



#### **Post-Mission Trip Reflections**

Last Sunday (7/16) we were able to hear some reflections from the group of students who returned from their week of service in Mission, SD. If you weren't able to be there or hear their report, I would encourage you to go back to the video on Facebook and enjoy their comments. I also wanted to add some of my own for the encouragement of our church. They could be summed up with this: we have an amazing group of young people! Let me share a few reasons why we should all be proud of them.

First, they were wonderfully participatory and supportive of everyone in the group. There was a range of age diversity represented on the trip, but everyone bonded very well together. I enjoyed seeing them work together and hearing them talk together. Some of my favorite interactions came when they would collectively come to me with a decision or a question that they had already agreed upon. For example, at one point on the way home, the question came up, "We already talked this through, now we want to hear how you answer it: how were believers in the Old Testament saved before the death and resurrection of Jesus?" Amazing!

Second, they each worked incredibly hard. One of my favorite parts of the trip each year is hearing from other adults from around the country coming and saying, "is one of your kids?" To which I am always enthusiastic to say "absolutely!" and my joy compounds when they say, "they are such a hard worker!" That has a lot to do with where they're from, to be sure, but it reflects a quality of character that we should all be proud of. Many of our students end up leading and directing the work on their crews, not because they are brash, but because they are competent, confident, magnetic, and hard working.

Third, I was very proud of the way they not only bonded in friendship, but also in spiritual growth, as they all shared their stories of what God had been doing, how they understand what He is doing, and what they hope for in their futures. This kind of honest sharing takes courage, but they each found it, and they were blessed for it.

Finally, I am especially proud of the young adults who were leaders on this trip, who have been attending workcamps together since they were early in their teenage years, and who intend to continue leading groups of students from our church into the future. They know that family and life circumstances make it very difficult for me to be away for home and they are stepping up and already talking about the summer of 2024. Seeing young students grow into young adults and step into leadership is a thrill to this pastor's heart.

Join me in thanking God for this group of young people, representative of the quality of young people we have amongst our entire church family.

Girl's club and the church youth group will have an end of school BBQ event where they can gather and bring friends and also "grill a Christian" and talk about faith things. Last year this brought in a lot of non- Christian kids who had good questions and conversations - pray this happens again this year.

Continue to pray for the contacts we have here that struggle with hard things in their lives- either circumstances or abuse or poverty or health - pray we can help their immediate needs, but also show the love of God through our actions and speech.

Our Asha team just had a weekend away - it was great for visioning and for team building. Pray that we can continue to build on the things we talked about and planned and continue to grow together.

These youth are searching, inquisitive, and have deep questions! Camper teams have worked together and celebrated success once they found unity. Life lessons are learned through every camp experience



#### HAVE YOU HAD AN ABORTION?

"Have you had an abortion, and now regret it?" While many women probably read that and say to themselves, "Yes," the idea of actually talking with someone



about that regret is often daunting. It can be a difficult first step to pick up the phone and talk with someone. But with this first step, the healing process that has been put off, sometimes for decades, can begin.

Pregnancy Resources utilizes a resource called "Forgiven and Set Free," by Linda Cochrane. It is a 10 week Bible study steeped in scripture. Typically, meetings are done in a group setting, but one-on-one arrangements can be made as needed. The group setting allows the participants to realize that they are not alone. At the beginning, women are often nervous and unsure about having signed up for this! The group leaders, who are also postabortive, offer assurance that God has healing in store – if they will just keep at it. And when they do, He is faithful!

At the end of the study, each woman has an opportunity to name her baby. We hold a memorial service where she can then tenderly release her child into God's care. It is always a touching and meaningful time. The women of the group have bonded and celebrate their healing together.

Here are a few thoughts from previous participants in their own words:

"From the first meeting, I felt completely loved and safe to begin the journey to forgiveness and healing."

"I feel like I have finally left this confessed sin forever at the foot of the cross and won't pick it up again."

"I have forgiven myself for not making a better choice for my baby and I can accept God's forgiveness."

God uses the After Abortion Care ministry at Pregnancy Resources to heal hearts and change lives. It is a blessing to be able to offer this important help to those who take that first step. So, have you had an abortion and now regret it? If so, please take that first step and call. You won't regret that!





Once you have filled out the form submit it to the office by **NO LATER than AUGUST 27th**. Session will review your request at their August meeting the next evening.


