The stories behind the great hymns of our faith are always a blessing to learn about. Thomas Chisholm, the author of "Great Is Thy Faithfulness" and 1200 other poems was born in a log cabin in Kentucky in 1866, and he lived a quite ordinary life: he worked as a schoolteacher, a newspaper editor, and insurance agent, then he retired and spent his remaining days at the modern equivalent of a nursing home. Unlike many hymns that have heart-wrenching stories behind them "Great Is Thy Faithfulness" is inspired by the simple realization that God is at work in our lives on a daily basis. Chisholm wrote, "My income has not been large at any time due to impaired health in the earlier years which has followed me on until now. Although I must not fail to record here the unfailing faithfulness of a covenant-keeping God and that He has given me many wonderful displays of His providing care, for which I am filled with astonishing gratefulness." Doesn't that add some beautiful context to the words:

Summer and winter, and springtime and harvest, Sun, moon, and stars in their courses above, Join with all nature in manifold witness To Thy great faithfulness, mercy, and love.

Years and time and seasons seem to roll on with increasing speed; and the Lord God is present in each of them to meet us in grace and faithfulness.



Darkness: Distraction from or deep dive into Christmas Joy?

While living in another city several years ago, a couple a few doors down experienced a heartbreaking nightmare. Their dear sweet 29-year-old daughter, who loved and enriched the lives of many others, succumbed to suicide after a long bout with soul-shattering depression. This horror rocked their world. It rocked the worlds of all the neighbors on our street – we cherished this precious family and longed to help them wade through the deep waters of their grief. Many neighbors stepped up to serve by being present and grieving with them, taking them meals, running errands, and seeking to meet other practical needs.

After several months passed, we were entering the Christmas holiday season. I knew this would be an extra excruciating time for this family given it was one of the many firsts they would journey through without their beloved daughter. I wanted to find a way to reach out

and let them know we were still celebrating their daughter's life, grieving her death, and hoping in Christ's resurrection reunion. We were still in their corner with our hearts leaning their way.

Over the course of my ministry, when families have lost children, it has been my custom to let some time pass and then give them a Nicholas Wolterstorff book entitled Lament for a Son. Wolterstorff lost his 25-year-old son in a tragic rock-climbing accident. This impactful book, characterized by profound honesty and vulnerability, narrates his journey through an intense period of lamentation and grief, akin to traversing a deep valley of emotional experiences. I've seen God use this treasure to help many grieving parents process the horrifying experience of the death of their child.

A few days before Christmas I walked over to this couple's house to give them this book. The wife greeted me at the door and seemed grateful for the gift. She and her husband were/are such gracious people and such exemplary neighbors. It was fascinating for me to see how she was able, amidst her grief, to point out how amazing the neighbors on our street had been in loving them. While plagued with gut-wrenching suffering, she was finding ways to be thankful for others.

I kept my visit brief and as I turned away to walk home, she said something that stopped me in my tracks. She warmly noted that she appreciated the gift, but she wanted to let me know that she and her husband didn't want us feeling sad for them at this time of year. They wanted all their neighbors to be free from sorrow so we could have a Merry Christmas. In some strange way, though they were experiencing the worst nightmare of their lives, they didn't want their grief to spoil the happy holidays for others. Now let me hasten to say that I was BLOWN AWAY by her and her husband's selflessness – they were always like that... always thinking of others. Always out to do random acts of kindness for people. I commended her for her generous expression of kindness. But... I also had to offer what I hoped and prayed would be a comforting rebuttal to her sentiment. I told her that I love the holiday season and all the merriment... no doubt about it. I'm a big fan of Christmas merriment as a cultural holiday. However, I also believe that we can easily misconstrue and therefore miss the truly enchanting nature of the Christmas story.

Dark times don't undermine the joy of Christmas. They accentuate the jubilance of this magical season.

Advent is about us practicing actively waiting on God to arrive... to show up amidst this world's sickness, suffering, sinfulness, injustice, darkness, and death. God's a "showing up" kind of God. He comes to pitch his tent slap dab in the middle of this fascinating and frustrating life adventure with us. He comes to be "God with us."

The rather famous Advent hymn, Come Thou Long Expected Jesus, captures it well by targeting the cheerful news of the birth of God's son right at the bull's eye of our pain and sorrow.

Come to earth to taste our sadness, he whose glories knew no end; by his life he brings us gladness, our Redeemer, Shepherd, Friend.
Leaving riches without number, born within a cattle stall; this the everlasting wonder, Christ was born the Lord of all.

Did you catch it? The hymn writer is insisting on the true nature of Christmas merriment. Here's "the everlasting wonder" – He's saying that this is the true magic of Christmas... this is what makes for holiday cheer. The Christ (The world's true King of Love and Hope. The one alone who makes all things new.) is born the Lord of all. This is the eternal Son of God –

"he whose glories knew no end." AND... what was the heartfelt job description which prompted the Son of God to be launched into this life with us? This is God in a Bod... and for what? He did it because he wanted to "taste our sadness" and through his deep-dive headlong plunge into our sadness he would go judo on it, reverse it and end up healing this broken world and our broken lives. He tastes our sadness to bring us gladness... as the old book says, he turns our mourning into laughter. He does this not by avoiding the darkness plunge but by embracing it.

Advent invites us to step into the story of the gospel. The whole light shining in the darkness experience. Like immersive theater (Tish Warren's description), where the audience participates in the play, during Advent, we join the people of Israel in their anticipation of the Messiah. As Tish Harrison Warren puts it in her wonderful book, Advent: The Season of Hope,

"... we imaginatively enter into the confusion, longing, frustration, and sense of dreams deferred that the people of Israel felt year after year, generation after generation. We prepare for the joy of Christmas by waiting on the dark streets of Bethlehem, our eyes straining to glimpse the dawning of that everlasting light."

Christ entered into our pain and confusion. He walks those roads with us to redeem and restore the neighborhood he created in love and he set out to redeem in love. It is precisely because he's a God who arrives in the darkness to bring his everlasting light that we can journey through the darkness into the light and so that we can be instruments in this Redeemer's hands spreading his light and life to all around us. We do this knowing that there's a second advent coming where Christ will arrive in glory to make all things new. Here's Tish Harrison Warren (Advent: The Season of Hope) once again for the win:

"We celebrate that Jesus came in his incarnation and find comfort in how he comes to us in our daily lives, but all of our longings meet their end in Christ coming again, bringing healing, peace, joy, and an unimaginable wholeness in his wake. The final return of Christ is the undoing of cancer. It is the utter dismantling of white supremacy and racism. It is the delivery of justice for the victimized, for the weakest and most vulnerable whom the powerful have brutalized with seeming impunity. It is the regeneration of dead coral reefs. It is the end of global pandemics. It is the vindication of those falsely imprisoned. It is the weeping of children giving way to their eternal laughter. It is the death of death."

Back to the book, Nicholas Wolterstorff's Lament for a Son, I gave as a Christmas gift to our neighbors grieving the loss of their daughter. This is a beautiful quote filled with all kinds of Advent/Christmas themes:

"Rather often I am asked whether the grief remains as intense as when I wrote. The answer is, No. The wound is no longer raw. But is has not disappeared. That is as it should be. If he was worth loving, he is worth grieving over. Grief is existential testimony to the worth of the one loved. The worth abides.

So I own my grief. I do not try to put it behind me to get over it, to forget it. I do not try to dis-own it. If someone asks, "Who are you, tell me about yourself," I say – not immediately, but shortly – "I am one who lost a son." That loss determines my identity; not all of my identity, but much of it. It belongs within my story. I struggle indeed to go beyond merely owning my grief toward owning it redemptively. But I will not and cannot disown it. I shall remember Eric. Lament is a part of life.

A friend told me that he had given copies of *Lament* to all of his children. "Why did you do that?" I asked. "Because it is a love-song," he said. That took me aback. But Yes, it is a love-song. Every lament is a love-song.

Will love-songs one day no longer be laments?"

Advent and Christmas help us join the church through the ages in immersing ourselves in the powerful one-two punch of Lament and Love that the story of Christ's arrival provides us with. We are to own it, live it, walk it out, and share this glorious good news with the world. We can journey full of faith, hope, and love precisely because God sent his son into the darkness. He is a God "who lost a son" in order to bring many daughters and sons out of the darkness and into his marvelous light.

One day love-songs will no longer be laments! Hallelujah! Christ has come! Christ has lived! Christ has died! Christ has risen! Christ will come again!

As we celebrate this Advent and Christmas season, let us remember the true essence of these holidays - the arrival of Christ's hope and love amidst our darkness.

Last week (on Thanksgiving!) the market that is across the road from our home had a big Christmas light switch on event. We walk through the market everyday to take A...... to school, so she has been watching them add lights and Christmas trees in preparation, and was very excited to go see the lights. We got there in time for the

countdown and a blast of fake snow as the (very bright) lights turned on. Then Elton John's *Step into Christmas* started blaring. Looking around, we were surrounded by Muslim market stall owners, and a mix of kids and parents, half of whom were also Muslim. I was struck again by how unique this area is- we are a minority here both in faith and in ethnicity, and most days we see more hijabs and halal food signs than anything else. Yet we also live in a secular western society, and our Muslim neighbors have adapted to it enough to be able to enjoy the fun and lights and free hot chocolate right alongside our secular atheistic neighbors. And, they are all missing the depth of significance that this is the celebration of God coming to live with us in order to save us! It is a challenge to speak truth here, because there are so many layers of belief and acceptance. But we have confidence in a God that did choose to come to earth to save us- and that fills us with joy in him and hope for those around us to hear and understand. Please rejoice with us and pray with us too.

A look at our December! We have extra events for Christmas and we also have the everyday events of normal... and then we have a break for the holidays.

We'll start the month slowly, with normal things like S.... doing ESOL one-to-one lessons, spending Mondays and Tuesdays in the bookshop talking to those who stop by, or having planned meetings to discuss faith, and book table on Friday afternoon. We also have a staff meeting every Wednesday and Asha services on Sunday afternoon. C.....has a couple slower planning days on Mondays and Tuesdays that will be spent on safeguarding training, and then lunch clubs on Thursday and Friday, art drop in, and girl's club.

December 6<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, and 20<sup>th</sup>, and potentially the 11<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> as well, C...... will be assisting an organization called Crossteach with assemblies for area schools. Crossteach focuses on partnering with local churches to reach local schools with the truth about Jesus. Religion is taught in schools here, but not always accurately, so Crossteach offers to run assemblies at Christmas and Easter to explain Christian beliefs- they are fun, engaging, and accurate. These are also a way for local churches to be present and involved in the community in a positive way.

December 10<sup>th</sup> we will invite our Asha family and guests to a nativity play at a local farm- we are hoping this will be a way to get families involved and also a fun way to talk about the story of Christmas, as we walk through the farm. December 17<sup>th</sup> is our Asha Christmas service. Events at the holidays are popular here, and usually bring a larger crowd. This will have a meal after and some acting of the Christmas story during the service.

December 22<sup>nd</sup> will be a girl's club Christmas dinner and talk about Christmas. We will put on a full dinner for them, and are also asking the graduated girls to come back and help cook- hoping for good times of conversation.

Then we will have a couple weeks off while the kids will are on holiday from school!

We are currently at around 97% of our needed monthly support, and we are very grateful to all of our supporters! You are all amazing and we are very grateful for how God is using you to help share Him with SE Asians here in L.....! Some of our support does come from year end gifts and one time gifts, both of which help boost those monthly numbers. If you are considering a year end gift, we do ask that you pray about that and talk to us if you have questions. 



The Women's Ministry will provide soup luncheon before congregational meeting. There will be a variety of homemade soups to choose from and all available for a freewill donation.






The Women's Ministry does much work and support behind the scenes for the church, so please stay and support them while filling your bellies with some warm, comfort food!

The small storage room located between the janitor's closet and lounge, just behind the kitchen, has become a general "catch all" area and is in need of cleaning and organizing.


