REACHING OUT; REACHING IN

There is a question that church leaders usually discuss among themselves when evaluating ministry effectiveness that goes something like this, "what are the pathways for involvement in our community?" The question is essentially asking, how it is that people are first exposed to the church, grow in familiarity with the church and the Gospel of Christ, and then set on pathways toward Christian discipleship that lead to places of service and perhaps leadership.

There are some [mostly very large] churches that intend a very specific roadmap of classes and events and programs and ministries for every individual need and every individual circumstance. While that kind of intentionality might be programmatically commendable it is also practically impossible for most churches. That doesn't mean that churches shouldn't be equally as intentional, but it does mean that efforts will have to pull double and even triple duty. Consider the following reflection on some of our upcoming events that have a purpose in reaching new folks and building up the ones that already call Edgington their spiritual home.

The Harvest Party – October 8th 4-7pm - This event is for the church family but is also just as much for those not yet part of the church family. That's why we invite all the un-churched families from the summer VBS program to attend and why you are encouraged to invite friends and neighbors to join us. At the same time, we look forward to a time spent together with the families and friends that we already know. It's not either/or – it's both/and.

If our hope is to have an open hand to our community during the Harvest Party, it's even more true of our Trunk-or-Treat – October 29th 4-6pm – Last year was a wonderful success, and I hope we see it expand this year. If you were not able to attend and reserve a spot last year, please consider it this year! This event is put on by all of us, and it engages all our members who are willing to share in blessing our community. Speaking of reaching out, Lisa works hard to get invitations out to all the elementary students in the district, so who knows how many we will see this year – I hope we will be prepared with LOTS of candy.

So, these events have value for the first-time visitor, the irregular visitor, the new member, the long-time member, the servant-member, and the leader-members. These events reach out and reach in at the same time. They are not events in and of themselves, just to have another thing on the calendar. We approach these opportunities with purpose to reach out and strengthen the existing ties that bind. Won't you consider joining us and helping us to accomplish both of those purposes? I look forward to these, and every opportunity we have to gather as the body of Christ, and I especially look forward to seeing you there.







FOOD PANTRY UPDATE & NEXT DISTRIBUTION

On Thursday, August 24th five of us set up tables and boxes for the distribution and loaded some carts to be ready for packing on Friday. God sent us good help on both Friday and Saturday - 10 people packed the boxes on Friday. On Saturday, we had wonderful help from 6 high school students who did the heavy lifting & helped to pack meat and produce &helped with the patrons. In addition to the high school students we had 9 adults help on Saturday.

Two families had to reschedule their pickups. By Monday morning all the boxes were picked up. We served 30 families comprising 88 adults, 7 teens, and 13 children. We were surprised that numbers were down from previous distributions. However, two people had passed away and two families had moved out of the district, so that accounted for 4 families.

We purchased some extra non-perishable items, as we had thought there would be approximately 40 families, so we have a good start for the fall distribution. Now we are ready to add to the shelves with more non-perishable items. Thank you to all who helped us with prayers and donations of time, money, and food. We certainly appreciate the support from area churches and the community.

Our next distribution for the food pantry will be on November 11th.

Jenny* came to Pregnancy Resources happy to be pregnant, interested in parenting classes, and excited to be starting this new chapter in her life.



Although she and her partner hadn't been together for long, they both laughed and smiled through the pregnancy test and ultrasound appointments and began attending classes together. Then came that horrible day.

The anger and the violence was not something Jenny had seen coming. The police were called, an order of protection was issued, and Jenny was relocated to a safe, undisclosed location. Now, the woman who had been happy, excited, and filled with joy was devastated, terrified, and overwhelmed with grief. This pregnancy was one more complication and abortion seemed to be the solution.

In the days after the event, Jenny reached back out to Pregnancy Resources and asked to meet with her nurse to fully discuss her options once again. As Jenny and her nurse met, Jenny was able to talk about her fears, her frustrations, and her heartache. She was heard and she was seen. Options education occurred once again, and there was a long discussion about adoption as a realistic option. At her request, another ultrasound was provided, and Jenny saw "her little human" on the screen. In the midst of turmoil and fear – this mother's love for her child prevailed and Jenny again chose life for her little one.

The days ahead will not be easy, but Jenny knows that she is not alone, and she has hope that there will be better days ahead. Thank you for making continuing support available for Jenny. Because of you, Jenny was able to find the hope and the help she needed when life hung in the balance.

Tomorrow another "Jenny" will walk through the doors – and because of you, another "Jenny" will find help too! Thank you for making a difference.

It was a sweet time to see them and discuss how God has been answering healing prayers for this little boy.

As school starts up again next week, we will go back to a full schedule of events. Pray that we will be deliberate in how we talk about faith in these times, and for logistics of scheduling as well. Some specific things to pray for:

Why gray hair doesn't mean the end ...

Recently we visited a non-traditional church, Downtown Phoenix Church who focus on being salt and light near ASU's campus. We have met with them off and on over the past 7 years. Looking for ways to connect, this group of church planters found bringing well-behaved, friendly dogs who opened natural magnetic connections. Now in parks & coffee shops they have causal chats that lead to intentional spiritual conversations.



They have grown to four house groups meeting weekly and a monthly Sunday afternoon worship that is authentic fellowship with one another and the King of Kings.

We were asked, why, at our ages did we sign up with ITEN, to which Nan replied, "Why not? We enjoy good health, have information that is needed to equip leaders to take the gospel where it isn't. As Westerners we are barred from the northern region of V....., where 30-40 unreached people groups live. A place where there are not believers or churches. And our age gives us credibility. So why not!"

The next day we received this text from Pastor Jim: "We thoroughly enjoyed hearing how you say "why not?!?" when asked to continue in mission. I find it amazing how God uses us, not because we are anything so talented -but because we make ourselves available. My prayer is that more and more of our folks will recognize being the church doesn't require as much "spectacular" as it does being relational and available. After all, ultimately it is God's presence that changes everything, and we are merely brought along in the process!"

"Why not?" is a great question to ask when discerning God's path for your life. Life isn't static; sometimes God's shuffles the deck and moves us. How has God led you to take steps to be salt and light, to change your location, to adjust your lifestyle? You seasoned adults, how have your lives been led over the years? We'd enjoy hearing your stories.

What's been on our desks and what's ahead...

Ed has updated materials for two MLTI classes and is working on a third. Isn't it true that what is good can always be edited to be even better after field testing?! "Theological Foundations" was taught by team leader, M. K. in S..... L.... in August for the EPC of S..... L....'s pastors and leaders. Well received. Nan, as a co-leader with D..... V.V., is doing leg work for a vision/work trip for churches in the Presbytery of the West to a Business for Transformation (B4T) project in SE Asia. This site's platform does mariculture Community Development via raising sea cucumbers (a delicacy in Asia) while living & working side by side with unreached Muslim people. We've been asked to help with Community Health Outreach (think Evangelism) ...

In November ITEN teammates, M. K., P./E. B. and we will attend GPro, Congress II a conference in P..... to network and learn about trends & trials in informal theological education. Informal means that courses don't lead to an accredited degree but provide accessible training for pastors and leaders. This is the type of program we have been providing in V......

After a quick repack of our bags, we'll head to V...... to coach the 8 men who will teach the new cohort of 30 leaders for Ministry Leadership Training Institute (MLTI). During the summer we have been plotting how best to schedule reviewing content and considering best possible teaching methods. We want to encourage these men who are like sons. May we be apt teachers/mentors and be a blessing to them. May we continue to build fellowship as the body of Christ. While there we hope to have conversations about other ways we can serve local ministries to make better use of the cost/stress of travel. While on that side of the globe we'll take time to visit some new locations.

The end of 2023 marks the end of full time work with ITEN.....but we don't plan a full stop retirement. We aren't ready for rocking chair lives yet - less work load pressure is desired to make time for new ways of being salt and light. We have been blessed by many people and churches who have faithfully supported us financially, praying, and encouraging! Our hearts are full of gratitude! Thank you! Thank you! THANK YOU! INTRODUCTION TO NEW MINISTRY PARTNERS - MIKE & STEPHANIE KUHN

GRATEFUL FOR YOU

Dear Deb and Missions Committee,

Greetings in Christ. I hope this finds all of you well.

Stephanie and I have noticed two gifts from your church in April and in July. Thank-you so much! It's even more special because we've never met you. I wanted to understand how such a wonderful thing happened so I called your church number and spoke to Lisa. She explained that you had supported the Woodworth's and the McCallums. Thank-you for that long-term support and for continuing as the Woodworth's and McCallum's transition into new ministries and callings.

Could I briefly introduce you to myself and Stephanie?

We have three daughters...all are married. We also have 7 grandkids and an 8th on the way. I'll attach a family photo below.

Our ministry history is divided into four periods. First, we were in Europe, North Africa and the Middle East for 21 years (1984-2005). Most of that time was in Cairo, Egypt. We were discipling former Muslims and also connecting them with local churches in and around Cairo. In 2005, I was deported from Cairo and that brought that phase of our ministry to an end.

The second phase was from 2006-2012. After our abrupt departure from Cairo, I was hired as an assistant pastor at Cedar Springs Presbyterian Church (Knoxville, TN). It was a great place for me to learn about the church in the US, to stay involved in international mission and to get our girls established in US schools and universities. In 2012, CSPC helped send us back to the Middle East...this time to Beirut, Lebanon.

We both taught at the Arab Baptist Theological Seminary from 2012-2018. I helped launch an online program. Steph taught English to the seminary students. Later I became the professor of Biblical Theology and Discipleship. During this period we were with ITEN, seconded to ABTS.

2018-present. We departed Beirut in 2018, feeling the time had come for us to give our teaching roles to locals. We continued with ITEN (International Theological Education Network), working in the Middle East. This year, I became the director of ITEN taking over for Bruce Anderson, ITEN's founder. I'm very excited about the possibility of non-formal theological training as a means to further church planting among unreached people. I could tell you a lot about that, but this email would get super long, but I will forward to you our most recent

newsletter. Please let me know if you would like me to add your email address to our newsletter distribution list. Thanks.

My purpose in writing is to thank you and assure you of our prayers for Edgington. We appreciate your support of ITEN and we hope it will continue to be a fruitful partnership for many years.

– And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. John 10:16a

This was my third trip to S.... L.... I'm getting to know these young men. With each trip my respect and love for them grows deeper. All of them are training to plant new churches and/or pastor the churches they currently serve. In our training, we attempt to hear His voice through His word. Like their master, they are bringing other sheep into His fold. Here are a few aspects of the trip that made an impression on me.

- Though the training is in English, it is usually the third language for these trainees. For that reason, we need to go slow and make sure everyone understands.
- Our topic was "Theological Foundations." We dove into topics like creation, the church, God, man, sin, salvation, etc. There was a broad awareness that they needed to grasp these doctrines in order to serve their churches. These men aspire to lead their communities.
- I estimate that about 80% of the questions they face arise from their Muslim majority background. It felt familiar to me to be responding to questions I've been asked for many years in the Middle East.
- Worship was passionate; Prayers were intense and usually voiced all together at the same time
- Poverty is an ever present reality. Meals are very simple--rice and something on top. Sardines are the "go to" meal.
- Each of these trainees works in the interior villages of S..... L..... None are based in the larger towns and cities. the EPC of S..... L.... aspires to plant churches in the Muslim majority villages. It is an honor for ITEN to play a role in their ministry.
- In addition to six churches, many churches are being planted through village outreaches led by the trainees.

Pictured above was an evening session of 2+ hours where a S.... L..... colleague and I were sharing with the village people. Because the Evangelical Presbyterian Church of S.... L.... is deeply committed to education as a means of serving their country, there is great respect for the EPC pastor, his family and the church. About 100 were present. We estimated that 85% were Muslims. The questions were explicit, often concerning the things they had been taught about Christianity by their Muslim leaders (e.g. Isn't Islam the final religion taking the place of what preceded it? Jesus foretold a prophet who would come after him. Wasn't that Muhammad?). It was a chance to clarify and correct misconceptions and ensure, as best we could, that the gospel was understood.

After this session, we were asked to pray for a young woman (about 14 years old) who was afflicted by an evil presence, a demon. After a long season of prayer and some demonic manifestations, the young woman appeared well and was given instructions for further discipleship from the local pastor. I was grateful to have been a part of that prayer time. It gave me a sense of the challenges these brothers and sisters regularly face.

We give praise for the following:

- The summer was full and wonderfully blessed.
- Our first ITEN retreat where we enjoyed great unity of heart and purpose. PLEASE check out our updated ITEN website! We are excited to see where God takes the ITEN team in the coming years.
- Safe and blessed travel to S..... and S..... L....
- Mike's finger wound healed wonderfully while he was in Africa. We were shocked at how quickly the wound closed up and new skin formed! THANK you so much for praying with us! There is still some nerve damage but we trust that will dissipate with time.
- We've enjoyed several good visits with our kids including one family photo session (see below)
- Our garden has produced a bumper crop of tomatoes, zucchini, apples, arugula and kale.

As we move into the Fall, please join us in prayer for the following:

- A new ITEN couple beginning their ministry in C..... A... (K.......).
- Fruitful travel and ministry for several of our ITEN team to C..... A..., E..... E....., P......, V......
- Over the next 2-3 months, we will share with several supporting churches: Cordata Presbyterian (Bellingham, WA),
 Uptown Church (Charlotte, NC), First Presbyterian (Jacksonville, OR) and Great Valley Presbyterian (Malvern, PA).
 Please pray for God-given connections and relationships of trust.
- Plans for ITEN training in B...... in early 2024. Pray for the right collaborative team to form for training in B.......
- Unity, focus and excellence among our ITEN colleagues in the various sites we serve globally.







We hope you have a plan to be in God's Word for 2023! To help you with that, Pastor Zach has a chronological Bible reading plan on the table in the sanctuary foyer.







This is such a wonderful ministry with such great impact and allows everyone to get the chance to do a little hands on mission work!


