A PLACE WHERE YOU CAN GROW

There is something energizing about the end of summer. Vacations wind down, schools prepare to reopen, familiar routines return, and the church enters a new season of ministry. As we look toward the conclusion of the summer and the beginning of fall, I am grateful for the many opportunities the Lord is providing for people of every age to become more deeply connected to the life of our congregation.

We have ministry opportunities for everyone! Women and Men; Young Adults; Students; and Children. Whoever you are and whatever stage of life, there is a place for you to plug in.

Discipleship rarely happens in isolation. God ordinarily grows us through His Word and through relationships with other Christians. We need places where we can ask questions, receive encouragement, serve others, and be reminded that we are not walking through life alone.

Our ministries throughout the week do not replace the Lord's Day; they flow from it and lead us back to it. Before we are members of a ministry group, volunteers at an event, or participants in a program, we are the gathered people of God, called by Christ to worship Him and receive His grace.

As schedules fill again this fall, decide now what will have first place. Make worship with God's people the fixed point around which the rest of life is ordered. Then, from that center, look for additional ways to grow, serve, and build relationships within the church.

I am excited about the season ahead and thankful for the leaders and volunteers who make these ministries possible. Whether you are a child, a student, a young adult, a parent, or someone simply looking for a place to belong, there is room for you in the life of this church.

Come worship. Come learn. Come serve. Come share life with the saints.

This is a place where you can grow.

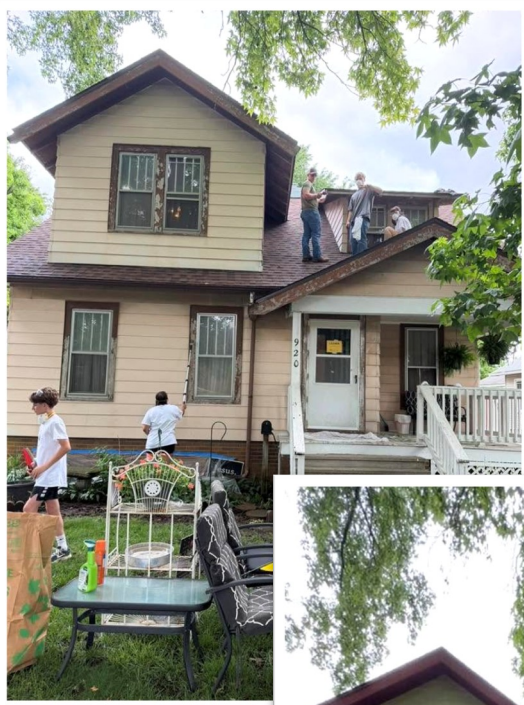

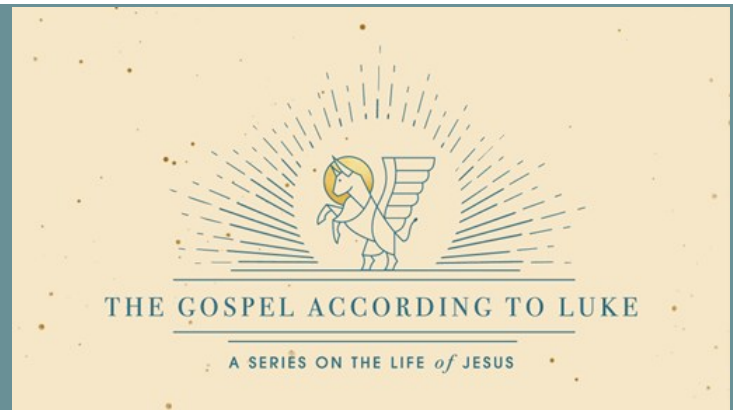

ESV.org is an online Bible reading tool created to help you read and engage with God's Word. While many features of the site are available without signing in, we invite you to **create a free account**, which makes it easy to save personal notes, highlight favorite verses, and start interactive reading plans.

Blue Letter Bible provides powerful tools for an in-depth study of God's Word through our free online reference library, with study tools that are grounded in the historical, conservative Christian faith. We view the Bible as central to our study resources. We intentionally designed the website to include study tools that are linked directly to Bible passages. Dig deep into the Word using commentaries, encyclopedias, maps/images and much more. One of our most used tools is the Lexicon search, which gives users immediate access to the original Hebrew and Greek words.

REDEMPTIVE-HISTORICAL BIBLE READING PLAN

Each year Pastor Zach provides a new reading plan to help equip you to spend time reading through God's Word. This year he has chosen a redemptive-historical reading plan from Greg Lanier, who is an associate professor of New Testament at Reformed Theological Seminary, Orlando (full-time) and as associate pastor at River Oaks Church (PCA) (part-time).



Daily Bible Reading
MAKE IT A HABIT THIS YEAR

Annual Bible reading plans are great. But there are tradeoffs. They can be oppressive for some, and they require a heavy load of reading spread equally across all chapters and books with little time to reflect, pause, connect dots, etc. One may not, at the end of reading the Bible through in a year, emerge with a much better understanding of the 1,189 chapters you just read. The plan provided on the next few pages and linked to the image takes a different approach meant to complement (not replace) the normal one. It curates the key chapters of the OT that help frame the flow of redemptive history (how God has worked in history to bring about his plan of salvation). Most sections of OT readings include NT chapters that shed light on fulfillment in Christ. You can go at your own pace and pause however often you want to dig deeper and reflect on what you are reading. At the end, you will have a solid grounding in the entire message of the Bible, which can then help you revisit those 1,189 chapters afresh.

In the year ahead, ask God each day to speak directly to you from the Scripture passages you read. Be expectant, and let your continual exposure to God's Word reshape your attitudes and behavior as you gain a better understanding of every part of His written testimony to us.

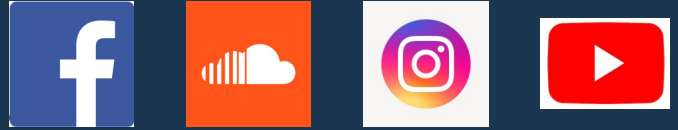

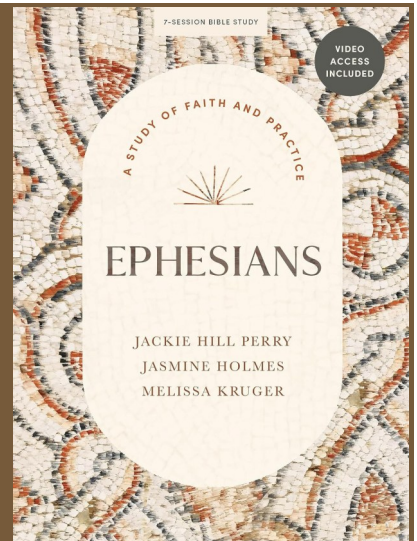

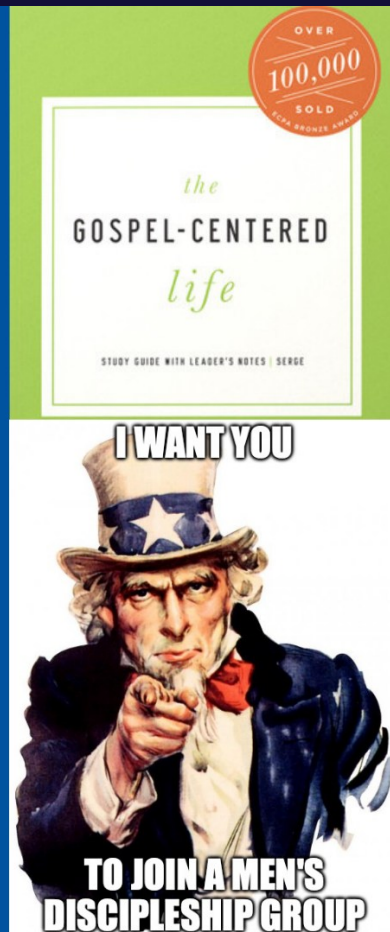
