

The Diaconate: Five Essential Truths in Five(ish) Months (5 of 5)

Through 2025 I have committed to reserving newsletter cover articles for the subject of the church office of deacon. Last year, the Session determined that the Diaconate would be a major concentration of our interest and training, not only among Church Officers, but across the whole church family. Deacons are essential to the Church. They are one of two specific offices provided to the people of God as the gifts of the Ascended Christ. By the absence of His Heavenly Session where He reigns upon Heaven's Throne, Jesus presents to His body two orders of officers to mediate His presence and authority and service by the empowerment of His Sprit. Those offices are Elders and Deacons. Deacons are essential for the life of a healthy church.

Encouraging Our Deacons

The Apostle Paul, after outlining the qualifications for deacons in 1 Timothy 3, offers a remarkable promise: "For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 3:13). The work of the Diaconate is often done in the shadows—setting up, serving, cleaning up, comforting the lonely, and resolving tension quietly. It's not glamorous work. Yet Scripture affirms that the Lord sees, calls the church to notice, and the faithful deacon will be richly rewarded with respect from others and boldness in their walk with Christ. The Greek phrase rendered "great confidence" evokes a holy courage—an emboldened, seasoned faith forged in the fire of humble service.

This promise dignifies the work of deacons. It reminds us that "behind-the-scenes" faithfulness is often the very engine of church health. When deacons carry burdens, they help elders shepherd the flock without distraction. When they model sacrificial compassion, they embody the heart of Christ, who came not to be served but to serve. The church should honor this calling. In a world where influence is measured in visibility, Scripture reverses that standard: the lowly servant will be lifted up (Matthew 23:12).

So how can we encourage our Deacons? Take initiative. A well-timed thank-you card, a small gift, a public word of appreciation or honor, or even an offer to help with their duties can be wind in their sails. Better yet, include them in your prayers, and let them know you're doing so. As Proverbs says, "a word in season, how good it is!" (Proverbs 15:23). Let's cultivate a culture of gratitude and encouragement in our church family—a community where deacons are honored and treasured.

Old Business:

- The 45th General Assembly of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church was held June 17-19 in Northville, MI at Ward Church. TE Hopkins attended and reported on several key items, including the disposition of the Assembly related to three overtures sent up from the EEPC Session to Rivers & Lakes Presbytery, and then to the General Assembly. All three were adopted. It was remarked how wonderful it is to have a positive influence in the national church.
- Two new communion trays were purchased. This will allow for the elimination of trash cans during the distribution of the Lord's Supper.

New Business:

- Vacation Bible School is scheduled for July 21-25, 2025. The last planning meeting is June 29, 2025, at 11:30am.
- The annual Ice Cream Social is scheduled for August 10, 2025.
- Plans for a late summer/early fall Men's Discipleship Groups were discussed. The Elders are soliciting men for leadership of these groups.
- TE Hopkins reported on a Summer Membership Matters class. There are at least two prospective adult members, with one needing to be baptized. Subsequent approval of that baptism and reception for active membership will be acted upon following successful completion of their classes and elder interviews.
- M/S/C to approve the Facility Use Request from Brandee Neece for Caroline's graduation open house on May 23, 2026.

TINY PILLS = RUINED LIVES (Click <u>HERE</u> for the entire Summer Newsletter)

Please let me take a moment to update you on some new research regarding the abortion pill and two important legal matters that impact all who care about the value of every life.



The Ethics & Public Policy Center just released new research regarding the dangers of the abortion pill. This group examined the insurance claim records of 865,727 women who had an abortion pill abortion from 2017 – 2023. Records indicate that 11% of women who used the abortion pill had serious complications that required an emergency room visit or hospitalization. These complications included sepsis, infection, or hemorrhaging within 45 days of the mifepristone abortion. This data starkly contradicts the FDA's repeated false claim that less than 0.5% of women have serious complications related to the abortion pill. It also shows the deceitfulness of the abortion industry that claims that the abortion pill is safer than over-the-counter pain relief medication. This study recommends significant, immediate changes to the manner in which abortion pill medication is made available. We are thankful that current and well-sourced research demonstrates the truth that abortion harms women – all of the women who are aborted and some of the women who have pill abortions.

Next, you may have heard that the US District Seventh Circuit Court just issued a long-awaited decision on the Illinois Health Care Right of Conscience Act. Judge Johnston upheld a key provision which has **gutted conscience protections and attempts to require Illinois-based pro-life pregnancy centers to refer for abortion**. A stay and injunction were immediately issued and this finding is being appealed. **Regardless of this latest attempt to force** a **pro-abortion agenda**, **Pregnancy Resources will continue to offer life-affirming help**, hope, and compassion in the name of Jesus Christ!

Finally, on May 31, 2025, Illinois HB 3709 passed both the House and Senate and now awaits the governor's signature. This legislation will mandate university campuses to provide, prescribe, and promote the abortion pill as part of their "student health services."

Rest assured, **Pregnancy Resources will never promote abortion as healthcare**, and **Pregnancy Resources will never encourage or refer for abortion**. Like you, we care about moms, about dads, and about the pre-born. We know that abortion harms women and we know that from the moment of conception every life has intrinsic value. for the summer! He had a good first year at university and we are happy to have him around again. S.... and A...... had a weekend away with other dads and kids [at a camping event]. A...... looks forward to the weekend all year and loves having the time with her dad and other families she knows from church. (She also loves that they camp with the Christian group A...... C......- if you haven't heard of them, I would recommend!)

At a recent Bible study, we were encouraged to think of our prayer requests and how we could pray in light of scripture truths. We had been studying Hebrews, so it was specifically truths from Hebrews. It was a very encouraging thing to do, and has influenced how I think about prayer. And, as we think about what we do here and what fruit we would like to see, we want to be praying like Abraham that we "look forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God" (Hebrews 11:10) That we keep in mind that God is doing the building and the planning and the drawing of nations and people to him, and that we can look forward in confidence and faith to a sure future for us and those God brings. We also are encouraged by you all and your support and your prayers for us and for what happens here, that we are all part of a body of believers that encourages and "stirs one another up" (Heb 10:24). We are grateful for you all and we are praying for you all and your churches!

Updates on the last month:

Arts and crafts drop in has continued to have around 10 ladies attending each week. They talk about how they enjoy the time together and being out of the house, and most weeks we have a chance to talk about scripture or what was discussed in the Asha service the day before. **Praise** that this time has gone so well this year, and **pray** for planning over the summer as we figure out how to make the time even better starting again in Sept, including planning in a Bible time at the end, similar to how it happens in ESOL classes.

C...... has had the opportunity to help lead and start a girl's club again, with a month long trial this June, which will hopefully lead to a weekly club starting in Sept. We have had 4 Bengali girls coming each week, and another that wants to come in the autumn. **Pray** that this club can take off and that God can be guiding it.

This week Serge has about 30 people here for LEAP week. They will learn about the religions here and the work that is done here at the Serge church plants. They will be in our area on Wed. and Thurs. and S.... is leading some talks this week as well. **Pray** for S.... as he plans and speaks, and **pray** for our team as they teach and help this group. **Pray** for the group too, as they consider what God may be leading them toward.

ESOL classes finish in a couple weeks. The women's classes have had high numbers all year, and it is also encouraging to see how many will stay for the Bible story at the end. The men's classes are also growing. **Pray** for S.... as he considers how best to visit his pupils and structure classes in the autumn. A fun event was taking an ESOL trip on the cable cars. Everyone enjoyed it and some overcame fears to go up so high in the air. S.... even had one of his students come along and take care of the baby during the trip so that his wife was able to enjoy the time and have a break as well.

Continue to **pray** for our team as we discuss and pray about Bible translation. We have spent this month praying and talking and are still working on best outcomes. **Pray** we can continue to love and understand each other well and also glorify God in our decisions. **Pray** for S.... and the elders as they lead during this time.

Upcoming events this summer:

July 9 - L..... graduates from university! **Praise** with us that she has finished her degree and pray for her decisions over future plans.

July 12 - We are having an Asha church day away! We will go to a nearby beach and spend the morning doing

some teaching/learning and then spend the afternoon in fellowship at the beach. Please **pray** for the time and for growth in community and in understanding of who God is.

July 22-28 - Our family is at EPC World Outreach Family Gathering- this happens every 3 years and we are looking forward to the time of rest and worship and connecting and learning with friends. **Pray** for all the travel involved in this. We are aware that for many it is a much harder journey than it is for us, and **pray** for all that are attending for restoration and encouragement in work.

July 27-Aug 3 - Our local church has their Holiday club outreach (basically like VBS) that we are involved in helping with. **Pray** for lots of local kids to attend and to hear about Jesus.

Aug 30 - We are having an Asha sponsored beach trip. This is usually well attended by families from ESOL classes and Asha attenders and includes good chances to talk while on the train and a lot of good memories at the beach. For many in the city, they don't get a chance to get out to the coast, so this is a well-remembered event. Please **pray** for those that come and for good convos about Jesus during the time.

School lets out July 18 and then there are about 6 weeks of summer break. Most of our regular events during the week will stop over the summer. Be **praying** for our team as they rest and have time away with family, and also for chances to make connections in our neighborhoods while everyone around us slows down some too.

This summer has held both losses and consolations. **Consolation: The comfort received after a loss or disappointment.**

One of the unexpected events of the summer came in the form of a bulging disc towards my spinal nerve in my (M...) lower back. Ouch! After an Emergency Room visit on Memorial Day, I've been trying to recover by non-invasive means: meds, PT, Chiropractic, and rest. All to no avail. I'm now scheduled for surgery July 28th, if insurance approves the treatment plan. *Please pray for this approval*.

Another significant loss was 2 days before we were set to travel to Egypt (all 16 members of our family!) - the Egyptian Internal Security refused the entry they had granted to me a year ago because of the Israel-Iran war. It was a huge disappointment for us all; I wouldn't have been mobile even if we'd made the trip. So, we're hoping they reverse this decision and allow us back in next year. **We'd appreciate prayer for that opportunity to come again quickly.**

But, the consolation? Our wonderful kids arranged a getaway in Long Beach, WA, for a week. We played games,

In our last update we asked for prayers as we traveled to GA and sought to care well for relationships with 4 different groups of people. As always, the Holy Spirit showed up and worked things for His glory and our good. THANK YOU for your prayers! They kept us going through a busy week with very little sleep!

Our kids: we've had challenges in the past with childcare at General Assembly, but we're so grateful to the staff at Ward church who put on "Camp GA" for the kids. They loved every second of getting to play



with other WO kids, volunteers' kids and pastors' kids who were there. Three weeks later they're still laughing about inside jokes and singing worship songs they learned. They also really enjoyed the game room in the basement of our Airbnb!

Young adults: we had 9 alumni of our Mission Cohort come to help us share about WO at GA. 5 of them stayed with us at our Airbnb and we had deep and hilarious conversations until the wee hours of the morning. On Thursday they led a panel discussion at lunch titled "Why does missions need young adults?" Watching them take ownership and share their hearts with the people in attendance was definitely a highlight for us.

Newly commissioned workers: our primary role with World Outreach is that of "field mobilizers," meaning that we walk with people who are discerning a call to go overseas. This year we had 17(!) people who were appointed as WO Global Workers and commissioned at this year's General Assembly. We had the privilege of introducing them to church leaders during the Wednesday night dinner. We're always so encouraged and inspired by the variety of ways God calls and equips people for a specific ministry that's so unique to each one. It was a joy to be with them in person and welcome them into our WO family.

"Pipeline": We also took advantage of this large gathering of our denomination and WO to connect in person with 8 people who are in various stages of applying to join World Outreach. We were able to introduce them to coworkers who could share with them about specific places and ministry platforms. Our hope is that the experience was helpful and clarified some things for them as they continue their process. We look forward to reconnecting with them in the second half of August and hearing what God has revealed to them as far as their next steps.

We hope that you are encouraged by the work God is doing! This is a unique calling and role that God has us in. The fruit of it is relationships, and your prayers and financial support are the reason we are able to freely pour into these people. Thank you!

We took a couple of days on the way home to visit Lake Michigan and Indiana Sand Dunes National Park. It was too hot to do much hiking, but we LOVED swimming and getting our 10th Junior Ranger badges!

What's next?

After a couple of very busy weeks at home (Swim lessons! Camping and canoeing! Our anniversary!) we are all packed up and back in the van. This time we are headed to Chicago where we will fly out on Sunday, the 20th to meet up with all of our WO missionaries in the Mediterranean for a week-long retreat that happens every 3-4 years. We are so excited to see many friends, including some that we haven't seen since they launched to the field.

We'd appreciate your continued prayer support! Getting our whole family across the ocean is no small feat and this week we've already encountered ear infections, sore throats, and a tweaked neck for Jesse. Please pray for health and safety as we travel! And that we would continue to trust God with our days, surrendering to Him all the things we can't control. Pray that this would be a really sweet time of community with our organization.



Blue Letter Bible provides powerful tools for an in-depth study of God's Word through our free online reference library, with study tools that are grounded in the historical, conservative Christian faith. We view the Bible as central to our study resources. We intentionally designed the website to include study tools that are linked directly to Bible passages. Dig deep into the Word using commentaries,

encyclopedias, maps/images and much more. One of our most used tools is the Lexicon search, which gives users immediate access to the original Hebrew and Greek words.

DAILY BIBLE READING FROM AN HISTORICAL APPROACH

Have you ever wondered what it would have been like to read the Old Testament in ancient Israel? Or, the New Testament as the books were written? In this plan, the order of the Old Testament readings is very similar to Israel's Hebrew Bible, progressing from Law to Prophets to Writings. The New Testament ordering is based upon research regarding the order in which the books were authored. Although this research is not conclusive, it may offer helpful insights to your Bible reading.

Each year Pastor Zach provides a new reading plan to help equip you to spend time reading through God's Word. This year he has chosen an historical reading plan from Blue Letter Bible. It is a 1-year reading plan and you can start at any time. The new year is always a great time to start fresh!

If reading through the entire Bible in one year seems like an insurmountable challenge, just mark off each reading as you complete it and then move to the next. Each day progresses you through the books in the order they are believed to be written in and once you reach number 365, you will have done it!

In the year ahead, ask God each day to speak directly to you from the Scripture portions you read. Be expectant, and let your continual exposure to God's Word reshape your attitudes and behavior as you gain a better understanding of every part of His written testimony to us.









Have you ever been intrigued by the prophetic books of the Old Testament?


