

Denise and her sisters visit us at the Moline Youth Center almost daily. They walk over for a popsicle, a hug, and the daily Bible verse! YouthHope is often the first thing they do when they wake up. Denise has been known to ask for a popsicle at 8:30am! (We now keep banana bread on hand too!)

There is power in the relationship we have. Summer-time is a tough season for many kids with no regular daily structure or routine, no guaranteed school meals, and limited or no activities or social opportunities.

384 kids and teens, like Denise, are starting school with their own stories from Camp Summit! At-risk teens, firsttime campers, M.O.V.E. mentees from schools, Youth Center students, foster care kids, church youth groups, student mission trip teams, and court-mandated community service students have experienced kindness, learned purpose, and found HOPE for their future!

We thank God for all these kids and teens, the camp staff, and the many volunteers who joined us this summer! Please join us in praying for blessing and protection over them all as they resume life away from Camp Summit.

A SAFE PLACE

Many clients come to Pregnancy Resources afraid to tell their story and share the complicated details surrounding their current pregnancy. This was true of Hallie (not client's real name), a recent client who's living in the midst of abuse and is pregnant. It can be here

client who's living in the midst of abuse and is pregnant. It can be hard to be honest about the messy and often painful bits of our life. Who wants to tell someone that kind of difficult information, especially a complete stranger?

Nurse Beth was on duty this day and listened to Hallie with loving kindness. Hallie described all the difficult things that happened to her and now as a result, she was pregnant. Hallie was considering abortion. She wondered how she could deal with this situation and have a child as a reminder?

These.

Nurse Beth was patient with Hallie as she started the ultrasound appointment, and eventually was able to show her the life growing inside of her. Hallie was fortunate to have her mom at the appointment to support her. The baby and the heartbeat were clear on the screen, and Hallie and her mom both saw the image at the same time.

Nurse Beth was able to educate Hallie on abortion, the risks, and the possible negative side effects abortion can bring. The nurse also discussed the resources and referrals Pregnancy Resources offers. Hallie said she felt better after the appointment because she'd been able to share her difficult experience with someone who was compassionate and there to listen and help. Hallie said that **Pregnancy Resources was a safe place.** Since this appointment **Hallie has connected with additional resources and has decided to carry this child instead of having an abortion.**

Tomorrow another woman like Hallie will walk through the doors in need of a safe place – thank you for supporting a ministry that will help her feel safe and help her to see and choose life!

Each year Pastor Zach provides a new reading plan to help equip you to spend time reading through God's Word. This year he has chosen a plan with Navigators.

The Navigators Book-at-a-Time Bible Reading Plan takes you through the entire Bible in one year, providing two reading for each day.

The first reading alternates between Old and New Testament books with the Gospels spread throughout the year. The second reading takes you through a chapter of the wisdom literature and Isaiah.

You can begin at any point of the year!

Each month consists of twenty-five readings. You'll have a few extra days each month to meditate more deeply on something that was significant to you in the past week, to catch up on messed readings, or to revisit favorite passages.



I know many of you have struggled with accessing the digital directory on your phones - so have I, but I think that it is **FINALLY** corrected - please Lord, & praise God!

When you go to the website, in the menu bar, click "Member Access". Then, if you are on your phone, click on the text that reads: "Digital Directory - Members Only Access". Enter the church's password and it should open for you! If you need the password, please contact the church office. We want to protect the privacy of our members, so we are not publishing it.



If you are on any other device than a phone, scroll down to the box with the church's logo and click on the "Click here to begin", then enter the church's password.

If you have not already registered your family so you can access your profile and make changes, you can do so from the "Member Access" page as well. Follow the directions above, based on the device you are using, but instead of logging into the directory, click on the "Manage My Family Info" link. Then click on "Haven't registered yet?" Next, enter the "Family" email - usually the man of the household's email, unless he does not attend or it has been requested to be the lady's. If you are single, it is your own email. It should then send you an **email from "no-reply..."** with the subject line "Member Portal Registration" There will be a link in the email to register your family and create your own member portal. It will ask you to choose your browser and then send you to the Registration Member Portal page. Enter your new password and click "Register". This should open your portal. It should read "Powered by SERVANTKEEPER at the bottom" and there should be links to your "Family Profile" and each individual member of your family with the word "Profile" as the link just across from their names. You should be able to click on each one of those profiles and update your pictures and info. You should also see links to "Change password" and "Visit Edgington EPC's Directory". I would recommend that you bookmark this page on your device and be sure to save your password and these directions if you feel like you may have trouble in the future. You can always call the office if you do, and I will do my best to walk you through it.

I am sorry this has been such a difficult process for so many of you and that it has taken so long to get resolved, but I think (again, please Lord!) that we finally have it fixed!

We would still so many of your lovely faces in the directory, so if you haven't added yours, please either access your profile through the directions above and add it, or send it to edgingtonepc@gmail.com and Lisa will get it added so we can see you!






WOMEN'S MINISTRY BIBLE STUDY & MEETING UPDATE

2024 VBS WRAP-UP

The books are closed on VBS 2024. 216 campers were registered and all but 1 came. There were 39 different churches represented and 35 campers with no church affiliation. 56 high school/college-age counselors were in charge of the campers, and approximately 65 adults led and assisted at the various stations. The campers brought food items that were then donated to the Rocket Closet (a school sponsored group which sends needed food and



personal items home with kids each week who have been identified as needing assistance). In addition to the food, the campers raised \$980.00, which was split between the Rocket Closet and World Vision.

We dealt with rain Wednesday morning, and were very grateful that it stopped by 11am. It was very appropriate that the Bible story for the day was Jesus calming the storm on the Sea of Galilee! The rest of the week was great weatherwise.

The Junior High group (43 strong) was divided on Wednesday, with 8th graders going to Camp Summit to help, and 7th graders working on several projects in Edgington. The planned projects had to be quickly adapted due to the rain, but still felt all came away with lessons learned and an appreciation for serving others.

Afternoons were filled with various activities that kept kids busy and having fun. Since it was a water theme, we had speakers on water rescue, local watershed program, fish and wildlife, and a professional fisherman. Younger kids met a local author/illustrator of a children's devotional. Thanks to a very generous donation, each child received a copy of the book. Kids also learned about poison control, emergency preparedness, and hands only CPR. They swam each day, shot BB guns, did archery, and raced boats they made in crafts.

We would like to sincerely thank all who helped in any way - from enrolling your kids, donating cookies, supplies, money, time, &/or talents. It is hard to measure success, but investing in kids (the future of our church and community) is always time well spent. The Boy Scouts have offered us the week of July 21-25, 2025, and the Lord willing, that will be our plan as well.
