"TO GLORIFY GOD, & ENJOY HIM FOREVER"

Each year in our annual report we publish a summary of our membership. In this list we identify that our membership is divided into four different categories that our church constitution outlines. Those categories are: Baptized, Active, Affiliate, and Inactive. In 2022, I am using the newsletter to explain each of these categories. In February, we considered the baptized role. This month, we'll consider the role that most folks have in mind when they consider church membership.

The Active Roll: This list includes all communicant members, that is, those who have been baptized and made a public profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

How does someone become an active member?

There are three ways a person could become an active member. Hopefully, you'll recognize in these options how you came into the family of God here in Edgington. The first way is by **profession of faith.** In this instance a person petitions the Session for membership and undergoes some form of course of instruction (think: communicants' class or membership class) so that the Session might receive confidence of a person's intention to fulfill their membership vows. If a person has not previously been baptized, they should be baptized prior to professing their faith and joining the church. In many joyful circumstances, we can move the names of students from the baptized roll to the active roll as the sign of their baptism becomes a reality by their living trust in Jesus. The second way to become an active members is by **reaffirmation of faith**. This process involved someone who was previously an active membership. To do so, they would stand in front of the congregation and again affirm their faith and trust in Christ alone. The final way is by **transfer of membership**. Because we believe in the universality of the church, we recognize the memberships of individuals in other Bible believing churches and are happy to welcome these folks, still by way of a class and public profession, to our church family.

What are the rights and responsibilities granted to active members?

That's another way of asking, "what is the benefit of church membership?" Among many things we could highlight, here are a few very important ones: Active members are called communicant members because they are authorized by the Session to commune at the Lord's Supper. Of course, we welcome guests who sincerely receive and rest upon Jesus as He is offered in the Gospel but being among our membership gives one the confidence that they may and indeed should come to the Table as they continue in faith. Another benefit is that active members receive the shepherding care of the Elders and Deacons. Being a member is equated with being known; it's hard to care for people you don't know, and much simpler to meet the needs of folks that are known. Another responsibility is the participation in the government of the Church by voting in meetings of the congregation. Admittedly, as an Elder-led Church, there are not overwhelming opportunities for congregational votes, but when they take place, your involvement is essential. Congregations especially vote on: the calling of a Pastor and the election of Church Officers that have been nominated from among themselves.

How to continue in active membership?

Very simply, by continued participation which we define as attendance and financial support of the ministry. If someone asks, how few times does one have to attend in a year to still be considered an active member, it's clear that person does not understand the purpose of membership.

In an age when "membership" gets lumped together with everything from civic organizations to media streaming platforms – we need to continually reaffirm the dignity and worth of identifying oneself with the visible church of Jesus Christ. That is why we have the active member roll. I hope these reminders are helpful.

Attendees Present: Teaching Elder Zach Hopkins and Ruling Elders Jim Mueller, Kevin Oak, Mic Penry, and Patrick Shovar. RE Keith Wilson was excused. A quorum is present.

Pastor Zach acted as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer and read from Acts 6. The Elders prayed for individual members of the congregation and then studied and discussed the Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 32: "The Condition of Man After Death and the Resurrection of the Dead."

Approval/Amendment of Docket: Motion was made and seconded to approve the docket. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes: November 30th, 2021, minutes were reviewed. Motion made, seconded, and approved.

Zach's Report: Zach reported on members with health concerns and prayer needs. During the past several months he conducted many visits including: 5 office, 14 home, 2 hospital, 4 funerals, and other activities such as PW planning, Brookstone Bible study, and the 34th RLP meeting. Zach took questions and asked for feedback on a few matters he was seeking counsel.

OLD BUSINESS:

- The details of our Shepherding Ministry were reviewed. Updates about spreadsheets, logistics, and record keeping were received. Lisa is working very hard to get Servant Keeper (Church Management Software) up to speed for our benefit.
- The online directory is progressing through Servant Keeper. The congregation is encouraged to submit photos to the office.
- The 34th RLP Meeting was reviewed. RE's Oak, Shovar, and Mueller reported on their attendance. RE Penry was commended for his service as Presbytery moderator, for which we are all very proud.
- The details for the 2021 Annual Meeting were reviewed. The original date was postponed and has been re-scheduled for February 27th after worship and a PW hosted soup luncheon. The reports were reviewed and approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

- The 2021-2022 Communicants' Class schedule was reviewed with special attention given to dates needing RE participation, including the student examinations. The students are on track to join on Palm Sunday.
- Travis & Olivia Ryser have been previously approved for baptism, the date of March 27th has been determined. Steve and Amy will meet with TE Hopkins and RE Wilson on a date prior to this for instruction.
- The Elders discussed a question related to Church Greeters. Church Greeters are secured by the Deacons for services and should be a member of the church. Follow-up communication will be given as necessary.
- It was M/S/C to set the Easter schedule as follows: 7pm Good Friday Service (April 15th); 8:30am Breakfast, and 10am Worship (April 17th). Gratitude was expressed to Tara Johnson for leading the efforts for the breakfast.
- It was M/S/C to establish the spring adult membership class schedule as follows: classes on April 24th, May 1st, May 8th, with membership vows and reception on May 15th.




- Two Facility Use requests were approved.

- Communion will be held on March 6th, 2022. The next Stated Session meeting will be Tuesday, March 29th, at 7:00pm. The Session will study Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 33: "The Last Judgment" at that time.

Hello all and happy New Year! Our January was a strange one, so it feels like we are still figuring out this new year stuff! We had C.... here for three weeks after Christmas, and had a great time catching up and spending time together. We ate a lot of kimchi and heard all about his time in Seoul. He is now back at the university for his second semester. Then, a few days after he left, we got hit with Covid - L....., then S.... and A...... None of them were very ill, but there is a 10 day isolation period (unless you test negative sooner - L..... did, S.... and A...... went the whole 10 days) which made everything feel a bit upside-down! Everyone is better and

UPDATES ON MINISTRY THINGS:

We had a joyful Christmas Asha service, which involved all the children there in the storytelling and celebration (without any pre-practice!). We were able to go from Genesis to Jesus, laying out why He was born and the need He filled. The service also featured a debut Sylheti Christmas song, translated from Bangla for the service!

We also held a family craft event right before Christmas where we made wreaths and told about Jesus through some facts about wreaths and the symbolism behind them. It was a fun time that was well attended, and with some lovely wreath creations made!

At a recent Asha service, we had a mom and her kids come again, after being gone for a

bit. One of the kids said that they loved the Sunday School time and had been asking the mom to come back! So encouraging that they enjoy it, but more so, that they are hearing of Jesus through this. Pray that we can continue to share well, and be engaging also!

Continue to pray for ESOL classes, as new people come, and especially for those who stay to hear the Bible story after class. In the lady's class yesterday, there was discussion and agreement that Jesus was special and no one else was like Him. Pray that this acknowledgement grounds the further learning about who Jesus is and what He came to do, and can lead to a recognition by these ladies that He is more than just a prophet.

We feel like we are still figuring out our schedules and how to not rush from one thing to another, and how to have time to connect more with individuals. Pray that we can work through that, and especially pray for S.... and good connections with some guys he has met with in the past - that schedules would line up so they can meet again.

Last weekend we were able to join Rivers and Lakes Presbytery meeting (via ZOOM) and share about what we are doing here. We are really grateful for the chance to do that and to see people too!! We really appreciate all the support!

We have a new Serge team member joining us this month! Pray for her move here and settling in time. We are excited to have her here with us!

Thank you to all of you that are supporting us! Monetarily, prayerfully, or both - we feel very blessed by all of you! And, thank you especially for all the Christmas love! Cards, gifts, emails - you really touched our hearts! Thankyou!!

Wanted to share again - your support goes to help us live here, but also toward ministry expenses we have while here. For example: at Christmas, we were able to buy material telling the message of Jesus' birth that we gave to every child that came to Asha. We also bought some craft supplies for the wreath making event. Thank you for supporting us, but also those in our Asha community.

And, we are at around 90-95% of our needed monthly support, but that is with monthly support and one-time gifts combined. Both are helpful. Classes are beginning!

Praising God! We heard last week that our March classes in V..... will be able to meet! Travel documents have been sent to the participants so they can come. Sadly, we can't be there in person as visas are not yet available. E. will "travel" nightly via Zoom. We are thankful that the group can meet.

Mr. H, our talented administrator will be very busy to get all the details in place. Pray for his energy and problem solving.

Class 1 is on Missions and Evangelism.

Pray for content - biblical, practice, and strategies - to deeply impact their minds and hearts. They will go home with plans to do two "missions events" for their churches.

Pray that God would instill in the churches a desire to reach other people groups who haven't heard the gospel yet.

E. will teach the second week on Old Testament Survey. Old Testament Survey will look at the overarching story of God reaching out to people, drawing them to become "the People of God." Class members have the assignment of teaching the content to other leaders.

Pray for the content to come alive as they look at the stories of real people, real life situations, and a real God who relates to people. That each person will have a handle on each book of the Old Testament.

Pray for the participants to have honest dialog and prayer in their small groups

All the materials have been translated into the national language and the mother tongue of the participants.

E. began Monday to switch time zones. His late nights gives him lots of quiet time to work ahead on the October class on Genesis. He says each chapter has held questions he has always wanted to delve into. The study has been personally enriching for him.

N.. received good news last week on her one eye with macular degeneration. For the first time since September 2020 there was no leakage visible in the photo at her retinal appointment. Praise God!

N.. has begun teaching ESL through an organization called Matthew House. She is working with a refugee family from the Central African Republic, a country both she and E. visited in 2009. She was part of the mission team at an EPC church who decided to come along side of the Bungui Evangelical Theological Seminary - an African seminary run by Africans focusing on French speaking countries. If you know someone studying French, let them know that there are more French speakers in African than in Europe. Could God be calling them to be a global worker in either Africa or Europe?

We had a Middle Eastern refugee couple over to watch the Super Bowl. We are guessing that this was their first time to visit in a home of Christians. The family of 6 enjoyed watching the game on TV, playing games that didn't need lots of talking (Chess and Othello) and making paper beads for jewelry. They were surprised to eat humus with tortilla strips, Dots, pretzels, and vegetables. The big hit was when the children climbed a ladder and picked oranges to take home. We are growing a friendship with them relying on Google translator on our phones. Our prayer is that they would see God within us and desire to have this same type relationship of knowing God's love, acceptance, and forgiveness.

Life has been good here. We hosted a newlywed couple, John and Samantha, for part of January and February. They are a dynamic Christian couple who have become part of our family. John created a NGO using music therapy and music lessons for under-served children and teens. Sam teaches birth through 3 yr. olds how to listen and speak. So all are enjoying the cross-generational friendship. We were reminded of past friends who have lived with us and how we have been blessed to experience these opportunities.

Blessing to you. We take joy in knowing you, serving with you, and being sent by you!




