To Glorify God & Enjoy Him Forever... For the Good of our Neighbors

Q & A #1 of the Westminster Shorter Catechism gives us the language that our chief end, or ultimate purpose in life is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever. We have adopted that language as the guiding principle for the life of our church as well. The ultimate end and purpose of our church is to glorify the Triune God and grow deeper in the sincerity of our Christian discipleship as we take delight in all that God is, within Himself, and for us as Redeemer. We also long that there would be those, who do not know this as their chief end, who might come to know this truth, through the witness and ministry of Edington EPC. How might that happen? I have two main reflections on that.

First, our unbelieving family, friends, and neighbors won't (indeed cannot) come into the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ if we are not actually holding up the Word of Truth in the Gospel. That is important to emphasize because often, individuals or churches, think that in order to make the Christian faith more attractive, there needs to be some kind of subtraction that takes place, even if they suggest it is only temporary, in order to make the Christian faith more palatable to the secular age. We are not going to do that. Instead, we regularly re-affirm that we unashamedly believe the historic truths of the Christian faith. We believe that people will come to know the Lord – as the Church bears witness to Her Lord.

Second, that witness to Christ must necessarily involve some kind of tangible expression. We want to put flesh and bones onto the words of our profession. This comes by acts of witness and outreach. I'd like to encourage you to think of our two special events this month as opportunities to do that very thing. Consider this: the **Harvest Party** isn't just a special event for our church family – it is a chance to welcome others to celebrate the season alongside of us. Extending an invitation to share a meal and enjoy an evening of fun family activities is a great way to bear witness to the warmth of Christian community. Likewise, the Trunk-or-Treat event that we are trying this year is a chance to turn outward to the larger community around us with an open invitation to come and enjoy a safe and generous event. I remember growing up and remembering which houses gave out the best kinds of candy on Halloween. How exciting would it be, for kids to have that sense, and to encourage their parents with something like, "can we please go to the church Trunk-or-Treat? Those people are so nice, and they give out the best candy!" What a fun reputation for the church to have in the larger community who might not otherwise have any interactions with us, even though we're right here in the center of the Rockridge world.

What I'm hoping you'll see is that these events are not simply events for the sake of events. They are opportunities to bear witness to the warm hospitality and open-handed generosity that we know characterizes this congregation. But the people in our community won't know unless they see it and experience it for themselves. Let's not waste a great opportunity to reach out, for the good of our neighbors.

- M/S/C to remove Andy and Torri Gundling from membership by request of transfer received on Aug. 1st, 2022.
- M/S/C to approve RE Wilson, RE Penry, and TE Hopkins to represent Edgington EPC to the 36th meeting of Rivers & Lakes Presbytery Sept. 30th Oct. 1st. (Aurora, IL).
- M/S/C to approve TE Hopkins attendance at the Fall 2022 MVC/MCC/EBL national meeting at the GA Offices Sept. 13th -15th (Orlando, FL).
- M/S/C to approve the Ehm Wedding (Aaron Ehm & Michelle Maranda) on Oct. 22nd 3pm.
- M/S/C to approve scholarship request in the amount of \$500 to applicant Mackenzie Reimers. TE Hopkins will prepare the documentation and submit to Barb Freyermuth for payment.
- RE Mic Penry will be preaching on November 6th as TE Hopkins will be in Indianapolis for a family wedding. The Elders will conduct the service. November communion will be moved to the 13th.

- Floor tile by the elevator in the basement needs to be glued down.
- Food Pantry reported the old heavy wooden table in the basement is not needed. Trustees will remove. There also is an old door that needs to be removed.

 Chris Stark asked for assistance to replace a broken post at the Dunlap Cemetery. Mel and Jim will help.

For many years now Edgington EPC has been a host site for Senior Meals. The doors are now open here for meals **EVERY WEEKDAY!**



Deliberate – Precise in providing life-affirming early pregnancy medical care and pregnancy/early parenting support.



Stacy (not the client's real name) walked into the center earlier this week smiling, laughing, and happy to be here, but her story didn't start that way. Stacy didn't want to be pregnant. She didn't want anyone to know she was pregnant. Stacy is the girl who does things with a plan, and pregnancy was not in the plan.

Stacy knew that her parents would have divided opinions about what she should do. Her mom had always been "pro-woman and pro-choice" and when mom heard the news there was pressure to schedule an abortion. But her dad felt differently. He was sure that if Stacy came to Pregnancy Resources, she would get the information she needed to make an informed decision about her pregnancy. Stacy reluctantly agreed and came to meet with a nurse and have an ultrasound. After meeting with the nurse a few times, Stacy made the choice to change her plans and parent her child.

Stacy is now participating in Pregnancy Resources' pregnancy and early parenting support program. She comes to class weekly to learn about caring for herself during pregnancy and to learn about caring for her little boy once he arrives this winter. She's making friends with other moms and feeling more prepared every day to take care of her boy when he finally arrives. Both of her parents are now fully supportive of Stacy's choice to parent her child – and in a few months that precious little one will be welcomed into a family that already loves him dearly.

Deliberate Acceptance, Patient Listening... Liz Ryan, Partner Development

A small group of women faced each other in a circle at Pregnancy Resources. They prayed together, cried together, and shared their stories of their abortions decisions. They shared how it had affected them, but most importantly, how Jesus had forgiven them and set them free. Each one received deliberate acceptance and patient listening:

Janice (not client's name) shared, "I want to thank you for not giving up on me, listening to me, and accepting me. This class is not what I intended ...But it is where I needed to be. After this class, I can say that I feel 100% forgiven."

Anne (not client's name) shared, "I wasn't sure why God led me to PRC until the group (After Abortion Care). It was wonderful to explore all of the possibilities with this group of ladies in a place where we could share honestly, with no fear of condemnation It enables us to go deeper and experience more of his grace, mercy, and healing."

After Abortion Care is a vital ministry of Pregnancy Resources. Forgiven and Set Free is a Bible study designed to help a woman take deliberate steps on the read to healing after abortion. The leaders of the After Abortion Care program understand the women's choices as they have made the same choice, done the hard work and found healing in Christ. After Abortion Care is also available for men with a Bible study called *Healing a Father's Heart*.

Greetings! Hope everyone is doing well and the back to school, end of summer time is good! Where we are at, most everything stops during August, and starts again with school term - so we are feeling the transition that comes with back to school! I have a cool story to share with you (below) and then a bunch of prayer requests.

A ministry of some of our B..... Asha teammates is a Christian bookshop in a traditional B..... area. People will come in and look at the books, talk and discuss

faith. S.... helps in this bookshop a couple days a week. Seven years ago, a man came into this bookshop and threatened to blow it up because it was Christian. One of our Asha teammates was there at the time, and after this occasion he watched everyday for this man to return. When he next saw the man outside on the street he called to him and invited him into the shop for tea. He told the man that he was not concerned over dying, because he believed in Jesus, but he was concerned for this man's soul should he kill people. Over time and years this continued - he would invite this man in for tea and a talk about what he believed.

About a year ago, as we were all emerging from covid, this man came back into the bookshop and started talking with S..... He was fascinated about America and enjoyed asking questions. He also shared that he no longer believed in Islam and was searching. He agreed to start reading through the Bible with S..... This past week, he came in and said he believed all of it and would like to be called a Christian!

I want to share this story because it is amazing and wonderful and a testament to God's love and power, but also because it shows the nature of the work and the commitment of our local teammates.

1 Corinthians 3:6-9 says, "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. The man who plants and the man who waters have one purpose, and each will be rewarded according to his own labor. For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building."

We definitely see how God uses us here, but we also often think that we are doing the watering where others have put in the hard work of preparing the field and planting. Many of the people that attend Asha services are long term friends of our B...... teammates, many of the girls at club are allowed to attend because of other local Christians investing years into relationship with their parents and the community, and men are willing to talk deeply with S.... because he has been introduced by other long time community members that are Christians and trustworthy. It is humbling to be a part of this and to be used by God alongside these other believers, and we want to acknowledge both God's power and their faithfulness. And God is at work!

Some updates & ministry prayer needs:

The girl's club residential was exhausting, including a really rough trip there during tube strikes, but also a lot of fun and good for bonding with the girls. We have about 4 girls aging out of the group, and 4 or 5 young ones just joining, and it was good to go deeper in relationship with both sets. We want to start meeting with the older university age girls and continue the deeper faith conversations, so please pray that they are willing to do that. And some of the younger girls have emotional needs, so please pray that club can be a safe space for them, and that they can see God through our actions and our talk to them....






