

#### **TEN YEARS OF MINISTRY TOGETHER**

As something of a personal rule, I try to avoid excessive autobiographical reflection in my public ministry. Besides not wanting to talk about myself, I think it usually distracts from better points of focus for our collective attentions. That rule notwithstanding, I wanted to offer some personal comments (not in any particular order and certainly not exhaustive) after crossing the threshold of a decade of service as pastor at Edgington. Marking that occasion on June 5th by sitting in the pews to worship alongside my family as we presented our daughter for baptism was an incredibly special day; not only for my family, but for who we shared it with – every one of you – our church family.

These years have been marked by the kindness of our Triune God. In the words of the hymn writer William Cowper, "Deep in unsearchable mines of never-failing skill; He treasures up His bright designs and works His sovereign will." His kindness has been shown to me as those storehouses of divine providence built from eternity unfolded in the events of my life that brought me to Edgington. Just this week at VBS some friends and I were remembering that my very first exposure to this area was in late July 2009 taking a ride with my future mother-in-law out to Loud Thunder to see what was happening out at camp. That day I met a community of people who would become unspeakably precious to me in the coming years. During my time in seminary there was an irrepressible magnetism to my desire to return – I couldn't wait to come back and be with you all again. As God's wisdom was revealed, a seminary graduate eager to serve was able to connect with a church in need of a pastor.

Thank you for embracing me and all of the inexperience and enthusiasm that came with it. Thank you for letting me stumble along the path of obedience of my own Christian discipleship as I learned what it means to be a pastor. Thank you for welcoming me: to your tables, into your living rooms, at your hospital bedsides, as we shared all of life's beautiful and sometimes sorrowful moments together. It has been an inestimable privilege. Thank you.

Sometimes people who are particularly insightful to the uniqueness of ministerial vocation ask, "how can we encourage our pastor?" Not that discouragement is somehow disproportionately assigned to clergy compared to other callings – but there does seem to be an awareness that pastors are for some reason given to a kind of melancholy or emotional fickleness that rises and falls with attendance and participation metrics. That is a topic for another time. But I do want to say that I have been most encouraged, not by a comment about one sermon or another being graded on a scale of "good to decent" – but in ways you have shared with me how my ministry has pointed you to the Good Shepherd and led you to find rest as you trust in Jesus. It thrills and renews my soul.

After ten years I hope I have grown in wisdom and pastoral care. But to be sure, it seems like I am still only just beginning and have so much more to learn. That also moves me with confidence that the Lord has wonderful things in store for us as we share in ministry together. As I have often said, being a pastor is just getting a privileged front seat to the glories of God's Kingdom advancing in a place among a people. And Edgington is a place, and you are a people that I deeply love. Which is why I am so happy to be,

**Attendees Present:** Teaching Elder Zach Hopkins and Ruling Elders Jim Mueller, Kevin Oak, Mic Penry, and Keith Wilson. **Excused Absence:** Patrick Shovar. A quorum is present.

Pastor Zach acted as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer and read from Psalms, Chapter 133. The Elders prayed for individual members of the congregation.

**Approval/Amendment of Docket:** Motion was made and seconded to approve the docket. Motion carried.

**Approval of Minutes:** May 31st, 2022, minutes were reviewed. Motion made to approve, seconded, and approved.

**Zach's Report:** Zach reported on members with health concerns and prayer needs. During the past month he conducted, Bible Studies at Brookstone and Women's Association, attended Rivers and Lakes Presbytery meeting. Zach attended the EPC 42nd General Assembly June 21st-24th. At General Assembly Zach led an all-day seminar on Understanding Evangelism.

#### **Old Business:**

- Zach noted his recent vacation from June 6th through June 13th and thanked Mic for preaching on June 12th.
- Zach updated the Session on highlights from the recent General Assembly and his role in leading a seminar on Evangelism.

#### **New Business:**

- The Session reviewed corrections from the RLP Records Review Committee. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve those corections.
- Zach gave a detailed report on the recent General Assembly. Areas discussed were:
  - Racial Reconciliation. An interim committee is being formed to discuss creating a pastoral letter concerning this.
  - Per Member Asking vs. Percent of Income. The GA is moving to asking churches to support the GA based on a percentage of the church's income instead of a flat amount per member. This creates the need for presbyteries to evaluate their course of action concerning their share of support from churches. The Session will study this and formulate a suggestion for RLP.
  - Virtual Communion. A standing committee has determind that it no longer permissable in the EPC for churches to allow virtual communion. This causes no changes in practice at EEPC.
  - Zach noted that the 43rd GA (2023) will be held at Cherry Hills Churh in Denver, Colorado the 3rd week of June.
- Communion will be held on July 3rd, 2022. The next Stated Session meeting will be Tuesday, August 2nd, 2022, at 7:00pm. The Session will study chapter one of the book, "Gentle and Lowly", by Dane Ortlund at that time.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting at 8:50pm. Motion Carried.

- Mission Updates:
  - Youth Hope: Summer Camp has started and they are in week 3. Over 114 children still need sponsorship to attend summer camp. The cost to sponsor a child is \$250. Monies must be received by July 1<sup>st</sup>. ExStream Fun fest started the week of June 13<sup>th</sup>. YH is partnering with YouthWorks to provide Urban Missionary Service Projects for high school students from across the nation. YH is taking this program into low-income neighborhoods to teach them about Jesus. CRE8 Studios Art Camp meets for five days and kids try a new artistic medium each day. Youth are discovering their passions and will pursue advanced training in areas they are most focused on this fall. This program has been a hit! Teens draw, write, paint, make ceramics, bake, dance and more! Deanna has been approved for volunteer status and is looking to support the Friday night weekly teen dance.
  - Pregnancy Resources: The Moline and Davenport Centers have been receiving threats. They are requesting prayers to keep their facilities, equipment, and personnel safe. Deb will be delivering the last 8 baby bottles to the Moline Center this week.
  - **Winnies Place:** No update. Nancy will reach out to see if they are ready to receive the furniture we have collected so we can make arrangement to deliver.
  - Steve Woodworth & McCallums: McCallums are being called back home and will be continuing with ITEN until June 2023. Mike Kuhn has agreed to serve as the new ITEN Coordinator beginning January 2023. Steve Woodworth will be the new Assistant Pastor for the church in Clarkesville, GA beginning January 2023. Steve has requested we continue our support until year end.
  - Burdsall: Prayers for visa renewals, prayers for J..... and his GCSE testing, L..... will be attending Anglia Ruskin in the UK studying Music – prayers for her as she finalizes paperwork, payments, etc.
  - **Saul & Jess Huber:** Family has been plagued with illness. Still able to share the message of Jesus with a Middle Eastern couple in Carbondale.
  - Jeff Lancaster: No Update
  - **Christian Care:** Karla visited Christian Care and was given a tour of Martha's House. This is designed to house 20 women; they currently have 10 in residence. They are looking for tall chest of drawers if anyone wants to donate. Karla is discussing some Bible study material for CC and will be visiting the site again next month.
  - Andrea Elliott & Amber Anderson: Checks were delivered to these two to help support their current needs. Amber's father, Mitch, spoke with Deb and says Amber is doing much better and has no additional needs at this time. Andrea Elliott called Deb personally to thank EEPC for their generosity and to let us know that if she needs anything further, she will reach out to us.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- **Marion Medial Mission:** Their goal for 2022 is to build 3,450 wells scattered over 60,000 square miles in Malawi, Zambia, and Tanzania. It costs \$450 to build a well to support an entire village. The committee discussed the need and voted to sponsor 1 well at a cost of \$450.
- Youth Hope: We discussed sponsoring 2 children to attend Camp Summit. The cost is \$250 per child. \$500 was approved by the committee so we can send 2 children to camp.
- Food Pantry: We need to be thinking about how we can support the needs of the Food Pantry this year. We will reach out to better understand their needs and timing so we can discuss this at our July meeting.

#### HER 2ND CHANCE AT CHOICE...

It was a Friday afternoon when Maria\* arrived for her scheduled ultrasound. She was conflicted, scared, and alone. The appointment was uneventful until I asked Maria how she felt about her pregnancy. Maria immediately began to cry as she told me about her visit to an abortion clinic two days prior. She'd been sold the abortion pills to perform an at-home abortion. Maria explained she had taken the first pill (Mifeprex) and regretted it. Afraid and wanting to stop the abortion, Maria called her abortion provider and was told it was "too late; there is no reversal." Knowing it might not be too late, I asked if she wanted to try the abortion pill reversal protocol. Instantly Maria said yes.

An ultrasound was performed to check for viability and gestational age; the next step was to call the APR hotline. Maria was nervous to call alone, so we made the call together. We spoke with a compassionate hotline nurse who helped Maria contact a local APR provider. With tears in her eyes, Maria left PR hopeful that she might have a second chance at choosing life for her baby. That same evening Maria was able to begin taking the APR pills.

A week later, Maria came back to give me an update. She was smiling, hopeful and grateful as she excitedly thanked the nursing team for the care she had received. Maria is following the reversal protocol right now and says that she has never been so happy to complain of nausea! Soon, the Abortion Pill Reversal protocol will be available at Pregnancy Resources. Then, even more women like Maria will have a second chance at choice.

The celebration involves killing an animal (goat or sheep mainly) and eating some as a family and sharing some with neighbors and the poor - big business for butchers this time of year! Pray for conversations we can have with our Muslim friends at this time, and also for the Asha service event we are having this Sunday. We will make it more of a celebration feel and explain Abraham and Isaac and how that points to Jesus death and the hope that we have in him.

I never would have thought that sitting in this crazy room full of cat walkways and hideyholes would have been how I would do outreach! And pray specifically for this young woman that has been reaching out in friendship - that there are opportunities to share about a God that is loving and who doesn't have different rules for men and women, and who doesn't require us to keep our emotions in check when we come to Him. (all things she dislikes about Islam)

S.... has been meeting with a man who is very interested in Christianity, but who has been leaning toward the mystical aspects more in how he searches for truth. They have been reading through Genesis and he is excited by what he is learning. Pray for wisdom in S.... as he answers questions, and for this man to see God and the wonder of His love.

Some early census data has been released. Some interesting facts about T.... H...... It has grown 22% in population in the last 10 years. It is the most densely populated borough in L...., with 112 people living on each football pitch sized area of land! We are certainly in the right place to reach people!

Again, praise for the visa renewals. Now please pray that we get our biometric cards in the mail soon. We need these cards before we can enter/exit the country, and have been hearing some stories on the slowness of .. mail.

We are starting to realize how soon L..... will be heading to university, and how much we will miss her - praying for good times together this summer.
