

THE DIACONATE: FIVE ESSENTIAL TRUTHS IN FIVE MONTHS (3 OF 5)

Through the first months of 2025 I have committed to reserving newsletter cover articles for the subject of the church office of deacon. Last year, the Session determined that the Diaconate would be a major concentration of our interest and training, not only among Church Officers, but across the whole church family. Deacons are essential to the Church. They are one of two specific offices provided to the people of God as the gifts of the Ascended Christ. By the absence of His Heavenly Session where He reigns upon Heaven's Throne, Jesus presents to His body two orders of officers to mediate His presence and authority and service by the empowerment of His Spirit. Those offices are Elders and Deacons. Deacons are essential for the life of a healthy church.

The Vital Service of the Diaconate

In every faithful church, there are countless unseen acts of service that allow the ministry of the Word to flourish. From missions' outreach to managing the practical needs of the congregation, deacons play a crucial role in ensuring that elders remain focused on their calling to shepherd the flock. Throughout church history, the work of deacons has centered on mercy ministry—providing for the vulnerable and tending to tangible needs. Yet their responsibility extends even further, as they remove obstacles that might distract the elders from their primary duties. Deacons are not only problem-solvers but also proactive servants who anticipate needs before they arise, ensuring that the mission of the church remains unhindered.

Much like offensive linemen protecting a quarterback, deacons labor behind the scenes, rarely receiving public recognition yet playing an indispensable role in the health of the church. The best deacons are those who see and meet needs without seeking credit, sacrificing their own time and resources for the good of the body. They take initiative, responding to challenges before they become crises. A faithful deacon is reliable, diligent, and committed—not angling for authority, but instead serving with humility and wisdom (for more about deacon qualifications see: <u>2 Timothy 3:8-</u>13). Without such deacons, the elders would face constant distractions, and the ministry of the church would suffer under the weight of unaddressed practical concerns.

As we reflect on the role of deacons in our own congregation, let us be deeply grateful for those who serve in this essential office. Their quiet, faithful work allows our church to function smoothly, enabling the elders to focus on preaching, teaching, and shepherding. If you see a deacon this Sunday, take a moment to thank them for their service. And as we consider the future of our church, let us pray for God to raise up more godly leaders who embody the heart of a deacon—humble, proactive, and eager to serve.

- It was M/S/C to approve Youth Education Scholarship requests for Kira Nelson and Laina Nelson for the '24-'25 school year.


New Business:

- Feedback for the new Adult Sunday School Class on a survey of the prophets in the Old Testament was offered. Members are encouraged to take advantage of this discipleship and learning opportunity.
- The Spring Adult New Members Class will be held 3/23; 3/30; 4/6 after worship. Any new members will join on Palm Sunday (4/13/25) with a reception hosted by the Deacons. There was discussion about adjusting the format of the classes to allow for more personal elder interviews with each prospective new member.
- Results from the Men's Ministry Survey that has been available to members for the last month were reviewed. TE Hopkins will be coming up with a draft ministry plan in order to minister more effectively to the men of our congregation.
- Elders were invited to the 3/2/25 meeting of the Diaconate for the purposes of observing the continuing education discussion of ch.1 of "Gospel Training for Deacons." It was also proposed that a joint meeting of the Session and Diaconate might be scheduled for May. RE Penry will confer and report.

EVERYDAY ACTION, EVERYDAY LEGACY

This year marks the beginning of Pregnancy Resources' 35th anniversary of ministry in the greater Quad Cities area. From our earliest days, the vision of Pregnancy Resources has been



clear: Unplanned pregnancies and abortions would decrease by providing holistic, life-affirming, biblically based resources and education that promotes informed decisions regarding pregnancy, parenting, and biblical sexual integrity. Preparing for this important year, I had to look up the definition of legacy. In my background, a legacy was never talked about. Instead, the focus was on immediate needs and how to get through today.

Legacy is "the long-lasting impact of particular events, actions, etc. that took place... of a person's life." What struck me most about the definition was "the long-lasting impact of particular... actions... " The long-lasting action of a person or a group of people can leave a legacy.

My journey as a Christian was profoundly shaped by the intentional actions of the women and men in my church. Their commitment to pass on their Legacy of Life in Christ transformed my life and my son's. It all began with their "Yes". These women and men invested their knowledge and time.

A small circle of women visited with me regularly, sharing their knowledge of God's Word and truth. They sat and explained the truth to me even when it was hard to hear. I wasn't a project; instead, I was a person who needed care and compassion. Each woman gave me small action steps to follow, and they encouraged me regularly.

My transformation didn't happen overnight. The women and a few father-like figures from the church were generous with their time and offered me a place to ask hard questions.

They invited me into their home for a simple meal of sandwiches, chips, and conversations. These conversations helped shape a Godly foundation. They spoke life to me, and my life was changed by their actions! These women and men have a life legacy because they chose to invest their knowledge and time.

Every day, women and men enter the doors of Pregnancy Resources and need someone available and ready to volunteer to speak Life to their situation. You can be that significant person whose actions can lead to a Legacy of LIFE!

M & S – BEYOND THE CURRENT REALITY

Recently, I've found myself wondering who I can believe.

After returning from my overseas travel, I wanted to catch up on national news. I listened to one network representing one end of the political spectrum and then tuned to another network on the other end of the

political spectrum. Honestly, I thought they were speaking about two different worlds. The two perspectives were in such stark contrast that I wondered who was telling the truth. Who could I believe? Can I even know what is happening in our nation?

One thing is sure. We live in confusing times. We need a lot of wisdom as we attempt to make some meaning out of all that is transpiring in our world.

This is the current reality...no denying it!

However, for the follower of Jesus, the current reality is not all there is.

For the follower of Jesus, we anchor our reality in the Kingdom of God, whether visible or invisible. We know the triune God-Father, Son, Spirit, is not bound by earthly kingdoms that come and go. And frankly, that kingdom is worth pursuing and building up.

We had *an amazing time of worship and study around God's word in N....* Thank you so much for interceding with us! Pastor N, our N...... Partner - J, and myself came together to teach the principles of understanding and applying God's word in its context and truth. We had asked that only 30 students attend - we thought if the number was larger it would make it difficult to engage in group study. But, 60 people came from long treks over mountains (One brother traveled two days!). Many slept on the church floor. Many are first-generation Christ-followers from Hindu backgrounds. As you can imagine, being with these brothers and sisters is humbling. They challenge me to keep pursuing the God of the Bible, not the gods of our imaginations and inclinations.

From N...., I flew to A..... where I attended a conference of global theological educators. That too was a *mind-boggling experience*. n the 1980s, while a college student, I joined with a small group of students praying for the gospel to go into A...... At the time, there were no known Christians and communism had imposed an atheistic worldview on the people of A...... Can you believe, 40 years later, I'm attending a global conference of theological educators? In A.....? And, the cherry on top? ITEN played a role in opening a theological seminary that has trained 100s of pastors and church planters that are planting churches throughout A..... and beyond. I sometimes need to pinch myself at the kindness of my Father to allow me to see a glimpse of His work in His global church.

The trip was a wonderful opportunity to update my understanding of global theological education. The conference was organized by the International Council on Evangelical Theological Education (ICETE). Suffice it to say, I am increasingly persuaded that this is a vital niche of God's work among the nations today. God is using leaders from the nations to take the gospel to the remaining unreached peoples. I feel very privileged to be a small part in such a huge global endeavor.

For those who are interested, what is called "non-formal theological education" is a rapidly expanding area. "Non -formal" simply means it takes place outside formal accredited theological institutions (seminaries). While both formal and non-formal training are essential, we are seeing more of our time and energy in ITEN devoted to the "non-formal" training niche.

- Due to the back issues we had to postpone a planned trip to visit ITEN colleagues in G.......... We hope to get there in November.
- April M will share with the mission leaders of the Central Carolinas Presbytery. Pray for these leaders to discern God's leading in their ministries and leadership.
- **May** We will travel to **Findlay, OH**, where **M will be a main speaker at Gateway EPC**. Pray for God's Spirit to lead us all into deeper knowledge and understanding of His kingdom on earth.

holiday - and we do greatly appreciate it! Sorry for the slow responses- still catching up and finding things after unpacking!

As we have spent the last couple months in a bit of chaos and upheaval, it has been good to remember God's character - His faithfulness and strength and compassion. Last week at Asha, the kids started looking at Nehemiah. In Nehemiah 1 and 2, he prays to God and then boldly asked King Artaxerxes for help. Nehemiah had confidence that the "great and awesome God" would keep his covenant promises (Neh 1:5-6) - and the result was the king granting all Nehemiah's requests and more!

We are encouraged when we read of God's promises - both that he has sent Jesus as a Savior and as our great high priest, and that one day people of every tribe, language, people and nation will worship in eternity (Rev 5:9-10). We want to be continuing to pray with confidence for God's promises to be fulfilled, even when we see hardness of heart in those around us, or hear of situations of abuse or violence in the world. Thank you for your prayers for us and for those we live and work among! And we will be praying for you and your neighborhoods as well!

Updates on the last couple months:

Early January C went to a conference for those working with youth and children. It was both encouraging to have time to worship and pray, and also great teaching and ideas for sharing the gospel with kids.

Most of January was spent sorting, packing, downsizing (our new place is slightly smaller and also doesn't have a garden).

S has been busy with English classes for men. He has many different ability levels, so about three classes throughout the week. The women's studies have an optional time discussing a Bible story after, but none of the men have been keen to stay for something like that, but they have been willing to stay for tea and some informal conversation. **Pray** for S as he plans lessons and builds relationships, and for opportunities to have faith conversations.

February 1st was a long day. Our new flat has a very small and very slow lift, so it seemed to take forever to get things up to the 5th floor. We were encouraged by the many volunteer helpers we had. It made the day much less stressful. Please **continue to pray** for us as we settle into this new area and try to meet new neighbors. It is an adjustment living in a tower block and comprehending that there could be around 300 people just in this one building! An entire small town in one space! **Pray for friends, especially Bengali friends**.

It has been tiring just figuring out new travel patterns. Our first week we were getting A to school 20 minutes too early because we didn't want be late! In the middle of February was school half term, which was a great chance to just rest and get used to this new space.

Right before half term was a week of Life Exhibition. This is the third year C has helped. It is a great way to be able to tell local school kids about Jesus in a fun and interactive way. Almost 500 kids came through in the week, from 9 different schools. It was really encouraging to see school kids recognize volunteers from various churches that had also come to the schools for assemblies or who lived near the schools. C got to chat with kids from a school where she had done a Christmas assembly and will be back for Easter - great to build connections. There were many great questions from kids: "How do you know Jesus is real?" "Why did Jesus die?" " Why do we have to love our enemies?"

Each week, Asha events include: Women's Arts and Crafts on Monday morning, Men's English class on Tuesday, Women and Men's English classes on Wed, Men's English class on Thursday, book table outreach on Friday, Shantir Boi bookshop - open all weekdays, visiting in homes Mon., Wed., and Fridays, church services on Sunday afternoons, staff meetings and elders meetings during the week. **Please pray** for all of these events and for us and our teammates as we work in these areas.

Some things to highlight for prayer in the next month:

Ramadan started yesterday and lasts until March 30/31. **Pray for our Muslim neighbors** at this time, that they could see the futility of working hard for eternal results, and also as they see visions and dreams, that these would lead them to questions and interest in Jesus. And in general, **pray for us and ministry here** that often slows down during this time.

There will be a baptism at Asha on March 23! Praise God with us for this and also pray for the woman being baptized, for strength and confidence for her and also for protection over her.

In the weeks before Easter break, C will be helping with school assemblies. Pray for these opportunities to share what Christians believe about Easter and why we think it is good news!
