Loved Ones,

With summer in full swing, I am sure that your family is already in the midst of a busy season with many opportunities for rest and recreation. Between sports and activity schedules, church commitments, and family events, the summer calendar fills up fast. I wanted to take the opportunity to reflect on a reality for the church in the midst this season, that of pulpit supply.

When I use the term pulpit supply – I mean it in its short-term application – that of someone filling the pulpit for single weeks at a time, rather than a long season of someone filling the pulpit for consecutive weeks when a church is without a pastor. When I am away on personal vacation or church business, worship on the Lord's Day still needs to be conducted and the Word still needs to be preached – so we turn to pulpit supply in these instances. I'm so thankful for our Elders in assisting in this process, especially RE Mic Penry who regular fills the pulpit in my absence. It is also wonderful to have existing relationships with other ministers who can travel to Edgington on select occasions to preach the Word – I especially think of Rev. Derek Morrison who has ably exhorted our congregation many times.

In addition to times when I am away, I will also try and secure pulpit supply at the end of a busy season of church business, especially presbytery meetings. In these instances, I like to have other ministers, especially retired ones like Dr. Salnave and Dr. Tromble, come to Edgington to fill the pulpit even though I am not away. It is a joy for me to sit in the congregation with you, under another man's preaching and teaching.

The reason why I am reflecting on this topic is because we are currently in the midst of a five-week period when I am only preaching one time. Two of the weeks, I will be or have been gone, two other weeks I have been present, but not preaching because of other week-long ministry commitments (General Assembly, Youth Mission Trip). Here is my central point in all of this, it is a good, even a healthy thing for a congregation to have a variety of preachers. While it will certainly be the case that the pastor of the church is the primary/regular preacher, having others preach protects against thinking it is the person that matters in preaching. I always like to think about it like fine dining; there may be different people serving the food (preachers), but it is the substance, the food (the Scriptures), that is actually the focus. When we think about it like this, it is a joy to have different men delivering the Scriptures to us because it protects us from thinking that the way I preach is the only way to serve the food of the Word and gives us cause to delight in the Word rather than the preacher. This is important for a healthy church to establish.

So, I would like to encourage you, even if it is not the regular waiter, come to the feast of the Word and delight yourself in the truth of God here in Edgington.

The Edgington Evangelical Women's Ministry (WM) met on June 1, 2023, in the church basement with 7 members present. Moderator Karyl Parrish opened the meeting with a prayer and members read Our Purpose Statement.

- 2. **Mother's Day Roses** Purchased 72 roses for \$60. They had an appropriate Bible verse attached to them which Teresa Balmer and Pat Block had chosen. Sue Miller will check with Kathy Stegmiller to see how many roses were used. Women who received them were very pleased.
- 3. **Father's Day Recognition** The number of roses used will help to determine how many candy bars to purchase for Father's Day, June 18th. Sue Miller will do the purchasing.
- 4. **Class on Balance** It was filled by senior citizens from Project Now. Another class will be scheduled in the fall.
- 5. **MC Caregiver** Karyl Parish contacted Mercer County to see if people from Rock Island County were eligible for the benefits. They are not, but Rock Island County has a similar program. It offers some free resources to those who are caretakers.
- 6. **Church Concerns** Member concerns were discussed.

The Mission Committee met on May 16th, 2023 at 6:30pm in 1st floor conference room. Those attending were: Deb Wagamon, Nancy Engstrom, Jim Johnson, and Eric Moel.

Deb opened the meeting in prayer.

Old Business:

- Reviewed and approved April minutes.
- Reviewed mailings and local ministry newsletters.
- Local and Regional Missions: Continuing to discuss and generate ideas on how we may reach out to our local area and with our regional ministries to be more active in the community. This will continue to be an agenda item as we go into the summer months. We did have a request for assistance for Tierney Fischer who lost her home in Rock Island due to storm damage. The members voted to send Tierney \$1000 to help her in her recovery.

New Business:

- Youth Hope: We continue to prayerfully consider additional monies to help the Camp Summit project. They are needing \$30,000 to finish the funding for this building. The mission team voted and approved sending (2) children to camp this summer at a cost of \$500. Deb provided Lisa with a list of supplies needed for Camp Summit this year and an insert will be going into the bulletin on the 21st. Deb will deliver the supplies where needed.
- **Rockridge School District Teachers:** We are continuing discussions with Brandee on supplies for the upcoming 2023/2024 school year. We hope to have a complete list of supplies by July so we may obtain the items and have them at the school for the start of the new session.
- **Pregnancy Resources:** EEPC will be sponsoring their Baby Bottle Campaign beginning Sunday, May 21st through Sunday, June 18th. The bottles will be on the table for the congregation as they depart from church services. The bottles will be returned to the church and the mission team will deliver them to PR.
- Chicago Church Planting: Deb has reached out to Jeff Lancaster to see if we can schedule a meeting to come to Chicago and learn more about his ministry and its needs so we may update the congregation. As soon as a date can be secured, Jim Johnson and Deb will visit with Jeff and hopefully deliver more information to EEPC on this ministry.
- **Ministry Advocates:** Hoping to assign ministry advocates to our local and regional ministries so committee members can work directly with these local/regional ministries each week and bring their needs and fundraiser/volunteer opportunities back to the committee meetings. In this way, we can be more proactive and be more supportive of this missions. Kelly has volunteered to team with Pregnancy Resources, currently Deb is the YouthHope advocate. The rest of the team will report on their choices next week.

The coronation watch party went well. The coronation had a lot of Christian symbolisms and meanings, and there were many good conversations about what everything meant with the people who came, including a discussion about communion and the meaning behind it!

The Monday after the coronation we went to a community party in a nearby

churchyard. The community band J..... is a part of was playing as entertainment. We saw many people there that we knew, and had a good chance to connect with some contacts we hadn't seen for awhile. It was a productive day, and also left us feeling that we have a community here!

The half term event went well - we talked about Daniel 3 with the kids, and the ones that came seemed to enjoy and interact well with the story. It was great to see the kids acting out the story and seeing God saving Shadrach Meshach and Abednego from the fiery furnace! There were also 12 ladies that came and heard the story of Ruth.

S.... has had opportunity to meet again with J at the bookshop - he has wanted to spend time learning more about faith and the Bible - pray this time together and the growth continues.

S...., J..... and a couple other teammates have recently started playing cricket in the park on Thursday nights. It has been hard here to connect and get to know any Bengali men, especially younger ones - but now they have had up to 12 guys coming out to play cricket each week. They are excited about the relationships that can be built.

Over half term we had a trip with girl's club to paint ceramics and picnic in V. Park - it was a good time to talk with the girls and hear how they are. Pray for increased times to share more deeply with them. A couple weeks ago we had a session where our teammate shared her testimony - pray for opportunities for her to chat with the girls in future if they have questions about what she shared.

S.... is continuing to run book tables on Fridays and some Saturdays - pray for the people that stop and pick up material or who talk. Some who come by are very well trained in how to argue - pray for wisdom for S.... in those moments and for God to speak through him.

A teammate and I had a recent chance to share about Asha with a local church. She was sharing facts about Bengalis here in L.... and commented that she knows of two, maybe a couple more, Sylheti believers here - those two are part of our plant team. It struck me just how hard this outreach is, but also how amazing these two are, and what a blessing they are to all of our team and those attending Asha. Please pray for them!

Family prayer requests.

A...... had a good birthday - she and her friend enjoyed ice skating, and got a surprise of L..... coming down to help out. Continue to pray for good connections and relationship building with her friend and family.

Together we will empower moms and dads to choose hope and choose life!



THE END AND A BEGINNING

Phase 1 Competition! Wonderful closure celebration! On to Phase 2 in the fall. A recap.

Ed: When I hit 65, I wasn't interested in retirement but rather in redeployment. I had a burden for the huge number of global churches without trained leaders - hundreds of thousands of church leaders have little or no access to solid Biblical education. When we began with ITEN, none of us knew God had been drawing an ethnic group to faith in SE in LARGE numbers who needed training. But their needs and ITEN's skills as a team were a match!

The ITEN SE journey has been stretching. It's amazing what we have pulled from our wells of experience and what new things we have learned. God has convinced us afresh that "we are His workmanship, created for good works which God made in advance that we should walk in them." Ephesians 2:10.



May 19th we celebrated completion of the Ministry Leadership Training Institute (MLTI) Phase 1 of training.

If you are a numbers person...here are some stats for you:

- 30 Church leaders trained as trainers (pastors, evangelists Church-planters).
- Out of the 30 who began, 26 completed all the requirements. Four are working to do so.
- 210 churches have received training with MLTI curriculum.
- At least 67 training sessions took place through the first 8 classes.
- 6 different denominations in seven provinces have been impacted.
- 8 men from Phase 1 have been approved to be the instructors for Phase 2 courses with coaching from us.
- Ed has written a reference Study Bible for them a first of its kind in the mother tongue of the students.

If you are a relational person, we have parental/brotherly love the men of MLTI they are like our sons...only 2 are over 50. Praying with them, worshiping, hearing stories, and eating together has been deepened our relationships. Nan has collected information about their families and prayer needs and can share them if you would like to provide prayer support for them contact her.

Meetings and meals with the leadership of the denomination and bible school we partner with have been warm. Having the denomination's president reach over and put food on our plates showed either we are terribly awkward eating or they are honoring us as they would older members of their family. Likely a little of both based on relational interactions we have seen.

We are more than pleased with what has been accomplished and are looking ahead to Phase 2.

Rejoice before the Lord with us! Pray for the men to be faithful in re-teaching the two final classes in their regions.

June 5-7 M & S K., team leaders for ITEN, will come for a few days to meet B. & F. and their kids. B. has taught ITEN classes in SL for ITEN. He is working on a masters at ... here in B. finished his first year of courses successfully. His twin sons, turning 5 years old June 14, got into different schools for about a month. Ezra totally loved the stimulation. Ezekiel got to ride the "big Velveeta" school bus to his school. They will begin kindergarten in the upcoming school year. Ephraim (3 y/o) is on a list to get info Head Start preschool in the fall. Pray for ongoing relationship.

ITEN will have a full team retreat in the Denver area June 16-19 - first ever in our organizational history. August 4th we'll celebrate our 50th anniversary and Nan's 70th birthday on the 15th indicating that we are actually old.

We will be working on revisions on MLTI materials so it can used more broadly overseas...even at your church. The courses are being used in SL and plans are in the works for a S. A. country in partnership with another World Outreach worker. We'll be back in touch prior to our return overseas as the dates are arranged.

Pray for the details to come together. Look for an email the 2nd half of August.







Saturday, July 8th, 5 teens, 4 adults, and your pastor are leaving for Mission, South Dakota to spend a life-changing week with the Lakota

people of the Rosebud Sioux Reservation, and many will never be the same! They'll never forget the wild beauty of the land where the Sicangu Lakota, "Burnt-Thigh Nation," live. The Rosebud Reservation is an exciting world of rolling grassy hills and deep, tree-lined creek bottoms—like the scenery you may have glimpsed in the movie *Dances with Wolves*. For centuries these prairies were ruled by the proud horse culture of the Sioux, who roamed and hunted buffalo from the Mississippi River to the Rocky Mountains.

Today the various bands of the Sioux Nation live on reservations scattered across several states. The Rosebud is one of the poorest counties in the United States. Many here face a harsh choice: leave the reservation, the family, friends, and culture they love—or stay and live in shocking poverty, where up to 80% cannot find a job. Life is especially hard on the elderly, whose sons and daughters move away to find work, leaving them either alone or left to raise their grandchildren.

The teams will demonstrate Jesus' love and compassion in tangible ways, serving real people in need while working on projects like building wheelchair ramps and handrails, weatherizing homes and trailers, reconstructing sagging porches, significant painting projects, interior and exterior carpentry, and other home repair projects that the homeowner cannot otherwise complete.

Please be in prayer for all of them, the people they are going to serve, the other teams that they will be working with, and those leading them, plus so many other aspects of the trip.
