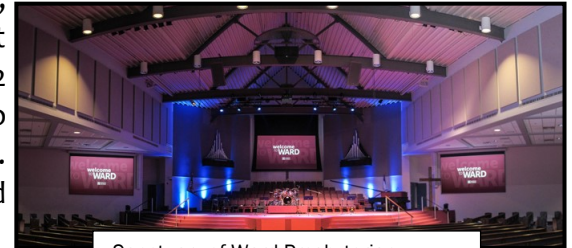




What is General Assembly? Just like the early church met in a gathered assembly in Acts 15, the General Assembly is the annual meeting of the national court of the church with Ruling and Teaching elders from all over the country gathering to receive training and resources, worship, and conduct the work and business of the church. This year we meet at Ward Presbyterian Church in Northville, MI – one of the original 12 churches that founded the EPC in the early 1980s and former home to the Office of the General Assembly before it relocated to Orlando, FL. The GA convenes on Tuesday, June 21st for a Leadership Institute and then meets in business sessions Wednesday 22nd – Friday 24th.

What do I do at General Assembly? Quite a bit.



Specific to the operation of the meeting itself, I have two specific functions. First, as the timekeeper, I am responsible for running at least four clocks at one time to keep the meeting moving along in good order. Here's a screenshot of the app I use on my phone to keep those various clocks organized. This is necessary in a meeting of close to 1,000 people. I work in conjunction with the EPC Stated Clerk and Moderator of the Assembly to assist the timing of the business. In decidedly un-Presbyterian fashion, that means I have to sit in the front row. Gasp! A second function of the meeting I assist with is serving as a Minutes Reader/Reviewer. There is a team of recording clerks, and I am on a team that works (often late at night) to make sure the minutes are ready to publish the next day.

In my capacity as Chairman of the Permanent Committee on Theology for the General Assembly I have two main responsibilities. I must present the work of my committee to a Standing Committee on Theology Thursday afternoon who will review and decide if the product of our work should be sent to the floor for ratification or not. The big item we worked on this past year was the review of the practice of "virtual communion" and whether it was a compatible practice with the EPC's understanding of scripture, our confession of faith, and constitution of the Church. If you would like to see that report (it's only two pages – very short!), I'd be glad to share it with you. If the Standing Committee approves our work, I will then present before the entire Assembly on Friday to take questions and submit for ratification the product of our work from the last year. I have served on this committee for 5 years now, three as chairman. It is a real privilege and one that I undertake with great care.

At this point, I feel a burden to acknowledge, that this already sounds like a heavy degree of involvement. I agree. It is. But one of the blessings of Presbyterianism is that it allows for local representation at every stage of church government. Simply put, the work of the church is done by the people of the church. I consider “churchmanship” to be a great virtue and I want to serve where I can, in whatever capacities allow, for my gifts to be of aide to the Church.

That is also why I serve as the leader of a networking group within the EPC called the Westminster Society. This is an informal group of friends and elders from around the country who use the annual gathering of the General Assembly to organize lecture series and presentations for the purpose of continuing to develop our commitment to ministry in the reformed tradition. In years past, we have published a journal (now in three volumes, but not since 2019) and hosted events at the GA itself. In the past four years, the national leadership of the EPC has requested that the Westminster Society provide a “theology track” to the Tuesday Leadership Institute that happens at every General Assembly so I have been responsible for organizing speakers and presentations to go along with the theme of the meeting (this year it is evangelism), but also uniquely within the area of theology. Here is a shot of this year’s theology lectures. My lecture is on the Scottish Puritan Thomas Boston and his contributions to the Reformed understanding of evangelism through his book, *The Art*

The Mission Committee met on May 17th, 2022 at 6:30pm in the basement at EEP. Those attending were: Deb Wagamon and Nancy Engstrom.

Deb opened the meeting in prayer.

OLD BUSINESS:

- **Minutes:** April minutes were approved.
- **Mission Updates:**
 - **Youth Hope:** Efforts continue to clean-up and ready Camp Summit location for summer events – looking to have 400 attending this year! The new mentoring program (M.O.V.E.) is providing boys with male mentors who are changing their lives and bringing hope. They have 146 students in their Creative Arts (CRE8) program this year. Prayers that this ministry continues to change the lives of children and teens in our local area. The first CRE8 Studios showcase is this Saturday, May 21st. Opens at 1pm, performers start at 2pm. To sponsor a child for Camp Summit, the cost is \$250 per child. Supplies are needed for Camp, handouts to be placed in the Church Foyer on May 22nd.
 - **Pregnancy Resources:** Nine filled baby bottles have been returned. Waiting for the remainder to arrive before Father's Day to deliver them to the Moline Campus. Prayers for this fundraiser to be successful. Volunteer training is scheduled for June 28-30 and October 4-6 in the Moline Center.
 - **Winnie's Place:** They will be ready to accept furniture by mid-June. They are requesting some volunteer manpower in the following areas: Replacing roof shingles, tree trimming and removal, weather stripping, upgrading the security system, adjusting apartment doors, sealing/repainting deck, replacing a floor in apartment 6.
 - **Steve Woodworth & McCallum's:** No update on the reassignment as yet.

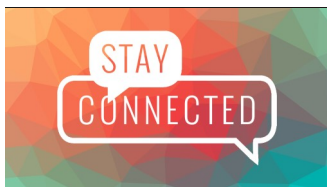
Here are some of the ways a Deacon can help out:

- We ask all these things in the mighty name of Jesus!



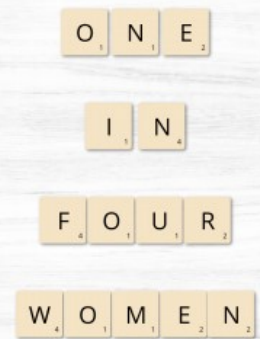
IT IS A SORROW I CARRY ALONE...

She found me at a local event. In her late 40's, she was attractive and articulate. With tear-filled eyes, she spoke quickly and in a hushed voice. "I know I can trust you, you're the second person I've shared this secret with." She paused, took a deep breath, and whispered "I had an abortion when I was in college. When we are weak, then He is strong.

There's a family in Carbondale we've been trying to hang out with that's from Saudi Arabia, but between travel and sickness it hadn't happened. They are moving back to the Middle East in a couple of weeks and the dad had been asking if I want to buy some stuff they're selling. Last Saturday we had a really rough day...kid stuff, lack of sleep...even some conflict between Jesse and me. That night we were at a park near their apartment and decided to see them, but literally EVERYTHING started to go wrong. We were frustrated and confused and I actually said to Jesse, "Okay, I'm going to take a couple of kids and go see them for a minute, but it's not like I'm going to share the Gospel or anything." We prayed for wisdom, then I ended up dropping Jesse and the three little ones off at home for bedtime while Sam, Zuri and I headed to their apartment. That way, we would be able to stay later and the little ones could get to bed in good time. Sam and Zuri started playing with the four kids while my friend showed me the stuff he was trying to sell. 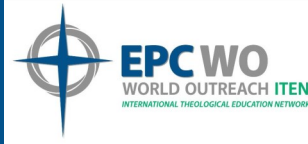

 - ♦ **We had planned** to complete our service by mid 2022, but agreed to continue serving until June 2023. We are praying through what ITEN role the Lord would have us do **moving forward at a slower pace**. We look forward to Phase 1 being completed by this date in (V) S. A. We'll return there in October!
- ITEN has been working to see additional staff come alongside Mike for this next season and trust God for these good gifts. God brought the right people for the first season, and we trust Him for the right people for the future. We have reached a **milestone to be celebrated** and an opportunity to pause, reflect, and envision. We are excited to see what the Lord will do next! **Please...**

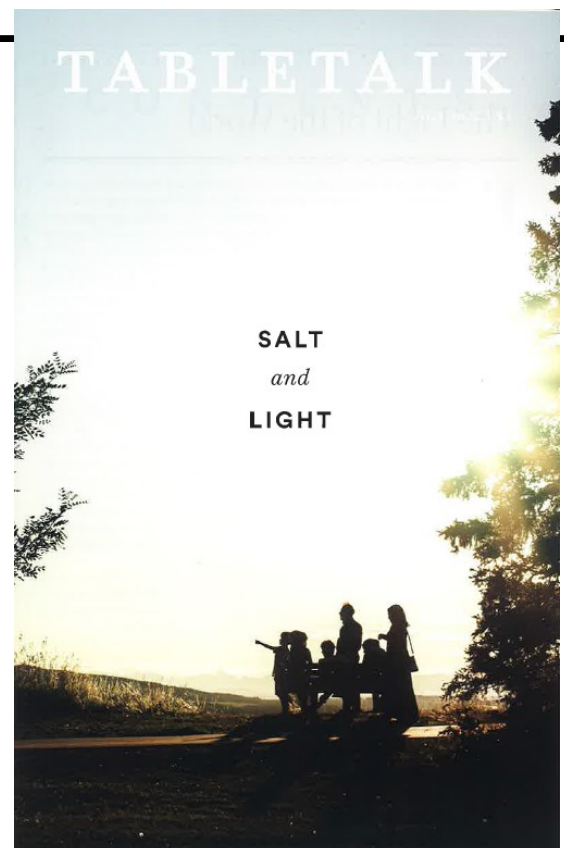

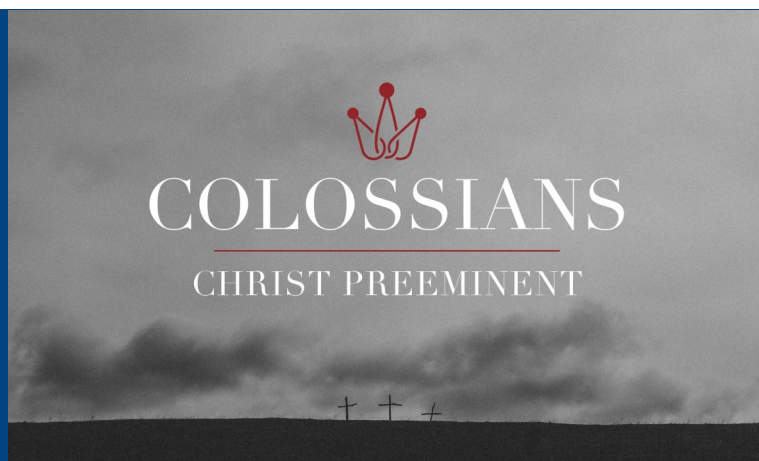

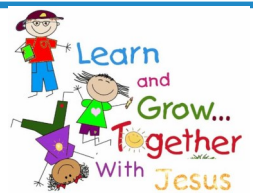

OLD BUSINESS:

- This rummage sale was the most successful we've had in terms of income. However, it was a lot of work for the few who showed up each day to get things ready.

NEW BUSINESS: (The following items were discussed and are to be voted on as a whole.)

1. Dues/Donations – Originally dues were used to pay PW USA. Now that we are no longer part of PCUSA, it is suggested that we don't pay dues, but donations are welcome.
2. Involvement Cards – Since the Deacons send cards and many individuals do also, it was decided this was not necessary.
3. Need to approve Treasurer Reports, Secretary Reports, and bills to be paid for funeral dinners, materials for mission, and every day expenses is not required.
4. Need to update Our Purpose to omit "worldwide" after church and to add "Evangelical" in front of Presbyterian Church.
5. Do we want to keep the Mizpah Benediction? – Discussion indicated we should keep it.

ITEMS TO DISCUSS AND VOTE ON AT SEPTEMBER MEETING:
