



CHURCH MEMBERSHIP IS A BLESSING

Church membership is a good thing. That might seem like an obvious statement from a pastor, but I'd like to expand on it because I think many people might actually see church membership, not as a negative thing (I hope!) but as a neutral thing. That is, someone might respond with a take it or leave it attitude toward church membership. But as our church membership notes, church membership matters.

Church membership is a visible commitment to Jesus. When someone joins a church, they make a public profession of their hope in Jesus in the presence of a congregation. It is raising the flag of your personal faith commitment in a way that includes the attestable witness of the congregation. The member is saying, "I believe, along with you, in Jesus Christ."

Church membership is a visible commitment to Jesus' People. In an age of secularization, sometimes the Christian faith can be lonely. Church membership commits us to Christ, and to His people. Receiving Jesus means receiving His family, His Body, the Church. Jesus' people are my people, as a Church member.

Church membership makes a strong statement in a low-commitment culture. You can easily unsubscribe from emails or other digital platforms. When something doesn't meet your preferences or your needs, you can move on from it. But church membership involves professed vows that have staying power and serve as a reminder of making and keeping promises. Sometimes people only "date" a church – take her around for special events and occasions, return to her when life is lonely or difficult, or keep her on the side just in case. Church membership means you intend to marry and make a commitment, rather than just date. It defines the relationship between you and God's people.

Church membership serves to keep us accountable. By way of our promises, we say, "I am here to be here, to participate, to support, and share in life together with these people." It's no surprise then when someone is absent and they are missed. Church membership means that I am noticed and cared for. A desire to live in ambiguity will run from that, but membership entitles you to receive accountability to your claims.

Church membership afford us the opportunity to join in service. Putting your hand to the plow with someone next to you is a wonderful thing. Besides the benefit of getting something done, getting to know your fellow members, sincerely and mutually, is a wonderful thing. This happens best when you're side-by-side in service.

Church membership entitles us to be the recipients of shepherding care. Hebrews 13:7 speaks of the elders who "keep watch over you." They do so because they are the undershepherds of the Lord Jesus, the Good Shepherd. By identifying with a Church, you are counted among the flock, and receive the care of the shepherds.

Just a few thoughts on membership as we anticipate an exciting new group of spring adult members. What a blessing!




For many years now Edgington EPC has been a host site for Senior Meals. The doors are now open here for meals **EVERY WEEKDAY!**

Child Safety Nan will attend the Child Safety and Protection Network annual conference in Orlando in March. Jordin Greer, the newly hired Assistant World Outreach Director, will attend with her. This will be a great chance to help her network with this fabulous organization. Nan is currently vetting the 2 other new World Outreach staff women.

Our lives have been stretched and challenged for the past four months to be flexible and willing to extend ourselves. Not always easy, in fact it's often tiring. We have been reminded again that God prepared us in advance for the roles we have in ITEN. It's amazingly shocking at times! This encourages us to keep on keeping on trusting God's faithfulness. He never slumbers nor sleeps. He cares for us, you and each of the 8 billion plus people on our planet all at the same time! 


Pastor Zach is on Facebook Live every Sunday morning at 10am for our Lord's Day Worship Service .




QUILTING
