



June is General Assembly season in the life of Evangelical Presbyterian Church. Just like the early church met in a gathered assembly in Acts 15, the General Assembly is the annual meeting of the national court of the church with Ruling and Teaching Elders from all over the country gathering to receive training and resources, worship, and conduct the business of the church. The 44th annual meeting of the GA will meet June 18 - 20 at Hope Church just outside of Memphis in Cordova, TN.



This summer will bring the same responsibilities for me as last year during the meeting itself. I run the debate and speaker clocks during the business portions, and proof the minutes for next-day distribution and approval. This will be my first assembly in six years where I do not have a scheduled report for a standing committee because my term on the permanent committee on theology has ended. Briefly, permanent committees do the work of the assembly during the year between annual meetings, and standing committees are constituted only during the three days the assembly meets. In other words, standing committees are made up of commissioners to serve as a check and balance system for the work of the Permanent Judicial Commission, have on -call parliamentary and constitutional advisement responsibilities throughout the week. Our nine-person team serves as something of the ecclesiastical supreme court for the denomination and is often called upon to assist in matters to keep the general assembly working decently and in order.

The networking group that I lead, the Westminster Society, is offering three opportunities for learning and fellowship. Our theme this summer is, "The Psalms", and we are hosting two lunches and one dinner. On Tuesday we host a networking lunch called, "Study the Psalms", with Reformed Theological Seminary's Washington D.C. campus president, Dr. Scott Redd.





Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the March 26th, 2024, Session Meeting were reviewed. A motion was made to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded and carried.

Zach's Report: Zach reported on members with health concerns and prayer needs. During April he conducted five office visits, one home, and three hospital visits as well as a lunch meeting. He conducted three Membership Matters Classes and participated in the Trustee Yard Cleanup. He also served on the RLP Ad-Interim Ordination Committee, RLP Ministerial Committee, attended three meetings of the EPC Permanent Judicial Commission and the 41st RLP Meeting. He also conducted the funeral of Linda Anderson.

Correspondence: Zach shared a Thank You card from Olivia Freyermuth thanking the Elders for their service to the church. The church received a Beneficiary Letter from the Lane & Waterman Law Firm, to be discussed under new business.

Old Business:

- The Session discussed the recent Good Friday and Easter Sunday services. Both services were well attended.
- Mic and Keith gave updates on the recent 41st RLP Presbytery meeting held in Aplington, Iowa. Among the highlights were Scott Burdsall's and Jeffery Lancaster's presentations. The Session also discussed the draft of the Pastoral Letter of Racial Lament and Hope and the Pending Overtures scheduled to be reviewed and voted on at General Assembly.
- Zach has completed the Membership Matters class with Jason and Heather Parchert and Lori Meier attending. Jason and Heather will be received into membership on May 5th and Lori Meier will be received with the fall class. Taylor Freyermuth will be baptized on May 5th as well.

New Business:

 Lane & Waterman law firm sent the church a beneficiary letter in April that indicated the church is a beneficiary of the Michael L. Swanson Trust. A motion was made for Zach to instruct the Treasurer to follow up in response to the letter. The motion was seconded and carried.

- Zach reminded the Session of the upcoming 44th EPC General Assembly in Cordova, TN on June 18th 20th and asked if anyone was interested in attending and serving as a delegate. Delegates need to be signed up by the end of May.
- Zach asked for feedback and suggestions for the Adult Sunday School Class. The current classes are well attended and received. Zach intends to teach on Biblical Anthropology in the fall and asked for help in creating a summer series. Keith and Todd volunteered to draft suggestions and formats for the summer series and send out prior to our May meeting.
- Preaching Schedule: Zach asked the Session for a Study leave the week of May 20th which will necessitate filling the pulpit on May 26th. He also requested to have someone preach on June 23rd, following his return from GA. A motion was made to approve the Study Leave and filling the pulpit on May 26th and June 23rd. The motion was seconded and carried. Mic volunteered to preach on one of those weeks and Zach will work on a replacement for one of those dates.
- Zach requested his vacation from July 1st 15th. A motion was made to approve the vacation. The motion was seconded and carried. Mic has volunteered to preach one of those weeks and Zach will work on finding a replacement to preach one of the weeks.
- The Session discussed our church's music program and the desire to supplement our organists. Zach will discuss with Pam Pithan and Nancy Cooksey.
- The Session discussed creating a Sabbatical for Zach. We would like to proceed with getting more details and advice from EPC and allow time for Zach to reflect on timing. Zach suggested that we contact Roy Yanke, Executive Director of PIR Ministries, for more information.
- Next Communion will be held May 5th, 2024. The next stated Session meeting is May 28th, 2024. The Session will discuss Chapter 7 of Strange New World, by Carl R. Trueman at that time.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting at 9:55pm. Motion Carried.

KATY'S STORY (from Trisha Wilson, Executive Director)

Sometimes, when a person makes an abortion decision there are long -term emotional, psychological, and spiritual complications. But there can be healing and freedom from those wounds. That's why after

abortion care and recovery for women and men is available at Pregnancy Resources. Below is Katy's story:

I learned about Pregnancy Resources shortly after our move to the Quad Cities. Recently, I decided to take a Pregnancy Resources Training Course. I knew my past, but no one there did, and I did not come bearing my history on my sleeve. It was during that training that I learned about a post-abortion Bible study called Forgiven and Set Free.

Participating in this group was not my original plan, but it was exactly what I needed. I was referred to a lovely woman who opened her heart to me, shared her personal story and listened to mine – whatever I wanted to share or not to share. She became someone I could trust and talk to.

My abortion story started when I was raped at age 14 by a man more than twice my age. About a year later, I found myself 16 and pregnant by the same man. **He wanted me to have an abortion to take care of our 'problem.'** I was unable to get the abortion the first two tries at two different facilities. Ultimately, this man drove me to across state lines and gave me cash and a different name to use for him on the forms. **He sent me in alone to have the abortion.** I was 14 ½ weeks pregnant. I felt broken and conflicted, but thought it was what I had to do to get away from this man and my life changing situation.

As a Christian since childhood, I was ready and willing to move on from the pain I'd struggled with for decades. I had prayed, studied the Word, and done counseling in the past... to try to unload the shame and self-hatred I had because of the decision I made as a teenager. I thought I had laid my burden at the foot of the cross, I'd asked God for forgiveness many times, but kept picking it back up – still feeling unworthy and stuck after all this time.

I believe Romans 8:28 and I rejoice in fully knowing that I have God's forgiveness, freedom, and peace after taking part in this Bible study facilitated by Pregnancy Resources. If you struggle with sorrow, regret, or shame because of an abortion decision there is healing through God's Word, and Pregnancy Resources is ready to help you, too.

In March we rejoiced as our teaching team of national men in V..... presented two MLTI (Ministry Leadership Training Institute) courses to the new cadre of 33 leaders / pastors. The first two courses are: Understanding, Applying and Teaching the Bible and Introduction to Spiritual Formation. The men taught in their mother tongue, which helps greatly with understanding. Each class member is committed to reteach the courses in their regions - living out 2

Timothy 2:2. Please be praying for their faithfulness to do the retraining. The class is made up of some bivocational pastors and but mainly church leaders. Most of them have agricultural jobs.

In mid-May we will return to refresh the men on the next two classes. Our team member, B. A., will be joining us, refreshing their grasp of *Theological Foundations* covering basic Christian doctrines (Scripture, God, Creation, Man, Christ, Salvation, the Church and Last Things). Ed will cover *The Church: Its Nature, Mission, and Leadership*.

While there, we will have discussions with local leadership regarding their invitation to provide training for another minority people group who has a growing Christian population but no trained leadership. Plans have required lots of back-and-forth communication on logistics. We thought we'd meet and train a group of 20-25 leaders on this trip but logistics needed more time. We are now aiming at doing back-to-back classes in September. The current plan for May is to head north after meeting with the Teaching Team to visit a couple of villages to help establish a relationship. Our dear co-worker, Mr. H, will drive, escort, and interpret for us.

The gospel came to this new group in the mid 1970's. A U.S. missionary came across a large gathering of this ethnic group. They were celebrating the anticipated return of a king of their people. The missionary was able to share good news about a greater king, who has already come and will come again. The gospel took root but has spread slowly in this group. We understand that there are about 1,500 believers in about 10 churches that are under the cover of our host denomination. Their church leaders have little or no training.

Discussions are in progress for two possible new locations for ITEN. One is in another SE A... location. Team leader, M. K., will be headed there to evaluate the needs and our ability to come along side of nationals. The second is a high mountain location in South A.... In September we and M. K. have penciled in an exploratory trip. Nan and Pastor Yg met in Panama in November and asked us for help training. Not all requests fit what ITEN can supply. We train leaders who commit to replicate the training with others. We aren't a brick-and-mortar group. We provide non-formal education for those who would not be able to attend a formal (traditional) Christian training degree program for various reasons. We are committed to the 85% of global pastors who have no formal training. Is that a niche you and your church have or are interested to step into? If so, can we team with you?

June 18-20 is the EPC's annual meeting, General Assembly ("GA" for short) taking place in the Memphis area at Hope Church, Cordova, TN. We will arrive the evening of the 15th and would love to have the chance to get caught up, chat and thank you for your prayers, financial support, and interest in ITEN. Can we set up time to meet?

Registration is currently open at the lowest rate. Waiting to register is more costly for participants and makes it difficult for the host church.

For those not attending, watch on <u>EPC.org</u> for information on how to listen in. Great equipping and worship will take place.

Two ways of refining we are experiencing:

Waiting -- For others to make decisions, to be able book airplane reservations early for the best price, to know for sure the opportunities in the months ahead, for a travel document to arrive. Waiting is a fact of life. Like you, we need to hold our plans loosely many times and be able to flex. Willingness and availability seem to be attitudes the Lord develops in us, not all at once, but from stage to the next. We are lives in progress.

THE HUBER FAMILY - Off to Southeast Asia, then Memphis, and... then to Central Asia!

Dearest Friends & Family,

We're writing to ask for much needed prayer support and financial needs (giving info below) regarding upcoming trips! In just a couple of weeks we will be kicking off our busiest season of travel in several years.

Saul and a World Outreach coworker will be leaving on May 17th and leading five young adults from Mission Cohort Five to Southeast Asia for two weeks for a vision trip. On the first leg of the trip, the MC5 crew will spend time with one of our World Outreach teams on a remote island engaging the local culture and seeing how the team of global workers carries out the unique ministry God has called them to. This particular team (the first Christians to live on this island) is a group of marine



biologists who help local Muslim families grow sea cucumbers for the sake of selling them and creating a living for themselves. The ultimate purpose of the long-term team there is to introduce the locals to the Gospel and see their hearts transformed by a saving faith in Jesus Christ. On the second leg of the trip, we will fly to another city and spend our time at a university engaging Muslim college students in conversations on culture and religion. This is where the students (and myself) will get the chance to practice evangelism and Gospel conversations with young adults in a totally different culture!

When Saul returns from his trip, we will have a little over two weeks before we head, as a family, to Memphis for EPC General Assembly where we will be leading various missions mobilization events. Jesse has a ton of responsibility in this area as she's deeply involved with event planning and designing promotional materials/swag for World Outreach. And we will both be doing quite a bit more public speaking than in the past.

Then, in the middle of July, Jesse will head to Central Asia for two weeks. Part of that time, she will be helping to facilitate a vision trip for two of our cohort alumni to visit several teams of global workers in the area and discern if that is where God is calling them to land long-term! It feels like a full-circle moment, as Saul accompanied these ladies on their first overseas trip to Jordan in 2021 and now they are appointed World Outreach workers, figuring out where they can best serve God in that country. We've been so blessed and encouraged as we've walked alongside them for the past 5 years. The other part of Jesse's trip will be with a short term team that is coming alongside workers in the city who are putting together a week-long camp for teens. She will be out of her comfort zone, sharing the good news in a camp setting that's entirely in Russian.

We're excited to see what God does in our family through this season, but we know it won't be comfortable. We'd love your prayers for us!

- The team going to Southeast Asia: Saul, Thomas, Esther, Nathan, Cate Rivers, Jenna, and Bethany. May 17-30.
- Jesse and the kids while Saul is gone.
- All the work still to be done before General Assembly (June 18-21) and that it would result in people being mobilized to participate in the Great Commission.
- The team going to Central Asia: Jesse, Mattie, Abby, Shawn, Brad, Mark, Jordin, and Jenn. July 14-29.
- Saul and the kids while Jesse is gone.

Financially, we need some specific one-time support for these trips. In our regular budget, we have allocations for all the travel we do in the US, but not a lot of extra to cover international trips. Saul's trip will cost \$2,900 and Jesse's is going to be a little over \$3,000. So, we're asking for \$6,000 to cover these costs. 

IT'S ALWAYS A GREAT TIME TO START FRESH IN GOD'S WORD!

Each year Pastor Zach provides a new reading plan to help equip you to spend time reading through God's Word. This year he has chosen a plan with Navigators.

The Navigators Book-at-a-Time Bible Reading Plan takes you through the entire Bible in one year, providing two reading for each day.

The first reading alternates between Old and New Testament books with the Gospels spread throughout the year. The second reading takes you through a chapter of the wisdom literature and Isaiah.

You can begin at any point of the year!

Each month consists of twenty-five readings. You'll have a few extra days each month to meditate more deeply on something that was significant to you in the past week, to catch up on messed readings, or to revisit favorite passages.

If reading through the entire Bible in one year looms as too large a task, you can alter the plan to meet your needs. For example, you could read the first reading this year and the second reading next year.

In the year ahead, ask God each day to speak directly to you from the Scripture portions you read. Be expectant, and let your continual exposure to God's Word reshape your attitudes and behavior as you gain a better understanding of every part of His written testimony to us.



2024 Youth Mission Trip July 6th – 13th


WHO: High School Students / Ages 14+
