 Obtained a contractor price of \$15,302. After discussion, Trustees voted to approve the work


 to be completed as soon as possible.

JENNIFER'S STORY

In March, Pregnancy Resources' 35th Anniversary Legacy of Life Banquet took place. That night, **Jennifer shared how your prayer and financial support of Pregnancy Resources made a difference in her life**



financial support of Pregnancy Resources made a difference in her life. Here is a part of her story, in her own words...

I was 17 when I started making decisions that would forever impact my life and found myself pregnant. I was completely overcome with emotions, the strongest of which was loneliness. It was at the first doctor's office visit when the reality hit me that I was in fact pregnant. I was sobbing and no one extended a hug or a kind word. I was utterly alone.

With very little family support, in an instant I was pregnant, homeless, and without medical insurance. I had nothing. My best friend and her parents became my second family and moved me into their family home that same day. God bless them!

I went into Pregnancy Resources seeking some kind of help – any kind of help. The volunteers graciously gave me all kinds of baby items. Because of their generosity and kindness, for the first time I felt like "I can do this"! I felt like I had help. I felt a step closer to being prepared. I knew I wasn't alone, and started to believe that maybe I could be a parent! For the first time in my pregnancy, I had a moment of happiness and joy.

Please never underestimate what you see as a smallest gesture of kindness and the impact it can make. This type of ministry has made and continues to make an eternal difference. It was the kindness of strangers and a bag of baby items that gave me hope in that moment when I needed it most. Compassion and hope still matter today; they are crucial in supporting life choices.

By the grace, love, and hand of God we made it! My son is now 27 years old, married with a young daughter and the youth pastor of a local church. I'm so very thankful for the role Pregnancy Resources played in supporting my family. Thank you!

The founder of this global, grassroots, soul-transforming movement didn't just teach, serve, or sacrifice. He conquered death itself. That changes everything.

It means church planting is not ultimately our idea—it's His.

And it means that our work here in Chicago is not powered by strategy, charisma, or hustle, but by **resurrection power**. We're simply instruments in the hands of the Risen One, joining Him in what He's already determined to do.

And friends—it's happening.

Oh the joy I experienced in having a dear Jewish friend join with us in attending an Easter service this past Sunday. I was hugging on him during the service. He whispered to me: "This is the first church service I've ever attended. It's really fascinating." Later I was hugging on his wife (she sat on the other side of me). She's from another religious background. This dear one whispered to me, "Keep singing loudly (I have the tendency to do that... especially during an Easter worship service) it makes me feel very good."



Over the past year I've had a dear friend ask me to walk with him as he seeks to recover from a calamitous blow vocationally. Suffice it to say, the type of blow he took would rock most all of us. I felt a little surge of Easter energy recently when he shared with me that he's not sure he would be alive if I wasn't able to travel this comeback trail with him. What an honor to serve as the hands, feet, and voice of our risen Christ!

After getting to know Jeffrey and Cathy the past couple years, a few things immediately stick out:

They have a Godly faithfulness and direction in their ministry. A sweet love and strength to their marriage. Unnervingly kind Southern hospitality that is a perfectly unassuming drink of fresh water in Chicagoland. I've never met anyone like them. AND they like jazz and art?! Come on!

Happy May! Hope it is fully spring where you are, and that you can enjoy the warmer weather and flowers. It is always amazing here in L..... to see how pretty it is and how green it is, even in the middle of the city! Sorry for a skip in newsletters - C..... had family here and then there were 2 weeks of school break for Easter. Some days felt like vacation and others

felt like 5 things at once! It was really great to have family here though, and to show our area to those close to us, and to go visit!

Numbers aren't everything, but here are a couple encouraging things from the Easter season here:

The assembly team C..... is a part of did Easter assemblies in 8 local primary schools. That equates to several hundred children hearing the story of why Jesus chose to die and how that is good news for Christians! Many of the schools requested follow up lessons from the Crossteach team, and all the schools were given children's Bibles to keep in their school library.

Over 100 significant conversations were had with local people at the book tables S.... helped with in the M... E.. area- specifically reaching out over the Lenten season with questions and facts about who Jesus is and why he came and died.

This sharing and spreading of God's word is exciting and encouraging, especially as we start looking at Acts in Asha on Sundays and see how God's word spread in the early church. But we also remember that it is through the Holy Spirit's power that all these things come about and that hearts change. So we pray for that work to happen here, and have faith in God's power.

As always, we are so grateful for you and your prayers and monetary support, and your commitment to seeing hearts change here in East London! Thank you!

Updates on the last couple months:

We have been encouraged by connections made in our new home and neighborhood. It seems easier to talk to people as we meet them in the lift or going in and out. We were touched that our Bengali neighbors, just a door over, brought us some food from their Iftar meal during Ramadan. (Iftar is the meal they have when breaking their fast in the evening) S.... was also able to meet some local men at the mosque down the road. They held an "open house" to connect with Christians in the area. Pray we can build on these connections and also meet more people.

English classes took a break over Easter, but they will start up again this week. Numbers were a little down during Ramadan, so please be praying that the students all return. Especially pray for the optional Bible story time after the lessons, that women would stay for those and be engaged in what they are hearing. The English classes have been great points for connecting with the community and offering help to a specific need, but they have also been great ways to build relationships and many who come to Asha services have first met our team at English classes. Please pray for this ministry and the teachers as they teach and build relationships. Pray specifically for S.... as he teaches the men's classes too.

Asha continues to have regular attenders, with people coming even when the L.... marathon was taking place right outside and creating havoc with transport! We had communion again this past Sunday and were encouraged to be sharing this together. We had hoped to have a baptism, but the lady is concerned how this will affect her family and taking some time. Please do pray for her and for others of this background who are believers but who know the very real cost of this faith and how it can affect them, their family, and their relationships and positions in society. This is a western country with freedom of religion, but for someone coming out of a different faith background, there is still very real persecution from their community.



There is a signup sheet in the sanctuary foyer.




