee had prepared. In order to complete the budget, the Personnel Committee and Trustees need to review and provide input.
- The Annual Meeting will be held on January 30th, 2022 at 12:15 following a soup luncheon sponsored by the Presbyterian Women.

Keith gave a report on the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) which was enacted as part of the CARES Act that was signed into law as a response to the COVID pandemic. In April 2021 the church had applied for and received a loan from this program in the amount of \$21,300. Keith recently applied for loan forgiveness as provided by the Act. This forgiveness has been granted and no further action is required.

New Business:


- Steve and Amy Ryser have requested to have their children, Travis and Olivia, baptized. A

- Zach discussed his desire to schedule two weeks maternity time upon the birth of his second child. The Session was in favor of this knowing that at this time the dates are uncertain. Mic has been preparing messages for the time that Zach will be off.

Communion will be held on December 5th, 2021. The next Stated Session meeting will be Thursday, January 13th, at 7:00pm. The Session will study Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 32: "The Condition of Man After Death and the Resurrection of the Dead" at that time.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting at 9:34pm. Motion Carried.



Some updates on ministry things:

- Our Thanksgiving outreach went very well. We had up to 70 people come over in the afternoon many English class members, school friends, and families of team kids, some girls from Friday club. Everyone seemed to have a good time and also enjoy the food. It was very encouraging to be able to welcome people this way and celebrate with them, while also getting to know them more personally.
- S.... and others on our team have been able to do book tables more regularly now last week S.... said they had one man asking very deep, on the spot questions while another rather drunk man was yelling at them...and a large crowd gathering as a result. Pray for those at the tables, that they can answer calmly and wisely, and show love in how they present the gospel. Pray also for those stopping by - that God would speak to them through the gentle answers of S.... and the others there.
- English classes are growing! There are many more ladies coming and more men as well. Pray for S.... and our teammate as they lead classes and figure out how best to teach the many levels of ability. Pray also for the Bible story time and those that stay to listen.
- Asha services have been a little lower in attendance since the colder and darker days, but there are still people coming, and some very regularly. Pray for those that come, that their questions and seeking would be answered, and pray that we can figure out the best time for meeting in these winter months. We are also doing a Christmas service on the 19th, and a craft event for families on the 21st. Pray for the planning and that both will be well attended.
- S.... had a chance to talk with the youth group that J..... Attends giving advice on how to speak to their Muslim friends when they have questions. These kids are getting some hard questions on a regular basis - pray for them and their faith as they work to answer wisely.
- S....'s eyes are much better- he has some drops that have healed them considerably. Thanks for the prayers!
- J..... and L..... are both working on future schooling plans- J.... with decisions on 6th form and L..... with decisions on universities (here or in the US?) Pray for God's guidance for them.

I did check up on our support account this past week though, and it made me cry (in a very good way). We have been well supported this past year, and that is such a gift and blessing to us. We are aware that things have not been easy during covid, so we appreciate so much your commitment to us, and to being part of this work here in T.... H......

CHURCH PLANTING AND PARENTING: DIRTY YET REWARDING JOBS

Over the course of 2021, I've seen the Lord show up and convince me of his presence in big and small ways. To name a few:

- In October I had the privilege to assemble for a day of fellowship, worship, and prayer with a couple of hundred women and men from all over Chicagoland people of various ethnicities, wildly divergent backgrounds, and very different ministry contexts gathering to pray for the healing knowledge of Jesus Christ to cover Chicago as the waters cover the sea. CUIP (Chicagoland United in Prayer) is a great organization. When I gather with this fellowship I sense God powerfully at work in our city (in big and small ways). To hear the testimonies opens your eyes to the reality that the Lord of the harvest is on the move.
- I've watched God open up doors of opportunity for me to build relationship connections with ministry leaders in our city. I'm seeking these leaders out to see if they will consider loaning us church members who can help us form a launch team to move our church planting effort forward in the aftermath of the COVID lockdown. I covet your prayers for this. God is giving me favor with these dear minister friends, but it's a big ask given everyone is still trying to navigate their respective ministry contexts and figure out their new ministry normals in our COVID world.
- I've continued to see God at work mysteriously moving in the heart of a dear friend of mine and Cathy's. Over dinner a few weeks back this young woman was pouring her heart out regarding past dating relationship nightmares, the COVID deaths of @20 of her relatives in India, the death of her father a year-and-a-half ago, and the struggles of relating with an abusive mother. At one point in the conversation, she acknowledged that her life has no solid foundation from which she can face life's hardships and move forward in hope. It was a joy to tell her again about the solid rock God has given us in Jesus Christ. I continue to pray for this dear one who has opened up her life to us and given us the privilege of being her friend.

- For good holiday time in Chicago with our children and neighbors. Pray for us to relax and enjoy some downtime.
- Pray for our continued investment in the lives of individuals. Would love to see God bring about startling conversions and deeper encounters with Christ. Pray for God to use us to raise up more Christ-followers to love their neighbors and our city.
- Pray for God to bring us missional-minded Christians who want to labor with us in this church planting
 endeavor. Pray for my continued efforts to seek out ministry leaders asking if they will loan us some

- Pray for me as I seek to start a couple of (Re) Considering the Historic Jesus studies in January. These are 6
 -8 week investigative seeker studies offering a safe context to consider the historic claims of Christ.
 Hopefully, I can launch one in our neighborhood and one at a downtown office.

Can we see these situations as times of refining and trusting in the goodness of God? Lord, change our thinking so that we grow in dependence on You.

Nan has jumped in with passion volunteering with the IRC in refugee resettlement. She is finding it to be great fit for her skills. One Middle Eastern family has told us we are now their parents and the grandparents to their kiddos. What an honor and responsibility. If you wonder if your area is receiving refugees, check it out. You don't have to speak their language just the language of caring. There are many ways to get involved and become the hands and feet of Christ to people from places where they haven't meet Christians nor heard the gospel. ITEN SITES UPDATE

In my last newsletter I shared news about the current state of our sites. In particular, I highlighted the plight of our friends in Myanmar, the governmental restrictions for our partners in Russia, and the possibility of war in Ethiopia. In the months that have passed since that newsletter hit your inbox, more conflict has emerged around the globe. Particularly as it relates to ITEN, two more of our global sites have been upended by violence.



First, on October 25th, the hope of a transition into democracy for Sudan came to an end in a military coup. Then, just 2 weeks later, Americans began fleeing Ethiopia as rebel armies began marching towards the capital city of Addis Ababa.

While we remain prayerful that both conflicts will end quickly and peaceably, it was another reminder that ministry leaders in these parts of the world face greater obstacles to theological education than simply access or finances alone. Please join us as we seek God's wisdom and discernment regarding how best to support our national partners amid these latest tragedies.

Return to Si. L.

Lord willing, I will finally board a plane again in January 2022 and join with our brothers and sisters in S. L. for a week of pastoral training. We currently have 25 pastors registered for the event and I will be assisted by our faithful friend and colleague, B. M. from Liberia. Our course will center on the major themes of pastoral ministry including preaching, pastoral care, church administration, and worship. Please join me in prayer from January 1-8 as we launch our newly designed program.





Back to A.....

In February, I will have the opportunity to return to A..... where I will teach a course for ISTL. I will have the honor of hosting several guests from the US who will join me on the trip to explore possible ministry partnerships with the school and throughout in the Balkans. I will be traveling from February 5-12.






