VBS STILL MATTERS – and WHY

I recently came across an article from the Barna Group that focused on the question of how common it was for churches to have Vacation Bible School Ministries. The article focuses on survey data that is admittedly very out of date by today's standards, but still raised some interesting points. If the trendline of churches not offering VBS continues, it will likely mean that only half of US churches engage in this type of ministry in the future. For those churches reporting that that have, in the past, but no longer, offer VBS ministries, the top reasons were related to not having enough volunteers. Part of the article includes some synthesis about what the research means for the continuing significance of this type of ministry, not only for who receives it (children and families) but also for who is conducting the ministry (overwhelmingly volunteers).

Why do I share this? Because of three key findings that I think continue to be relevant to our VBS ministry here in Edgington. Those include, as quoted in the article:

1. VBS remains a key way for churches to minister to their community—and not just to the kids, but to the parents as well. And VBS isn't just summer Sunday school. It can be more focused on unchurched families and offer a more intensive program that allows for greater flexibility in content and delivery.

2. VBS is also an opportunity to engage young adults in service. So many young adults lose their connection with a local church because they feel underutilized. Churches can give key VBS volunteer roles to young adults and college kids in their congregations. Using young people as servants and not just consumers is an important way of establishing a faith that lasts.

3. An effective VBS needs to have specific objectives. Churches need to determine their own objectives and structure their VBS accordingly—not just do VBS because 'it's always been done'—but to have goals in mind.

I'd like to invite you to think about those three things with me this month. How does our VBS program relate to effective outreach to our community? How can we continue to strengthen the bond that young adults have to this ministry by engaging them in service (i.e. counselors and leaders)? Finally, do we have a clean "why" in view and are we taking steps to see that purpose come into reality?

I love VBS! I am so thankful for all that goes into this important ministry, not just for one week in July, but in the many months of coordination and preparation, and even the months that follow to evaluate our effectiveness. As we look to 2024's camp, please join me in praying for and thinking strategically about how we can leverage this important ministry effort toward our ultimate purpose of "glorifying God and enjoying Him forever."

Location: Conference Room

Present: TE Zach Hopkins and RE's Jim Mueller, Mic Penry, Patrick Shovar, Todd Stegmiller, and Keith Wilson. A quorum is present. Also attending was Rachael Johnson (Director of Children's Ministry) and Roy Yanke, Executive Director of PIR Ministries (via Zoom call).

Pastor Zach acted as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer and read from Matthew 19:14. The Elders prayed for individual members of the congregation, then reviewed and discussed Chapter 7 of Strange New World by Carl R. Trueman.

Zach's Report: Zach reported on members with health concerns and prayer needs. During May he conducted three office and three home visits. He also served on the RLP Ad-Interim Ordination Committee, attended three meetings of the EPC Permanent Judicial Commission, participated in a MVC Pilot Project Meeting and met with Roy Yanke. Zach also conducted the funeral of Lisa Whitney.

Old Business:

- The Session continued discussion on planning for a Sabbatical for Zach.
- Todd and Keith reported on plans for the Adult Sunday School summer schedule. The month of July will be a break in the schedule and during the months of June and August the class will be led by different individuals. Volunteer teachers for June are: June 2-Keith, June 9-Mic, June 16-Todd, June 23- Zach will ask Matt Youck, June 30-Jim. August teachers TBD. This schedule will allow Zach time to spend in other classrooms.
- The Session reviewed the preaching schedule for June and July. Zach thanked Mic for • preaching on May 26th. June 23rd Rev. Dr. George Salnave will preach, Zach will be present. July 14th Rev. Jeffrey Lancaster will preach during Zach's vacation. July 21st Mr. Jeff Durham (candidate for a Dubuque church) will preach, with Zach present.

New Business:

- Rachael Johnson gave the Session a report of her activities the last few months as she begins • her role as Director of Children's Ministry. She has instituted an attendance gathering tool that will assist in helping analyze attendance patterns. She is in the process of learning about curriculum ordering. Rachael also expects to be involved in planning activities for children during the ice cream social. Mic suggested that a handout be developed concerning the church's children's program to be distributed during the food pantry days. The Session voiced their support and appreciation for Rachael's activities.
- The Session met with Roy Yanke, Executive director of PIR Ministries, via a ZOOM call to • begin planning on setting up a sabbatical for Zach during a portion of 2025. There are many things to consider as we move forward with this. Roy was pleased to find that the Ruling Elders are in full support of a sabbatical. The Session will be involved in planning for this over the next several months.

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- Zach introduced his idea of initiating a Preaching "Lab". Where he would hold a series of meetings for volunteers who would be willing to preach in the future. He would coach each volunteer on the creation and delivering of one or two sermons in a group setting over the course of a few months. The Elders were in favor of this approach.
- Zach informed the Session that Lisa Bowman would be on vacation May 31st June 13th.
- Zach gave an overview of Session Membership terms:
- RE's Keith and Patrick are serving their sixth year and would be taking their Sabbatical year in 2025.
- RE Kevin Oak desires to return in 2025
- The Session should be considering prospective Ruling Elders for future service.
- Next Communion will be held June 2nd, 2024. The next stated Session meeting is June 25th, 2024. The Session will discuss Chapter 8 of *Strange New World* by Carl R. Trueman at that time.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting at 9:51pm. Motion Carried.

They are also known for their Ale-8-One soft drink that dates to 1926, the only soft drink invented in Kentucky that is still around today. Group Workcamps has been in Winchester over 14 years ago. June 6th, 2024

Attendance: We started on time at 1pm with 10 women present: Kathy Stegmiller, Pat Block, Beth Flickinger, Pam Pithan, Teresa Balmer, Regina Thomas, Nancy Cooksey, Dorothy Rursch, Shirley Flemming, and Sue Miller.

Minutes: We do not currently have a secretary. I asked everyone to take notes on their agendas and share them with me, so I could type up the "minutes" from those. Kathy was the only one who shared, but this worked.

Correspondence: Sue read the thank you note from Mitch Anderson.

Funeral Luncheons: Discussion was brought up by Pat to encourage families to cater the main portion of funeral meals in an effort to cut down on the work involved in serving funeral luncheons. More discussion revealed that Zach usually does suggest that the family provide the main portion, and that the church will provide salads and desserts. Sue will touch base with him on that topic. Pat also shared that Anthony Pearson passed away, and that his family requested a simple gathering with no more than 2 desserts. They will be in touch as to when his service will be held.

Treasurer's Report: After Kathy gave the Treasurer's report, the discussion of an abundance of cookbooks came up because several people approached her to buy one, and she ended up selling several. We decided it would be a good idea to have a table set up for the ice cream social to sell our church cookbook and other items we have available.

Missions/Quilts: Shirley delivered \$89 of women's toiletries, three adult quilts, and one baby quilt to the Mercer County Family Crisis Center. We discussed Winnie's Place and came to the conclusion, that we would follow the lead of the Church Mission Committee and stop contributing to that organization.

 Quilting Schedule: June 20th, 2024 at 9am, Summer break for July and August, September 19th, 2024 at 9am (These dates may be changed to accommodate more women)

Fall Bible Study: After discussion, we decided to ask Zach to look at two different studies: *Steadfast, A Devotional Bible Study on the Book of James* (Courtney Doctor), which is 8 weeks, and *Wisdom of God* (Nancy Guthrie) which is 10 weeks. We want to be finished with the series by Thanksgiving, so we decided to start on September 10th and continue the Tuesday 10am and Wednesday 6:30pm schedule.

It was decided to ask the Sunday School kids to hand them out the Father's Day gifts after church on Father's Day.

Women's Ministry Booklets: We are going to ask the greeters to offer them to those ladies who haven't picked one up yet once a month. Sue will label the basket and ask the greeters to show the ladies the basket where they can pick one up.

Lisa Sloan generously offered to donate her mom's punch bowl and cups to the church, but It was determined that we do not need any more punch bowls and cups but do appreciate the offer.

Prayed for members of the congregation with specific needs.

It was decided to change our meetings to Wednesdays, starting on the next meeting date.

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THE BATTLE CONTINUES

Daily **the battle to protect women, families, and the pre-born wages on**. For more than 50 years, we have lived in a culture that falsely claims abortion is healthcare while also declaring that pre-born life is

not life with value. Sadly, while some laws may have changed, hearts are still hardened and the abortion industry is thriving.

Recently, the Guttmacher Institute released their 2023 abortion statistics. On the national level **abortion has increased by 10**% since Roe was overturned with the Dobbs decision in the Summer of 2022. **In 2023 over 1.2 million abortions were provided through our US healthcare system**. This horrific number does not include internet based do-it-yourself abortions where no US doctor or clinic was consulted – the actual number of abortion occurrences is likely much higher.

This is the highest recorded occurrence of abortions in America in more than a decade (2012). **In Illinois there has been a 72% increase in abortions provided** – with nearly 53,000 lives lost last year. More than 25,000 women came to Illinois as abortion tourists.

But we will not lose hope! At Pregnancy Resources **we don't offer abortion, we don't encourage abortion, and we don't refer for abortion – and we are HONEST about that**. Knowing this simple truth, women & men still walk through the doors every week looking for help and searching for truth. Every week abortion appointments are canceled. Every week moms and dads choose life for their child. And we are so very thankful!

This summer, the needs of our community will be great. Hundreds of neighbors/family members/friends will make life or death decisions for their pre-born children. Your continued support during **#SavingLivesSummer2024** will help us help them at the moment life hangs in the balance. Working together, hearts will change and lives will be saved. SE A: Our time in country was productive. The time with our Teaching Cohort allowed us to **refresh and deepen their understanding of Theological Foundations and The Church: Its Nature, Mission, and Leadership**. The Cohort had significant time demonstrating understanding of content and teaching skills in teaching presentations. We and B. A., our team member, gave input on presenting skills. and body movements can either hinder or enhance teaching and preaching. The cohort evaluated each other on content and encouraged each other. **May they teach effectively these two courses in July to men with open ears to learn and apply.**

We were honored to have **time with each man to hear about family and church needs**. These are busy men who give sacrificially to serve their churches and to be trainers. It's neither easy nor convenient to be a bi-vocational pastor in the north due to financial challenges and difficulty making a living in their area. Government leaders encourage various types of farming including animals and trees. This has led some to cinnamon farming both for the oil (in demand from China) and powdered forms. But in the city a man can make in one month what would take 6 months farming. Some pastors, as well as other men, are looking for other jobs in large cities as a result. It's not uncommon for both parents to work in the city with the children left in the care of grandparents. This trend leaves mostly women behind in churches. It seems to point to the great need for increased Christian Community Development. This has been one of our twelve classes. **Pray for God to lead them to additional financial resources and community development**. Examples of the need....One of the pastors in this Cohort had borrowed money to begin raising pigs. Sadly, the venture failed. He is currently working away from home in a mine to raise the money to pay off the loan as quickly as possible. Another man told us he gleans in for honey and bamboo sprouts to feed his family. He's what would be called an executive pastor in the US in a 600 member church. He receives no regular remuneration from the church. If you would like a copy of the prayer requests, let us know and Nan will send it.

As usual we brought a large pile of theological resource books compliments of a donated library of a retiring EPC pastor. While touring the library Ed gave the librarian information about a theological library organization. ITEN has a special project fund for library development. We'll request that the cost of membership be sent from this account to give them access to more resources. **Pray that the library resources will assist the student body and faculty.**

The denomination we are partnering with has a zeal for planting churches. **Every year since Covid, they have added 50-60 churches.** Many of these are within the main people group of the country which has a low percentage of Christians! They are a wonderful example of church.

The president of the denomination met with us to finalize the plans for us to **begin teaching leaders in another minority people group**. It was affirming to hear his confidence in ITEN's materials and of our sequence of courses. In September when we return, we will begin this new endeavor...likely a three year program. Please pray as Pres "S" chooses those to be trained and who will handle the logistics for the class. We know this doesn't sound like retirement for us and we agree! We are praying for a few theologically trained individuals to join us. **Might this be you?** Let's talk.

The **trip had hiccups to overcome**. The evening before classes were to begin, our interpreter sent word that he was ill and unable to come. Our man on the ground worked his network and was able to procure a skilled interpreter, D, who has interpreted for us before. It was great to work with him again. Another wrinkle is that the translation of course materials into the mother tongue of the students wasn't finished. Moving past frustration to flexibility is the name of the game. Due to post class stomach distress for Ed, events of our final two days were canceled. No planned field trip to visit two villages nor preaching /church visit on Sunday. But gratefully, Ed was well enough to fly home as scheduled. **Please pray for his continued healing. He is still doctoring**.

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Nan **used time to reach out** as an ongoing mentor to a college gal over 'Egg Coffee'. "N" has a passion for growing in deeper her faith. Conversation involved a number of challenging topics and Bible passages as well as "N" sharing her future plans and prayer. Nan always spends time with the owner and staff of the nail salon by the hotel. It's amazing that you can have a conversation via Google Translate. It also gives a chance to talk with tourists For safety reasons we are not linking the full report. and share about Jesus in casual conversation. She learned at a Muslim owned hair salon in Michigan to take advantage of God making our hair grow necessitating regular repeated visits. Try it at your next appointment. We'd love to hear your stories. While wandering a picturesque shopping area, Nan sat down by a Russian young single gal and struck up a conversation. Speaking a few Russian words, picked up from traveling for the Midwest Presbytery, opened the door to talk about their backgrounds. God doesn't waste our past but uses it to impact our present. It was a new thought for her to have a purpose of life that matches that of your spouse.

Update on Bill & Faith.

We hosted a graduation party for them with people from the various churches where they have fellowshipped and networked. We enjoyed a variety of African foods and sharing of stories. Four of Bill's relatives living in the US surprised him by coming. On the visa front, neither Bill nor Faith were drawn for the Diversity Visa. Bill has been following various options. One is an African church in the Philadelphia area which reaches out to African diaspora. The denomination has churches in Liberia. **Please pray for God's provision for their future**. Each of the US based options in the US will require him raising support and getting a work visa. Let us know if you want to be kept in the information loop.

This Spring has been wedding season and C and A have been to 3! These weddings were all people from local churches that work in this area. It was beautiful to see the love the couples have, but also their love for God and the reminders of God's love for his people - reminders of God's promise of an eternal home and rest where we live with Him. As we thought about the joy of that day we also thought of the promises in Revelation 5:9 that we will see every tribe and language praising God in Heaven. That promise and hope is why we are here and what encourages us. We are grateful for your partnership with us in sharing this hope to those around us and through Asha services.

Some updates and prayer requests:

On June 6 we will turn in application paperwork for Indefinite Leave to Remain in the U. K. This will mean that we have settled status here and don't have to continue filing for visas every few years. **Please pray for this paperwork to go through quickly and easily and for there to be no problems along the way.**

Last Friday I gave my testimony in Girl's Club. It was a little loud and chaotic, as always, **so pray that it did make** them think and maybe encourage questions or just thinking about faith in the future for them. Also continue praying for one girl that I have had some good faith conversations with lately.

Girls club will be closing after June, mainly because of staffing changes and lack of volunteers to continue it currently. **Pray for the girls at club that this affects - for them to be willing to try other clubs run by the same church (possibly church youth group) and for the ones graduating club anyway; that they would be willing to meet one to one. And pray for me as I figure out what's next.** There is definitely still a need among local young women, and there are some possibilities of other organizations to help with, and also an idea to start something for young adults at Asha. **Pray that God would lead in this area for the best next thing.**

We have been doing an art drop in time for ladies through Asha every Monday morning for a few months now and it has been encouraging to see about 5-6 ladies show up each week. They are incredibly talented at sewing and designing, and many say that it is so nice to get out of the house and do things with other people. **Pray that they would be willing to practice their English a bit more, and for opportunities to have faith conversations.**

I have been doing some home visits with another member of our team on Thursdays. She has been in the area for many years and has many contacts. It has been a good learning experience to see how she has built up relationships with people, and also the benefits of visiting. As westerners we tend to feel we have to plan ahead and not bother people, but these visits are seen as caring for people and for valuing them by wanting to see them.

Continue to **pray for Asha services and pray for men and children to come!** It is encouraging to have ladies attending regularly, but some of the men that used to come have been "encouraged" not to come or just find the days busy. **Pray for them and pray for ways that we can reach out to families either on Sundays or other events for children especially**.

Eid al Adah occurs on June 16th. This is the Muslim cerebration honoring Ibrahim being willing to sacrifice Ishmael. It is a day of prayer and also of sacrifice. Muslims are required to offer a sacrifice, qurbani, of usually goat or sheep, and then give some to those in need. In L.... this doesn't always mean actual sacrifices in the street. They can pay for a sacrifice to happen elsewhere, like in B....... **Pray for our conversations during this time.** It is a good opportunity to discuss what Christians believe about Abraham and Isaac and what the sacrificial lamb points toward.

In family news:

J has 5 more tests to take and then he is finished with school! **Pray for him to finish well and for a couple days** when he has 2 test days, which means 6 hours of writing!

L recently finished her second year of university! In the B..... system that means just one more to go!

S. flies back to the U. K. on June 5th. Please pray for safe travels for him.

steadfastness and faith in all your persecutions and in the afflictions that you are enduring... that our God may make you worthy of his calling and may fulfill every resolve for good and every work of faith... that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified.'

V..... - My trip to V..... was fruitful and inspiring. I had the privilege of being the speaker for their H.... Bible College faculty and staff retreat weekend. Before the event, I had little information about it, except that we were going out of the city overnight. So, I took bug spray and my mosquito net, as I envisioned being in a camp in the hills in some rustic situation, sleeping in a hammock or something. But instead, we learned we would be on a nice cruise boat in H. L... Bay (famous scenic place) for an overnight cruise. It was awesome to have two worship services on the boat and share my teaching with them (as the boat staff and other passengers heard and saw us). It was so uplifting for everyone and an unforgettable experience!

After we returned to H...., I taught a teacher training course to prepare 8 selected pastors from the northern hill tribes who will be teachers of our MLTI program courses. With these pastors, I reviewed the course I had taught them two years ago, 'Theological Foundations' (a simple and accessible form of systematic theology). E. McC..... and I worked together with Nan's assistance. E. did the same kind of training for his 'Nature and Ministry of the Church' course.

These men will replace me and other ITEN teachers and teach our courses to other pastors (about 500!) among their people group in years ahead. We rejoice that we are achieving an indigenous self-sustained training program, which has been our goal. It was so rewarding to see these outstanding rural tribe pastors prepared to teach future generations of pastors. This minority ethnic group (which is 90% of the northern V..... church) had

not had a training program until we started ours with them about 4 years ago. They are reaching out in church planting to communities with about 30 unreached people groups.

The Evangelical Church of V.....-N.... has planted 50-60 new churches every year over the past four years! The church is growing rapidly, and one pastor in H.... said he profited greatly from ITEN and has seen his new church plant in the city increase from 12 to 80 members in 1 year! Believers in V..... are persecuted yet progressing in their faith and church planting.

U..... - It is very tough in U..... right now, with lots of missiles and weariness. A few days ago, J..... texted me, 'It is very difficult at the front. Many of our acquaintances joined the army, most of them volunteers.' 'Since the Russian invasion, 600 places of worship have been destroyed, over 30 faith leaders killed or kidnapped, forced expulsions, imprisonments and arrests.' (Evangelicals, one of main targets of Russia in U....., Evangelical Focus) Yet, Baptists in U...... report planting 54 new churches, growth that all evangelicals in U..... see.

My trip to U..... and P.... in April was very fruitful, thank the Lord! I caught a bad virus on the way to U..... and had to power through 21 events in 11 days in 7 cities—but somehow it worked, really such grace from God, and certainly not my own strength! Here are some highlights: (*Pictures not included here for safety reasons*)

- Preached in this 'capital church' in K..., Temple of Peace; spent the day working with the national director of young generation ministries for the Baptist denomination of U.....
- Taught seminars about engaging and reforming society in several cities; had an interview recorded for a radio/ TV program; preached in churches in several cities
- Lectured at C...... University on Protestants in sixteenth-century U.....; spoke in two Christian schools; worked with leaders of Baptist non-profit humanitarian and outreach ministries; Pastor S.... showed me this missile fragment that had been brought to his office.
- Teaching leaders of so many arenas—like the chaplain, pastor, nuns, and mayor here; these Catholic priests received my message, too, and joined in by sharing their own affirming remarks from the platform after I concluded
- Another of many impact examples, long-time leaders in our New Reformation Movement led city prayer breakfasts bringing all confessions of clergy and public officials together —a Pentecostal mayor (left) and Baptist pastor (right); to read/see more, go to (link not included for safety concerns)

I recently received this video from Pastor J. L., my ministry partner of the past 20 years in Eastern Europe (link not included for safety). It reports on the recent 'Forum on Evangelism in the Conditions of War', produced by our partners, Christians for U...... It is just one glimpse into the work they are doing. In almost every frame, I see my dear friends and ministry partners (various denominations) speaking and leading. Many are leading projects supported by EPC funds. This growing unity is one fruit of the work of Christians for U..... and the wider church during this war time. Overall, the training of our reformation movement for over twenty years and currently (especially the COA) is fostering the growth of the church's engagement in society, moving it from the old separatist, underground, and insulated Soviet model to a more widely missional, holistic, transformative, engaged, and relevant need-meeting church in society. This is increasing evangelism, new believers, and church planting, praise God!...

To learn about another Christians for U...../Christian Rescue Service 3-day forum for chaplains—this time in I.... for 200 chaplains from different denominations and regions—see (*link not included for safety*) These trainings are touching thousands of chaplains, mental health workers, and social workers throughout all regions of U...... My primary ministry partner, J., recently reported other good work:

- Completion of project funded by the EPC International Disaster Relief Fund and facilitated by J. and me: 1) In T......, the construction of a rehabilitation center for soldiers and their families, which also holds a new local church plant, 2) In K..... R.., renovation of a hospital for military hospital capacity, 3) Christian Rescue Service chaplain training program throughout U....., and 4) Summer camps for children through our previously established education centers in 11 cities
- Production and distribution of evangelistic literature

- Upcoming forum in July at the National University of O..... Academy on 'Christianity and the public sphere' for around 200 participants.
- Graduation in July of U..... COA, issuing certificates from the National University of O..... Academy to 311 who passed all the tests
- Preparing for the summer evangelization campaign 'There is Hope!', primarily for eastern U....., with camps for children, prayer/outreach tents in the center of cities, reconstruction of destroyed houses, and other humanitarian work.

B..... - Thousands of B....... have fled persecution and are now refugees in P...., including my long-time friend and ministry partner, Z. F. and his family. I met with him in W..... to brainstorm a growing vision for some kind of 'New Geneva' church planting work among B...... believers in diaspora in P..... Who knows! Please pray for God's will in this.

P...... - I had planned to travel to I...... in May. However, it seemed better to me and my ministry partner Dr. M. K. to have him come to the US for our EPC General Assembly meeting in Memphis (June 17-20). He will also visit partners in other states and see his daughter Z. in TN. At the last minute and to our surprise, he was granted a visa. It will be a fruitful time introducing him to our EPC denomination. We will report on what the Lord is doing in P....., have many meetings with pastors and elders, and seek to foster partnerships and support. M. leads the A.... training program and advises P. Mission Society. These are wonderful ministries. I have seen them in person while teaching and encouraging their leaders in P...... I stay close to M. throughout the year in partnership to see these ministries develop and grow.

Persecutions in P...... this month—including a martyr: (link not included for safety concerns)

People are thirsty for God everywhere—even here in Virginia! - About two weeks ago, I was preaching in a church here in Virginia. Kenny, a middle-aged man, came to me during the greeting time, before I preached, and said, 'I know you are the guest preacher, but would you please pray with me. I want to be saved.' After my sermon, I gathered their elders, and we heard Kenny's confession and words to the Lord from his open heart and then prayed with him. It was authentic, beautiful, and encouraging!

Family - Ellie and I are doing fine. We celebrated our 38th anniversary (late, as I was in V..... on that day) and had a glorious day hiking, walking the beach, playing mini-golf (she beat me), and going out for dinner.

Update on K.....

It's quite exciting for me (S.) to write and share about our time in K....... It's been a very long time since I've been on a ministry trip overseas, and it was a gift in so many ways. Thank you for praying with and for us and for our teammates, D and C.

Our time in K...... was full, enjoyable and timely. M enjoyed engaging with church leaders on Islam and how to walk with Muslims on their journey to Jesus. His training sessions were educational and timely, as Islam is growing in this post-Soviet culture. He also spent a full day leading these young adult leaders to reflect on their own spiritual journeys through the lens of the life of Peter. M's book, In Quest of the Rock, was translated into Russian for this seminar. It will hopefully be distributed across other churches in the Russian-speaking regions where ITEN works.

We were also invited to participate in C...... ministry, which is an organization that supports families with special needs children. C, our colleague, helps to support the leader of this ministry, and we enjoyed getting to meet some of the many families impacted by C....... We drove out to a village setting, and onto a church property. There we found kids and moms who wanted to play. Laughter is definitely good for the soul that aches and is weary. At some point we split into moms and children, and after more games, I shared a pre-gospel story from Genesis 1:1-5 with a handful of moms. We touched on the presence of God's Spirit at the beginning of time and then focused on the way God spoke light into the darkness. God's word and His Spirit are important concepts for Muslims to lay hold of and the creation story brings these out. These women know a great deal about "darkness". C and her colleagues are in an amazing place to share that light and life are found in Jesus. **Pray with us for them.**

I loved being with those village women; it brought back many memories of ministry days gone by! We're so grateful to the Lord that D and C get to live in such a place- at this time. Their national colleagues are wonderful and offer a vibrant ministry in C..... A.... We walked away feeling honored to have been with them and encouraged to continue praying for the church in C..... A....
