



CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

The first Sunday of November we have the very happy occasion to receive new members into our church family during the worship service. This provides a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the significance of church membership.



Why membership in a local church? The Bible uses several pictures to define "the Church." The Church is one body in Christ. We are all members of the same body, and we belong to one another (Romans 12:5). The Church is one family. To be a member of any family, we are to be either born in it or adopted into it. Since we are all born as "children of wrath" (Ephesians 2:3), we must be adopted; and God has adopted us into the communion of His Triune love. We have one Father, one Savior and elder Brother, and one Spirit of adoption

by Whom we are made members of the family (<u>Romans 8:15–17</u>). Therefore, as Scripture repeatedly addresses us, we are brothers, sisters, fathers, and mothers to one another. Therefore, we are entitled to the watchful care, instruction, prayers, and government of the church, and other rights and privileges that come with it.



Isn't being a Christian enough, why join? A Christian is someone who has been united to Christ by faith; when we are joined to Christ, we are also in union with one another (i.e. other Christian believers). Church membership is essential to a healthy Christian life.

Who can be a member of the church? Any person who is called a Christian by having made a credible profession of faith, having been baptized in a Biblebelieving church, and having been admitted by the Session (the body of elders) to the Lord's Supper, can be a communing member of Edgington EPC. Children

of believer(s) are, by virtue of their birth into a believing household and in covenant with God, children of the covenant, and therefore members.

- 1. Do you acknowledge yourselves to be sinners in the sight of God and without hope for your salvation except in His sovereign mercy?
- 2. Do you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Savior of sinners, and do you receive and depend upon Him alone for your salvation as He is offered in the gospel?
- 3. Do you now promise and resolve, in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit, that you will endeavor to live as becomes the followers of Christ?
- 4. Do you promise to serve Christ in His church by supporting and participating with this congregation in its service of God and its ministry to others to the best of your ability?
- 5. Do you submit yourself to the government and discipline of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church and to the spiritual oversight of this church Session, and do you promise to promote the unity, purity, and peace of the Church?

- One of the parking lot lights is not working. Will investigate.
- Zach asked trustees to look at possible ways to control parking when events are held outside. Perhaps parking cones or barriers.
- Trustees discussed the need for additional seating in the sanctuary. One possible solution is to remove part of the choir risers and move the piano and organ forward. This would allow 2 or 3 more pews along the north wall.
- Trustee meeting time will be changed to 6:00 pm during the winter starting in November.

It also seems like September flew by - a lot of time spent with our university kids, and then we've been talking about secondary schools

(Short explanation, next year we will need to apply for a secondary school for her years 7-11, and because it is a big city, there are multiple public school options that we get a bit of a choice over. This year as parents, we are doing some investigating, so we aren't totally overwhelmed next year!)

It feels like we have had a lot of change lately - time in America and saying hello and then goodbye to family, older kids leaving and heading out on their own, new ministry opportunities or things to plan toward, A...... also getting older and more independent. Last week we sang "Christ Our Hope In Life and Death", by the Gettys, and it has been running through my head ever since.

> Who holds our days within his hand? What comes, apart from his command? And what will keep us to the end? The love of Christ in which we stand.

Grateful to have that confidence, even when things change around us.

Some updates and prayer requests:

The start of this term has been all about ESOL classes! The lady's class is booming and we have actually had to put a cap on numbers and start a waiting list. It is hard to turn people away, but also has been good to see consistency in the current ladies coming, and be able to build on relationships with them. Along with high attendance, there has also been high numbers staying to hear the Bible story at the end of class. **Pray for the teachers and the students as they get to know each other, and pray especially for those staying for the story, that it would be clear for them.**

For the men, S.... has two classes and another day of tutoring. The men have very different levels of knowledge and learning needs, so he has had to break up the times more. **Pray for him as he plans a lot of different levels of lessons, and for these lessons to build relationships and interest in learning about the Bible too. And pray that the men show up for class when it is scheduled.**

Another exciting thing is Monday Art and Crafts. This past Monday we had 9 ladies show up! We are encouraging the time as English conversation, as well as a chance to socialize and be creative. We are also **praying for opportunities to share faith through our conversation.** This week started with a lady questioning the reason a teammate believes in Jesus. She had a great answer and discussion out of it.

S.... has also been helping with the bookshop again, and leading book table outreach. He has been able to reconnect with a couple contacts and friends, which has been encouraging. **Please be praying for S....'s schedule and how he can best use his time and energy as he continues to adjust back to working!**

I have been helping an afterschool club run on some local housing projects. They needed some help and I have the time with other youth work ending last term. **Pray for me as I work out what to spend my time on. And please pray for these kids that come to this club.** They come from pretty disadvantaged homes, but are willing to listen and connect with the leaders.

And, Asha services continue to be attended by a consistent number of people. It is always joyful to be able to sing together and look over the Bible together and eat together after. A little more about Sundays from Rob, one of our teammates and Asha church elders.

You can begin at any point of the year!



If reading through the entire Bible in one year looms as too large a task, you can alter the plan to meet your needs. For example, you could read the first reading this year and the second reading next year.



It should read "Powered by SERVANTKEEPER at the bottom" and there should be links to your "Family Profile" and each individual member of your family with the word "Profile" as the link just across from their names. You should be able to click on each one of those profiles and update your pictures and info. You should also see links to "Change password" and "Visit Edgington EPC's Directory". I would recommend that you bookmark this page on your device and be sure to save your password and these directions if you feel like you may have trouble in the future. You can always call the office if you do, and I will do my best to walk you through it.


