If you've been following along with the newsletter articles in recent months you might expect this to be the final explanation of the four church membership categories. We'll return to that next month. I wanted to take the opportunity to address a preaching decision that I have made, and the Session has encouraged me to pursue.

It's my normal practice to preach exposition sermons (verse by verse) through books of the Bible. Typically, I will rotate between Old and New testaments with a brief topic series between each transition. That has been my humble attempt to preach, as Paul explains, the whole counsel of God (Acts 20:27). In other words, I don't pick and choose my favorite subjects, ideas, or resources while attempting to remain in vogue in with the times.

This month we'll come to Paul's statement, "See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ" (Col 2:8). That is quite the admonition. It is also wonderfully transcultural and able to be applied across the generations. The Apostle wants the church to be captive to and filled with Christ. We can't do that if we are living by empty philosophies that deceive. So, what are those human traditions?

You can image that the specific applications may differ from various times and places. For example, the intersection of ancient Platonic and Aristotelian philosophies of the 1st century Greek world will likely not seem as relevant to us living in the 21st century. But we certainly have our own human traditions that attempt to draw us away from the Lord Jesus. Individualism. Rising Secularism. An ever-shifting sexual revolution. These and other human traditions are a part of the reality we see when we look around at our world; perhaps in ways that are closer to us than we are comfortable with.

The purpose of this will not be antagonism or discouragement; not at all. I want to take Paul's statement and use it to evaluate what we see and hear around us. I'll be doing so with the admonition from Carl Trueman, who writes in his recent work, <u>The Rise and Triumph of the Modern Self</u>, "Every age has had its darkness and its dangers. The task of the Christian is not to whine about the moment in which he or she lives but to understand its problems and respond appropriately to them." I would add to that important counsel that the response that is needed is to lift up God's plan and intent for His creation as the only true basis for human happiness and flourishing.

One of the most basic things about the Christian life is that we have come to understand that our lives are not our own; we are created and redeemed by the One True God. It is eminently reasonable then, that the God who has made us and saved us knows how best to bring about our joy. I hope that you will grow in that conviction with me as we seek to understand how Paul's statement in Colossians 2:8 applies to us, living right where we are and when we are.

I look forward to seeing you on the Lord's Day.

Attendees: 33 members were in attendance which exceeds the requirements of 20 for a quorum. Zach Hopkins served as moderator. Nancy Engstrom was appointed Clerk Pro-Tem for this meeting only.

Zach opened the meeting with prayer.

Purpose: The annual congregational meeting is held to review the reports for the year 2021 and affirm the 2022 budget.

- **Approval of Docket:** Motion made and seconded to approve the docket. Motion carried.
- **Approval of minutes:** The January 31st, 2021, minutes were reviewed. Motion made, seconded, and approved. Motion carried.

- M/S/C to approve a facility use request for May 28th.
- M/S/C to approve delegates to the Spring RLP Meeting (Hillsboro, IL). TE Hopkins and RE Penry will attend.

 - Burdsalls: Continuing their work with EPC WO, planting a church and teaching.
 - **Saul & Jess Huber:** Continuing their work with EPC WO, mobilizing and recruiting those who wish to move into the missionary field.
 - **Jeff Lancaster:** Working in the inner-Chicago district; current church planting efforts have produced a group of 6 or 7 who are meeting in a local home each week. Continued prayer for this ministry.

NEW BUSINESS:

- **EPC International Disaster Relief Fund** is collecting monies to assist Ukraine refugees. We discussed our desire to donate to this cause, but concluded we would table this until next meeting to see how this situation progresses and truly understand the needs of the people of Ukraine before committing to support.
- Winnies Place: Nancy will reach out to Betsy for an update on the furniture needs and come back to the committee by Sunday. At that time, we can determine how we may be of assistance.
- **Minute for Mission:** On March 20, 2022, Deb will share an overview of the core commitments of the EEPC Mission Committee with the congregation.



FOOD PANTRY DISTRIBUTION UPDATE

We had a successful distribution to 39 families consisting of 83 Adults, 12 teens, and 38 children on April 2nd. When we packed on April 1st there were 17 people who helped. 


If you missed the first class, please don't let that deter you from coming! Pastor Zach will arrange to get you caught up!

able to attend, please notify Kathy Stegmiller at 309-791-1162 or the church office at 309-795-1713.


NEEDS: We have 22 girls and 16 boys registered for the junior high group. We need another adult female to help with the girls.
