"TO GLORIFY GOD, & ENJOY HIM FOREVER"

Each year in our annual report we publish a summary of our membership. In this list we identify that our membership is divided into four different categories that our church constitution outlines. Those categories are: Baptized, Active, Affiliate, and Inactive. In 2022 I am using the newsletter to explain each of these categories. So far, we considered the baptized and active role. This month, we'll consider the roll that is most often puzzling to folks.

The Affiliate Roll: This list is for believers temporarily residing in locations other than their permanent homes.

Why does this roll exist? An affiliate member would be someone who wants to maintain their membership in their home church, but also come under the formal care of another church for a particular time.

What are some of the envisioned scenarios for this roll? If someone is an affiliate member it assumes, first of all, that they are an active member in good standing at some other church. The second assumption is that they are geographically separated from their ability to attend that specific church for a period of time. Finally, when that scenario exists, that individual may petition to be received as an affiliate member of a church, which would retain their active membership, while also affording them the benefits of membership in another church for a temporary time. Some of the envisioned scenarios for this type of membership may include, with Edgington specific examples in mind: 1) a military officer has been appointed to a position at the Rock Island Arsenal and is looking to come under the shepherding care of a Reformed Church during his/her temporary duty assignment, 2) an Augustana college student's home church is EPC and they desire to worship at a fellow EPC church while they are in school. In both instances, the individual belongs somewhere else, but is looking to temporarily belong at Edgington.

What can/can't affiliate members do? Affiliate members have all the rights and privileges of church membership, except for voting in a congregational meeting and holding elected office in the church which they are only temporarily associated with. That means, they would be welcome to participate in the life and ministry of the church and be a recipient of the shepherding care of the Elders and Deacons. Affiliate members would join the church the exact same way other members would who are transferring an existing church membership – through a Session approved course of instruction and examination. Technically, according to our polity, affiliate member status is good for one year at a time, subject to review, but is certainly renewable.

The benefit of understanding about this unique roll is that it promotes a view of the church that reflects its catholicity or universality. Edgington is of course not the only church. We are a part of the Church (note the capitol "c") of Jesus Christ. Within that Church, the Evangelical Presbyterian Church exists as a denomination of assembled churches in local places (like Edgington). But the EPC isn't the only denomination that is a part of the True Church. When we remember that we are a part of the larger worldwide Body of Christ, then we will understand the wisdom in embracing brothers and sisters to join among us for a period of time. To embrace those individuals is what is in view with the affiliate member roll.

HUBER-VENTURES Stories from Jordan...Finally! (click <u>HERE</u> for the full update)

At the start of the year, eight of our mission cohort students, a handful of EPC WO leaders and myself (Saul) returned from a two-week trip to Jordan. While there we worked alongside an amazing organization led by Jordanian Christians, serving refugees from Iraq, Yemen and Syria who have previously fled their wartorn home countries and found refuge in Jordan. This was easily one of the best trips I have ever experienced... in part because it started off with so much uncertainty, but mostly because God did things we could have NEVER imagined! Here are some of the ways we ministered to refugees alongside our Jordanian brothers and sisters:





• Organizing clothing that will be distributed to refugee families.

• Scraping walls at a building that is going to be used to serve refugees with sewing/ computer training, English classes, a medical clinic, exercise classes for Muslim women, and even discipleship for new believers.

- On another day, we traveled north where a few of our students in medical fields spent the day at a clinic that specializes in Tuberculosis treatment.
- We visited a woman who is the lone believer in her entire family/village of Muslims, where we got to encourage and pray for her.
- We got to play soccer with a group of kids and give a goat to a group of local village leaders to help them start a new reproducing goat project.
 - leaders to help them start a new reproducing goat project.
 - We even had the joy of attending and ministering in a couple local Iraqi Christian churches.

The main way we supported our Jordanian ministry partners was through home visits, which meant we got to spend half of our time serving in the apartments of refugee families. Those visits were the ones that wrecked us—they were so challenging and so rewarding.

Our team split into small groups. Each group would enter the home of an Iraqi, Yemeni or Syrian family with a food bag, clothing bag and gift bag for the kids, and would proceed to assess if they had any other physical needs that our host organization could meet. These mostly Muslim families would usually offer coffee or tea and then share their harrowing stories of losing homes, friends, and family members as they fled the wars in their home countries. Not a single family was untouched by incredible sadness, loss, and tragedy. I found myself leaving the apartment of a Syrian family whose story was particularly heartbreaking, getting in the car and weeping uncontrollably.

Into the darkness though, God infused light! Muslims talk about God often, which would open doors for us during our conversations with them. We were then able to bring up stories from the Bible and talk about hope and God's love, and, when appropriate, share the good news of the Gospel. Some of the responses were incredible... a testament to the Holy Spirit already drawing these families to Himself. In all the home visits, we saw nine different people (half of them Muslim) profess faith in Jesus Christ as their savior! Praise God! (At this point in the update Saul tells a story about an elderly refugee couple that commits their lives to Christ. PLEASE, click <u>HERE</u> to read the story and be encouraged!)

- 1. God is reaching the unreached! He is pursuing those that have never had the chance to hear the good news of Jesus Christ.
- 2. God is truly raising a generation of evangelists. There's plenty of data out there about how young people have left the churches in large numbers, BUT there's still a crowd of young adults that are passionate about sharing the Gospel.
- ^{3.} You're a huge part of this! Through your prayers, donations, and relational support, you are partnering with us and these young adults in Great Commission work. THANK YOU!!!

2022 started with two successful trips to Sierra Leone (January) and Albania (February). Return to Sierra Leone

During the first week of January I had the opportunity to join with our brothers and sisters in Sierra Leone for a week of pastoral training. We had 25 pastors gather for a course on "Pastoral Ministry." I was assisted in the teaching by our faithful friend and colleague, Bill Massaquoi from Liberia. Our course centered on the major themes of pastoral ministry including preaching, pastoral care, church administration, and worship. In the village, I was greeted by the presence of a new school building, several new dormitories for students, a new outdoor pavilion for

events, and a new church building. Our week closed with a time of worship and sharing the Lord's supper together (pictured above). Plans are being made to return again in August to expand the program.

Albania & Goodwill Church

Just several weeks after my trip to Africa I was back in the air again on my way to Albania. The purpose of the trip was twofold. First, I taught a course for ISTL on Christian Leadership and I was also hosting one of the pastors and two members of Goodwill Church (EPC) of New York. The aim of our trip was to learn about the country of Albania while exploring the possibility of a longterm partnership between the Balkans and Goodwill church. It was a fruitful week of fellowship filled with both learning and teaching.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY

Edgington has a long tradition of providing for fellowship and ministry among the women of our congregation. For many generations this been through the Presbyterian Women's Association, or as it is often called, "PW." This group has met monthly on Thursdays for business, fellowship, Bible Study, and programs on a variety of interesting topics. Additionally, throughout the year the PW is responsible for many activities and fundraising or outreach focused events including: Soup Luncheons, the Edgington Rummage Sale, Quilting, and the very important ministry of serving funeral dinners for grieving families as an expression of the tender love of Christ who is near to us in our sorrows. For these reasons and the bonds that have been formed



through these various activities, PW has and always will be a beloved part of our church history.

As we consider that history, it is important to not only appreciate the past, but consider how we can build upon it to continue in effective ministry in the present day and beyond. The leadership of the women's association has for many years been reflectively thinking and praying about how the PW can involve more women in our church. At the beginning of this year, we sat down to ask clear questions about the purpose of our ministry and the direction we hoped to go. We're excited to share with you about a new future for women's ministry at Edgington.

It starts with just that – we're going to be moving away from a model of a women's association, with membership, business meetings, and the varied formalities that come with that and shifting toward a ministry focused model to be just that – a women's ministry. If you are a woman in this church – you are invited to be a part of what we're doing – as often as you can – as much as you can – and when you can't – we understand. But we want to encourage every woman to plug in somewhere to strengthen the fellowship of women in our church family.

- There will still be quarterly meetings (March, June, September, and December), but no membership dues. You may donate if you want.
- We will not have dessert, but anyone that wants to bring a sack lunch can socialize before the meeting.
- Committee meetings will be held as needed. When a committee is working on a project, announcements will be made in church, including the bulletin and newsletter, for those interested in helping.

There will be three main concentrations of the women's ministry and they are summarized by these three words: **GROW**; **SERVE**; and **REACH**. In many ways, each of these represent what the current PW structure is already doing, but also represents an expansion and more inclusive model to allow for more participation. In the coming months, you'll be hearing more details about each of these, and specific opportunities for your involvement – but for now we want to briefly summarize each one, and then make an exciting announcement about one opportunity that is just around the corner.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY (Cont. from p. 17)

- **<u>GROW</u>** will focus on discipleship through Bible Study and building mentoring relationships in order to GROW in Christian maturity.
- <u>SERVE</u> will focus on inter-Church opportunities for service such as: funeral dinners, rummage sale, and other things we can assist existing ministries with. For example, helping the Trustees with a big project, or the Deacons with congregational care needs.



 <u>REACH</u> – will focus on efforts outside of our Church to reach out with compassion, care, and witness. We'll continue efforts like quilting for Winnie's Transitional Housing and the Mercer County Family Crisis Center, and also partner with the Food Pantry and other things as we partner with our Church's Mission Committee.

There will be regular announcements about what is going on in each of these three categories so you can consider how you can be involved in the women's ministry at Edgington.
