Location: Church Basement

Present: TE Zach Hopkins and RE's Jim Mueller, Mic Penry, Patrick Shovar, and Keith Wilson. Absent

(Excused) Todd Stegmiller. Cade Reimers also attended. A quorum was present.

Pastor Zach acted as moderator of the meeting. Zach opened the meeting with prayer, then read from Psalm 103. The Elders prayed for individual members of the congregation. The Session reviewed and discussed Chapter 9 of Strange New World, by Carl R. Trueman.

Approval/Amendment of Docket: Motion was made and seconded to approve the docket. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the June 25th, 2024, Session Meeting were reviewed. A motion was made to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded and carried.

Correspondence: A scholarship request from Gia Johnson was read.

Zach's Report: Zach reported on members with health concerns and prayer needs. During July-August he conducted seven office visits and two home visits. Zach did a Theology Exam Review and met twice with the EPC Permanent Judicial Commission, twice with the EPC Exam Graders, acted twice as EPC Ad-Interim in Dubuque, recorded two podcasts for radio broadcast, and participated in a Youth Hope Staff Devotion. Zach conducted the graveside service of Cheryl Christianson and attended the funeral of John Hayes and John Gulley. He participated in VBS and the Ice Cream Social.

Old Business:

- The Session reviewed the outcomes of VBS and the Ice Cream Social. Both were deemed to be very successful events. It was great to see the many youths involved in assisting at VBS and the Ice Cream Social. The Children's Carnival at the Ice Cream Social was a great addition this year. Rachael Johnson did a great job of organizing the carnival.
- The Session discussed the remaining summer schedule for the Adult Sunday School Class. Zach will resume teaching in September with the theme of Biblical Anthropology. Session members will step in to teach the September 15th and 29th classes.
- The Session reviewed the preaching schedule for September. On September 15th Danny Credelich will preach while Zach is in Chicago for a wedding. On September 29th the First United Presbyterian Church of Moline is doing a pulpit swap with us. While Zach preaches at their church, TE Justin Beach will be preaching at our church.
- Zach presented a final draft of a document that detailed his plan and materials for conducting a Preaching Lab. The purpose of this lab would be to hold meetings for volunteers who would be willing to preach in the future. A motion was made and seconded to approve the plan and to conduct the training. The motion carried. The lab will kick off this coming fall.
- The Session discussed the planning for a sabbatical for Zach in 2025. Zach is putting together materials for funerals and graveside services.



New Business:

- Cade Reimers gave a report on the activities of the Youth Group. The attendance at the last
 Youth Group Meeting was 25. The mission trip was a great success and everyone is looking
 forward to the trip next summer which is planned for Minnesota. Many Youth Group
 members assisted with the Ice Cream Social. Several members of the group have expressed
 interest in joining the church. Cade voiced his appreciation for the assistance of Nathan and
 Lindsey Flickinger. The Session is very encouraged by the efforts of Cade and the enthusiasm
 of the group.
- Zach gave an overview of upcoming ministry events:
 - Women's Bible Study (Tues AM/Wed PM; Sept 10/11-Nov 19/20)
 - Blood Drive 9/14/24
 - Fishing Derby 9/8/24
 - Harvest Party 10/13/24
 - Trunk-or-Treat 10/27/24
- Zach gave a report on plans for the Fall Membership Matters class. Dates are 10/13th, 20th, and 27th; and joining the church on 11/3rd. There will be two youth-only sessions, tentatively 9/29th and 10/6th. Zach is expecting approximately 5 adults and 7 high schoolers.
- Zach gave out materials for the church's officer nomination, training and election process in order to educate and prepare for the 2025 nominations. These materials will be made available to the congregation. Patrick volunteered to lead the nomination committee and Keith will also serve the committee as a Session member. Each committee is asked to appoint one member to serve on this committee.
- A request to hold a second Matters of Balance Class on Mondays and Thursdays from 12:30 to 2:30pm, beginning September 16th was reviewed. Motion was made to approve and seconded. Motion Carried.
- A Motion was made to approve the scholarship request of Gia Johnson and seconded.
 Motion Carried.
- Zach reminded the Session of the upcoming 42nd RLP Meeting to be held 9/27th 9/28th in Hogarty, WI. Motion was made for Mic and Todd to serve as delegates for the meeting. The motion was seconded. Motion Carried. Jim Johnson will also attend as an observer.
- Zach asked the Session about a Thanksgiving service. After discussion the Session decided not to have one. Zach also asked about a Lessons and Carols service for December. Everyone was in favor of continuing this tradition.
- Zach reviewed an invitation for him to participate in a Small Church Leadership Summit in Raleigh, NC in February 2025. He is being asked to lead a session one day and preach during the worship. After discussion concerning Zach's already busy schedule, the Session decided it would be best if Zach did not participate.
- Next Communion will be held September 1st, 2024. The next Stated Session meeting is September 24th, 2024. Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting at 9:33pm. Motion Carried.

The Mission Committee met on August 20, 2024 in a virtual meeting. Those attending were: Nancy Engstrom, Jim and Bailey Johnson, Eric and Kelly Moel, Cassie Fuhr, Todd Stegmiller, and Deb Wagamon.

Deb opened the meeting in prayer.

Old Business:

- **Minutes:** July minutes were approved as written
- Review ministry updates: newsletters & mail were reviewed, discussed, and prayed over
- **Rockridge School Supplies:** Brandee met with Deb and Nancy and notified us that they are not in need of supplies to begin the school year. They will be needing them; however, around October. We will continue to collect and package supplies so we are ready to distribute when they are needed.
- Lancaster Update: Due to personal issues that kept the team from meeting in August, Jim will update the team on the Lancaster ministry via email.

New Business:

- Caminul Felix: Due to an extensive raise in minimum wage, the Romanian ministry has been burdened with a significant increase in their monthly budget. While our news feeds and radio waves seem to be filled with hard things these days, I have GREAT NEWS to report today!

Despite the difficulty of these complicated times, **EVERY DAY**moms and dads are CHOOSING LIFE across the greater Quad Cities!



In just the first six months of 2024, more than **3,221 Christ-centered office visits** and over **651 meaningful spiritual conversations** have happened at one of our THREE locations or on the Mobile Medical Unit.

There have been **464 pregnancy test appointments** provided, and your team of nurses has facilitated **449 ultrasound appointments** – offering life-affirming help as our culture continues to attack women, families, and the pre-born.

From January to July, 162 children were welcomed to the world with New Baby Gift Bags, and more than 36,000 diapers have been distributed to families in need. More than 751 pregnancy, baby care, and parenting class sessions have been offered, and 91 families have earned NEW car seats for their children with regular participation in parenting classes! This represents a 30% increase in compassionate assistance, education, and care!

This life-affirming, holistic ministry was **only possible because of your faithful support. Tomorrow 10 more moms will each find help** and have the chance to choose life for her pre-born child at her ultrasound appointment. In the next two days **15 families will access much needed clothing, formula, and diapers** at Bella's Boutique. Finally, **this week there will be 28 class sessions** offered at various locations (with some provided in Spanish) that teach about pregnancy, baby care, breastfeeding, parenting, fatherhood, and the Bible because this ministry can depend on you!

Class details

Rev. B. G., from southeastern M......, is exploring a sense of call to join ITEN. He will join us for a week to team teach Understanding, Applying and Communicating the Bible. The people in the class come from the "..." people -a new people group to us. 1500 people in this ethnic group have responded to the gospel but they have NO trained pastors who speak their language. The head of the E......- North (Rev S) has taken these ten churches under his wing and asked ITEN to commit to provide the full twelve courses of Ministry Leadership Training Institute (MLTI). This upcoming class is a pilot to see how the training is received. May we have open eyes to observe and evaluate well in the face of a 2 to 4 year commitment that will need to involve new people. We have started recruiting possible instructors for this group assuming that our time with the "..." people will point in this direction. May we encourage the "..." men to deepen their walk with the Lord and correctly discern if ITEN is a good fit as trainers for these young believers.

Nan wrote new material for our course Evangelism and Missions. This replaces material we used originally not realizing it was proprietary and that our students would not be allowed to re-teach it. Ed will be the color commentator and Nan the play by play announcer as we introduce the course to the Teaching Cohort. Our education degrees are put to good use in ITEN. Little did we know how the Lord was preparing us back in the '70s for what we are doing now.

Ed will review Old Testament Survey with the Teaching Cohort. We will give a set of flash cards to each student to help them reteach the material. Lots of content to review. Likely many questions...

We are in conversations/texts with our partners as assessment the damage in the capital city, the mountain locations of our students, the roads, and risk of mudslides becomes known. So far we have not heard of damage to churches or Bible college buildings nor loss of life.

Our first concern is for our pastors and church leaders as they attend to the needs in their areas. The storm hit the east coast with the power of a category 3 hurricane. Lots of storm surge, wind and ongoing rain. As it got to the northern tip of Laos it was greatly diminished....but still raining.

Please join us in praying for God's protection on lives, homes, businesses, and livestock.

May the Lord use the damage of this storm to open up ways for believers to reach out to their neighbors in practical ways and with prayer.



IT'S ALWAYS A GREAT TIME TO START FRESH IN GOD'S WORD!

Each year Pastor Zach provides a new reading plan to help equip you to spend time reading through God's Word. This year he has chosen a plan with Navigators.

The Navigators Book-at-a-Time Bible Reading Plan takes you through the entire Bible in one year, providing two reading for each day.

The first reading alternates between Old and New Testament books with the Gospels spread throughout the year. The second reading takes you through a chapter of the wisdom literature and Isaiah.

You can begin at any point of the year!

Each month consists of twenty-five readings. You'll have a few extra days each month to meditate more deeply on something that was significant to you in the past week, to catch up on messed readings, or to revisit favorite passages.

If reading through the entire Bible in one year looms as too large a task, you can alter the plan to meet your needs. For example, you could read the first reading this year and the second reading next year.

In the year ahead, ask God each day to speak directly to you from the Scripture portions you read. Be expectant, and let your continual exposure to God's Word reshape your attitudes and behavior as you gain a better understanding of every part of His written testimony to us.



DIGITAL DIRECTORY UPDATE

When you go to the website, in the menu bar, click "Member Access". Then, if you are on your phone, click on the text that reads: "Digital Directory - Members Only Access". Enter the church's password and it should open for you! If you need the password, please contact the church office. We want to protect the privacy of our members, so we are not publishing it.



If you are on any other device than a phone, scroll down to the box with the church's logo and click on the "Click here to begin", then enter the church's password.


If you have not already registered your family so you can access your profile and make changes, you can do so from the "Member Access" page as well. Follow the directions above, based on the device you are using, but instead of logging into the directory, click on the "Manage My Family Info" link. Then click on "Haven't registered yet?" Next, enter the "Family" email - usually the man of the household's email, unless he does not attend or it has been requested to be the lady's. If you are single, it is your own email. It should then send you an **email from "no-reply..."** with the subject line "Member Portal Registration" There will be a link in the email to register your family and create your own member portal. It will ask you to choose your browser and then send you to the Registration Member Portal page. Enter your new password and click "Register". This should open your portal. It should read "Powered by SERVANTKEEPER at the bottom" and there should be links to your "Family Profile" and each individual member of your family with the word "Profile" as the link just across from their names. You should be able to click on each one of those profiles and update your pictures and info. You should also see links to "Change password" and "Visit Edgington EPC's Directory". I would recommend that you bookmark this page on your device and be sure to save your password and these directions if you feel like you may have trouble in the future. You can always call the office if you do, and I will do my best to walk you through it.

I am sorry this has been such a difficult process for so many of you and that it has taken so long to get resolved, but I think (again, please Lord!) that we finally have it fixed!




