



A VIEW OF CHILDREN IN THE COVENANT COMMUNITY

There was a temptation to title this, “Children in the Church” and provide a practical explanation for why we insist on *not dismissing* children to an age appropriate class during the worship service, as is common practice in many evangelical churches. That would be interesting and helpful but would perhaps be better reserved for another time because the substance of this newsletter article would need to stand as a foundation for how that other matter is answered.

One of the most practically distinctive parts of Presbyterian faith and practice is our view of children in the church, which we understand to be the assembly of the covenant community of Jesus Christ. Our definition of the visible church is that it “consists of everyone in the world who professes the true religion *together with their children* ([WCF 25.2](#)).” Our insistence to add that final portion regarding children is what distinguishes our view of the church from our evangelical relatives who would agree with our definition, but only until that point. We do so because of the Apostle Paul’s word concerning the children of at least one believing parent ([1 Cor 7:14](#)), the Apostle Peter’s proclamation of the gospel, which includes the application of the promise to believers and their children ([Acts 2:39](#)), which are both built upon the foundation of the Abrahamic Covenant which includes Abraham and his descendants ([Gen 17:7-12](#)).

Children of believers are called ‘covenant children’ because they are included in the covenant community (i.e. the visible church), and rightful members of that community ([Eph 1:1](#); [6:1](#)), distinct from the children of unbelievers, and blessed by our Lord Jesus ([Lk 18:15](#)). It is upon this line of reasoning that we are not only free to, but also required to apply the sign of the covenant – baptism - to our children. But a full view of children in the covenant community doesn’t end with an insistence upon their membership, but also their nurture within that community.

What does it mean to nurture the faith of the Gospel in the hearts and lives of our youngest lambs among our fold? It means that we take our responsibility to rear our children in the admonition of the Lord seriously, both in the home and in the church. With regard to covenant nurture in the church, that means that we make appropriate means of educating our children in a way that compliments the faith of their home (ex: Sunday School), and also, that we don’t merely give lip service to the inclusion of children, but we actually seek to include our children in practical ways (ex: Kid’s Kirk). In this way we hope to communicate not just our affectionate joy at the presence of children, but our insistence that they really do belong among the people of God.

If you haven’t pulled out the pew card that speaks to this reality, I would encourage you to look for it next time you’re in the sanctuary. Children are not merely tolerated in church at Edgington, they are rejoiced in! They are not a distraction; they are the next generation of faithful worshippers of the One True and Living God. That is why the church has often been called ‘the Nursery of the Holy Spirit’ as God uses His ordained means of Word, Sacrament, Prayer, and the Fellowship of the Church as the typical way that young children grow into mature and life-long committed followers of Christ. Friends, that doesn’t happen on accident – it happens because a church has purposed to be a place of covenant nurture. Rejoice with me in this work! Give thanks to God for the stewardship of our youngest and most precious lambs among us.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting.

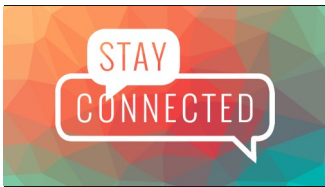

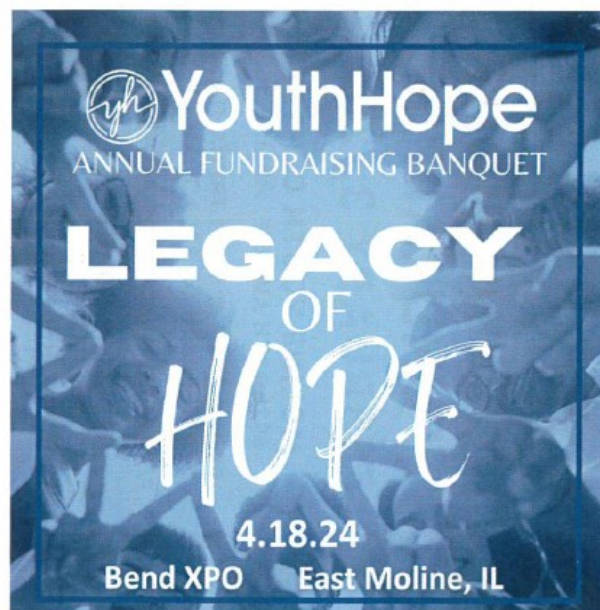
PRAYER REQUESTS

Greetings and happy February!

...At Asha we have been working through the gospel of Matthew. The past few weeks we have talked about humbling ourselves and being dependent on Jesus like children and about what it means to understand God's forgiveness and also forgiveness for each other. These are big things in a world that thinks differently -

pray for us as a team that we can model this dependence and forgiveness, and that this can be a witness to those around us who are seeking and investigating what Jesus' words mean to them. We are also praying for you all and for your churches, as you live and model Jesus' words in your areas.

An update on some of the happenings of the month:

- **Asha:** The Sylheti leaders at Asha do quite a lot, and are often doing the translation and leading in Sylheti. A couple times this month they have both been leading from the front - in English and Sylheti. The first time this happened I was struck with the excitement of this. These believers leading a service with other Sylhetis seeing and hearing - this is one of the goals we have had with this church plant! **Pray** for them as they lead and work, for God's sustaining and strength.
- **Life Exhibition:** This last week of January, local churches and mission groups have put on something called Life Exhibition - an interactive teaching time about the life of Jesus for local schools to attend. It meets the criteria for their religious education lessons, but it gives churches and Christians a chance to share about Jesus and also let children visit a church and interact with Christians. C.....helped for a couple days and it was really great to answer questions of kids and see them take gospels home with them and see their teachers positively engage. **Pray** for these kids and teachers.
- **Booktable:** The booktable team continues to set up in the same market space each week. **Continue praying** for their witness there and for those that see them there and engage with them.
Bookshop: Continue to **pray** for S.... and his conversations with J, that he can convey what it means to fully follow Christ, and for J as he seeks to pursue that. It is encouraging that he has been coming to have more talks with S.... recently. **Pray** also for S.... to have chances to discuss faith with his ESOL students and to encourage them to consider Asha.
- **Girls Club:** We had an overnight event in January that wasn't too crazy or tiring, but had some great chances to get to know some of the newer girls more, and for good conversations about everything from witchcraft to cheating in Arabic classes. **Pray** for continued times of deeper conversation, and **pray** that they consider what we share about Jesus.

A huge thank you to you all for your support and your prayers and your messages... We feel very loved by you all and it means more than we can express!

- Continue to **pray** for Asha services and for those that attend - pray that as they hear and read God's word that they would see the truth of it for themselves. **Pray** for the plant team that we would have wisdom and grace to share these truths well.

This can be a very brave thing for them to do, but many choose to stay and listen and ask questions about what they hear. **Pray** that the words they hear would touch their hearts and that God would be working in this time.
- Our team apprentice goes home the middle of this month. **Pray** for her leaving and her transition back to the US, and **pray** for our team here both practically as we fill jobs she did, and personally as we miss her.
- We are hosting an event on Feb. 14th during school break of a movie for children of the life of Jesus - with popcorn and crafts! **Pray** that lots of families attend and that the story really speaks to them.

Family prayer requests.

- S.... will leave on Feb. 29th. Please **pray** for this time for all of us. He will be in E..... during March, doing some resting and praying in B....., while also visiting some fellow workers there. **Pray** for him, and **pray** for us here as we figure out schedules and also missing S....
- J..... is going to give his testimony/statement of faith in church at the end of this month. **Pray** for him as he prepares and also for the friends he will invite and the witness this can be.

M & S

I arrived in S..... L..... shortly after New Year's Day. What a privilege it was to be there with my ITEN colleague, Dr. B. .. Every time I visit these... brothers and sisters, something happens. Surprises always await me. This visit was no different. I'll give a few highlights below.

- B.... taught a class on Community Development. One of B's key ideas is that the earth God has given us is good and has within it the ability to reproduce and multiply. Our trainees really latched on to this teaching, particularly as they sought to consider their own local resources. They are already implementing plans for locally sustainable projects.
- I had a long session with about 25 of the village leaders. This was my third time speaking to them about Islam. But this time was different. I was able to go right to the heart of what is different about the gospel and how Jesus makes the love of the Father visible and real, satisfying the deep needs of human beings. I felt they listened intently and I give praise to God for that, but also thanks to the local believers who have been sowing the seed of the gospel there for years. As we often say in ITEN "the great commission belongs to the global church."
- Not being responsible for teaching a class allowed me ample time to connect with the trainees. I was overjoyed and sometimes overwhelmed as they shared photos and stories with me of churches they are planting in remote villages. Of the 35 trainees in the photo below, I counted 22 church plants. All of these are in Muslim majority villages.
- Traveling with B.... was a blessing. Jesus sent out his disciples 2 by 2 for a reason :-). I felt like I heard B's passion and saw his gifting in a new light. I feel doubly privileged to be a part of our ITEN team. B shared a lot from his other travels to P....., V..... and U..... As I told B, I sometimes feel we are pollinators of the global church. We get to take the pollen of one location and insert it into the church in another location. What a joy!
- We concluded our time there with a half-day of meetings with five leaders from the EPC of S..... L..... We are planning a hand-over of ITEN's teaching responsibilities to local leaders. This is a cause for celebration. After August 2024, the brothers pictured below will carry the majority of the teaching load, calling on ITEN only as needed.

- Before I went to S..... L....., our ITEN colleagues E and N traveled to V..... to train a group of trainers. They are slightly ahead in the "hand-over" process. Praise God for fruitful interaction.
- Other ITEN team members are ministering in Eastern Europe, Central Asia, the Middle East and South America. We are over the top grateful for these connections to the global church of Jesus Christ

Pray with us for the following please:

- Feb. 23-25 - M... will speak at a missions conference in Thomasville, GA.
- March 18-23 - M... travels to A.... A....., E..... to teach [a class]. E..... is another A..... continent where Islam and Christianity are in contact and sometimes in conflict.
- Please pray for new fields that ITEN is considering: Currently B..... and N.... are on the drawing board. Expansion in C..... A... is immanent. We need clarity, vision, solid partners.
- Continue to pray for unity and fruitful collaboration for our ITEN team and for the mission which supports us --World Outreach of the EPC.

- E and I are expecting their first child and our eighth grand child any day now.
- We get to watch our grandsons (in Hope, BC) play basketball and our granddaughters in Seattle play volleyball and sing in the choir. How good is that?!

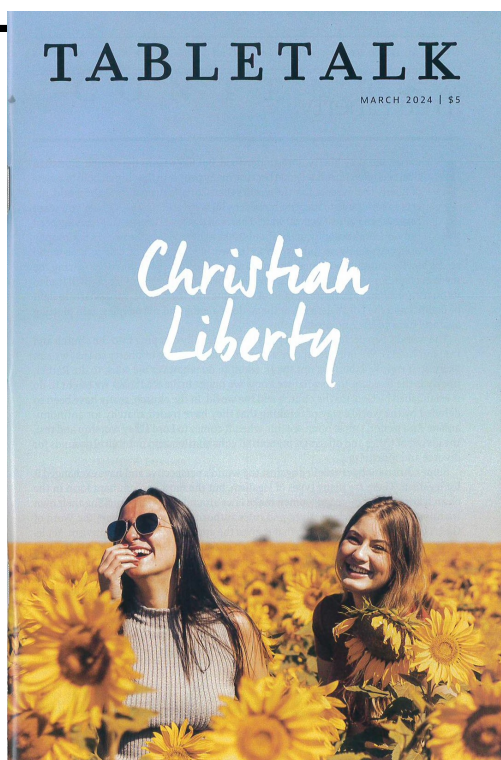

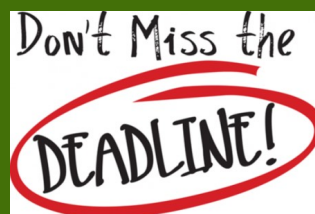

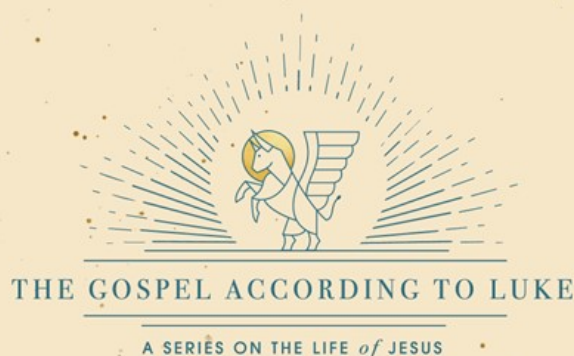

One of our most used tools is the Lexicon search, which gives users immediate access to the original Hebrew and Greek words.

2024 IS A GREAT TIME TO START FRESH IN GOD'S WORD!

Each year Pastor Zach provides a new reading plan to help equip you to spend time reading through God's Word. This year he has chosen a plan with Navigators.

The *Navigators Book-at-a-Time Bible Reading Plan* takes you through the entire Bible in one year, providing two readings for each day.

The first reading alternates between Old and New Testament books with the Gospels spread throughout the year. The second reading takes you through a chapter of the wisdom literature and Isaiah.

You can begin at any point of the year.

Each month consists of twenty-five readings. You'll have a few extra days each month to meditate more deeply on something that was significant to you in the past week, to catch up on missed readings, or to revisit favorite passages.

If reading through the entire Bible in one year looms as too large a task, you can alter the plan to meet your needs. For example, you could read the first reading this year and the second reading next year.

In the year ahead, ask God each day to speak directly to you from the Scripture portions you read. Be expectant, and let your continual exposure to God's Word reshape your attitudes and behavior as you gain a better understanding of every part of His written testimony to us.

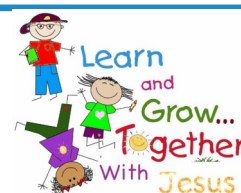

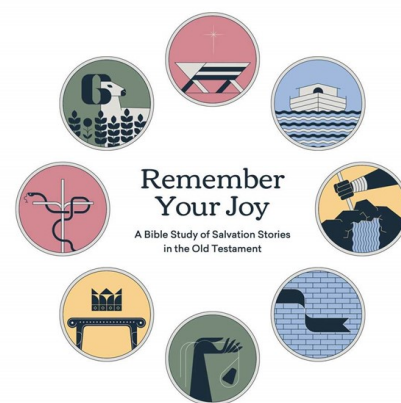


WOMEN'S MINISTRY SPRING BIBLE STUDY

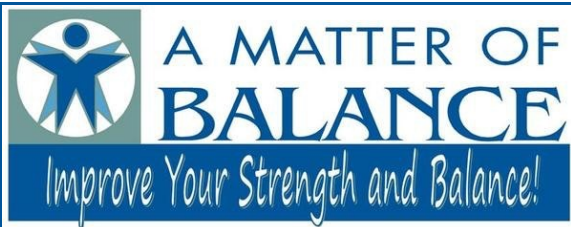
