

Dear Friends,

I wanted to use the opportunity of the August Newsletter to share about the upcoming plan for Christian Education in the fall. For our Pre-Kindergarten through High School classes, the one-room model will wrap up at the end of the summer and that means September 8th will be our return to a regular schedule. There is an age-specific class for your child, grandchild, niece, or nephew, so let me encourage you to make a renewed commitment to helping them attend. We are especially excited that after several years of service (thank you, Brandee Neece!) the High School class will be taught by Nathan and Lyndsey Flickinger. They will join the group of our faithful and dedicated teachers - Hillary Terrill, Kortney Geirlus, Beth Flickinger, Katie Pearson, Kathy Stegmiller, and Tara Johnson, who are ably led by our Children's Ministry Director, Rachel Johnson. It is an exciting time to be a part of our Christian Education ministry!

The adult Sunday School classes will also be resuming a regular schedule on September 8th. First, I want to thank the Elders who have been covering the summer classes which have been focused on discussion and fellowship. Second, I would like to introduce the topic for our fall class as a means of encouraging our regular folks to return, and also to encourage you, if you think Sunday School is not for you for one reason or another, that this will be a great time to join with us.

"Christian Anthropology" will be our topic this fall. So, what is that? Christian Anthropology is the study of humanity from a biblical perspective, exploring what it means to be human in light of God's creation, redemption, and purpose. This field delves into questions about the nature of human beings, our relationship with God and others, and the impact of sin and grace on our lives. In a world increasingly grappling with issues of identity, purpose, and morality, understanding Christian anthropology is crucial. It provides a foundation for discussing topics like dignity of human life, gender, and race through the lens of a biblical worldview. The format of our class will be a combination of teaching and table discussion followed by a summary with prayer.

I'd like to warmly encourage all of us to engage with the opportunities for growth offered in our Christian Education ministry. As we near the transition of summer to fall, I look forward to another season of ministry with you all.

June 25, 2024, at 7pm

Location: Church Basement

Present: TE Zach Hopkins and REs Jim Mueller, Mic Penry, Todd Stegmiller, and Keith Wilson. Absent (Excused) Patrick Shovar. A quorum is present.

Pastor Zach will act as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer and read from Jeremiah 31: 31-34 and 1Peter 1:10-12. The Elders prayed for individual members of the congregation. The Session reviewed and discussed Chapter 8 of Strange New World, by Carl R. Trueman.

Approval/Amendment of Docket: Motion was made and seconded to approve the docket. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the May 28th, 2024, Session Meeting were reviewed. A motion was made to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded and carried.

Zach's Report: Zach reported on members with health concerns and prayer needs. During June, he conducted three office visits. He met with the adult leaders of the upcoming Youth Mission Trip. He also met with the RLP CC, met four times with the EPC Permanent Judicial Committee, and attended the 44th EPC General Assembly.

Old Business:

- The Session continued discussion on planning for a Sabbatical for Zach and decided to have a Called meeting on July 17th dedicated to this topic. The time and location are to be determined.
- Todd and Keith reported on plans for the Adult Sunday School summer schedule. The month
 of July will consist of small group discussions and in August the class will be led by different
 individuals with teachers to be determined. This schedule allows Zach time to spend in other
 classrooms and visiting with congregants prior to worship. Zach will resume teaching in the
 fall with lessons on Biblical Anthropology.
- The Session reviewed the preaching schedule for June and July. Session appreciated the preaching of Rev. Dr. George Salnave on June 23rd. On July 14th, Rev. Jeffrey Lancaster will preach during Zach's vacation, and on July 21st, Mr. Jeff Durham (candidate for a Dubuque church) will preach, with Zach present.
- Zach presented a document that summarized his plan and materials for conducting a
 Preaching Lab. The purpose of this lab would be to hold meetings for volunteers who would
 be willing to preach in the future. He would coach each volunteer on the creation and
 delivering of one or two sermons in a group setting over the course of a few months. Session
 members were encouraged to seek out individuals that would be interested to participating.
 The lab will kick off this coming fall.

HE CALLED ME "THE MAYOR OF WEWORK"

Hi Friends,

Since I last wrote in April, there's been a lot of ministry action going on.

Between mid-April and the first of June, Cathy and I hosted two happy hour events at my WeWork office space. These allowed me to start increasing some

momentum for my Chicago Work Life Community Chaplain ministry initiative (https://www.chicagoworklifechaplain.com). It seems the Lord used these events to help me begin building greater

goodwill with the crowd that shares co-working space at WeWork. I had one of the building managers tell me he thought I was now the mayor of WeWork. The Lord is using these efforts to help me slowly, but surely, establish an identity in this office space. Please **pray** people will begin setting up times to meet with me as a chaplain.

In addition to the Happy Hour gatherings, we invited the WeWork leadership to our house one evening for a smoked salmon dinner. In case you aren't aware, my smoked salmon recipe is some of my secret sauce in the ministry. There's something about table fellowship that the Lord of the Harvest has used down through the ages to display His hospitable heart for humanity through His people's willingness to invite others to share life with them. I can't help but add that the way Cathy decorates our home and makes dinners we host into such magical occasions has a way of ministering God's life-giving kindness and God's colorful being to our guests. Her touch provides another powerful doorway experience into the knowledge of God. One young woman came to the dinner along with her live-in boyfriend. She grew up in the church, but seems to have moved away from the faith. It's been so sweet to see how she has really warmed to our friendship and has been our most faithful helper in getting the word out to promote our events. God is at work!

In this same 7 week'ish time period from late April till early June, Cathy and I hosted 2 felt-need seminar lunches at my WeWork office. We had twelve attendees at the first one and five at the second one. Again, we're plugging away at establishing identity and trying to begin speaking the truths of Christ into the lives of a very unchurched crowd of people. I'm taking a break from WeWork events in July and August. It takes a lot to pull off these gatherings and I don't want to come on too strong. I'm praying for the Spirit to build people's interest in my corporate chaplaincy work. As I've shared in the past, this effort is one key strategy component in a longer-term vision to get a church-planting-church established in Chicago.

I'm thrilled to announce that a few people have shown interest in participating in a Bible study with me and Cathy. From July 17th - August 28th we will be hosting dinner/Bible study gatherings at our house each Wednesday evening. I'm calling these "What's Your Story?" Dinners (see flyer below). We will seek to answer the huge question: "What's the story of the world of which the story of your life is a part?" Or, another way of asking it is: "What's the story in which you are living?" To help us all wrestle with this question, I'm asserting that the story of the world of which the story of our lives is a part is contained, in a nutshell form, in Genesis 1-3. **Pray** for these gatherings. **Pray** for the Lord to vividly communicate His hospitable heart and the life of Jesus' kingdom as we share food and drink table fellowship together each evening. **Pray** for the Holy Spirit to animate our time as we dive into Genesis 1-3 and behold the great story of the mission of God in the world.

Here's how I would summarize God's vision for us and His creation: Humans are created/redeemed to join God's mission to (re)build His garden-like-city neighborhood temple through Christ.

There are a lot of riches to unpack in this rich portion of scripture. I think telling the story of God's big, glorious game plan for the world scratches where humans are itching and answers the big life questions that are always percolating below the surface in every human heart. **Pray** that these dinner/Bible studies would serve as our efforts at building an altar on which the Holy Spirit could send down the fire of God's glory and reveal the light of the knowledge of God in the face of Christ Jesus. **P**ray that each of these evenings God would make Himself large and unmistakable - too big to miss.

These won't be big crowds... probably 4-10 people each week. **Pray** that this day of small things would be the occasion for the Lord to continue to build something special in a mustard seed kind of way. **Pray** that these studies, along with my chaplain work and our networking ministry over the years, would be the seedbed out of which a church plant might sprout one day.

I need a big uptick in my support raising.

I would appreciate all of you who are sharing in this mission through your prayers and encouragement would consider either continuing in financial support of this kingdom endeavor or for some, perhaps God will lead you to come aboard in financially supporting this long-term mission. It's a long obedience in the same direction effort. We need people to stay with us if you can. And we're praying for some fresh supply line of givers to feel called to help buttress our work.

Here are some specific ways you could financially contribute to this mission.

You can:

- Sponsor our ministry relations budget On average Cathy and I are sharing dinner out or dinner in our home with people or attending events with people 3-4 nights a week. I average about 4 lunches a week with people. \$1,100/month. \$13,200 annually.
- Sponsor WeWork office rental space \$250/month. \$3,000 annually.
- Sponsor my part-time executive assistant \$800/month \$9,600 annually.
- Sponsor our diaconal fund \$5,000/year.
- Sponsor Chicago Work Life Community Chaplain WeWork Happy Hours (every other month) \$1,500 an event = \$9,000 annually.
- Sponsor Chicago Work Life Community Chaplain "Life's Gonna Life" outreach lunch seminars at WeWork 9 seminars a year. \$450 an event. \$4,050 annually.
- Sponsor our missions giving in Chicago \$5,000/year.
- Sponsor our "What's Your Story" Wednesday Night Dinner & Bible Study Gatherings Four 7-week studies a year. \$300 a gathering. \$2,100 for each 7 weeks. \$8,400 annually.
- Sponsor Holiday Parties and Group Dinner Nights at our home \$5,000 annually.
- These are just some of the ways you can help support our mission. Additionally, there are my salary, housing, and benefits along with office supplies, discipleship resources, website and technology, etc. expenses.

I hold these words from Isaiah 43 near and dear to my heart: Isaiah 43:19

[19] Behold, I am doing a new thing;now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?I will make a way in the wildernessand rivers in the desert. (ESV)

Pray for God to keep doing new things and to give me and Cathy the grace to see with spiritual eyes what He's up to and to follow Him filled with faith, hope, and love through Christ.

Some recent encouraging things at Asha that you can praise God for with us:

- A couple Sundays ago was Eid al adha and we were wondering if anyone would come to Asha at all. Many of
 our guests come regularly, but haven't made any decisions to change their beliefs, and this is a big celebration
 day in Islam...but people did come! Including one whole family, even the dad!
- The week after, we had a few of our plant team away, and a good number of guests. After the service one teammate noted that we had more Sylhetis than non-Sylhetis in the building that day!
- This week I was talking with one of our regular Asha guests and she was bringing up the things discussed the
 previous Sunday in the scripture we had studied. It was great that she remembered so well and was still
 thinking about it.

These aren't huge things, but they are exciting steps in an area that is hard and quite slow to change. **Please continue in prayer for God to be at work**.

We have also been reading about and seeing the pictures of the horrible flooding in our previous home of NW lowa. We are praying for you all as you clean up and sort through so much damage and destruction.

Our next update will be in September. We will be travelling to the US this summer as a family, for a very short home assignment (fit in around the school schedule).

Some updates and prayer requests:

Our Indefinite Leave to Remain application was approved!! We are very happy and relieved. It is a **huge praise!** This will enable us to stay here long term and without needing to deal with temporary visas anymore.

We had the last girl's club at the end of June. It was sad to see it close, but hopefully we ended well and gave the girls a good send off. **Pray** that the years they have had being around Christians and hearing about faith will be something that God uses in their lives in the future. And, **pray** for the contacts I have with the older girls and graduates of the club, for continued chances to meet one to one with them and have deeper conversations or even read the Bible with them.

A neat thing from our last club - one of the girls gave us two leaders gifts that were Bible related. Mine had a list of scriptures to look at in times of trouble. IT'S ALWAYS A GREAT TIME TO START FRESH IN GOD'S WORD!

Each year Pastor Zach provides a new reading plan to help equip you to spend time reading through God's Word. This year he has chosen a plan with Navigators.

The Navigators Book-at-a-Time Bible Reading Plan takes you through the entire Bible in one year, providing two reading for each day.

The first reading alternates between Old and New Testament books with the Gospels spread throughout the year. The second reading takes you through a chapter of the wisdom literature and Isaiah.

You can begin at any point of the year!

Each month consists of twenty-five readings. You'll have a few extra days each month to meditate more deeply on something that was significant to you in the past week, to catch up on messed readings, or to revisit favorite passages.

If reading through the entire Bible in one year looms as too large a task, you can alter the plan to meet your needs. For example, you could read the first reading this year and the second reading next year.
